FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Dear Friends,

Our classrooms, hallways and parking lot have been overflowing with energy, joy and creative costumes in the last couple of days at CPC. From tiny preschoolers trick or treating with wide eyes, to finding ourselves the hub of community activity in Clinton on Halloween night, it has been so very fun! And certainly, it's a far cry from the Halloweens of my childhood in Northern Ireland with black plastic bin liners fashioned into a witch's cape at the last minute, plastic masks (which smelled horrific!) and carved turnips rather than pumpkin Jack-O-Lanterns!

Today, the day following "All Hallow's Eve", is sometimes called "All Hallows Day" in the U.K. On this side of the Atlantic we call it All Saints Day. We'll mark this occasion more carefully on Sunday as we remember those we have loved and lost in this last calendar year. For today, with all the candy given out and the costumes packed away, I'd like to encourage us to do something that Fred Rogers—Mr. Rogers—used to encourage people to do. I would like to encourage us all to pause for just ten seconds to remember the special ones in our lives who have loved us into being and who have helped us to become who we are—the people who have cared about us and wanted what was best for us. Just a ten second pause...

"Whomever you've been thinking about," Mr. Rogers would say, "how pleased they must be to know the difference you feel they've made." And I would add, think how pleasing it would be for you one day to know that you were the person who made a profound difference in another person's life. Nothing matters more, it seems to me—to make a positive difference in another person's life—that is, to be a saint.





Building Updates



As of Mid-October, all of our classroom spaces at CPC are open for business again! With such light and bright spaces, it's hard to remember what the rooms looked like before...so we've included some photos to remind you of how far we have come! Each room received new flooring and paint and storage space was added in three of the four rooms. It's amazing what a difference it has made to be able to store Sunday school supplies and more in an organized fashion. Teachers are able to put their hands on what is needed quickly and with everyone's cooperation we can keep these spaces uncluttered and invitational for church and community groups to use as needed.

In addition to the classroom spaces, new flooring was added throughout the hallway space and between now and the start of the new year all the stairwells will also get a facelift, with the banisters and railings being painted and the treads being refinished.

Sneak a peek at the staircase just outside of the sanctuary to see what is in store for the rest of the building. (note: the updates to the stairwells



were not included in the capital campaign and are being financed from our savings account.)

Another large item checked off the Capital Campaign project list was the replacement of the roof over fellowship hall. Thanks to the work of a large and talented crew, this all happened in a single day and we are ready for any snowfall that might come our way. No leaking roofs this year!

The repairs to the bell tower are in their final stages. The tower has been painted and after counter flashing is applied, the scaffolding will be removed!

What's next you ask? Signage! Plans have been submitted for signage both inside the building and out which will help both members and guest to navigate the campus more easily...not to mention delivery drivers who leave package deliveries in all sorts of interesting places right now! Stay tuned for more updates!
