I am thrilled that this year we can once again open our doors to welcome you to the 2022 Ravenswood Australian Women's (RAW) Art Prize and Exhibition of Finalists as we celebrate the extraordinary artistic works of more than 100 talented women artists representing every state and territory across Australia. The inspiring display is also available through our interactive web tour.

The RAW was launched in 2017 to advance art and provide meaningful opportunities for recognition of emerging and professional women artists in Australia. Now in its sixth year, it is the highest value professional artist prize for women in Australia.

There are three prize categories: Professional Artist Prize of \$35,000; Emerging Artist Prize of \$5,000; and Indigenous Emerging Artist Prize of \$5,000. In addition, there's the popular People's Choice Award of \$2,000. Since our inception in 1901, when our founding Principal Mabel Fidler, established Arts and Crafts as subjects, Ravenswood has recognised the importance of Visual Arts and is proud to have educated many artists amongst its generations of alumniand current students

Inspiring and connecting visual artists, this significant Art Prize supports current and future generations of Australian women artists by providing them with a platform to showcase their creative expression and extraordinary talents.

As a Ravenswood Alumni and practising artist of over 30 years, I am delighted to see this major art prize into its sixth year. The Art Prize acknowledges and strengthens the role of women in the arts industry.

For the girls at Ravenswood, it opens opportunities to learn about the work and careers of professional artists and to imagine how participation in the arts can make changes in all our lives. Art offers hope through imagination. It is particularly important to continue to support creative endeavour in difficult times such as those we are experiencing with climate change, international conflict, the global pandemic and ongoing matters of indigenous reconciliation.



This year, once again, artists have presented artworks reflecting the concerns of their individual practices, rather than responding to a given theme. Whilst a range of issues are represented across the 1,540 artworks entered, compared with 2020 and 2021 there are less overtly political artworks this year.

Instead, there is more focus on quieter works expressing the beauty of nature, a corner of home, the everyday lives of women.

There are contemplative views of calmness, balance and order in home life as well as reflections on sadness, loneliness and nostalgia.

Humour is sometimes engaged to draw attention to the unexpected. Nature is invoked through both the drama of the universal sublime and the close focus of detail.

Whatever the subject matter, the unique character of each artwork reminds and invites the audience to respond to and reflect upon their own place in the world. It is the role of art to offer new ways of seeing.

In this year's Art Prize there were not as many sculptural or digital video works as entered in previous years and we wish to encourage artists to enter their sculptures and videos in future years. This would show the diversity of women's art practices in Australia. The other judges and I also encourage more professional artists to enter their work in the 2023 Art Prize.

For the Ravenswood girls, I hope you will explore each work with curiosity and openness, allowing the experience and meaning of each work to wash over you. The variety of artwork in this Finalists' Exhibition delivers a mixture of skill, humour, daring, boldness, subtlety and beauty.

The Art Prize continues to grow and evolve, reaching both inwards within the school community and outwards to the broader community. It started in a spirit of generosity and it is this spirit that aligns with the very nature of the arts, the practice of which highlights the creative spirit and contributes so much to our societies.


