While watching the 2019 Women's U.S. Open earlier this school year, I witnessed an outstanding display of sportsmanship by 21-year-old Naomi Osaka, who hugged and consoled her 15-year-old opponent, Cori Gauff, after defeating her in the third round of the event. She hugged her and then went one step further by inviting her to do the post-match interview with her. I turned the channel after witnessing this emotional exchange between the two competitors only to watch story after story about countless individuals preparing to come to the aid of communities caught in the path of Hurricane Dorian.

In our own home state of New Mexico, I have seen signs in yards across our communities that read, "El Paso Strong" and have witnessed young kids throughout the state raising money for those struck by the tragedy that befell our neighbor to the South. It warms my heart to know that so many members of the New Mexico baseball community supported El Paso by volunteering their time and resources to facilitate a baseball clinic in the area. I have seen Boy Scouts and Girls Scouts of New Mexico performing various acts of community service. I recently pulled up to a stop light and saw a young adult handing a homeless person a bag full of toiletries and food. I saw a teenager mowing an elderly person's yard just because

it is the right thing to do. All of these beautiful acts of kindness occurred within a two-day period and those were only the ones I personally saw.

Every day, we witness humanity at its finest. Even though there are times when the negative headlines seem overwhelming, we still see displays of compassion and kindheartedness all around us. We know there is so much goodness in our schools and our communities and we feel our faith restored when these acts hit close to home.

So, it makes me wonder - why do we allow "winning and losing" to become the focal point in athletics? Why does a "win at all costs" attitude seem so prevalent? Why do acts of poor sportsmanship sometimes overshadow all of the good that we know exists in interscholastic athletics? For every one bad event, we know there are hundreds, or even thousands, of great things going on with our student-athletes. Why can't we look past the scoreboard to see and remember the true meaning of sports?

Don't get me wrong. I am the most competitive person there is. Even at my "old" age, I refuse to lose. But, as we get older, we see that there are such bigger and more important things that we gain from competition and that we gain through participation in interscholastic activities. We realize that truly "winning" is not about the score. For educators, it is about teaching our students that they are playing a game and that, at the end of the day, the end result of learning the traits of responsibility, integrity, respect, teamwork, dedication, perseverance and commitment are far more important than a blue trophy.

The importance of interscholastic athletics is really about winning in the game of life. It is about producing citizens who are capable of being compassionate to those in need, who understand that life is bigger than a game and who truly know that true winners are those who care about others and who live a life of being trustworthy, honest and respectful.

There are so many daily lessons that are learned through participating in sports and activities and we see these lessons being lived out around us every day. It goes back to role models in professional sports. It goes back to volunteerism and kindness to communities suffering tragedies and disasters. It goes back to being service-oriented within our communities. It goes back to doing the right thing, even when no one is looking. In the words of football coach, Lou Holtz, "I follow three rules: Do the right thing, do the best you can, and always show people you care." This is the true recipe for being winners in the game of life.

Legend of the Course

Ben Ortega, Taos High School, 1996-99


From crossing the finish line to successfully defending others in court, Ben Ortega has been a success in many aspects of his life. After winning state titles and setting records on the track, Ortega is now an attorney in the state of New Mexico. The New Mexico Activities Association would like to recognize Ben Ortega as a Legend of the Course in Cross Country.

Ortega was born in Taos, New Mexico and grew up in the village of Arroyo Seco. "My father was a lumberjack; in that business during its peak," said Ben. "The area I lived in was very agricultural and rural," he added. "I own that house today."

When horses weren't pulling timber for the Ortega family, it was Ben who would carry fuel up and down the mountain for his father. It was his stamina and love for the outdoors which proved to be helpful with his running career. "My father used to be a skier for UNM and my job as a kid was to carry his supplies around the mountain," recalled Ben. "We're talking 10,000 feet!"

