

We aim to open students' eyes to the many pathways out therefrom college to trade school to the workforce- and help them choose and pursue one that fits them best, so they can move into the real world with confidence.

This impact report highlights our work in three crucial areas:

### Equity & Access:

Talent is universal but opportunity is not. Though resources and programs exist to help students prepare for their future, many students are not participating in them due to access and opportunity gaps, leaving them ill-prepared to navigate their next step after high school.

We created high-tech Future Centers onsite at all partner high schools that provide year-round college and career readiness programs, services, and events. Our full-time presence on campus ensures equitable access to and participation in foundational opportunities before graduation so that no student is left behind.

### Transitions:

Far too many high school students are transitioning into the adult world without a clear plan for their future or the essential skills required to thrive in the 21st-century workforce.

Through various programs, resources, and opportunities, we show students all their options after graduation and connect them with the support, experiences, and resources they need to choose and pursue the best path for them.

### Cross Sector Collaboration:

Collaboration across various sectors is critical to help students see what is possible and prepare for their futures- we can't do this crucial work alone.

We unite school districts, nonprofits, businesses, and postsecondary education and training programs to collaboratively and creatively fill opportunity gaps and prepare students for the workforce.

**Promise Pathways** (now called Focused Futures) helps the most vulnerable students envision a promising future, find their paths, and develop the skills and confidence necessary to transition to their next step after graduation.

Through 1:1 coaching, career exploration and readiness activities, financial aid support, and visits to local businesses and post-secondary training/education institutes, more students choose and pursue post-secondary training/education programs as their best next step.

We piloted our program at Twin Oaks High School, San Marcos Unified School District's alternative high school that serves students at risk of not graduating on time. Due to the program's success, we are expanding it to serve 50 students at each of our partner high schools.

### **Program Services**



I liked having someone take a special interest in my future. We always talk about how I'm feeling about life after high school and at first, my word was panic. After being in this program and meeting with my career coach, the word I'd use is possibilities. -Gloria S.

of participants graduated with a career plan

76% applied to post-secondary training/education programs and completed the FAFSA. Over half of these students said they would not have considered post-secondary training/education had they not secured financial aid.

decided to join the workforce; nearly 50% of these students applied for jobs at companies offering benefits and career advancement potential.

2% enlisted in the military

These students face such significant challenges in their personal lives that they are in survival mode; school is not a priority. Many work to help support their families, some lack stable housing, and others deal with other personal issues.



**Promise 360** (now called Xcelerate) aims to show non-college-bound students all their career options and shift them towards more economically secure careers aligned with their strengths and interests. Students gain critical career insights through trips to apprenticeship programs, vocational and technical schools, and Career Expeditions to local companies offering higher-paying entry-level jobs with benefits and advancement potential.

### FUND YOUR FUTURE

One of the many barriers for students who wish to continue their education beyond high school is knowledge of and access to financial aid. The new AB 469 in California requires all high school seniors to complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or California Dream Act Application (CADAA). However, no additional resources were given to provide support to students and families. Identifying this as a great need, we vigorously pursued and received grant funding to staff Financial Aid Coaches at each of our Future Centers. Along with the counseling teams, our Financial Aid Coaches helped students understand their financial aid options, assisted them through the application process, and walked them through award letter reviews so students could make the best financial decision for their next steps. We're so proud of this collaborative effort because it opened more doors and opportunities for students beyond high school.

Connect to Careers provides students with exposure to the multitude of career opportunities that exist, as well as connects them with local professionals in small group settings to learn about careers and industries, build professional skills, and gain real-world experience.

Connect to Careers allowed me to meet with many professionals and learn about the variety of career paths available. More so, it gave me the reassurance that I would be able to find a job that would suit my lifestyle and interests. One professional detailed how she had made her career in real estate. I was amazed as I had never gotten the opportunity to learn about the management or active selling of a space that accompanies the foundation of a real estate business. She continued to tell me about the first town she had ever overseen and built. Surprisingly enough, it was the town I currently reside in: San Elijo Hills! It was a mind-boggling experience and allowed me to see future options for where and what I could do for work. 
