For one week, students will call the foothills of the Wind River Range their home base. They'll dive into a variety of outdoor adventures, including rock climbing, mountain biking, canoeing, fly-fishing, arts & crafts, and archery.

The experience culminates in a three-night backpacking expedition through the Wind River Range, where campers will master essential skills such as setting up camp, cooking their own meals, navigating with maps, practicing Leave No Trace principles, and following bear-safe camping techniques. This immersive journey offers a taste of diverse outdoor activities while equipping campers with lasting confidence and practical skills they can carry into every aspect of life.




