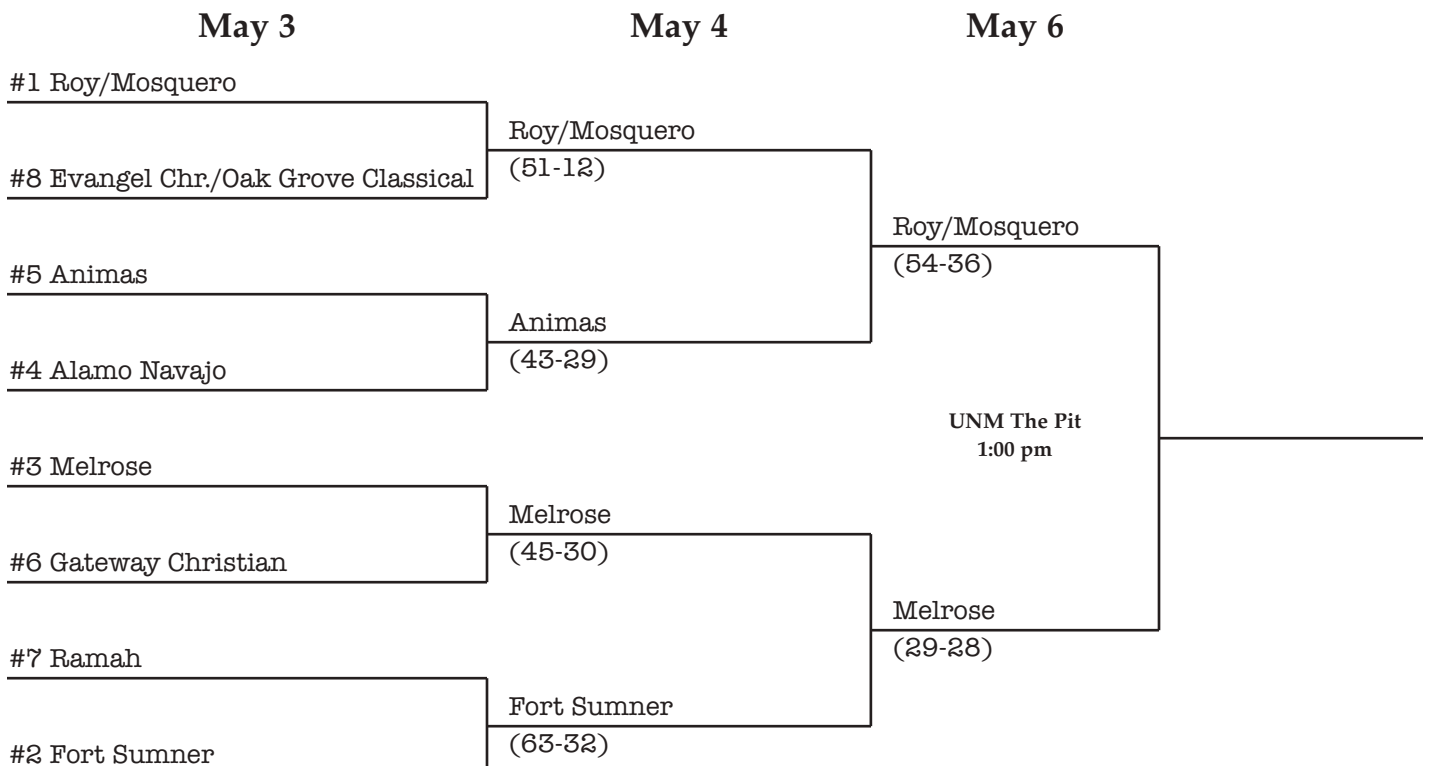




# A Boys State Championship Bracket

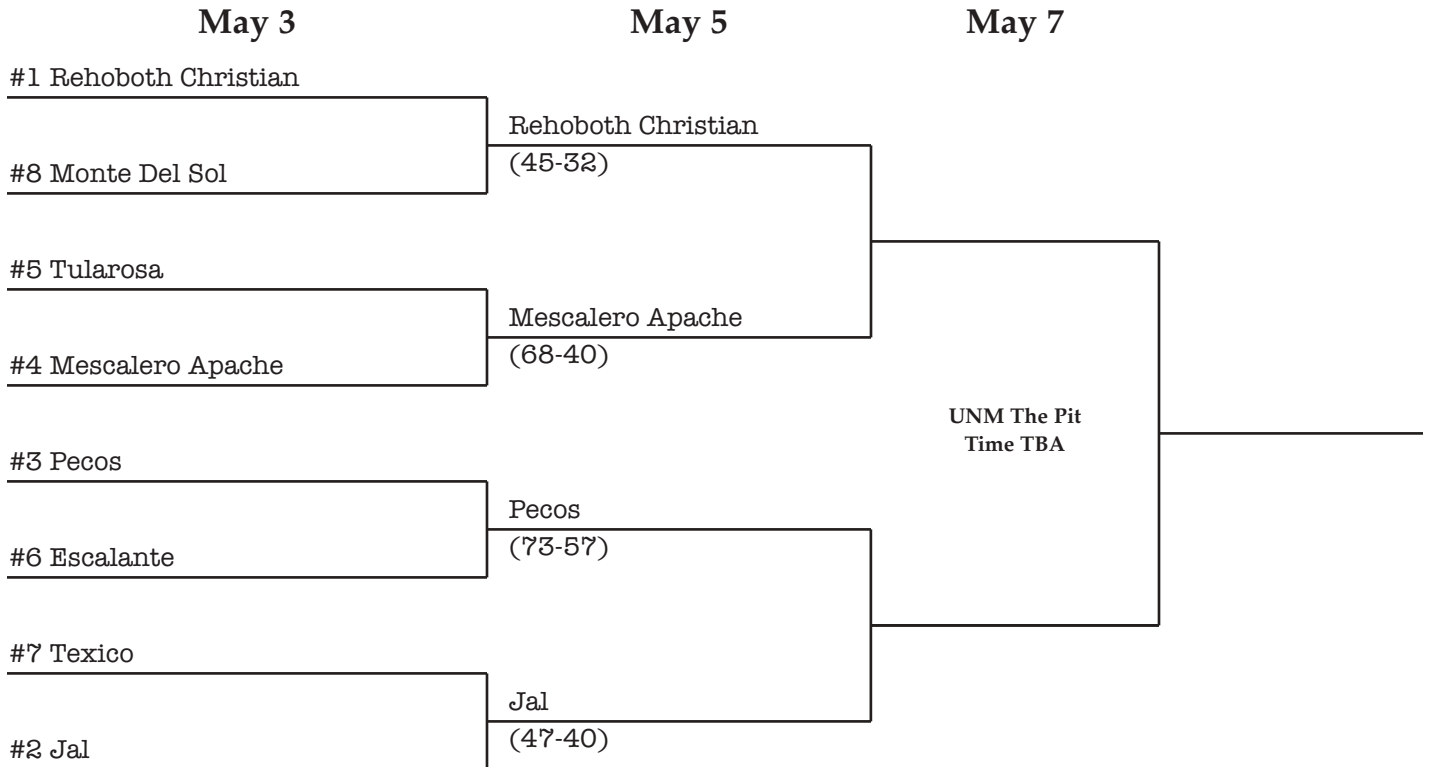

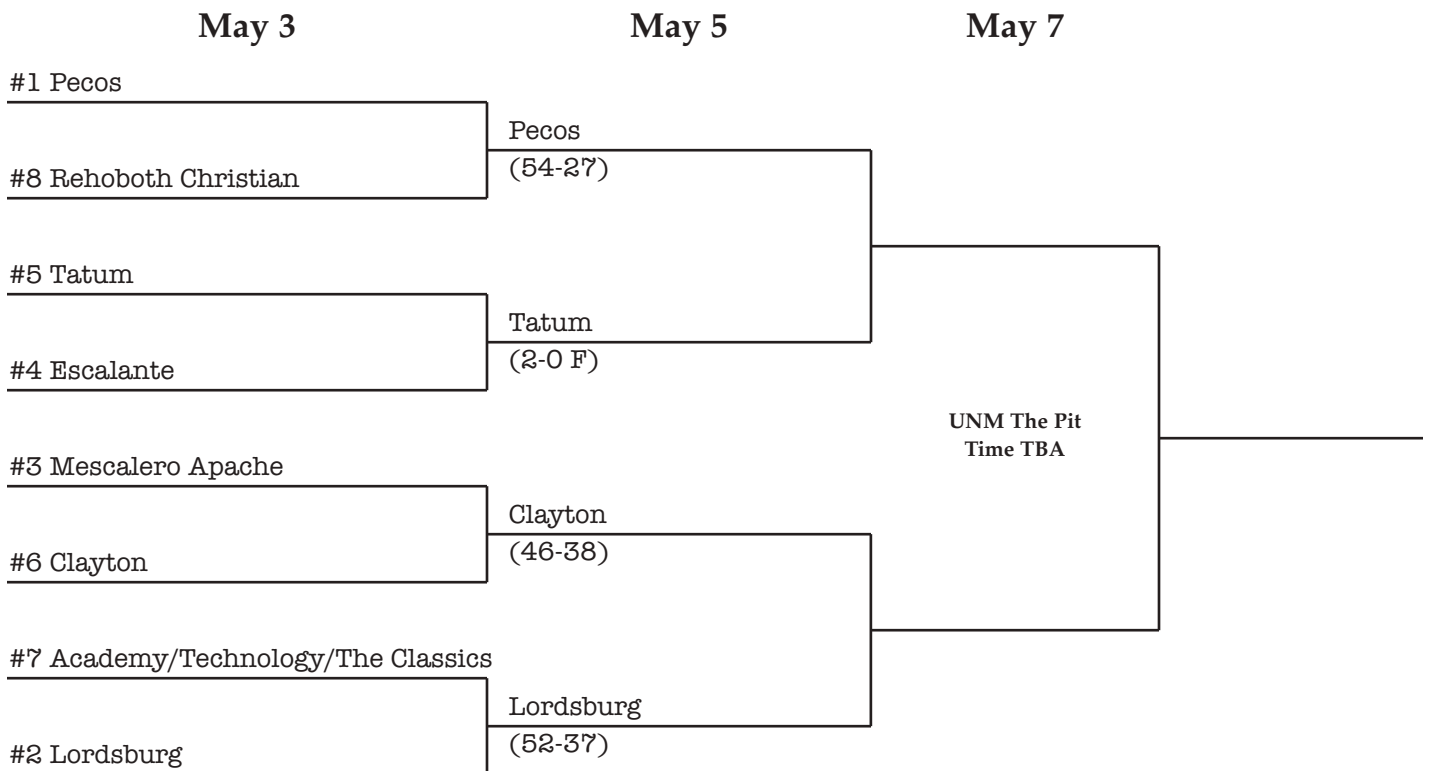

## Looking Back on March 2020: Getting the Call to Hold a State Basketball Tournament Without Fans



It was Wednesday, March 11. The quarterfinals of the 2020 State Basketball Championships were underway at Dreamstyle Arena The Pit in Albuquerque, as well as the Santa Ana Star Center in Rio Rancho. Thousands of fans filled both arenas to watch the most popular annual sporting event in the state of New Mexico.

Everything appeared to be going along as planned, until one phone call turned out to be the first step to the end of high school sports for the remainder of the year.

"I received a phone call around noon or one o'clock," said New Mexico Activities Association Director Sally Marquez. "The phone call came from the governor's office that we had our first case of COVID in New Mexico."

COVID-19 is an infectious disease caused by the most recently discovered coronavirus. The world was still learning about this new illness that would eventually affect hundreds of thousands of people in the country.

