In **1975 National Cancer Control Programme was started** to arrange treatment facilities for cancer. In 1984-85 some changes were made in the National Cancer Control Programme to make the Cancer treatment process more efficient and available to all.



## World Radiography Day: 8th November

World Radiography Day 2023 is observed on the 8th of November 2023. This year, 2023, the **World Radiography Day Theme is "Celebrating patient safety"**. X-Ray was discovered in 1895 by **Wilhelm Roentgen**. In his laboratory, he accidentally discovered a new Electromagnetic wave that is transparent through flesh but won't transfer through metals and bones

World Vegan Day 2023 is observed on the **1st of November 2023**. World Vegan Day 2023 is celebrated on 1st

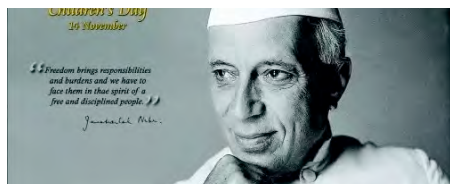
## Infant Protection Day: 7th November

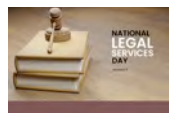
## World Pneumonia Day 2023: 12th November

officially celebrated this day. Some of the countries which celebrate World Kindness Day are India, Brazil, Australia, Canada, Japan, Italy, etc. **World Kindness Day was first celebrated in 1998 at the Tokyo Conference**.

## International Students Day: 17th November



**I**nternational Students Day 2023 is observed on the 17th of November 2023. **When Adolf Hitler came to power in 1933**, the Third Reich started aggressive claims over territories outside Germany's borders. The Nazis first captured Austria in 1938, Hitler's home country. **The first observance took place in 1941** at the International Students' Council in London.

Epilepsy Foundation in India is a non-profitable charity Organisation. Epilepsy Foundation of **India was formed by Dr Nirmal Surya located in Mumbai**.

## World Television Day: 21st November



**W**orld Television Day 2023 is observed on the **21st of November 2023**. The theme for the 2023 edition is "Accessibility". In 1927, a 21-year-old inventor by the name of Philo Taylor Farnsworth invented the world's first electronic television. On November 21 and 22 1996, the United Nations held the first **World Television Forum**.

## World Diabetes Day: 14th November



**W**orld Diabetes Day 2023 is observed on the 14th of November 2023. The theme for World Diabetes Day 2023 is "**Access to diabetes care**". Diabetes is a disease but till now there is no permanent cure for it. **World Diabetes Day became an official UN day in 2006**. World Diabetes

Day was established in 1991 by the International Diabetes Federation with support from WHO for the growing concerns about the health and economic threat posed by diabetes. The Day is celebrated to honour the First Educational Minister of India and his incomparable contribution to the Education system of India.

On 5th November 2001, the UN General Assembly declared the 6th November of each year as an International Day for Preventing the Exploitation of the Environment in War and Armed Conflict.

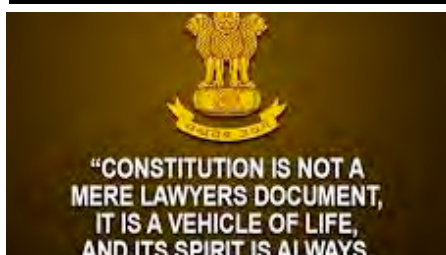

## International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women: 25th November

International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women 2023 is observed on the 25th of November 2023. On November 25, 1960, the Mirabal sisters of the Dominican Republic were assassinated by dictator Rafael Trujillo. According to a report by the United Nations, 19 percent of women between the ages of 15 and 49 years of age have experienced physical and/or sexual violence “by an intimate partner.” In December 1999, the United Nations General Assembly designated November 25 as the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women.



## Constitution Day: 26th November

Indian Constitution Day 2023 is observed on the 26th of November 2023. On November 26, 1949, the Constituent Assembly of India formally adopted the Constitution of India. It came into force on January 26, 1950. Constitution Day aims to bring awareness about the importance of the Constitution and Dr. B R Ambedkar.

## World Toilet Day: 19th November



World Toilet Day 2023 is observed on the 19th of November 2023. Jack Sim, a philanthropist from Singapore, founded the World Toilet Organization on November 19,

2001. He declared that day as World Toilet Day. In 2013, the Government of Singapore and the World Toilet Organization led to Singapore’s first UN resolution called “Sanitation for All.” This resolution decided to take action to end the world sanitation crisis by 2025. As a result, World Toilet Day was declared an official UN day, and 122 countries adopted the resolution at the 67th session of the UN General Assembly in New York.

