We believe in both breadth and depth of learning and encourage students to have a broad range of interests, and, alongside academic studies, we encourage and support them to develop good moral character, communication, and leadership skills. You will be encouraged to maximise your talents, abilities, and interests through self discipline and creativity.

There is a wide choice of subjects, whether you decide to follow A Levels, the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP), or the BTEC Extended Diploma in either Sport or Business. We are flexible and can support most combinations of options to suit your individual strengths or areas of interest, because, rather than restrict you with blocks of subjects to choose from, we design the timetable around your choices. Academic progress is carefully monitored and individual student reflections develop independence and resilience – manifesting itself in the excellent results our students achieve year on year. You will be a part of a small tutor group with your tutor who supports and monitors your academic progress and provides pastoral care. You will also enjoy the support of your Head and Deputy Head of Year, our Sixth Form Pastoral Mentor, Head of Careers, and the whole staff body.

Student life centres around an impressive purpose built Sixth Form building and adjoining teaching space, where there are state-of-the-art classrooms, fully equipped computer suites and an impressive Wessex Auditorium seating 400 people. These sit alongside common rooms, private study areas, and spaces where you can relax. At the same time, you benefit from being part of the whole School with access to the main library and the Bean Academic Centre as well as a huge range of clubs, societies, and co-curricular activities that are on offer. You will also be issued with an iPad to enhance your learning experience and prepare you for the digital world that awaits you after your studies.

Sixth Formers automatically become members of The Society of Old Brentwoods, and by signing up to the Brentwood School Association, they have a forum to keep in touch with the school community after leaving. Our School values - Virtue, Learning and Manners - are taken from the School statutes of 1622. The principles of academic achievement within a caring Christian ethos remain a cornerstone of the School's philosophy today.

We will give you all the guidance and support you need to succeed in examinations; our consistently excellent results prove this. We also wish our students to be well-informed, engaging people. Whatever subjects you study, we emphasise depth of understanding and creative thinking.

### International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme

The International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) is a distinguished qualification that is recognised by universities in the UK and all over the world. The IBDP requires the study of six subjects, three at Higher Level for specialist depth, with three at Standard Level to give you complementary skills. Students also complete a Theory of Knowledge course, an Extended Essay, and an accredited co-curricular programme. If you undertake the IB Diploma Programme, you will benefit from seeing what you learn from a global perspective and from depth and breadth in your studies.

### **A Levels**

We offer a wide choice of subjects to study at A Level and can accommodate most subject combinations, within the constraints of the school timetable. Most A Level students study three A Levels and complete the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ). The syllabuses we favour are excellent preparation for university study, as well as degree apprenticeships, apprenticeships or entry into the workplace across the Arts and Sciences.

the knowledge, understanding and skills that allow students to gain experience

# Suppo

Brentwood School Sixth Form is a community of around 390 students that is warm and down-to-earth. Our sixth formers play an active and visible role in bringing the values of the school to life by being committed, caring people.

You will be able to mix with new groups of people through your tutor group, academic classes, House and co-curricular activities and by the time you leave we hope you will have forged diverse friendships.

Each year group within the sixth form also has its own Head and Deputy Head of Year who supports them for the duration of the Sixth Form along with the Sixth Form Pastoral Mentor.

We encourage our students to have a broad range of interests no matter what their specialism, and alongside academic studies we help you develop self-discipline, communication and leadership skills. This may be through the House System or within the vast array of co-curricular activities that we run. We conduct a wellbeing programme that covers subjects such as Mental Health First Aid, navigating peer influence and sexual health.

The Headmaster, following a thorough application process, appoints our Head and Deputy Heads of School and Senior Praepostors. They apply for specific roles of responsibility and are inspirational role models for the whole student body.





# Cular

Brentwood Sixth Formers gain a sense of personal and collective achievement from the immense range of creative, sporting and social activities on offer here. From Fencing to Big Band; Debating to Cookery – no matter what your interest or passion, we will be able to challenge and inspire you.

### **Performing Arts**

Whether or not you choose to study Performing Arts as part of your sixth form curriculum, there is such a vast array of Co-Curricular Music, Drama and Dance present at Brentwood that it would be incredible to find a pupil who didn't have a creative activity or talent among their interests. These activities are available to both the accomplished and the novice alike.

