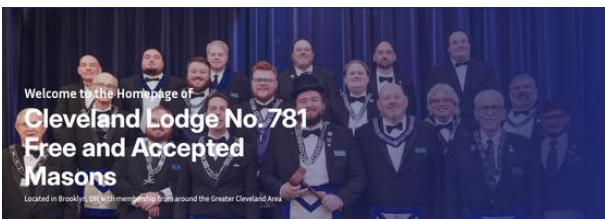

VIEW FROM THE WEST

Hooray-Hooray for the Month of May! May is truly a month of transition, when we once again begin to discover nature's beauty as the warmth and light of summer is being revealed to us. This is the time often used to plan and begin enjoying our favorite summer activities. For some it is preparing and planting a garden, others are prepping their boats for launch, some are brushing off the effects of winter's cold by preparing our bodies to enjoy summer sports...while still others are just looking forward to soaking up some good old Vitamin D and basking in the sunshine. May also dedicates a couple of days to honoring and paying tribute to, what should be, Hero's in our lives. The first is Mother's Day and the second is Memorial Day!

MOTHER'S DAY: When I was in DeMolay, I took pride in memorizing and presenting a couple heartfelt and moving talks. The first was the "Tribute to Mothers" which at that time was presented at open installations (not just for DeMolay but for Rainbow Girls and Job's Daughters events) and on request at Eastern Star events. It talked about God giving the sweetest thing in His Almighty power...and gave to Earth a Mother. All the mothers were asked to stand and as we described how much we loved and honored each of them, a couple brothers progressed from the East to the West presenting each mother a single Red Rose (and sometimes a kiss on the cheek). The tribute ended with the wish that God would bless the Mothers as truly as we have been blessed by the gift of their love and by them! The second memory was the "Flower Talk" which I believe was given after the DeMolay Degree (it's been about 55 years). From what I remember, it talked of; a Mother's Love which never fails, How she loved us- close to her heart- before we were born, and how she lovingly cared for us during our helpless years of infancy! The newly initiated were instructed to choose either a white flower (if his Mother had passed on, to honor her memory), or a red flower (if his Mother is living) to encourage him to take her in his arms and tell her it is our recognition of God's best gift to a man...his Mother's Love!

These were beautiful and meaningful talk. Perhaps we, as Masons, should remember these sentiments and express them to our wives and significant others. Although my Mother is gone, I will be buying my wife Red Flowers for Mother's Day May 10th and express to her how much she means to me and how much I truly appreciate her love and her efforts to care for my family!

MEMORIAL DAY: is more than a day for parades and cook-outs. The holiday originated when Brother- Major General John A. Logan (raised in Mitchell Lodge No. 85 in Pinckneyville, Illinois), National Commander of the Grand Army of the Republic issued General Orders No. 11, Washington D.C., on May 5, 1868, that May 30, 1868, would be observed as Decoration Day for the purpose of honoring America's fallen soldiers by placing flowers/decorations at the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country. In 1971, Memorial Day was officially designated as a federal holiday and moved to the last Monday in May, creating a three-day weekend for Americans.

As Cleveland Lodge members participate in the Brooklyn Memorial Day Parade this year, let us not lose sight of the true meaning of this holiday. May we remember, in our prayers, the sacrifices made by all military service members... but in particular those who gave their lives so that we can enjoy the blessings of freedom they have valiantly paid for!

Well brothers, Spring has sprung or at least it hasn't snowed in several days. And while one can't be sure whether to don long underwear or bust out a pair of jorts to mow the lawn; it's clearly going to stay warm soon. This makes us think of all the things of Spring like barbecues and bunnies. For this month's topic I'd like to focus on bees. Specifically, the masonic symbol of the bee hive. I'd like to state at the onset that I and more so my family have an irrational attachment to honey bees. Its to the extent that I get irritated with people who lump in those pesky wasps and yellow jackets in as bees when they get angry at something buzzing around their lunch spread. Someday, many moons from now, when (if) I finally get to retire, I hope to move to a place more farmy and have an apiary of my own.

The Masonic beehive is a symbol of industry, or at least that's what has been made abundantly clear by the twelve or so articles I've tried to read as research for this. Another thing is that it's important enough as a topic to be part of our material when becoming a master mason. The Cliffs Notes version of the whole thing being that we should be like the honey bee; in the sense that we should all be diligently working toward the betterment of world around us. In the context of the lodge, this would mean doing your part but also extends to our lives as a whole.