Ben first got into running track as a sophomore in high school when he was looking for a sport in which he might be able to excel. "I knew I had natural endurance," said Ortega. Although Ben was an overnight success, his hard work and determination helped build him into one of the top runners in the region. His sophomore season at Taos High School, he placed 80th at the state meet. By his junior year in 1998, he won his first state cross country championship in a time of 16:52. "If there was one thing I could do well, and probably the only thing I can do well, is to work at something over time," he said. "I practiced my running skills all summer. I ran almost every day. Being able to focus on it during the offseason, that's what made the difference." Ortega would repeat his success the following year in 1999 and win the state cross country championship his senior season in high school. Ortega also excelled at distance running on the track. He set the school record in the 3,200m run at the 1999 state track meet as a junior and would win the event his senior season. He also holds the school record in the 1,600m run.

Ortega then went on to run for the University of New Mexico. During his time as a Lobo, Ortega won a Mountain West Conference Championship in the 5,000m (indoor) and 10,000m (outdoor) events. He was named second



team All-Mountain West and competed in 10K the NCAA Outdoor Championships as a sophomore. In 2005, Ortega earned the Mountain West Conference Sportsmanship Award, the first ever for a UNM male athlete. Ortega went on to earn a law degree from the University of New Mexico.

Currently, Ortega practices law providing legal representation in New Mexico for a variety of different issues. He has a 6-year old son, Wyatt, and Ben runs for fitness. "If you practice law the way I do, it will make you go crazy unless you stay in shape and maintain your health."

Here is more of our conversation with Ben Ortega:

What was the difference between your state titles your junior and senior seasons in high school?

They were two completely different seasons. I was still an unknown going into my junior season and had to knock off the state champ, Darvin Valdo from Grants. He was one hell of a runner. We encountered each other at a meet in Santa Fe. At the time, he was knocking off everyone he came across. He came into Santa Fe and I wanted to learn everything I could about him. So, I challenged him and he could not outsprint me at the end of the race. I knew he would come up with a different game plan at state, but I held on like the same way I did three weeks before.

My senior year was more injury problematic. I pushed myself too hard and I wasn't able to get in shape and advance much that season. My senior year was more of a game of, 'Can I get fit enough and get smart enough to win this championship again?' It was a completely different challenge, but the same result.

What is your best memory of running in high school?

The best memory I have was after winning the state championship in 1998 and coming back home to Taos. The community was ecstatic about it. I received an incredible outpouring of support. The community never had something like that. The small-town high school vibe was great, and celebrating athletic success to inspire more success gave them something to feel good about. That was my favorite.

Why choose UNM?

I found out that I could use cross country to get a college scholarship. I wasn't going to go to college unless I did something like that. I knew getting a top-notch education would lead to a great future for me. It boiled down to the best value. The lottery scholarship just came out, which would supplement my athletic scholarship. UNM was the best combination of a quality education and good exposure to competitors. I had been a Lobo fan since I was a kid.

I ran with coach Matt Henry and his brother Mark - they're class acts. Matt (UNM's distance coach) treated me really well and taught me about running and life. I had a great experience in college. I found out running wasn't going to go beyond that. I couldn't make a living doing that, so I got more focused on academics and shifted my focus to try and get into law school, which took some work.

Why pursue a degree in law?

I wanted to be able to have a job that I could help people


who were in the worst situations of their lives. I thought about becoming a medical doctor or a lawyer. I decided on law because you can make a positive impact on the individual level and help everybody by helping change laws.

What did you do to win the Mountain West Sportsmanship Award?

A guy I used to compete against, from BYU, collapsed during my last conference championship in indoor track and I went and picked him up. I didn't expect to get an award for that.

What advice do you have for other student-athletes?

My advice is no matter what level you're at, long distance running can help you build skills that will be monumental down the road. Being able to work hard has led me to winning things I could lose. If you work hard and you're dedicated, you can go further than you thought and that will translate to college and a career. New Mexico has incredible cross-country athletes and the sport could provide a path to a good education and get them out of a potentially difficult situation. It did that for me and can do it for others around New Mexico.