"At that point, New York was a hot spot for coronavirus and you'd heard what was happening in other states and we were lucky that it hadn't hit New Mexico yet," said Marquez. "When the governor's office called, I thought 'oh no, we're going to be shut down' because some of the other states on the east coast were being shut down. At that point, the governor was going to allow us to continue because we had already started our state basketball tournament. We were not going to have to shut down or get rid of fans, at that point. They just wanted us to be aware of what had taken place and continue with precautions."

That was early afternoon on Wednesday.

But things would quickly change.

"I remember coming down the ramp after that phone call and I was stressed a little bit, but I realized we were going to be ok," recalled Marquez. "We just needed to get through the tournament and not alarm everybody."

Within the next hour, the NMAA Executive Director received another call from the governor's office. On that call they said, 'Sally, we might have to shut down'.

Thursday, March 12 would look a lot different.

**The following is a one-on-one interview with NMAA Executive Director Sally Marquez about the week that high school sports came to an abrupt stop for the rest of the year.**

**Question: When did the call come where they told you that they were going to shut you down?**

I would say we probably started having that conversation probably somewhere around 3 or 4 in the afternoon. As we were having that conversation, I was still very hopeful that we were okay and might not have to shut down the entire tournament. I was talking to the governor's office and also talking to Dr. Stewart, the Secretary of Education. All three of us were in communication back and forth. Coronavirus was so new. How do you handle the mass gatherings? How are you going to handle COVID-19 in the state of New Mexico? So, I think all three of us were trying to figure this out. Lieutenant Governor Howie Morales was also involved and we were all asking what do you do. It was probably about 5 o'clock when I did get the word when they said, 'Sally, we're going to probably have to shut you down.' It just went to a standstill.



We were still in the middle of playing. I mean, I was at the top of the ramp in this small tiny storage room, the games are going on, nobody knows what's happening, and I'm in this corner on my phone talking to these people. I remember sitting in this empty locker, just sitting there talking with different people, trying to make decisions. I think it's about five or six o'clock, going back and forth when they said 'Sally, you're not going to have fans; we're going to allow you continue, but you cannot have fans.' At that point, I'm wondering how is that going to work? So, I would say, the next two to three hours, they said, 'okay you can have 100 fans.' How are we going to make 100 fans work? Who's going to get to come into the Pit? How are they going to decide the team makeup and how many teams we can have in the facility? We were also dealing with Santa Ana Star Center, as well. So, it was finally given to me about 6 o'clock, I would say, I'm just kind of guesstimating, when they said, 'You can have 100 in the facility'. When you're talking about a hundred, keep in mind, we have 20 on each basketball team and you have two teams on the floor and two up in the locker room; there's 80 people right there. The governor's office was asking me, 'Well, can you house the two teams that are about ready to play at Albuquerque High, or Cleveland High School for Santa Ana, let them warm up there, and then bus them over to the arena once the other game is done?' Then we start talking about the Davalos Center to keep the teams before they play, but in their eyes the Davalos was the same facility as the Pit; even though it was two separate buildings, they were still connected to each other. So, we could not even put them in the Davalos Center to make it just two teams. Then you start adding maybe a little bit of parents or some media, we couldn't figure out how the hundred was going to work. It would take about another two to three hours to figure out how we are going to make one hundred work and I remember saying since about three or four o'clock that 'I am not going down the Pit ramp because everybody's going to know something is going on since I haven't shown my face in a long time.' So, I holed up for about 6-8 hours in that one room.

**Q: What was going through your mind at that point?**

You have to become emotionless, I guess that's the word. You have to become a little bit emotionless because you've got to put on the hat, like 'okay, now we are going to make this work'. These are the orders that are coming down from the governor's office and I respect the orders, and I will always respect the orders. So, now my job is to figure out how are we going to make this work, how are we going to communicate this, and the most

important thing is how are we going to tell kids that it's going to be okay and make sure that they are safe. So, yeah, there wasn't anger, there wasn't franticness, there was just 'okay let's put the hat on and let's make this happen'. That's what we did and that's how we made it work.

I had to give a list to the governor's office and the Secretary of Education as to who was going to be in the facility. Four teams, one scorekeeper, clock operator, all the essential workers. We sent most of our staff home in order to make the numbers work. We also had to figure out where to keep the officials. So, what we did is keep the officials at another site so we wouldn't have to count them in the building for that game and then we would shuttle them over when it was time for them to officiate. I think the hardest thing was trying to figure out how are we going to deal with the number of media. I couldn't decide that 'this media' can come in and 'this one' can't. I did not want to be that person to make that decision as to which media could stay and which ones couldn't in order to stay within the hundred-person limit. Ultimately, that decision was put in the hands of the New Mexico Broadcasters Association; but the first day, I said there would be no media. I look back on that and maybe I should have gone to the Broadcasters Association and the head of the print media and said, 'let's figure this out'. But we didn't have that time to turn that around at all. So, it was on Thursday, that first day without fans, when we got some complaints because the media wasn't involved. Then the governor's office called and asked 'How can we get media in?' and they did extend that number to, I think it was, 104 in order to allow a print and a TV member from each team into the facility. Then we left it in the Broadcaster's hands to make the decision as to which media outlet was going to be allowed into each game.

**Q: What was it like walking into the Pit that next morning knowing basketball was going to be played, but without any fans?**

I think I was more anxious wondering if everybody got the word there would be no fans. From 10 o'clock at night on Wednesday until 11, I had staff members calling teams to let them know that no fans were going to be able to come and the games would be streamed on the NFHS network. That was first and foremost, to make sure we got the word out in time for there not to be a line of fans at the Pit wanting to get in and buy tickets. We did meet with UNM to help with the process.

UNM was wonderful in this whole entire thing! They were right beside us making it work and they made sure we had security out there, and that the police were still out there, to make sure people were not able to access the building from the outside and be on hand in case they had to turn cars away. But they really didn't have to turn cars away because of our communication. I think the one thing I was most proud of was getting the communication out there. It wasn't the message they wanted to hear, but we communicated it in a way to the public where we didn't have the fans outside picketing, screaming and yelling and trying to get in. We were just going to have to continue moving forward.

