# NO ON-SITE REGISTRATION!

1. Make sure your **S3DA MEMBERSHIP** is current. Youth, Coach, and \*Team Memberships are renewed annually. \*(Team Membership MUST provide proof of insurance). Anyone shooting in S3DA must be an active member of an S3DA Team. All memberships must be paid to the National S3DA office before youth can participate in any S3DA events.

- 2. Determine your AGE and CLASS DIVISION, view here.
- 3. Visit the S3DA Sport:80 website <u>https://s3da.sport80.com/public/events</u>, select the event, and click "Enter Now".
- 4. Review the S3DA Rules, view here.

5. If you need a refresher on state S3DA event protocol, contact your S3DA Coach or request further guidance from your <u>State Coordinator</u>.



# What Should I Bring?

Each venue has specific rules about what is allowed. Each S3DA competition site establishes and enforces its own policy regarding pets. Please check with the event host prior to competition if you are uncertain.

1. Definitely bring all your shooting equipment and any backup items you may need, including extra arrows, nocks, fletchings, release, finger tab, etc.

2. Spectators may find the competition easier to follow when using binoculars.

# What Should I Wear?

Review the <u>S3DA Dress Code Policy</u>. Shoes must cover your entire feet, no flip flops! It is highly recommended that spectators, coaches, and/or guests wear footwear that covers the entire feet.

Manufacturer jerseys do not count as team issued competition clothing.

## What Do I Do When I Get To The Event? ARCHERS & PARENTS



### "Prior to the start of competition on the first day, all archers and coaches will be expected to attend a "Mandatory Competitors Safety Meeting."



Archers will need to arrive at least 30 minutes prior to their shooting time. Target assignments for NATIONAL EVENTS are posted on the <u>S3DA National Facebook page</u> or are available via <u>Between Ends</u>. Archers and parents will need to check there for lane/range assignments.

**Parents** – Help your archer(s) to find their target assignment(s). When finding a place to spectate, be mindful of the archers and other spectators. In Indoor and Outdoor Target competitions, most venues will have archer-only seating, and a spectator area.

In these cases, only the archers, S3DA Range Officials/Judges and approved S3DA Media may proceed past the designated spectator area. Adults that are assisting the Jr. Eagle/Eagle classes with scoring can proceed past the designated spectator area but MUST obtain credentials from the Tournament Director.

Courtesy equipment checks may be utilized by tournament officials prior to the start of the tournament. Equipment is subject to random inspections at tournament officials' discretion. It is ultimately the responsibility of the shooter and coach to know and follow the rules of the tournament including but not limited to the equipment they are shooting. Any shooter who feels that another competitor's equipment is not in conformity with the class rules must report the issue to the range official or tournament official.

### S3DA adheres to the universal whistle commands at all Indoor & Outdoor Target Events.

### Indoor Target & Outdoor Target competitions

- Mandatory safety meeting announcements will be made at the shooting line prior to each shooting time. No scorecards should leave the target.

### **3D competitions**

- The mandatory competitor's safety meeting will start thirty (30) minutes prior to the start of each round.

- Shooters are required to be on their assigned target fifteen (15) minutes before the start of competition.

- Scorecards will be available at the entrance to each range. Shooters will pick up the official-colored scorecard for that day, along with one white "shooter's copy" scorecard which is to be retained by the shooter for their record, at the beginning of each round.



For 3D, on all competition ranges: Yardages may be provided via State Coordinator's discretion for Jr Eagle and Eagle and optional for Youth and Young Adults as measured within a one-yard tolerance based on the equipment used. Yardage cards WILL NOT be provided at the National 3D Tournaments. Shooters may elect to use range finders but may not exceed the time allowed and are required to share their information if requested by another competitor in their group.

