



Ron Foale, the pater of the Gipps Jazz Band and father of pianist Margie Fullerton, could silence a large crowd with his virtuosic solo performances on the Tin whistle. The tumultuous applause and emotion in the room from those performances led to the introduction of the Ron Foale Musician's Award in 1989. Recipients of the Ron Foale Musician's Award have always been chosen for their significant talent and their musical contributions to numerous festivals. These musicians showed dedication to the ongoing development and longevity of jazz music, in all its various forms, and the continuing patronage of jazz festivals.

Several years ago the name of this award was changed to the MJF Award. Recipients began to include volunteers who had shown incredible dedication to the Festival.

The 2023 MJF Committee determined that both groups of recipients are equally deserving. Accordingly, they have reinstated the Ron Foale Musicians Award and changed the name of the MJF Award to the MJF Service Award.

Given the passing of former MJF President and Secretary Kevin and Aileen Walsh last year and the retirement of nearly all the previous committee, there will not be a Ron Foales Award this year. Instead, four MJF Service Awards will be presented at the Official Festival Opening on Saturday morning at 10am in Spencer Park.