## Universal Children’s Day: 20th November



Universal Children’s Day 2023 is observed on the 20th of November 2023. Children’s Day was first officially declared a national holiday by the Republic of Turkey in 1920 on April 23. Children’s Day has

been celebrated nationally since 1920 by the Turkish government and is declared as the day for children. Though Universal Children’s Day was established by the United Nations in 1954, it wasn’t until November 20, 1959, that the UN General Assembly adopted an extended form of the Declaration of the Rights of the Child. Originally acquired in 1924 by the League of Nations, the UN adopted this document as its own statement of children’s rights.

## International Men’s Day 2023: 19th November



International Men’s Day 2023 is observed on the 19th of November 2023. In 1968, an American journalist named John P. Harris communicated that there was a celebration for International Women’s Day for female workers but failed to deliver a male counterpart.

## 22nd Annual Conference of IASSI to be held

The Centre for Economic and Social Studies (CESS) will host the 22nd annual conference of the Indian Association of Social Science Institutions (IASSI). S. Mahendra Dev, distinguished professor, ICFAI Faculty of Social Sciences, IFHE, Hyderabad, and former director and vice chancellor of the Indira Gandhi Institute of Development Research (IGIDR) in Mumbai, is the conference president. E. Revathi, director, CESS, is the chairperson of the organising committee and Dr B. Suresh Reddy, associate professor, CESS, organising secretary. It brings together over 200 researchers from universities and academic institutions. The three main themes are sustainable development, urbanisation and development, and women empowerment.

## GeM registers service growth of 1.5 lakh crore rupees in the current financial year 2023-24 till now



The Government e-marketplace (GeM) has registered a service growth of 47 per cent or 1.5 lakh crore rupees in the current financial year 2023-24 till now. It has provided services to multiple Central Public Sector Enterprises (CPSEs), Union Ministries, and State governments. Coal India Limited has emerged as the biggest buyer with orders worth more than 24 thousand crore rupees.

## Shri Nitin Gadkari inaugurates and lays the foundation stone for 26 National Highway Projects worth Rs.17,500 Crore in Guwahati, Assam

The Union Minister for Roads Transport and Highways, Shri Nitin Gadkari inaugurated and laid the foundation stone for 26 National Highway Projects with an investment of more than Rs. 17,500 Crore in Guwahati, Assam. The Union Minister of State for Roads Transport and Highways, General Shri VK Singh, the Chief Minister of Assam, Shri Himanta Biswa Sarma, State Cabinet Ministers, Member of



Parliaments, MLAs, and NHIDCL officials were also present on the occasion. The Dibrugarh-Tinsukia-Ledo project aims to enhance interstate connectivity between Upper Assam and Arunachal Pradesh, boost strategic presence, and promote trade and tourism.

## MCA's big reform mandates dematerialisation for private companies

The Ministry of Corporate Affairs has mandated private companies to go for dematerialisation of their securities. All private companies, excluding small and government companies, can issue new securities only in dematerialised form. The Ministry of Corporate Affairs said this in its recent amendment to a Rule concerning the issuance of securities. Private companies are required to facilitate the



dematerialisation of existing securities. The time period to comply with the recent directives is until the end of September 2024. After September 30, 2024, no private company will be able to issue or buy back its stocks until all of the promoters', directors', and key managerial employees' securities have been dematerialized.

## Central Railways commissions the BPAC system in the Vasind-Asangaon section

The Central Railway has commissioned the block proving by axle counter (BPAC) system in the Vasind-Asangaon section of the Mumbai Division. As per a release issued by the Central Railway, the BPAC system plays a pivotal role in maintaining the utmost safety of train operations. Specifically, it meticulously examines the last



vehicle of a section, subsequently confirming the section's clearance before granting authorization for another train to enter. Earlier, the BPAC system was exclusively deployed up to Vashind railway station within the Kalyan-Igatpuri section.





## PM Modi, Sheikh Hasina inaugurate key rail link, 2 other India-backed projects

Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Bangladesh's Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina virtually inaugurated a rail link connecting Northeast India with Bangladesh. Three Indian-assisted development projects were jointly inaugurated by Prime Ministers of India and Bangladesh via video conferencing. The three projects are the Akhaura-Agartala Cross-Border Rail Link, Port Khulna-Mongla Rail Line, and Unit-II of the Maitree Super Thermal Power Plant. It has been executed under the Government of India grant assistance of 392.52 crore rupees extended to Bangladesh. The total project cost of the Khulna-Mongla Port Rail Line is USD 388.92 million.



## India's first 50-year bond fully sold on growing insurer demand

India's first 50-year Government Security (G-Sec) fully sold. RBI accepted 54 bids worth ₹9,988 cr at the cut-off yield of 7.46%. The maiden auction of the 50-year G-Sec was held. Investors, especially insurance companies and pension funds have shown enthusiastic bidding. Before this auction, the longest available government bond was of 40-year duration. The notified amount

## PFRDA allows NPS subscribers to withdraw up to 60% of their pension corpus through the SLW facility

The Pension Fund Regulatory & Development Authority (PFRDA) allows a Systematic Lumpsum Withdrawal (SLW) facility for NPS subscribers; pensioners can withdraw up to 60% of funds periodically. Subscribers to the NPS now have the option to use the Systematic Lumpsum Withdrawal (SLW) facility to automatically take 60% of their pension corpus. National Pension System (NPS) subscribers can use the SLW facility



periodically (monthly, quarterly, half-yearly or annually) for a period till 75 years of age. Earlier, the lump sum amount could be withdrawn in a single tranche or could be withdrawn annually. In case of annual withdrawal, the NPS subscriber were required to start the withdrawal each time and authorised.