2018 State Championship Recap

Cleveland Storm Wins 2018 Boys' 5A Cross Country Title



The Cleveland Storm returned to the victory stand for the second straight year at the 2018 Laguna Burger State Cross Country Championships. This marked the Storm's fourth blue trophy in school history; the first came in 2011.

As a team, Cleveland tallied 62 points with all five scoring runners finishing in the top-20. Clovis finished second with 91 points, followed by Albuquerque High (127), Rio Rancho (134) and Volcano Vista (145) rounding out the top-5.


Individually, junior Yonas Haile of Cleveland was crowned the 2018 individual champion, crossing the finish line in a time of 15:27.35, repeating as state champion. Haile finished the race almost 20 seconds ahead of his closest competitor. He won the event in 2017 and finished in the top-5 in 2016.

"I'm happy I was able to get my second straight championship," said Haile moments after crossing the finish line. "I've really been looking forward to this."

Patrick Colborn of Hobbs placed second, in a time of 16:09.85, followed by Stevie Salas of La Cueva, who crossed the finish line in a time of 16:12.35. Jerrick Maldonado of Clovis (16:19.45) and Triston Charles of Peidra Vista (16:25.55) completed the top-5.

Other medalists included Simon Baca (Albuquerque High), Sean Dwyer (Eldorado), Cody Smith (Rio Rancho), Walker Quale (Albuquerque High) and Daniel Beam (Rio Rancho).

Hilltoppers Win 4A Boys' Blue Trophy



The 2018 Laguna Burger Boys' State Cross Country Championships in Class 4A saw the Los Alamos Hilltoppers atop the podium for the first time since 2014, capturing their seventh blue trophy in the school history. The Hilltoppers managed 42 points, with three runners finishing in the top-5.

As a team, Los Alamos finished seven points ahead of second place finisher Albuquerque Academy (49). Miyamura took third place (126), as Kirtland Central (144) and Hope Christian (168) rounded out the top-5.

Senior Kashon Harrison of Kirtland Central captured the individual state title for the second straight year, crossing the finish line in a time of 15:27.35, followed by Rafael Sanchez of Los Alamos, who placed second in a time of 16:06.55. Harrison ran the fastest time of the day and best on the course since 2012.

"It's fun to win state," Harrison said following his second straight title. "It's a lot of hard work, but if you're mentally prepared for a race you can do whatever you want."

Duncan Fuehne of Los Alamos placed third, finishing in a time of 16:07.90. Additional medalists included Ty McCray (Miyamura), Steven Strevell (Los Alamos), Justin Hickey (Albuquerque Academy), Oliver Pilon (Albuquerque Academy), John Hall (Pojoaque Valley), Skyler Forman (Albuquerque Academy) and Eric Scharton (Hope Christian).



2018 State Championship Recap

Zuni Boys Win 17th State Title



The Zuni Thunderbirds captured the boys' 3A division, winning their 17th blue trophy in school history at the 2018 Laguna Burger State Cross Country Championships. It was Zuni's first title for the boys' team since 2015.

By race's end, the Thunderbirds had tallied 40 points as a team, winning the title by nine points over second place finisher Santa Fe Indian School (49). Cottonwood Classical finished third with 118 points, followed by Cuba (136) and Navajo Prep (147).

Sandia Prep's Epherem Zerai was crowned the state individual champion, crossing the finish line 14 seconds before the closest competitor, with a time of 16:23.85. Deshawn Goodwin of Zuni was second in a time of 16:37.00.

"I'm so happy," said Zerai immediately following the race. "My grandmother recently passed away and I had her in my mind and I knew I had to work hard for her."

Christopher Humetewa (16:42.45) of Santa Fe Indian School finished third, as Justin Howey of Cottonwood Classical finished fourth (16:44.15), followed by Joshua Valdez of Robertson (17:02.50), rounding out the top-5.

