Don Ledingham

Don Ledingham is the Founder and Chairman of [Ceannas](#), the Scottish-based Leadership Development and Consultancy Service. The Ceannas Vision is to build a 100-year-old company - so only 90 years to go!

With a high-profile list of global clients, such as Allianz and Google Cloud, they have developed a range of proprietary products and services which have had a transformative impact on the performance of organisations.



Don Ledingham has had a lifelong interest in education and leadership. It led him earlier in his career to become a teacher, university lecturer, headteacher, and executive director of education.

He is the author of 'A Small Step to Wise Leadership, (2017) and 'The Wisdom of Knowing you Know Nothing' (2021) and an honorary professor of leadership at Queen Margaret University Edinburgh. In 2019 he wrote 'Edinburgh Revisited' with Gordon Hunter.

He subscribes to the words of Seamus Heaney: "Believe that a further shore is reachable from here".

Antonia Ypsilanti

Associate Professor Antonia Ypsilanti is the co-Director of the [Campaign to End Loneliness](#), which is one of UK's leading advocacy bodies focusing on research, policy, and practice on loneliness. She has worked on loneliness research for 10 years with a focus on understanding the underlying psychological mechanisms that make loneliness problematic.



Antonia's session aims to present how the Campaign to End Loneliness has influenced decision making and policy making on Loneliness. Also, during the session, attendees will learn how the Campaign is structured and how it is resourced and provide innovative ideas on how to make an impact in your community. A final aim is to provide an overview of the international collaboration that the Campaign is involved in and share good practices on befriending services from across the world.

Antonia will be joined by Professor Andrea Wigfield, the Director of the Centre for Loneliness Studies and the co-Director of the Campaign to End Loneliness. Her research focuses on the wider social determinants of loneliness and social isolation and advocates evidence based research which is policy driven and leads to impact and change.



Wendy Halley

From setting up support groups for people living with lung conditions to head of volunteering, Wendy's had roles in multiple charities of varying sizes. Mainly in volunteering development, Wendy has supported local volunteer managers across the UK with volunteer recruitment, retention, day-to-day management and dealing with difficult conversations.



Back in 2015, Wendy commissioned Save the Children's volunteer management system, helping to shape and direct the features of the software that would become [Assemble](#). Seven years later, she moved from volunteering development to work directly with Assemble itself. Initially delivering all of the customer training she now manages the direction and delivery of Assemble across the volunteering sector. But volunteering is still a passion and supporting "digitally nervous" volunteers (and managers!) in a world for digital natives, has become an increasing focus.