**Q: At what point did you realize, the NMAA can pull this off?**

You know, my personality is 'give me a problem and we will pull it off'. I've never doubted myself or my team around me that we couldn't pull it off. So, even when the governor's office told us we couldn't have fans, I knew we could figure out a way to make this happen. Maybe it's my math background, but I look at a problem like a puzzle and you just have to make the pieces fit.



**Q: What was the most challenging and difficult part of that puzzle?**

I think the most difficult part was, as a parent and as a mom, knowing that parents were not going to be able to see their kids. I think that was probably the most difficult. Sure, you're going to have streaming games, but it is not the same as watching your kid play. So, I think that probably was the most gut-wrenching part of it. I knew the kids were going to be okay, the coaches could handle it, the officials would be okay, but that was probably the hardest part emotionally for me, the parents not being able to see their kids, especially the senior parents.

**Q: You held a press conference that first night to announce to everyone there would be no fans. What do you recall about walking up to that podium to deliver that message for the first time? What was going through your mind?**

An hour before the press conference, I told the governor's office 'I need a statement from the governor. I mean, if you guys are telling me I have to shut down, I need to be able to go in front of this media right now and tell everybody this is coming from the governor's office.' Nobody really understood, at that point. We haven't had a situation like this in New Mexico. They did send me a statement and I went in there and made sure I had it in my hand before I got in front of everybody to let them know what was going on.

**Q: What did you hear from the kids and coaches after the decision? What was their reaction?**

So, it's two-fold. At that time, they were thanking us for just allowing them to play. We did get a lot of thank you's. But now that

once people look back and realize what we pulled off, now that we know what COVID is, it's not new to them, they understand where we are in our state. Several months later, I think looking back on it, it's the 'Wow!', it's the wow factor that we were just able to play and we pulled this off. People say, 'Thank you guys, thank you for giving our kids the opportunity'. We were the last ones standing, we are one of the few States that had finished their State Basketball Championships that week. So, I think the difference is now it's they're shocked that we were able to do that. The kids were just excited to be able to play and the excitement of them running down the ramp was the same whether they had people in the stands or not. You know, even though there were no fans in the stands, the kids still competed just as hard as if the building was full. We had no issues with poor sportsmanship, everyone competed with class, and that was great to see. It was a very unique event that's never been played in circumstances like this, but once the ball went up in the air, you wouldn't know there was any difference by the play on the court. In the end, that's what you want to see, kids respecting each other, competing with integrity, and getting the opportunity to just play.

**Q: Is there anything you would have done differently?**

The media, I would have done that differently. Other than that, we did a good job. It's hard for me to say that because I'm so critical of myself. But the media situation I did regret. I guess I didn't know there were leaders in broadcasting that would be able to take that ball and run with it because they did a fantastic job on Friday and Saturday. They organized it and I didn't have to worry about it. That's my biggest regret. But I am proud of what we did and that we were able to pull it off. When we were putting to-



gether a list of who was allowed to be in the building, I was arguing for the media. I don't think people know that. I was checking off people and asking the governor's office 'Can I go to 110? Can I go to 120 to get the media in?' and I was given a 'No' and there was no way that I could see, at that time, any way I could do it. Then the governor started getting calls and ultimately let us expand it to 104. Even with just the four people, we made it work.

***Q: How did this help you as a leader? What did you take away from this event?***

I think first and foremost, it's communication. If you're closed off and you're not accessible to answer questions, people wonder what's happening. I think people want to know what's going on. And when you open up and tell people 'this is the truth' and you're out there so there's no unknown, I think that helps. I pride myself on being accessible and the communication between myself and the membership is strong. Parents call me, coaches call me directly, you know the kids could call me, I pride myself on being accessible. I think the communication piece with people from the beginning, even though people were angry at that time, the way that we were able to communicate the message and work closely with the governor's office and the Public Education Department, made a big difference. We're all in this together, we're in it for kids. It's important for people to see that you care and that you have a heart and that we are all in this together, that's one thing that I really can take from it.

***Q: Now, several months later, looking back on that day that put a stop to high school sports, how do you view the entire experience?***

I look at it more that I hurt for kids, you know. Yeah, we pulled it off, but it's about the kids. We had a lot of kids that were really just thankful that they were able to play. I remember when I was their age, before I started every game, I made sure my parents were in the stands. You go back to your playing days to compare and realize that in this state tournament they weren't able to get that reassurance that mom and dad, or brothers or sisters, or grandparents, were in the stands before they started the game. I hurt for them because I remember being in those shoes at one time. It was a big blow when we later had to call off Spring Sports. I think that was probably the worst day in my 36, 37-year career that I ever had to do was tell the spring sport athletes that we were done.

***Q: Do you think that day was the beginning of a change of sports forever?***

I hope we get back. I hope it's sooner rather than later; but in sports we teach lifelong skills and I think that we have to keep that focus, whether it's in negative situations, positive situations, uncomfortable situations, that we're continually teaching life skills. I think right now the focus should be education-based athletics. I do believe that with every situation, good or bad, we can always learn and we can always grow. I always say that I'm molded and shaped every single year and every single day of my life. Kids need sports and activities more than ever. It's sad that they're not able to do it, but the positive is that we are needed in kids' lives. If we can get better by working hard for students in the state of New Mexico, then it's a win-win.

