- We are a Biblical and classical school founded in 1980.
- We serve students from preschool through 12th grade with a total student body near 450.
- We are a college preparatory school: 99% of graduates attend college after graduation, including high caliber universities such as University of Virginia, Virginia Tech, College of William and Mary, West Point, Cornell, and Princeton.

What is the school day?

Why do you have a half day on Thursdays?

Yes. Hot lunches are delivered to the school daily from various vendors in the area. No lunch service is provided on Thursdays. Ordering can be completed through the school app.
















SCHOOL FUNDING: StoneBridge School does not receive any government funding. We rely on tuition and the generous gifts of donors to support our programs and scholarships.

Field Studies: Students in both Lower School and Upper School experience historical, scientific, and cultural opportunities at local establishments and beyond. Each grade takes at least one trip to enrich their academics and provide hands-on learning.

Schoolwide Special Days

Christian Heritage Day: A celebration of how God used specific individuals to bring about His purpose in American History. Students, faculty, and volunteers celebrate and remember the original purposes of the American holiday of Thanksgiving. This day is filled with demonstrations, games, story interpreters, hands on activities and delicious food! Upper School students have an opportunity to serve on this day as well.

Grandparents & Special Friends Day: Grandparents and family friends are integral members of the StoneBridge community. We celebrate them and their contribution to our students on this special day. Guests are invited to a chapel service and a special time in the classroom with their grandchildren and special friends.

Liberty Day: A candle lighting ceremony and pictorial slideshow are highlights of this moving chapel service, our annual tribute to the contributions of our U.S. military service members. This special service is followed by the Presidents Wax Museum, presented by our 5th grade students.

Spirit Week: Every day is themed to bring excitement and to join our community together in their love for SBS. A Pep Rally and other activities are planned this week. Spirit Days also happen throughout the school year to show support for our sports teams. Go Cavaliers!

STEM Day: A celebration of learning in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math. Volunteers from our SBS and Hampton Roads community share hands-on activities that relate to STEM careers. Homeroom classes also participate in group STEM challenges using steps of the scientific method.

Upper School Events, Projects, & Opportunities

Fall Retreat: A three-day retreat to experience adventure, fellowship, and spiritual renewal to kick off the school year held at Rockbridge Alum Springs, owned and operated by Young Life.

Student Prefects: Prefectships are servant-leadership positions open to high school students, with preference given to 11th and 12th graders.

Spiritual Emphasis Week: The Upper School community carves out extra time on the three days leading up to mid-winter break to refocus on the Lord through worship, prayer, Bible study, teaching, and small group discussion. It is always a time of renewal, growth, and excitement that sets the tone for the remainder of the school year!

Mentoring: Beginning in 6th grade, students begin their day with their mentoring group. Mentors are the Upper School faculty and staff who partner with parents to support students and foster academic, spiritual, and social success. They develop lasting relationships with students over the course of their time in middle and high school.

Student Life: Social Life prefects are in charge of planning fun social activities for their classmates throughout the entire year. They work together with administration to bring unity to our 6th-12th grades.

Student Government: Provides students with the training and experience in our form of government. Students serve as elected class representatives by grade level. Student governors communicate and collaborate with peers, faculty, and administrators to represent the best interests of the student body.

Drama


The drama department produces two or more productions each year, ranging from classical and contemporary plays, film, and musical theatre. Students learn about theatre primarily through hands-on experience in:

Thesis & Oration Projects

Academic writing and oral presentation are distinct features of a StoneBridge education. By their junior year, students will complete a research paper and oral presentation in economics or government. Seniors are required to write a 20- to 25-page thesis and orally defend it before a panel of faculty and community leaders.

Senior Seminar

Bible courses are required throughout a student's StoneBridge School experience. The Senior Seminar is a year-long required course that helps future graduates take ownership of their spiritual formation and apply their Biblical understanding as they prepare for life beyond high school.