## Defence Minister Shri Rajnath Singh inaugurates 'India Manufacturing Show' in Bengaluru

The Union Defence Minister Shri Rajnath Singh inaugurated the three-day 'India Manufacturing Show' in Bengaluru, Karnataka. The show has been jointly organised by Laghu Udyog Bharti & IMS Foundation and supported by the Department of Defence Production, Ministry of Defence. The central theme of the event is 'Make in India, Make for the World'. Shri Rajnath Singh also referred to the Innovations



for Defence Excellence (iDEX) initiative, which was launched to invite new ideas in defence manufacturing through start-ups and innovators. iDEX Prime was launched to support projects, requiring support beyond Rs 1.5 crore up to Rs 10 crore, to help the start-ups in the defence sector.

will help SHGs gain better price realisation in the market through the event aims to showcase India as the 'food basket of the world' and celebrate 2023 as the International Year of Millets.

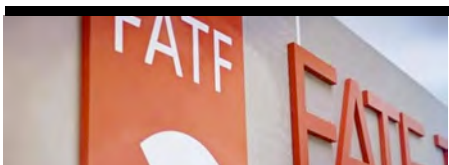

## Union Government may extend the export-boosting textile scheme

The Union Government is planning to extend the tenure of the Rebate of State and Central Levies and Taxes (RoSCTL) Scheme till 2025-26. It aims to reimburse all embedded State and Central taxes/levies for exports of manufactured goods and garments. The RoSCTL scheme was notified by the Ministry of Textiles in 2019. However, the scheme shall be implemented by the Department of Revenue, Ministry of Finance. This scheme has been introduced as a replacement for the previous Rebate of State Levies (RoSL) Scheme, which provided only rebates of state taxes.



## Cayman Islands: Removal from anti-money laundering "grey list"

The Financial Action Task Force (FATF) has removed the Cayman Islands from its grey list. It has added Bulgaria to the grey list in its review published on 27 October 2023. FATF has also removed Panama, Jordan and Albania from the grey list. FATF has added Bulgaria to the grey list. The Cayman Islands was added to the grey list in 2021. It was in the news during the investigation into charges made by Hindenburg Research against the Adani Group.

## NMC Will Launch Its One Nation, One Registration Platform For Doctors Across India

One nation, One registration platform' for doctors will be launched by the National Medical Commission. The regulatory body for medical education and medical professionals, the National Medical Commission, has launched "one nation, one registration platform". The aim of the platform is to eliminate duplication and allow the public to get information about any physician working in India. In the next six months, NMC will launch the National Medical Register (NMR) on a trial



basis. "Registration of Medical Practitioners and Licence to Practice Medicine Regulations, 2023" gazette notification was issued by the government. The National Medical Commission has also inked an MoU with the Quality Council of India (QCI) to give ratings to medical institutions in India.

## Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal to launch domestic sailing of first International Cruise Liner 'COSTA SERENA' in India at Mumbai

Union Minister of Ports, Shipping and Waterways, Sarbananda Sonowal will launch the domestic sailing of the first International Cruise Liner 'COSTA SERENA' in India at Mumbai. At the recently concluded Global Maritime India Summit 2023 organised by the Ministry, discussions revolved around reaching the target of 50 million cruise passengers in India by 2047. Costa Cruises is



expected to carry approximately 45,000 passengers in its next 2 months voyages. Such cruise initiatives are part of 'Dekho Apna Desh', launched on Prime Minister's appeal to the middle class to prefer domestic tourism over international.





## Rule allowing Indian companies to list overseas comes into force

The Union government recently permitted certain Indian companies to directly list on select foreign stock exchanges. The Union Finance Minister had announced that the government had decided to enable listed and unlisted domestic companies to directly list their equity shares on the International Financial Services Centre (IFSC), Ahmedabad. In a notification issued earlier this week, the Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) said the provision, which was announced in the Companies (Amendment) Bill, 2020, came into effect on October 30.



## IIT-Kharagpur Study Reveals Alarming Projected Rise In Indian Surface Temperatures By 2100

Surface temperatures over India were likely to increase by 1.1 to 5.1 degree Celsius by the year 2100, a new study by IIT-Kharagpur has indicated. A study was conducted by the Indian Institute of Technology, Kharagpur (IIT-KGP) recently. This study, titled 'Surface Temperature Increase over India during 1980-2020 and Future Projections: Causal Relationships Between Drivers and Trends,' was published in the journal *Nature* last month. The study was conducted in association with the Indian Institute of Tropical Meteorology in Pune.