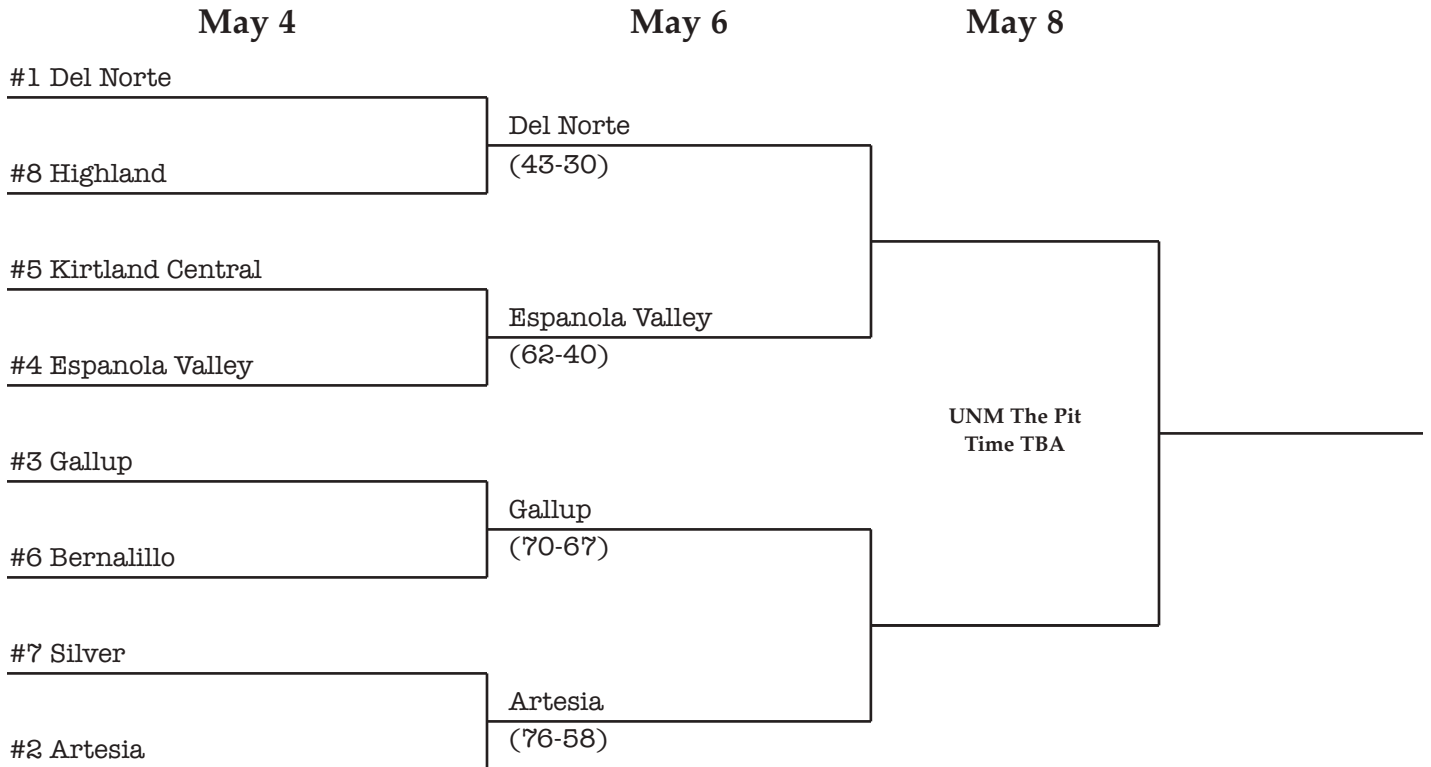

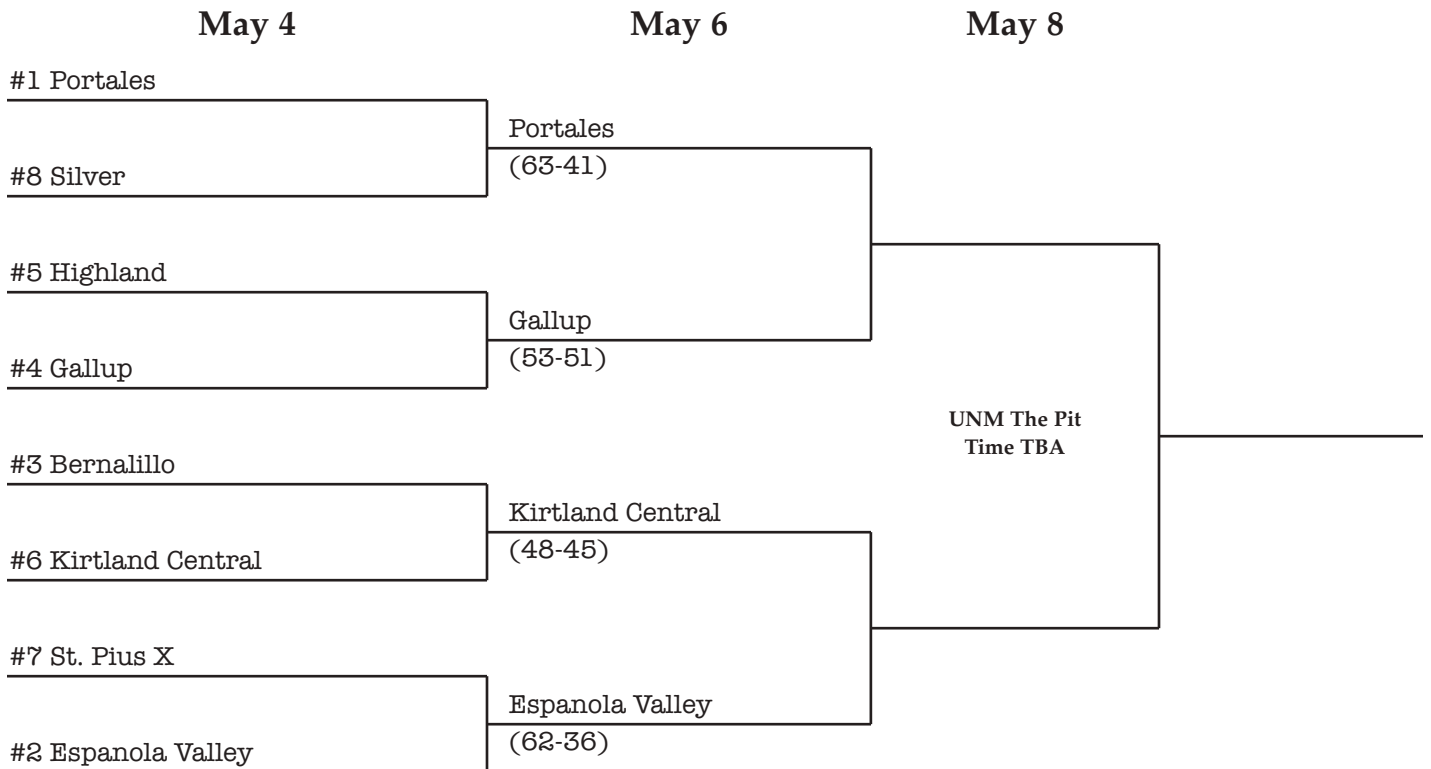

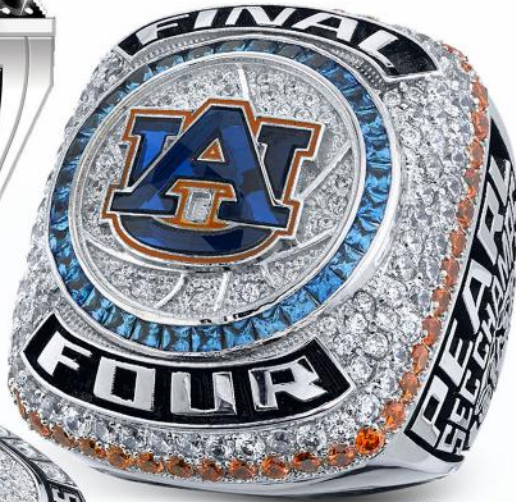

# 2020 State Championship Recap

## Melrose Back on Top in Class 1A



**BOYS CLASS A**

It was another No. 1 versus No. 2 match-up in the Class 1A championship game at the 2020 NMAA State Basketball Championships, as the Melrose Buffaloes (29-1) and the Maxwell Bears (25-5) squared off for the blue trophy. The Buffaloes would prevail by a score of 59-56, earning the school's third straight championship and the sixth overall.

Melrose had four players in double figures, as Tate Sorgen led the Buffaloes with 20 points, followed by Trace Jackson, Dylan Valentine and Tristan Sena each adding 11 points. The Bears were led by Kaden Riggs, who had a game-high 23 points and 17 rebounds, followed by Kolten Riggs with 13 and Caden Floyd with 10.

Three of the four quarters in the game were separated by just one point between the two schools. Melrose led after one 16-15 but Maxwell managed to tie the game at 31-31 going into the half.

The third quarter proved to be the difference in the game, as Melrose outscored Maxwell 18-14. The Buffaloes would hold onto the slim lead throughout the fourth quarter, eventually winning by three, 59-56 and hoisting the blue trophy for the third straight year.

## Pecos Completes 4-Peat

Pecos, Pecos, Pecos, Pecos...for the fourth straight year, the Pecos Panthers (29-1) won the Class 2A state title at the 2020 NMAA State Basketball Championships with a win over the Magdalena Steers (30-1), 63-53. It was one of the most anticipated finals of the event, pitting No. 1 versus No. 2. Magdalena came into the game undefeated at 30-0, while Pecos was 28-1 on the season.

For the Panthers, this was the fifth title in school history, becoming one of just a handful of teams to accomplish the 4-peat.

Pecos was led by Ismael Villegas and Xavier Padilla with 16 points each, followed by Anthony Armijo with 15 and Juan Varela with 12. As a team, the Panthers shot 48 percent from the field and out-rebounded the Steers, 41 to 30.

Magdalena's Joren Mirabal led all scorers with 20 points, followed Kyle Julian with 13 and Jaxson Mirabal with 11. The Steers were 35 percent from the floor in the game.