When one looks at a hive, and the busy bees that live there, its easy to think of the phrase, "Many hands make light work". It can be said that if we'd all just try to do our part that things might be a lot better. While there are plenty of references in the material I read to inaction being a bad thing, there are few that talk about trying to do too much. If we look at the humble honeybee as a symbol, we have to remember that they go out and sit on flowers. We can't always be on-task and need to set aside time as we are taught by the gauge for refreshment and sleep. In Latin the phrase 'Memento mori' loosely translates to remember death. While it sounds morose, we all need to remember that things will always be screwed up to an extent whether we are there to effect change in them or not. 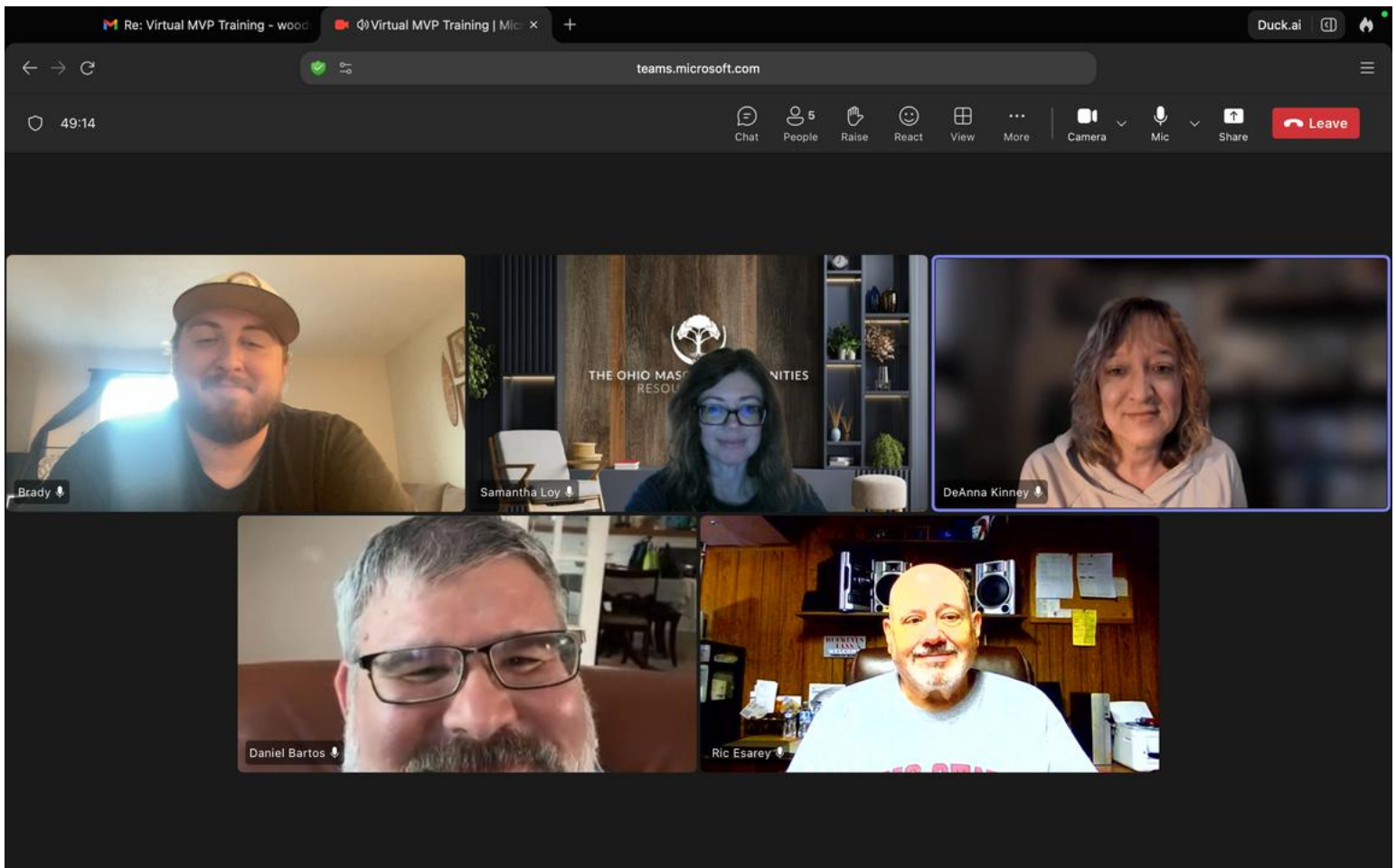
EVENT RECAP - MASONIC VOLUNTEER TRAINING

Grand Master's Award 2025-26

The Grand Master's Award Program is designed to build and strengthen Lodges across this jurisdiction. The form is divided into 6 sections, each area focusing on key measurables to promote positive growth, member engagement and personal improvement.

Section 1 includes specific tasks created by the Grand Master. Sections 2 through 6 will remain the same each year providing continuity for lodge leadership planning year over year.

To be eligible, a lodge selects from a list of challenges from each section to complete the required number for that section.

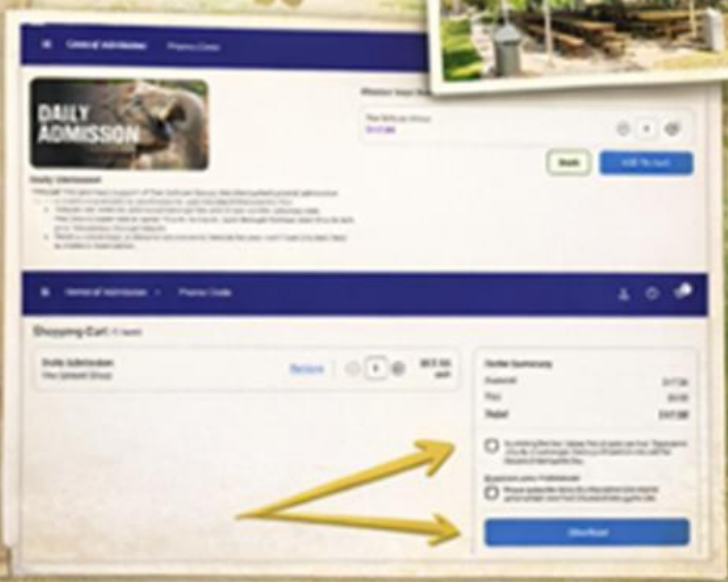
