I drive over the hill and it's gold! Gold spread out across the country. Gold in the scrub too.

Everywhere in the district just now, the gold delights the eye. Even when clouds are heavy, the gold lifts the spirits. When the sun comes out, the glory of the Canola crops and delicacy of Golden Wattle dazzle with their brilliance.

It will be gone in a few weeks. It's seasonality is part of its charm, but we must wait till next year to be charmed again. No wonder the beauty of golden metal, and its permanence, have always attracted us humans.

I was reading about King Solomon in the Bible yesterday. He lived about three thousand years ago, but the glories and challenges of life were just the same then as they are for us. His father, King David, had left him a substantial legacy – lots of gold, among other things - and he was a young man of promise.

He was challenged to ask God for whatever he wanted. He did not ask for riches or power, but for wisdom and understanding. These he was given, and ever since his wisdom has been proverbial, better than gold.

This treasure is for us too, if we ask. The people who received the letter of James, in the New Testament, were facing various trials (What's new?). James tells them, paradoxically, to count it pure joy! Gold! Why?? Because the testing of our faith produces perseverance, and then maturity.

But we might think we are not wise enough for that. So James tells us: 'If



any of you lacks wisdom, they should ask God, who gives generously to all, without finding fault, and it will be given them.' But we must know and believe that this is true, and not be doubleminded about it. God does indeed give wisdom, beyond our years, beyond our experience, if we but ask.



Winch House Where To From Here?

In common with quite a few community centres, the pandemic has held back the development of the next Strategic Plan at Winchelsea Community House.

Our last Plan expired in 2020, and we are now looking to set the directions for Winch House over the next 4 years. With all the changes that are going on, your local community centre also needs to change in order to achieve its ultimate ambition "To be Winchelsea's community centre for inspiration, growth and enjoyment".

Winch House has a small but very dedicated Oversight Committee which is responsible for setting and guiding the goals and objectives for the organisation. We made a good start on the next Strategic Plan last year as part of the process to adopt and extend into the adjoining Shire Hall. We have 3 high-level goals, each of which has a number of objectives;

Goal 1 - Positive Revenue

The financial squeeze has been on since forever, but it is getting intense. High inflation, reduced govenment funding, ever more red tape, and legislative developments are seeing greater expenditure in parallel with reduced income. Winch House is predominantly funded by State government with a major contribution from Surf Coast Shire, and Federal income through the child-care service. The financial year just past will

see an overall loss (come along to the AGM 7pm October 19th for the details). So our most important goal must be the financial sustainability of Winch House.


Goal 2 - Community Engagement

Well, the clue is in the name. As a community house, the place exists to foster connections between people, get people engaged in activities and courses, draw people together around issues and topics of interest, to combat inequality, help improve mental health and generally build a shared community spirit for the Winchelsea area. So this goal maps out what will get people through the doors.

Goal 3 - Internal Growth

It's all well and good to lay out what needs to be done; it's people that turn plans into realities. After a massive drop in volunteering across the country and even the world, the challenge is to inspire people with skills, experience or raw motivation to join in and help out. We all know the massive good-feeling benefits that come from volunteering. Winch House needs more volunteers. In addition to volunteers, staff and the Committee itself can learn and grow with new abilities and awareness. So the goal is to make Winch House a great place to be and stay whether volunteer, staff or Committee member.

Over the coming weeks, I will expand on each of these Goals to outline their Objectives - and how you might be able to help with your ideas, your time, or your participation. After all, if Winch House isn't for you, it has no reason to exist.





Snakes out and about as the weather warms up

Residents are being reminded that as the days become warmer, snakes will emerge to bask in the sun and search for food and a mate.

Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) Senior Wildlife Officer, Abby Smith, said: "Snakes are ectotherms, which means they get their heat from external sources, so residents are more likely to encounter them in spring."

"It's not uncommon to find snakes warming themselves on a path or in a clearing, particularly on a sunnier day, so it's important we're mindful that they can be out and about earlier than normally expected.

"Snakes are generally very shy and prefer to keep away from people and often when

a snake is found in a backyard it's because it's moving through the area to another habitat.

"In most encounters with humans, a snake will seek the fastest escape route and take off. However, if cornered and feeling threatened, a snake may defend itself.

"The most common snake species encountered in the Barwon South West region are the Tiger Snake, Lowland Copperhead Snake or Eastern Brown Snake.