Pecos jumped out to an early 17-12 lead in the first quarter but the No. 2 Steers ended up taking a one-point lead into halftime at 29-28, after outscoring the Panthers 17-11 in the second. The third quarter, however, proved to be the difference in the game, as Pecos put together a 13-2 run to finish the quarter, making it 52-39 after three.

The 13-point deficit was too much in the end for Magdalena to overcome as Pecos won their fourth straight title, 63-53.

## Bosque School Wins First Boys' Basketball Title

For the first time in school history, the Bosque Bobcats (26-4) captured the blue trophy in the sport of basketball with a 65-57 overtime win over district rival the Sandia Prep Sundevils (23-9) in the 2020 NMAA Class 2A State Basketball Championships.

The Bobcats were led by Elijah Davidson, with 26 points and 13 rebounds. He was also one assist shy of a triple double, with nine. Teammate Ian Kahn knocked down 13 points in the win. As a team, Bosque shot 41 percent from the field. Sandia Prep was led by Max Feit, with 20 points and Sam Henderson with 10. As a team, the Sundevils shot 37 percent from the floor.

Bosque jumped out to an early 20-13 lead in the first quarter but the Sundevils climbed their way back into the game in the second quarter, trailing 27-25 going into the locker room at halftime. Over the next two quarters of play, both teams exchanged baskets and at the end of regulation, the two teams were tied at 51-51.

In overtime, the Bobcats offense was hot, going 4-for-4 from the floor, including 2-for-2 from behind the arc and a perfect 4-for-4 at the free throw line, as they outscored the Sundevils 14-6, hoisting the blue trophy overhead for the school's first boys' basketball championship.

## Valley Repeats as 4A Basketball Champions



**BOYS CLASS 4A**

The Valley Vikings (22-7) headed into the 2020 NMAA Class 4A Boys' State Basketball Championships as the No. 1 seed and didn't disappoint. The Vikings faced their district Highland Hornets (21-11) for the fifth time in the season, which proved to be a classic, as Valley hoisted the blue trophy with a 67-61 overtime win.

This was Valley's fourth title in school history.

Marcus Voss and Gio Casaus led the Vikings with 15 points apiece, followed by Jevin Baker with 14 and Seyi Oyeku with 10. Oyeku also grabbed 10 rebounds to lead the team, recording a double-double. As a team, Valley shot 53 percent from the field.