# Safety Meeting for 3D Tournaments



- Shooters must be on your assigned stake 15 minutes prior to your scheduled start time. Spectators will not be allowed on the range until given the all-clear from a range official.
- Water will be available on the range but it's your responsibility to stay hydrated.
- Spectators and archers should stay within their assigned groups. Please do not wander around the range to other stakes as this causes delay.
- Parents may assist with carrying equipment but must not make any adjustments to equipment unless the archer calls and documents a breakdown.
- Score cards will be handed out on the range.
- Archers will be allowed 1 equipment breakdown and will have 45 minutes from the time range official is notified and will be allowed to make up missed targets. Any targets missed over 45 minutes will count as zeros (0).
- Archers will be allowed 1 personal time-out but must first check in with a range official and then check back in with range official within 10 minutes and complete the round.
- Pins Class: you are allowed 1 single gang adjustment, and you must inform your group that you are going to make an adjustment. All moveable sights must be locked down prior to shooting.
- Archers must touch or straddle the stake, except with an approved medical exemption. You will receive 1 warning for the first offense. 2<sup>nd</sup> offense will result in 5-point deduction from target score.
- If you deliberately move or bend the shooting stake, you will receive a 0 for that target.
- Do NOT glass from the stake after taking your shot.
- NO archer shall go behind a target to <u>look</u> for an arrow. If you can see the arrow, it can be retrieved if done so in a safe manner. It is suggested that you circle that target number on your white card and after official cards have been turned in, you can go back on range to retrieve arrows, but you must notify range officials first.
- Do not approach the next shooting stake until the group occupying that stake has fully cleared the area. Advancing will result in a warning and if done again, may result in a 0 on that target for the whole group.
- Do not touch someone else's equipment.
- No projection of light or reference point onto a target.
- You must wait for groups on both sides to be cleared from shooting before advancing to the target to score. Verify with both sides verbally that all shooters are finished and cleared.
- When advancing to the next stake, check both sides to make sure archers are not down range scoring before you resume shooting.
- Each archer will have 1 minute to shoot their arrow.
- The group as a whole will have 4 minutes to score and pull their arrows from the target.
- Please pay attention when each archer in your group shoots in case of a bounce out or pass through.
- Do not pull any arrows until they have all been scored.
- DO NOT USE RED PEN ON SCORE CARDS (range officials only will use red pens)
- When finished shooting, archers are to total score cards. Each archer will be responsible to verify that the score on their card is correct BEFORE they sign off on it and turn it in.
- Make sure everything is filled in (first and last name, division, and class) and both shooter and scorekeeper sign the card.
- Make sure any and all corrections are initialed by the scorer and scorekeeper before turning cards in.
- ALL SCORE CARDS ARE TO BE TURNED IN TO RANGE OFFICIAL <u>AS A GROUP</u> BEFORE YOU LEAVE YOUR RANGE.



S3DA will host their 7<sup>th</sup> annual S3DA Outdoor Target National Championship on July 12<sup>th</sup>-14<sup>th</sup>, 2024. Students will have the opportunity to compete against S3DA members from across the United States for the title of "National Champion" in their division. Jr. Eagle and Eagle archers will shoot two qualification rounds: each round consisting of 6 ends of 6 arrows. Youth and Young Adult archers will shoot one qualification round consisting of 12 ends of 6 arrows. Elimination rounds (head-to-head brackets) will take place for Eagle, Youth & Young Adult archers. # **Dress Code Policy**



### Dress Code (applies to archers, coaches, team managers, media, officials, agents)

- 1. Shorts and skirts MUST BE mid-thigh length while standing normally.
- 2. Cut-off jeans are prohibited.

**3**. Male and female shooters are required to wear upper garments covering the front and back of the body and covering the midriff when at full draw.

4. Participants must wear collared team issued competition clothing which may include team issued t-shirts or collared shirts with team names. Manufacturer jerseys do not count as team issued competition clothing. Event t-shirts, solid colored t-shirts or a plain collared shirt are allowed as an addditional option

for those with extenuating circumstances. For any other accommodations, please seek approval from tournament official prior to start of tournament.



5. Tank tops are not allowed.

6. Due to safety considerations it is required that shooters wear shoes that fully cover the entire foot. A single strap around the back of the foot does not meet this requirement. Bare feet, open-toed sandals or flip-flops are not allowed while competing on the ranges. Shoes should not have perforations/holes that would allow an arrow to have direct contact with the foot.

7. At no time will any shooters, guests or spectators wear any article bearing any image or language to be considered vulgar or offensive. If they do not have an alternative shirt, they will be required to turn the offensive shirt inside out if they wish to remain on the premises or they will be required to leave. Compliance with this rule will be determined by the Tournament Director and the Event Committee.

# **Spectators, Guests, Coaches**

1. Providing verbal information or coaching a shooter is strictly prohibited while that shooter is on the stake or shooting line during 3D competitions. Coaching is allowed in both Indoor and Outdoor Target competitions (with the exception of elimination or shoot down rounds) as long as it's not disruptive to other archers.

2. Spectators and guests are to conduct conversations in a manner that is not disruptive to archers.

3. All cell phones and electronic devices are to be silenced to avoid disturbing the competitors.

4. Each S3DA competition site establishes and enforces its own policy regarding pets. Should a site allow pets, they shall always be kept on leashes. Pet owners shall be responsible for their pet's behavior and for cleaning up after them. Pets are not allowed to walk on competition ranges or on access routes to ranges at any time. Any breach shall prohibit that pet from future S3DA attendance.

5. Video and digital image camera photography is allowed from behind the shooting line/stake. In the case of the working press or a film production crew, permission must be obtained by the tournament director.

6.Profanity and/or verbal abuse by adults will result in immediate dismissal from the competition venue.

It is highly recommended that spectators, coaches and/or guests wear footwear that covers the entire foot.



# **Scoring Information**

In the Jr. Eagle class, two adults may advance to the target with the group and will keep scores. Archers will make scoring decisions. The adult may provide guidance. In the Eagle Division, one adult will keep the official cards and an archer will keep the unofficial cards. Archers will make scoring decisions.