"All of these species are venomous, but it is rare for them to bite people. Most snake bites occur as a defence mechanism when people try to capture or kill a snake.

"With snakes on the move, people and their pets are more likely to see them, increasing the need for people to be 'snake sensible'," Ms Smith said.

If you live in an area with snakes, please remember:

When left alone, snakes present little or no danger to people.

Wear long pants, stick to cleared paths and trails.


If you see a snake, keep calm and move yourself and anyone with you (including pets) away from the area.

Don't attempt to capture or harm snakes. Instead call DELWP on 136 186 for further advice.

Maintain lawns and clean up around your house, as snakes are attracted to shelter such as piles of rocks and timber, chook sheds, sheets of metal, and building materials.

Undertake first aid training and ensure your first aid kit contains several compression bandages, and if someone is bitten, call 000 immediately.

A Victoria first experimental trial is fighting back against plant disease that is threatening the Otways

A Victoria first experimental trial is attempting to re-establish native bushlands that have been infected with Phytophthora cinnamomi commonly known as dieback. The project will involve planting of native species that have been pre-treated with phosphite.

The plants will be treated with phosphite, a salt solution, prior to planting. This phosphite treatment is like an immunisation for plants, it helps them resist infection from this devasting disease.

A healthy natural environment is important for our plants, animals, and communities. Phytophthora dieback poses a significant threat to the Otways heathlands environment.

This plant pathogen can spread easily, causing yellowing of leaves and eventual death. If untreated dieback can result in the loss of susceptible plants like our iconic grasstrees in impacted areas.

Grasstrees and other susceptible plant species found in our heathlands provide habitat critical for the survival of a number of our native mammals, including threatened species such as Swamp antechinus, Long nosed Potoroo and Southern Brown Bandicoot in our region. The aim of this trial is to reintroduce plant species that are susceptible to Phytophthora dieback to regain the vegetation structure and complexity of this habitat in areas affected by the disease.

There will be a focus on grasstrees, Xanthorrhoea australis a species identified by the National Threat Abatement Plan (EPBC Act) as a critical element of ecological function and an important species of very high cultural significance to Traditional Owners.

The trial is being run by Deakin University PhD student Campbell Learmonth who is collaborating with Barbara Wilson Pty Ltd, Corangamite CMA, Parks Victoria and the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning.

The seeds were obtained from areas in the Anglesea Heath and grown by Otway Greening and Aireys Indigenous Nursery.

Corangamite CMA's, Manager of Environmental Programs Jessica Miller says, "The battle against Phytophthora is being fought on many fronts through the Wild Otways Initiative. The project is undertaking mapping of the disease, hygiene training and treatment using phosphite".

"This research is groundbreaking because a trial like this has never been delivered before in Victoria".


"Our research shows that a number of our threatened small mammals are effectively absent from these Phytophthora infected areas. This planting trial will recreate vegetation complexity and is another management tool that will support small mammal recovery".

"Most importantly, the community also has a role to play in stopping the spread of this devastating plant disease into our native bushland."



Rocky Creek War Memorial Park

Located a few kilometres north of Tolga, Queensland, the Park is situated on the 2/2 Australian General Hospital laundry and medical stores site.

During WW11, the Tablelands area became the largest military base in Australia with camps at Tinaroo, Kairi, Atherton, Wongabel, Herberton, Wondecla, Ravenshoe and Mt Garnet.

Rocky Creek was the site of the largest military hospital in the Southern Hemisphere – a 3000 bed hospital which treated over 60,000 patients from 1943 -1945.

This year was the 77th anniversary of Victory in the Pacific, a memorial service was held on 14th August 2022.

The family of Kevin Bennett – daughters Sandra, Marilyn, Rhonda, granddaughter Veronica, niece Carleen and Geoff Davis and nephew Rodney Campbell had the pleasure of attending the day.

A plaque in Kevin's honour was unveiled on the wall of remembrance.

Family members were called to the microphone to give a brief outline of Kevin's life after leaving the army.

Then his name was read out, the bell tolled and poppies were placed on his plaque by family members.

Then a memorial service was held with guest speakers and wreaths being laid by many people.

After the Ode and Last Post one minute silence was observed. Followed by the Rouse and National Anthem and Benediction.

The first plaques dedicated in the park occurred on Victory Day 1995. A special




farm books & farm art & craft as well and of course we had some homemade play-dough.