Highland was led by Erasmo Carreon and Josh Barraza, who both knocked in 17 points, while Jose Murillo added a double-double, with 12 points and 10 rebounds. As a team, the Hornets were 43 percent from the floor.

Valley grabbed an early five-point lead after the first quarter at 14-9 and extended their lead to six at the half, making it 34-28 going into the locker room. After an even third quarter between the two teams, the Vikings held a seven-point advantage heading into the fourth.

The Hornets responded in the fourth quarter, outscoring Valley 17-10 to tie the game at 59-59 at the end of regulation. In overtime, it was all Valley, as the Vikings outscored the Hornets 8 to 2, going 2-of-4 from the floor and a perfect 4-for-4 from the line. Valley's defense also held Highland to just 1-of-4 from the field in overtime, as the Vikings won 67-61 and took home the 2020 state title.

## Las Cruces Captures 5A Boys' Basketball Title

The Las Cruces Bulldawgs (29-3) captured the 2020 NMAA Class 5A State Boys' Basketball Championship with a 65-53 win over Capital (28-5). It was the first title for the Bulldawgs since 2013 and the ninth blue trophy for the school in boys' basketball.

The Bulldawgs were led by Gobzalo Carbalan with 17 points, followed by Isaiah Carr, who scored 14. Teammate Salvador Nevarez added 10 points and 10 rebounds for a double-double. As a team, Las Cruces shot 58 percent from the floor and out-rebounded the Jaguars 34 to 23.

Capital's Antonio Sanchez led his team with 15 points, as teammate Dominic Luna added 13. The Jaguars were 39 percent from the field, while hitting 12-of-13 from the free throw line.

Capital held a one point lead at 11-10 following the first quarter of play but a 20-point second quarter by Las Cruces gave the Bulldawgs a nine point lead heading into the half. Las Cruces extended their lead to 12 after the third quarter, leading 48-36.

The two team each scored 17 points in the fourth quarter, as the 12-point deficit was too much to overcome for Capital. The Bulldawgs hoisted the blue trophy overhead, capturing their first title since 2013.

## Melrose Wins 8th Girls' Basketball Title



**GIRLS CLASS A**

The Melrose Buffaloes (27-4) defeated the district rival Logan Longhorns (25-5), 47-39, in the 2020 NMAA Class 1A Girls' State Championship game, earning the school's eighth overall title and the first since 2016. This was the fifth time during the 2019-20 season the two teams had faced each other.

The Buffaloes were led by Hailey Martin and Shannon May, with 12 points apiece. Teammate Nataley Mondragon added 10 points in the win. As a team, Melrose shot 38 percent from the field but were out-rebounded 41 to 23.

Logan's Karli Webb recorded a double-double with 14 points and 11 rebounds, while Jordan Hines also dropped in 14 points and nine boards. The Longhorns were 32 percent from the floor.

The Buffaloes took an early lead in the first quarter, 11-4, but Logan clawed their way back into the game in the second, outscoring the Buffaloes 12-7. Melrose would take a two-point lead into the locker room at halftime, 18-16.

In the third, the Longhorns came out on fire, pulling ahead by three points at 30-27 going into the final quarter of play. The fourth quarter, however, was a different story and it was all about Melrose. Over the last six minutes of the game, the Buffaloes held Logan to just one field goal, outscoring the Longhorns 13-2, as Melrose lifted the blue trophy overhead for the first time since 2016.

## Mescalero Apache Wins First Blue Trophy in School History

The Mescalero Apache Chiefs (28-3) earned the school's first-ever blue trophy with a 69-54 win over No. 1 seed the Peñasco Panthers in the 2020 NMAA Class 2A Girls' State Basketball Championships. The state title was the second for head coach Elmer Chavez, who also guided Santa Fe High to a state championship in 2014.

The Chiefs had three players score in double figures, as Ramona Fossum dropped in 13 and Brynn Martinez added 11. But, the story of the game was all about Fallon Velasquez. Velasquez scored a game-high 32 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in the Chiefs win. She was 8-of-15 from the field, 4-of-8 from behind the 3-point arc and an incredible 12-of-13 from the charity stripe. She tallied six assists on the night.

Carly Gonzales led the Panthers with 18 points and 14 rebounds, while teammate Adrianna Tafoya knocked in 14 points as well.

The two teams were tied at 10-all after the first quarter and Peñasco took a four-point lead into the locker room at halftime, 28-24. The Chiefs' offense exploded in the third quarter, outscoring the Panthers 24-10, holding a 10-point lead at 48-38 heading into the fourth.

Mescalero Apache continued to hold the lead in the fourth quarter, adding another 21 points. In the final two quarters of play, the Chiefs outscored the Panthers 45 to 26.

## Los Lunas Captures Blue Trophy for Third Time in a Row

For the third year in a row, the Los Lunas Tigers lifted the blue trophy at the end of the season. Los Lunas beat Kirtland Central for the second straight year in the title game to win the 2020 State Basketball Class 4A Championship, 47-33. It was the seventh trip to the finals over the last eight years for head coach Marty Zeller and the Lady Tigers.

After a competitive 15-12 first quarter, Los Lunas built their lead up to 23-16 by halftime. The Los Lunas defense held Kirtland Central to just one point in a decisive 10-1 third quarter. "That's what the Lady Tigers do," said head coach Marty Zeller. "We take opponents out of their game."

Los Lunas had three players in double figures, led by Natalie Jojola with 14 points. Dani Ross and Mia Guest each added 11 points for the Lady Tigers. Los Lunas outrebounded the Lady Broncos 31-18 and shot 40 percent from three-point range. After starting the season with a 5-4 record, Los Lunas won their final 22 games of the season and ended the year with a 27-4 record.

## Hobbs Back on Top in Class 5A

For the second time in three years, head coach Joe Carpenter and the Hobbs Lady Eagles were on top of the basketball world. Hobbs High School beat Volcano Vista 58-43 to win the 2020 State Basketball Class 5A Championship. It was the third straight trip to finals for Hobbs and the fourth time in five years Carpenter has coached in the title game.