Leadership Project

Service is an integral part of what it means to be a Christian and a leader. Seniors are required to study leadership through volunteering or by observing a recognized leader. This hands-on experience culminates in a final leadership paper.

Academics

StoneBridge teaches students how to reason from Biblical principles in every area of life. Our curriculum employs elements of classical education, such as foreign languages, history, math and fine arts. We offer several AP and honors courses in science, math, history, literature, and psychology, as well as dual enrollment in English.


A **servant** is one who voluntarily serves in a spirit of love; one willing to make sacrifices for other's needs.

A statesman encompasses all of the qualities of a scholar, servant and steward. Additionally, a statesman is one who is able to lead his own generation by example in a spirit of selflessness as a representative of Christ locally, nationally, and internationally.

Admissions Requirements

We seek families who desire to develop a child's spiritual stature in accordance with Biblical principles, through academic excellence, Christian self-government, and servant leadership.



PLACEMENT TESTING

The goal of testing is to ensure proper placement. We want our students to be challenged but not frustrated. Testing will be scheduled after a complete application (including references and school records) is received.

- Pre-K & Kindergarten:
 - The one-and-a-half hour session recreates the classroom to provide an opportunity for observation and the administration of readiness tests.
- Grades 1st through 12th:
 The two-to-three hour

The two-to-three hour testing session presents a variety of standard achievement tests based on the student's grade level. The student will provide a writing sample as well.

Learning Profile:

After testing is completed, a Learning Profile is prepared to summarize and interpret test results. The Learning Profile is reviewed with parents as part of the Final Parent Interview. (See Admissions Checklist, p. 5.)

The criteria for admitting any child begins with the family:

- ✓ Are the parents in agreement with the philosophy, Ethos, and Statement of Faith of StoneBridge School? (These can be found on the school's website.)
- ✓ Do the parents uphold the spirit and principles of a Christian home? This includes abiding by a Biblical living arrangement (i.e., cohabitation only occurs in the context of marriage between husband and wife.)
- Is the family actively involved, in-person, in a local church? Families new to the area must have prior involvement in a local church in their previous community.
- Are the parents committed to working with the school and teachers in accomplishing Biblical, spiritual, and educational goals for their child(ren)?
- ✓ Does the student display evidence of a teachable spirit, able to be discipled by teachers and mentors?

0	4.	Admissions Processing: All new applicants are held for processing until our early re-enrollment deadline (mid-February) as the Admissions Committee determines final enrollment availability. To expedite the application process, we encourage you to notify the reference contacts you submitted via your online application (pastor, teachers, school).			
0	5.	Placement Testing: Students applying for Pre-K through12th grade proceed to testing unless references are incomplete or indicate that further communication between administration and parent/student is required. Testing is not required for preschool applicants. A non-refundable \$130 testing fee is due at the time of testing.			
0	6.	Final Parent Interview: Both parents participate in a final meeting with administration. At this appointment, testing results will be reviewed for students applying for Pre-K through 12th grade and an Enrollment Contract may be offered to qualified applicants. For our Upper School applicants (grades 6th-12th), this appointment will also include a separate student interview with Upper School administration.			
		If a contract is offered, a Business Office representative will be present for any questions concerning your payment options. You will complete your online enrollment contract with the Director of Admissions.

Tuition Assistance

StoneBridge School acknowledges the significant investment families make by choosing a Principle Approach® education. This is why we have chosen to partner with FACTS® Grant & Aid, an independent, third party company that conducts financial analysis to determine your family's financial need. StoneBridge School receives a confidential report outlining your financial situation based on your application information and supporting tax documents. This allows us to offer tuition assistance to qualifying families.

The application fee is \$35. Tuition assistance is not available for preschool and Pre-K students. **New families** will be able to apply for financial aid while completing the student's **online application**. **Current families** can access the application through the FACTS® Grant & Aid link in your **FACTS Family Portal**.