**NexCAR19** is India's first indigenously-developed CAR-T cell therapy. Recently, the Central Drugs Standard Control Organisation (CDSO) granted market authorisation for **NexCAR19 to ImmunoACT**, a company incubated by **IIT Bombay**. This paves the way for the commercial launch of this therapy in India, where it is



expected to be available to cancer patients at a tenth of the cost abroad. CAR-T is a revolutionary therapy that modifies immune cells, specifically T-cells, by turning them into potent cancer fighters known as CAR-T cells.

## Fifth India-US 2 plus 2 Ministerial Dialogue to be held in New Delhi

The fifth India-US 2 plus 2 Ministerial Dialogue will be held in New Delhi. Raksha Mantri Rajnath Singh and External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar will welcome US Secretary of State **Antony Blinken** and Secretary of Defence **Lloyd Austin III** for



the Dialogue. The 2 plus 2 will enable a high-level review of progress being made in cross-cutting aspects of defence and security cooperation, technology value chain collaborations and people-to-people ties.



## Tata Memorial Hospital to set up Ayurveda-based cancer hospital in Khopoli

The Tata Memorial Hospital will soon establish the nation's first-ever hospital dedicated to the research and treatment of cancer through Ayurveda in Khopoli. The 100-bed hospital and research centre will be established on around 20-acre land in Khopoli. This complex will house a research centre dedicated to the exploration of Ayurvedic remedies for cancer. Anticipated completion for the hospital and research centre is scheduled for March 2026.



## IndiGo Parent InterGlobe to Operate Electric Air Taxis in India

InterGlobe Enterprises, the parent company of IndiGo, has announced its intention to introduce an all-electric air taxi service in India by 2026. In connection with its plans to operate the air taxi service, IndiGo has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Archer Aviation - a company that deals in electric aircrafts, air taxis. Once launched, the InterGlobe-Archer flight will carry passengers from Connaught Place in the national capital to Gurugram in Haryana in approximately 7 minutes whereas by road, the 27-kilometre-long trip will take 60-90 minutes.

## India set to open Seattle consulate, 7 years after it was announced

In 2016, India announced the opening of a consulate in Seattle in the US. The United States has also started the process of opening two new consulates in Bengaluru and Ahmedabad. US consulates are currently present in Chennai, Hyderabad, Kolkata, and Mumbai.

## I&B Ministry Releases Draft Broadcasting Services Bill for Public Consultation

The government has released the draft of the Broadcasting Services (Regulation) Bill, 2023. of these companies, 23 will start the production of servers, laptops, and tablets immediately and the rest will do so within the next 90 days.

## GAIL does the world's 1st ship-to-ship LNG transfer

India's top gas firm GAIL has done the world's first ship-to-ship liquefied natural gas (LNG) transfer to save on shipping costs and cut emissions as the state-owned entity looks at innovative ways as a pivot to boost business. GAIL has contracted 5.8 million tonnes per annum of LNG (natural gas super-cooled to liquid form) from the US. The ship typically travels a distance of about 19,554 nautical miles for a round trip to transport LNG from Sabine Pass in the US to India via the Suez Canal and Gibraltar. This journey



takes approximately 54 days and emits about 15,600 tonnes of CO<sub>2</sub>. This is the world's first STS between a large conventional LNG vessel and a Q-Flex LNG Vessel. This innovation plus the installation of the first floating CNG station helped GAIL win the 'Innovation Award - India and Midstream Project of the Year' at the Asian Oil and Gas Awards.

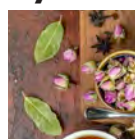

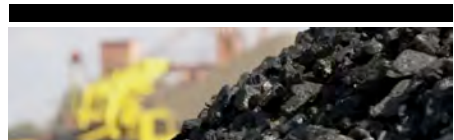

## Indian patent filings grow faster than others globally

Patent filings by Indian applicants grew by 31.6% in 2022, extending an 11-year run of growth unmatched by any other country among the top 10 filers, according to WIPO's (World Intellectual Property Organisation) annual World



Intellectual Property Indicators (WIPI) report. Overall, China, the US, Japan, the Republic of Korea and Germany were the countries with the highest numbers of patent filings in 2022. The largest rise in filings was reported from India. Switzerland (6.1%), China (3.1%), Austria (2.5%) and the UK (2.5%) also reported robust growth in filings.

## UGC notifies regulations for foreign universities to set up campuses in India

The University Grants Commission (UGC) issued regulations for foreign universities to establish and operate campuses in India. As per the regulations, foreign universities can collaborate to set up campuses in India, if they meet eligibility criteria individually. They should have secured a position within the top 500 in global rankings. Also, the final rules have



increased the time period for the standing committee to process applications from 45 days to 60 days. The recommendations of the committee should be placed before the UGC in 60 days, as opposed to 45 days in the draft regulations.