Hobbs built up a 23-12 first quarter lead, but the Hawks would not fly off without a fight. The Lady Eagles held onto a 32-24 lead at the break, but a strong third quarter start by Volcano Vista would tie the game at 34-all. "I felt good at the end of the third quarter that we were going to finish strong," said Carpenter. He was right.

A strong team effort by Hobbs, with baskets by Ashley Aragon, Elisa Turrubiates, Wisdom Anthony and Jamiah Clay helped the top-ranked team build up another 10-point lead midway through the fourth quarter to put it out of reach. Anthony led all scorers with 23 points. Ashley Aragon scored 14 and Elise Turrubiates added 13. Hobbs outrebounded Volcano Vista 39-26. Natalia Chavez led Volcano Vista with 13 points.

Hobbs finished the season with a near-perfect 29-1 record.

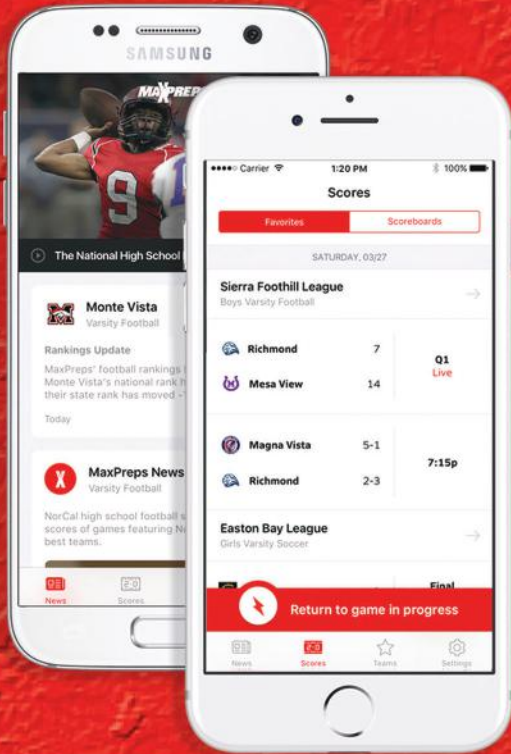

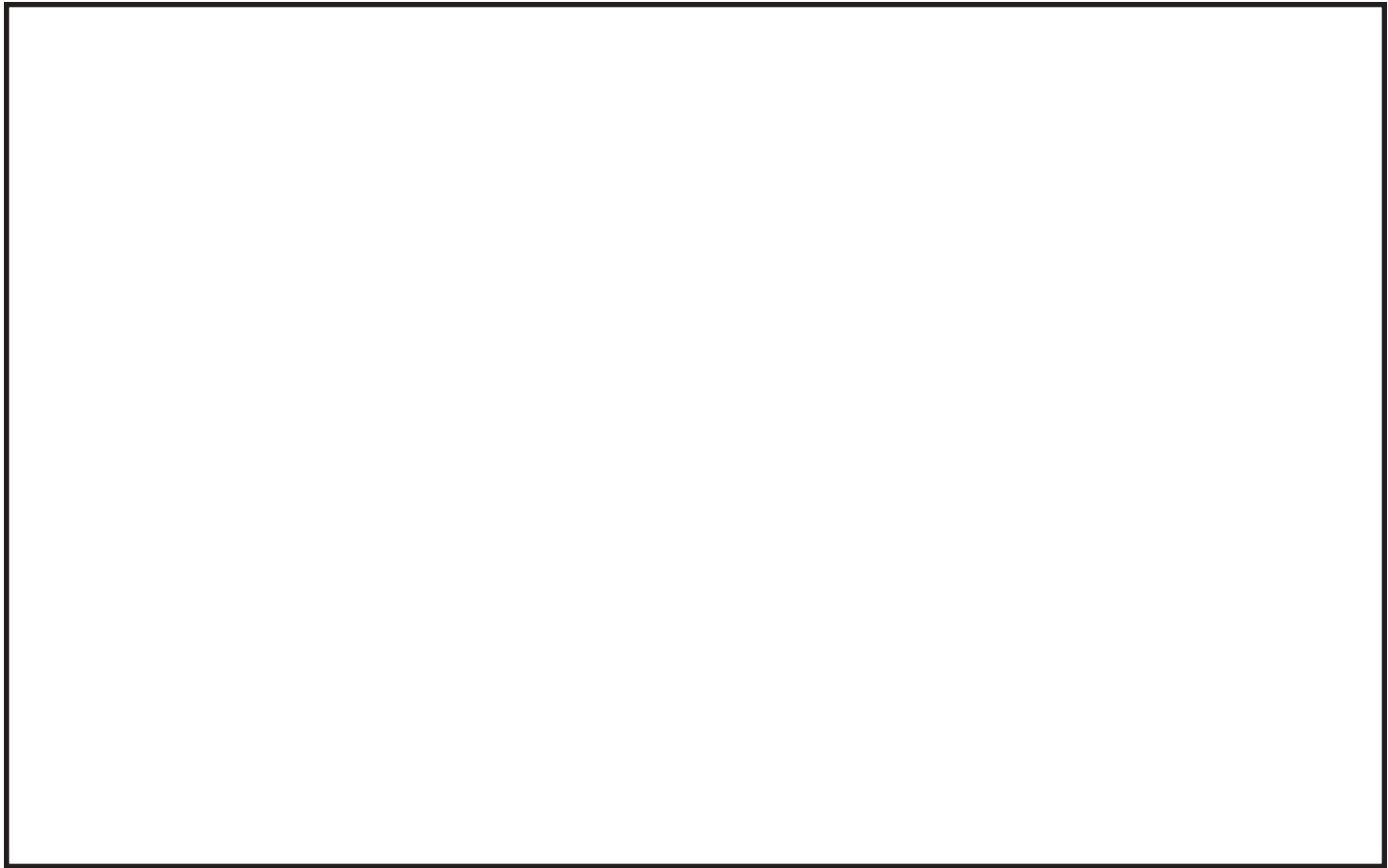
