### The Power of Being Present: Every School Day Counts

It may seem simple, but being at school every day, on time, is one of the most powerful tools for your child's academic and social development. When a child misses a day, they're not just missing a lesson; they're missing an opportunity to build on previous knowledge, engage with their peers, and connect with their teachers.

Missing a day here and there may not seem like much, but absences quickly add up. When a student misses two days a month beginning in kindergarten, that adds up to 20 days a year and the equivalent of almost a year and a half of learning lost by the time they reach graduation.

These small gaps can grow into larger problems over time, making it harder for a child to keep up with their classmates. ### Free School Meal Program Renewed for This Year

We are pleased to announce that all elementary and middle school students will once again receive free breakfast and lunch through the Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) program.

This means that all students at eligible elementary and middle schools will automatically receive a nutritious breakfast and lunch at no cost to their families. There is no need for parents to fill out a Free and Reduced-Price Meal Application.

The CEP program is a federally funded initiative that allows schools and districts with a high concentration of low-income students to provide free breakfast and lunch to all students. This eliminates meal debt and allows our Child Nutrition staff to focus on serving healthy, appealing meals to every student.

We believe that a well-fed child is better prepared to learn, and we are proud to continue our participation in this important program. Providing these meals is a crucial part of our commitment to the health, well-being, and academic success of all our students. ## Transportation Dept. Upgrades Help Ensure a Smooth Ride

The Transportation Department has worked hard all summer to finalize bus routes and procedures for the 2025-26 school year, implementing new technologies to enhance safety and efficiency.

With student safety a top priority, the district has implemented new, state-of-the-art camera systems on all school buses. These systems will provide real-time monitoring inside and outside the buses, creating a safer environment for students and drivers alike. These cameras are part of a broader effort to ensure accountability and provide a secure travel experience for every student.

You may notice some changes to bus routes and stops this year. This year's bus routes have been created using advanced new routing software that allows the district to create the most efficient routes possible, minimizing rider time while maintaining safety standards.

Start times for each morning route remain unchanged:

- 6:00 a.m. High school routes(+SWMS)
- 6:45 a.m. Middle school routes (+BBES & GES)
- 7:30 a.m. Elementary school routes

These route times are a general guide, and parents should be aware that the first week or two of school may see some variations in pickup and drop-off times as drivers adjust to new schedules and stops. The district encourages students to be at their designated bus stop at least ten minutes before the scheduled arrival time.