India's revised estimate of food subsidy for FY24 has increased by Rs 17000 crores to Rs 2.14 trillion. The revised food subsidy has increased due to an increase in the minimum support prices (MSP) for key crops. The food subsidy budget estimate for FY25 is likely to be around 7% more than the FY24 revised estimate. The increase in the food subsidy in the current financial year will not affect the government's aims of containing the fiscal deficit at 5.9% of GDP. Under Pradhan

## Government takes the apex cyber security agency out of public's right to know

THE CENTRE has exempted the Indian Computer Emergency Response Team (CERT-In), the national nodal agency to deal with cyber security threats like hacking and phishing, from the purview of the Right to Information Act, 2005. The Centre has used its powers given under subsection (2) of Section 24 of the RTI Act to exempt CERT-In from the purview of the transparency law. Using those powers, the Centre has included CERT-In at serial number 27 in the Second Schedule of the RTI Act. The CERT-In comes under the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology. These 26 intelligence and security organisations are: Intelligence Bureau; Research and Analysis Wing including its technical wing namely, the Aviation Research Centre of the Cabinet Secretariat; Directorate of Revenue Intelligence; Central Economic Intelligence Bureau; Directorate of Enforcement; Narcotics Control Bureau; Special Frontier Force; Border Security Force; Central Reserve Police Force; Indo-Tibetan Border



Police; Central Industrial Security Force; National Security Guards; Assam Rifles; Sashtra Seema Bal; Directorate General of Income-tax (Investigation); National Technical Research Organisation; Financial Intelligence Unit, India; Special Protection Group; Defence Research and Development Organisation; Border Road Development Board; National Security Council Secretariat; Central Bureau of Investigation; National investigation Agency; National Intelligence Grid; and Strategic Forces Command. Under Section 24 of the RTI Act, certain organisations are exempted from the law. The RTI law empowers the Central Government to amend the Second Schedule by including therein any other intelligence or security organisation established by it or omitting therefrom any organisation already specified therein.

## Survey of India, Genesys tie up for 3D digital twin-mapping programme in India

India and Australia are presently engaged in superior negotiations for a complete economic cooperation settlement (CECA) as a way to construct the **Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement (ECTA)** signed in April 2022.

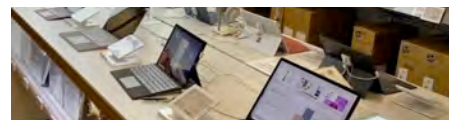

to brush up their knowledge. It uses Artificial Intelligence

(AI) to interact with students, and can be customised to each student's pace of learning. Pan India mock tests are conducted every weekend on SATHEE, with the same look and feel adopted by the National Testing Agency (NTA) for conducting the JEE.

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## 54th International Film Festival of India in collaboration with UNICEF screens five films

The foundation stone for the memorial at Ashuganj, Brahmanbaria was laid by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi and Bangladesh Prime Minister **Sheikh Hasina** in March 2021. The project aims to raise awareness of the 1971 Liberation War among the youth and will include facilities for children's recreation on the premises.

Western Sydney University (WSU), which is **ranked 375th globally**, is poised to become the **third Australian university** to set up a campus in India, following in the footsteps of Deakin University and the University

## CCI becomes a member of the International Competition Network's steering group

The **Competition Commission of India (CCI)** has become a part of the prestigious **18-member steering committee of the International Competition Network (ICN) at the ICN Annual Conference 2023 in Barcelona, Spain** after consistent efforts. The ICN was officially established in October 2001 and includes officials from 15 competition agencies worldwide. The concept for the ICN



originated from recommendations made by the **International Competition Policy Advisory Committee (ICPAC)**, a group formed in 1997. The steering committee serves as the apex body of the ICN, guiding its policies and activities.

A **phreatomagmatic eruption** built a new island near Japan's Ogasawara Island group. The Ogasawara island chain, also known as the **Bonin Islands**, constitutes a volcanic arc comprising over 30 islands and islets, some of which remain volcanically active. The Ogasawara Islands are recognized as a **UNESCO World Heritage site in Japan**.



## United Kingdom to Add India to its List of Safe Countries

The United Kingdom (UK) has decided to include India in its list of safe states. Apart from India, Georgia has also been included in the list of safe states of the UK. Other nations deemed safe by the UK include **Albania, Switzerland** along with **European Union (EU) and European Economic Area (EEA) states**.

## Bhutan's King Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuck Holds Meeting with Prime Minister Narendra Modi in New Delhi

Bhutan's King Jigme Khesar Namgyel Wangchuck visited India and held a bilateral meeting with Prime Minister Narendra Modi in Delhi. The meeting is of significant geostrategic importance, considering the growing concerns about China's efforts to strengthen its ties with Bhutan. India and Bhutan agreed to upgrade border and immigration posts to



enhance security and ease of movement across their shared border. Both countries discussed new routes for regional connectivity, which can promote economic and trade ties in the region.