Competing archers should always be in personal control of the scorecards. Completed and signed scorecards should be turned in by the group, as a group, to the range official or judge. At no time will coaches, parents or spectators be allowed to touch, hold, or manipulate scorecards. In the Jr. Eagle & Eagle divisions, adults will be asked to monitor arrow calling, scoring, and end results. It is the shooter's responsibility to turn in a completed and correct scorecard.

### When electronic scoring is being utilized, the paper scorecard will be the final determinant in any discrepancy between the electronic scoring and the paper scorecard for the value of the arrow.



# File an Appeal or Protest?

The Competition Committee will review all grievances and protests, as well as interpret the rules. All protests filed that could affect the results of the competition must be resolved prior to the next round of competition, or prior to the announcement of final results. All shooters agree to be bound by the decisions of the Competition Committee as final.

Any grievance or protest must be filed in writing with the Tournament Director within thirty (30) minutes of completion of a round, along with a \$20.00 protest fee. If the Committee rules in favor of the protest, or the protest/grievance is withdrawn, the fee will be returned. All decisions of the Committee will be final.

A general inquiry for an interpretation of a rule may be submitted in writing to the National Competition Committee. The Committee will review the submission at their earliest convenience, and a written response will be provided. No fee is required for this review.

# Archery Etiquette



#### Unsportsmanlike conduct on the range or at any tournament venues will not be tolerated.



If you have shot all your arrows, always be mindful of other archers who are near you.

If an archer near you is at full draw, be very cautious not to disturb them.

### **Mobile Electronic Devices**

Cell phones may be used within limitations. They must be silenced and cannot be used for communication purposes or music. Other electronic devices (headphones or earbuds) may not be used while on the shooting line/stake. Voice calls and text messages are prohibited unless approved by the Tournament Director, or by prior arrangement with the Range Official and their shooting group due to a personal situation. A shooter may receive a ten (10) point deduction if their phone is not silenced. Drones cannot be used without prior approval from the Tournament Director.

### **Photography**

By registering to participate in an S3DA Tournament, shooters acknowledge and agree that photographs or videotape of them may be taken while participating in S3DA Tournaments and/or tournament related activities. Flash photography is not allowed during tournaments. Photographers may apply for a media credential by contacting kaylas3da@gmail.com. Credentialed media are allowed downrange with the approval of a range official/judge.

## **Refund Policy**

Should a pre-registered competitor be unable to participate in a National Tournament their entry fees may be refunded minus a \$10 processing fee. Entry fees will not be refunded or credited if a competitor competes at any point in the event, leaves the competition early after their class shooting time was extended by the Tournament Director, or due to disqualification. Each S3DA state program has their own refund policy.



# **Equipment Failure / Medical Issue**



If you have an equipment failure or a medical issue during competition, notify the nearest range official/judge. Explain the problem and tell them how many arrows you have remaining to shoot. The following are the S3DA Rules for each discipline on equipment failures.

## For Indoor Target:

In the event of equipment failure, the archer will have fifteen minutes repair time without holding up the tournament. The student must return to the assigned bale and one practice end will be allowed. The archer shall be allowed to shoot any arrows he or she did not shoot during the fifteen minutes repair time, after the final end.

## For 3D:

Groups must have a minimum of three shooters and if a group of three experiences a breakdown that leaves only two shooters in the group, the range official will be the second scorer and accompany the group as a scorer until the third shooter returns. If a group is down to one shooter the range official will place the shooter with another group.

The Equipment failure need not be visible but must be reported to a tournament official. If the equipment failure occurs during the act of shooting, the arrow will be scored as shot. The shooter will have up to forty-five (45) minutes from the time the archer notifies the range official of a breakdown for equipment replacement or repair. Each shooter is limited to one (1) repair or replacement of equipment per tournament. A shooter with a second breakdown will be allowed to repair or replace their equipment but will not be allowed to make up missed targets.

Any shooter leaving the range for a personal time-out must first check-in with the range official and must then check back with the official within ten (10) minutes and complete the round. Only one (1) personal time-out per round.

# For Outdoor Target:

In the event (during the qualification round or official practice) of an equipment failure, or a medical issue, verified by medical personnel, extra time may be given to make the necessary repairs, change the damaged equipment or for medical personnel to determine the problem

and decide whether or not the athlete is fit to continue competing unassisted. However, the maximum time or number of ends for make-up arrows to be shot is 15 minutes (following regular order of shooting and timing), or two ends of six arrows outdoors. The athlete shall make up the appropriate number of arrows at the earliest opportunity under the supervision of a Judge. There is no allowance for make-up arrows during the elimination matches.

### Individual Education Plan (IEP)/504 (Individuals with Disabilities Act) Accommodations:

The goal of S3DA is to provide an opportunity for anyone that wants to participate in archery, no matter what their disability or handicap. Anyone that requires accommodations to participate in S3DA will need to submit documentation of the disability/handicap on the Sport 80 Membership platform when registering and provide IEP or 504 documents to the National Office. S3DA will strive to make every accommodation necessary, within reason, to ensure opportunity and safety for everyone.
