



January's theme of concede challenges us as believers to draw near to Christ and reflect His love for others. In Matthew 5:38-40, Jesus teaches a radical approach to forgiveness and response to injustice, calling His followers to go beyond the natural human instinct for retaliation. To "concede" in this context means to yield to God's higher authority, acknowledging His truth over our own desire for revenge. This act of concession becomes a separation point between believers and the world. While the world often responds to offense with anger and aggression, as followers of Christ we are called to respond with extraordinary kindness, generosity, and humility. By resisting the urge to retaliate and seek revenge, we reflect the character of Christ and entrust ourselves to God's guidance. As we seek His will with humble hearts, God leads us in how to navigate relationships with others, showing us how to extend grace and forgiveness, even when it feels difficult or impossible. In these moments, we are not just surrendering our right for what we desire as justice, but yielding to God's truth, allowing His love to shine through us and testify to a broken world. We are all sinners in need of salvation and surrender to His will.





Welcome to 2025! Happy New Year! This season often brings fresh opportunities for self-reflection, renewed goals, and personal growth. One guiding concept for our efforts is "conceding," not simply giving up, but yielding to God's ways instead of clinging to our own. In Matthew 5:38 - 41, Jesus teaches, "You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' But I say to you, Do not resist the one who is evil. But if anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to him the other also. And if anyone would sue you and take your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone forces you to go one mile, go with him two miles." This passage reminds us how "conceding" in conflict or misunderstanding can help us live out our faith more fully.

As parents, we see daily challenges where children struggle with fairness, retaliation, or standing their ground with respect. Yet the principle of conceding encourages us to go the extra mile, not letting others walk over us, but allowing God's grace to shape our responses. By surrendering our instinct for immediate justice, we choose to trust God's will instead.

This year, let's talk with our children about conceding. Ask what "turning the other cheek" might look like in classrooms, on the playground, or with siblings. Show them how it's possible to stand up for what is right while maintaining a spirit of mercy. Consider praying each morning as a family, inviting God to guide you through unexpected frustrations or conflicts. Emphasize that conceding isn't weakness, but a way to follow Jesus's example of humility and sacrificial love.

I am excited to see how these conversations about conceding will shape our students and our community throughout this new year.