## Norway to Support India's 'Hunger Project' for Women Leaders, Environmental Protection, and Food Security in Uttarakhand

Norway commits to providing financial support for India's **'Hunger Project'** aimed at strengthening women leaders, environmental protection, and promoting food security in Uttarakhand. The South African Environment Ministry has entered into Biodiversity Management Agreements (BMAs) with three landowners in Limpopo province. These agreements aim to secure the protection of privately-owned lions and rhinos. The Department of Forestry, Fisheries, and the Environment collaborated with the Sustainable Finance Coalition and Wilderness Foundations Africa in developing these biodiversity management agreements. In order to activate the agreements applicants have to sign a management plan of at least a five-year duration with the department. The incentive falls under the category of Threatened Species and Other Effective Area-based Conservation Measures (OECMs).

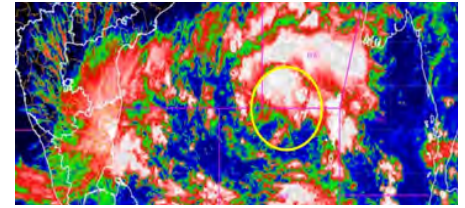

## Indian Meteorological Department Announces the Formation of Cyclone Midhili in the Northwest Bay of Bengal

The Indian Meteorological Department (IMD) has officially declared the development of **Cyclone Midhili in the northwest Bay of Bengal**. Under the influence of Cyclone Midhili, heavy rainfall is forecasted in coastal regions, specifically in **Odisha, West Bengal, Tripura, and Mizoram**. Wind speeds associated with the cyclone are expected to range between **40 kmph and 70 kmph** in the affected areas. The name 'Midhili' for the cyclone was given by the Maldives, following the established practice of naming cyclones in the region. The next cyclone in the sequence will be named 'Michaung,' a name provided by Myanmar as part of the regional collaboration in cyclone nomenclature. A cyclone is defined as a rapid inward air circulation in and around a low-pressure (LP) area. Cyclones are limited to the atmosphere between **30° N and 30° S latitudes**.

### Cyclones in India :

### Types of Cyclones :

- **Tropical Cyclones** : Characterised by winds exceeding 74 mph and heavy rainfall.

- **Very Severe Cyclonic Storms** : Even more powerful, leading to extreme wind speeds and torrential rainfall.
- **Super Cyclones** : The most intense and destructive cyclones with wind speeds exceeding 131 mph, causing widespread devastation.

## APEDA Facilitates Inaugural Shipment of Fresh Bananas to the Netherlands

In a significant boost to the prospects of fresh fruit exports, the Agricultural and Processed Food Products Export Authority (APEDA) has facilitated the export of the first trial shipment of fresh bananas to the Netherlands via a sea route. The trial shipment of bananas to Europe was carried out by the APEDA-registered 'INI Farms - a top exporter of fruits and vegetables from India. Despite being the world's largest banana producer, India's export share is currently only one percent in the global market.



India accounts for 26.45% of the world's banana production at 35.36 million metric tonnes (MMT). Andhra Pradesh is the largest banana-producing state in India, followed by Maharashtra, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu, and Uttar Pradesh. These five states collectively contribute around 67% to India's banana production in the fiscal year 2022-23

## 54th International Film Festival of India is Scheduled for November 20th to 28th in Goa

The 54th International Film Festival of India (IFFI) is scheduled to take place in Goa from November 20 to 28, 2023 as announced by Union Minister of Information and Broadcasting Shri Anurag Thakur. 54th International Film Festival of India (IFFI) from 20 to 28 Nov, 2023 at Goa. This year, a new category has been introduced for the Best Web Series (OTT) Award, receiving 32 entries from 15 OTT platforms in 10 languages. The winner will be awarded a certificate and a cash prize of Rs 10 lakh.

The 2-gigawatt Al Dhafra Solar Photovoltaic Independent Power Project (IPP) is located 35 kilometres from Abu Dhabi city and will generate enough electricity to power almost 200,000 homes. The plant is expected to displace **2.4 million tonnes of carbon emissions annually**. The project was inaugurated by **Sheikh Hazza bin Zayed Al Nahyan**, Deputy Ruler of Abu Dhabi, and in the presence of Lt. General Sheikh Saif bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of the Interior. The project was developed by **Abu Dhabi Future Energy Company (Masdar) and its partners Abu Dhabi National Energy Company (TAQA), EDF Renewables and JinkoPower**. The country will host the United Nations Climate Change Conference from **November 30th to December 12, 2023**.