Other medalists included Jacy Edaakie of (Zuni), Isaiah Paiz (West Las Vegas), Isaiah Velasquez (Santa Fe Indian School), Dallen Plummer (Santa Fe Indian) and Marcus Concho (Santa Fe Indian School).

Navajo Pine Wins Seventh Boys' State Title in School History



Navajo Pine hoisted the blue trophy at the 2018 Laguna Burger State Cross Country Championships, winning their seventh state title in school history and repeating as state champions from 2017.

The Warriors recorded the best team score of any classification on the day, scoring 31 points, with five scoring runners finishing in the top-15. In fact, Navajo Pine had three finish in the top-5.

Pecos, who finished first in the 2017 state championships in the 3A Classification, finished second with a team score of 49.

ATC (102), Cloudcroft (135) and Mora (211) rounded out the top-5 in the team competition.

Galvin Curley of Navajo Pine captured the individual title, with a time of 16:14.15, after finishing second in 2017. Teammate Michael Marshall was second in a time of 16:23.55, followed by Hagerman's Martin Flores (16:29.85), Navajo Pine's Dominique Clichee (16:50.25) and Isaiah Armijo of Pecos (17:01.05).

"It started off fast and that's what I liked about it," said Curley of the pace. "Every race I start off fast so I knew it was going to be my race. When I got up on the hill, I kind of burned out a little but as soon as a got onto the grass something came over me and I thought about how hard I worked over the summer and I took it from there."

Other medalists included Max Presler (Cloudcroft), Devin Gonzales (Pecos), Justin Madalena (Jemez Valley), Angel Varela (Pecos) and Gilbert Valdez (Penasco).



2018 State Championship Recap

Eldorado Wins 5A Girls' Cross Country Title



The Eldorado Eagles captured the blue trophy for the first time since 2012 at the 2018 Laguna Burger State Cross Country Championships, winning by nine points over second place finisher Cleveland. It was the sixth state cross country title for the girls' program in school history.

The Eagles won the 2018 championship over the Storm, scoring 57 points, compared to Cleveland's 65 points.

Albuquerque High (96), Rio Rancho (134) and La Cueva (136) rounded out the top-5 teams.

Eldorado's Jasmine Turtle-Morale of Eldorado won the individual title after finishing second in 2017, crossing the finish line in a time of 18:22.45, almost 25 seconds in front of the closest competitor.

"The first mile, I was going to take it a little slower, but I didn't," explained Turtle-Morales. "On the hill, I ran a little faster and then down-hill I opened my legs up and just went. I looked back one time and realized I need to open it up a little more and so I did. I'm really surprised I'm a state champ. I really wanted this and finally accomplished my goal."

Leah Futey of Cleveland placed second overall, with a time of 18:47.50, followed by Reilly McClanahan of Eldorado (19:08.30) and Alisa Marez-Fishbein of Albuquerque High (19:19.40) going third and fourth respectively. Olivia Salter of Sandia (19:25.65) rounded the top-5.

Other medalists included Brynn Esplin (La Cueva), Mari Gonzales (Cleveland), Reina Paredes (Rio Rancho), Isa Gonzales (Cleveland) and Lila Nezar (Volcano Vista).

Albuquerque Academy Wins Fourth Girls' Cross Country Championship



The Albuquerque Academy Chargers won the 2018 Laguna Burger 4A Girls' State Cross Country Championships, marking their fifth state title with 31 points. It was the third straight title for Albuquerque Academy and the third under head coach Adam Kedge.

The Chargers' 4A rival, Los Alamos, placed second as a team with 47 points, followed by Hope Christian (119), Kirtland Central (129) and Taos (132).

Zoe Hunter of Albuquerque Academy was the individual champion, crossing the finish line in a time of 18:56.60. Hunter placed third in 2017.

"It felt like I was pushed the entire time," said Hunter of the battle with Valdez. "I started out pretty fast because that's what I normally like to do. Norissa and I were side by side almost the entire race. It was good to have someone there that you push them and they push you. It was a lot of fun."


