#### Pastor's Corner

Do you ever feel as if God should not answer your prayers because you are unworthy? Do you feel that God could never love a person who has done the things you have done? I have been there and it is painful. You need Abba to move in your life. You need His help, but who are you to request these things from The Most High God?

As we approach the time of year that is observed as the season of Lent, we recognize Yeshua's sacrifice on the cross. Had Jesus not begun teaching at twelve, hit the pavement to show the world how we can be saved and reborn, suffered persecution and died a painful execution on an old rugged cross, you and I would be doomed to eternal death and separation from our Creator and the Lover of our souls. I don't ever want to imagine that existence and we don't have to because of Yeshua's sacrifice.

From the very beginning, humanity has been in need of salvation. The fall of Adam and Eve introduced sin into the world, creating a separation between God and mankind (Romans 3:23). No amount of human effort, good works, or religious rituals could bridge the gap. Sin demanded payment and the penalty was death (Romans 6:23). But Yahweh in hls infinite love, mercy and wisdom provided a way- a Savior who would redeem and restore what was lost.

One of the most beautiful truths about salvation is that it is a gift. Ephesians 2:8-9 reminds us, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast." Salvation cannot be earned; it is freely given by God through faith in Jesus Christ.

Never feel that you have done too much to escape the love of God. As heirs of salvation, it is Jesus' blood that washes us clean and makes us unblemished before God the Father. When we whole-heartedly repent, God will always right our wrongs. As we celebrate Lent, let us not only rejoice in Yeshua's resurrection, but also share the message of salvation with the world. Jesus is alive and because He lives, we can face tomorrow with confidence and faith.

This year we began lent on March 5, 2025. Lent is a special time of prayer, repentance, sacrifice and good works in preparation for Easter. Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word Lenten, which means, "Spring." Historically, Lent was a time for converts to fast and prepare for baptism and penance. However, in contemporary times, the emphasis has transitioned from baptism to the passion and death of Christ. Thus, Lent has become a time of penance for all Christians.

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Lent which lasts for 40 days, excluding Sundays. Sundays are omitted because they are considered little Easters. On this day, the remorseful spirit of Lent should be balanced with great expectation and celebration of the Resurrection. As we continue the season of Lent, we anticipate the great and marvelous things God will do in our midst.

#### The Purpose of Fasting

The purpose of the fast is for spiritual renewal, grounding and preparation for the future.

Because we are encouraging the entire Red Oak congregation to participate (if you are able), two types of fasts are outlined below from which you may choose.

#### Wesleyan Fast

This fast consists of going without solid food after the evening meal each Thursday until mid-afternoon (about 3:00 PM) each Friday. (Those who wish can also use the same practice for a Wednesday fast, as did those in the Ancient Church.) This time of fasting is focused in prayer to "spread the good news of Christ Jesus in a world that so desperately needs healing, hope and salvation."

#### The Daniel Fast

Eat only healthy foods such as beans, fruit, and vegetables. Some of the foods to exclude are meats, sweets, and other high fat substances. It is imperative to spend time in prayer and meditation on the word of God. Fasting will not be as successful otherwise.



March: A Time for Colorectal Cancer Awareness in Our Community

As we step into March—National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month—we are reminded that our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit. In our journey of faith, it is essential that we honor this gift by taking care of our health. This month, we will focus on colorectal cancer, a disease that has a disproportionately high impact on the Black community, and why proactive care and early screening are vital for each one of us.

Studies have shown that African Americans face a higher risk of developing colorectal cancer understanding the mass tree regions with several challenges:

**Increased Incidence and Mortality:** Research indicates that Black men and women are more likely to be diagnosed at later stages of colorectal cancer, which often leads to poorer outcomes.

**Barriers to Care:** Factors such as limited access to healthcare, socioeconomic disparities, and a lack of targeted public health messaging can delay diagnosis and treatment.

#### The Importance of Early Screening

One of the most powerful tools we have in the fight against colorectal cancer is early detection. Screening saves lives by identifying precancerous polyps and early-stage cancers when treatment is most effective. Here's what every member of our community should know:

**When to Begin:** While general guidelines recommend that adults start regular screenings at age 45, those with a family history or other risk factors might need to begin even earlier. Speak with your doctor to determine the best time for you.

**Screening Methods:** There are several methods for screening, including colonoscopy, stool tests, and sigmoidoscopy. Your healthcare provider can help decide which option is best for you.

**Peace of Mind:** Early screening can reduce your risk of dying from colorectal cancer by up to 60%. This simple act of care not only preserves your health but also strengthens our community

#### **Embracing a Lifestyle of Wellness**

Beyond screenings, a lifestyle that promotes wellness is a blessing we can all share. Consider these steps as part of your journey toward better health:

**Healthy Diet:** Incorporate plenty of fruits, vegetables, whole grains, and lean proteins into your diet. A diet rich in fiber can help protect your colon.

**Regular Exercise:** Staying active can help maintain a healthy weight and reduce your risk of many diseases, including colorectal cancer.

**Avoid Tobacco and Limit Alcohol:** These substances can increase the risk of many cancers. Reducing or eliminating them from your life is a step toward a healthier you.

**Stay Informed:** Knowledge is power. Keep up with regular check-ups and educate yourself on the latest health recommendations

As we reflect on our spiritual journey this March, let us also commit to taking tangible steps toward our physical well-being. Encourage your loved ones to get screened, embrace a healthier lifestyle, and support community health initiatives.