## Marie Sklodowska-Curie Stamps & First Day Envelopes Released

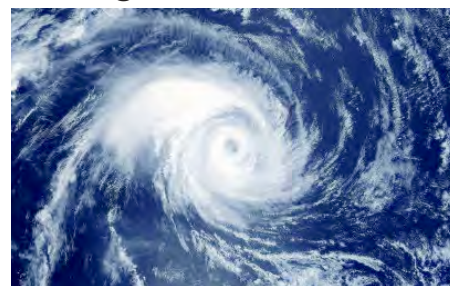
For the first time in over two decades, the **United Nations and the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA)** are collaborating on a new collection coming to the stamp counter. The **United Nations Postal Administration** will issue a definitive set of Marie Sklodowska-Curie stamps and first-day envelopes adorned with a new IAEA distinctive cachet on 7 November 2023. The collection commemorates the anniversary of Marie Sklodowska-Curie's birth and recognizes her significant contributions to nuclear science.



To this day, she is also the only person ever to receive two Nobel Prizes in different fields of science, one in physics in 1903 and one in chemistry in 1911. The special envelope also pays tribute to the **Marie Sklodowska-Curie Fellowship Programme (MSCFP)**, which upholds the IAEA's commitment to promoting diversity and empowering women in nuclear science by aiming to increase the number of women in the field.

The cyclonic storm is expected to affect regions in India, Bangladesh, and Myanmar. Cyclonic storm 'Michaung' originated in the Gulf of Thailand, contributing to its development. A cyclone is defined as a rapid inward air circulation in and around a low-pressure (LP) area. Cyclones are limited to the atmosphere between **30° N and 30° S latitudes**. Cyclones usually form in the months between April and December. A pre-monsoon spike in cyclonic conditions occurs in May while a post-monsoon peak takes place in November. The GPS tracker anklet is a wearable device affixed around the ankle of the person to be monitored and track their movement. The device is already being used in the **United States of America (USA), United Kingdom (UK), South Africa, Australia and New Zealand** to track the movement of accused persons on bail, parole and house arrest and accordingly de-congests prisons to a large extent.

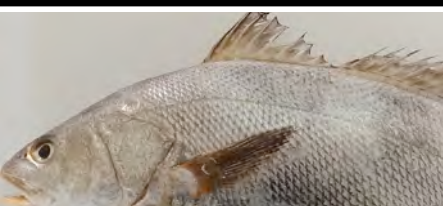

## Kerala State Authorities Undertake Initiatives to Expand Cultivation of GI-Tagged Onattukara Sesame

Kerala state authorities are actively working to expand the cultivation of Geographical Indication (GI)-tagged Onattukara sesame. Mavelikara Thekkekara grama panchayat president K. Mohankumar announced a financial assistance program providing ₹40 for a cent of land to farmers cultivating sesame. The cultivation project is a collaborative effort involving various entities, including the



local Krishi Bhavan, Onattukara Vikasana Agency (OVA), Onattukara Regional Agricultural Research Station (ORARS), Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Kayamkulam, and Mavelikara Thekkekara panchayat.

## Uttar Pradesh Government Prohibits Halal Branding on Food Products

The Uttar Pradesh government has imposed a ban on halal-branded food items. The State Food Commissioner's office has banned halal-labelled food items such as dairy products, sugar, bakery items, peppermint oil, savouries and edible oil. The State Food Commissioner's office issued an order, citing that halal labelling contradicts legislation passed in 2006 aimed at ensuring product quality. **Reasons for Ban** : Halal labelling is considered to create confusion among



consumers and is deemed contrary to the principles of the state government's law on the quality of edible products. Halal certification serves as a guarantee that the product is prepared in accordance with Islamic law and is free from adulteration. It is typically issued by a third-party body.

## Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknath Shinde Inaugurates Shivaji Maharaj Statue in Jammu & Kashmir's Kupwara

The statue was installed in Kupwara in a collaboration with Amhi Punekar organization, and 41 Rashtriya Rifle Maratha Battalion. The statue was sent to Kupwara from Maharashtra on October 20 and was handed over to the RR41MLI Regiment for the installation. Previously, two other statues of Chhatrapati Maharaj were unveiled by the Maratha Regiment in Jammu and Kashmir in January 2022.

## Uttarakhand Products Secure Geographical Indication (GI) Tags

From a local brick tea to textiles made from a Himalayan plant, over 15 products from Uttarakhand have been given the coveted GI tag by the Geographical Indications Registry. Uttarakhand's Berinag tea, highly sought-after by London tea houses and tea blenders, is made from the leaves of a plant that grows wild in the Himalayas, which are then compressed into a solid mass. Bichhubuti fabrics, made from Himalayan nettle fibres, was also on the list of products that bagged the GI tag. As the plant's fibres are hollow, they have the unique ability to accumulate air inside, thus creating a natural insulation and making an ideal clothing material for both winters and summers. The Uttarakhand



mandua, a finger millet grown in Garhwal and Kumaon that is part of the staple diet in many parts of the State, was among the products granted GI tags. Similarly, jhangora, a home grown millet commonly cultivated in the rain-fed areas of the Himalayas in Uttarakhand, got a tag. Gahat is one of the most important pulses growing in the dry regions of the State, whose medicinal uses have been known to Ayurveda and traditional physicians for centuries. Uttarakhand lal chawal, a red rice organically grown in the Purola region, was also on the list.