### **CCF (Combined Cadet Force)**

Many Brentwood students belong to the CCF. As a Sixth Former, you are given responsibilities as an NCO (Non-Commissioned Officer) in the discipline of your choice – Army, Navy or Air Force. Senior Members of the CCF have a week's leadership training, and are responsible for the organisation and wellbeing of junior members of their Corps on annual camps, with overall supervision from the Staff officers.

### The Duke of Edinburgh

The Duke of Edinburgh's Award helps to develop key skills for life and work, such as confidence, commitment and team working. To achieve a Gold Award, you have to complete five sections: volunteering, physical activity, a skill, a residential trip and the expedition. The expedition involves spending four days travelling in remote countryside with all your food and equipment. We have organised student expeditions to South Africa and Morocco as well as to parts of the UK.

### **SABS Guest Speaker Programme**

The Sir Antony Browne Society Guest Speaker Programme features a diverse range of influential guest speakers. The 2023–2024 programme included a host of interesting guests deepening students' understanding of matters ranging from war, politics, law, marketing, marine insurance, photography, journalism, languages, music, medicine at Cambridge, global adventure challenges and more. Our speakers are distinguished individuals in their fields and our students are heavily involved in the running of the society.

### **SABS Debating**

SABS Debating Society allows our sixth form students to develop their debating skills. Students are given the opportunity to explore different perspectives and argue their points of views on a wide range of motions. Our debaters have also taken part in several national competitions this year.

### **Sport**

All Sixth Formers take part in an afternoon of sport a week. With over 20 different activities to choose from, there is bound to be something for you. Students can opt for the 'Team Brentwood' pathway where you can represent the school in a range of different sports, or the 'Active Brentwood' pathway where you can take part in a variety of fitness classes. Our coaches are experienced and our facilities have been chosen as an Olympic training venue. Our teams tour overseas & compete at County and National levels.

## Progress

Two years at Brentwood Sixth Form will prepare you for the demands of a highly competitive and fast-paced adult world. Whether your next move is university study, an apprenticeship, employment or a gap year, you'll be ready to make highly individual choices and be enterprising when times get tough.

We advise on university courses in the UK and abroad and help with applications to drama schools, art schools, music conservatoires and other specialisms. We provide support for all students hoping to study Medicine, Dentistry, Veterinary Science, Engineering and Law and courses at highly competitive universities such as Oxford or Cambridge. All students can also take part in practice interviews to help their applications. Our Head of Careers is also able to meet with students individually to help explore opportunities and options with you.

If you want to enter the workplace directly, we help with that too. Our alumni network stretches far and wide and includes former Brentwood students in many different careers, in the UK and abroad. There is a huge amount of goodwill among Old Brentwoods, and many have nominated themselves as mentors, to give support to leavers with advice and professional contacts.

Some of our alumni have become world renown for their achievements and talents; all of our leavers understand how to make the best of themselves. The memories that are usually most cherished from time as a Brentwood student are those of close friends and dedicated, inspiring teachers.







Brentwood School has a long history of boarding and our boarders are an important part of the whole School community.

Students benefit from having more time to join in after-school activities without the worries of a long journey home. Dedicated time for homework with support from house tutors helps students keep on top of their work and there is plenty of time to make friends.

We have one girls' and one boys' boarding house. In truth, they are homes more than boarding houses: staffed by dedicated husband-and-wife teams and boarding house tutors, they offer warmth and a family atmosphere to students from different backgrounds, both near and far. Friendships made by our boarders often last a lifetime.

We offer full and weekly boarding and we feel very fortunate to have a wide mix of nationalities from Asia, Europe, and the Middle and Far East.

In addition to the wide range of Co-Curricular activities on offer at the School, boarders have their own programme of social activities. Houseparents make sure there is a plethora of activities on offer in the evenings and at weekends. These include trips to the cinema, theatre, paintballing, bowling and weekends away.

As boarding is such an integral part of the School, we are proud to announce that we will be transforming our boarding facilities by building a new state-of-the-art purpose-built boarding house for September 2025.

The project, which has been years in the planning, will be subdivided into three main sections; a girls' and boys' boarding house, with single en-suite bedrooms and a central shared facility including new dining and communal areas including a Sixth Form Cafe. There will also be an outdoor courtyard with dedicated landscaped social space.