## Uttar Pradesh Government To Transform Bundelkhand Expressway Into Solar Expressway & Targeting 550 MW Of Solar Power Generation

The Uttar Pradesh (UP) government is planning to install solar plants spanning 1700 hectares along the Bundelkhand Expressway. The solar plants are expected to collectively generate 550 MW of solar power, contributing significantly to the state's renewable energy capacity. ## RBI to directly regulate entities facilitating cross-border payment transactions



The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has expanded its regulatory oversight to directly cover all entities involved in facilitating cross-border payment transactions for the import and export of goods and services. These entities will be designated as Payment Aggregator-Cross Border (PA-CB) under the new regulation.

## RBI Permits District Central Cooperative Banks (DCCBs) to Close Branches Without Prior Notice to the Central Bank

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has granted permission to District Central Cooperative Banks (DCCBs) to close unprofitable branches without the need for prior approval from the central bank. However, DCCBs must obtain approval from the Registrar of Cooperative



Societies of the concerned state before closing branches.

## Mahindra Finance Collaborates with State Bank of India for Co-Lending Partnership

Mahindra Finance, a prominent Non-Banking Finance Company (NBFC) within the Mahindra Group, has entered into a strategic co-lending partnership with State Bank of India (SBI), India's largest public sector bank. To provide affordable financial solutions to NBFC customers. Notably, this collaboration marks Mahindra



Finance's first co-lending tie-up with a bank. The co-lending model is designed to leverage the distribution strength of NBFCs and the cost-efficient capital of banks.

## HSBC introduces e-Bank Guarantees to digitise trade finance

The Hongkong and Shanghai Banking Corporation Limited, India (HSBC India) has introduced Electronic Bank Guarantee (E-BG) services to facilitate the digitization of trade finance. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has imposed monetary penalties on 4 co-operative banks and a non-banking financial company (NBFC) for deficiencies in regulatory compliance. **Shree Lodra Nagarik Sahakari Bank Limited**, located in Gandhinagar, Gujarat, received a monetary penalty of ₹4.00 lakh. **Malpur Nagarik Sahakari Bank Limited**, located in Aravalli, Gujarat, received a monetary penalty of ₹3.50 lakh. **Jolarpet Co-operative Urban Bank Limited** in Vellore, Tamil Nadu, received a monetary penalty of ₹50,000. **Limbasi Urban Co-operative Bank Ltd.**, situated in Kheda, Gujarat, received a monetary penalty of ₹25,000. **Early Salary Services Private Limited**, based in Pune, was penalized with a monetary penalty of ₹3.20 lakh.

## RBI's Global Hackathon 2023: Indian FinTechs dominate winners with innovative apps

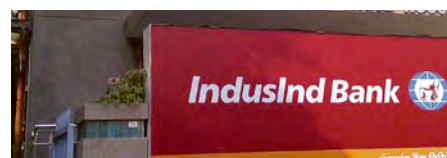
The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has announced the results of its Global Hackathon 2023, which focused on innovative FinTech solutions. The hackathon aimed to address various challenges, from inclusive digital services to compliance and CBDC (Central Bank Digital Currency) transactions. The second edition of RBI's global hackathon, named "HARBINGER 2023 – Innovation for Transformation," had the theme of 'Inclusive Digital Services.' This theme emphasized creating



financial services that are accessible and beneficial to a wide range of users. The hackathon received a significant response, with 154 proposals submitted by teams from both within India and 28 participating teams/entities from various countries, including Australia, Canada, Germany, Singapore, Sweden, the United Kingdom (UK), and the United States (US).

## RBI Grants Approval to SBI Mutual Fund for Acquisition of 9.99% Paid-Up Share Capital in IndusInd Bank

SBI Mutual Fund has received approval from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to acquire a stake of up to 9.99% in IndusInd Bank, a private sector lender. The approval is conditional on compliance with RBI regulations, as well as foreign exchange and capital market regulations. As per RBI guidance, SBI MF will acquire the shareholding in IndusInd Bank



within a period of one year, i.e., by Oct. 10, 2024. SBI MF must ensure that the aggregate holding in the bank does not exceed 9.99% of the paid-up share capital or voting rights of the bank at all times.

## India's Pioneering Bad Bank, the Stressed Asset Stabilization Fund (SASF), Nears Conclusion of its Two-Decade Journey

India's first bad bank, the Stressed asset stabilisation fund (SASF), a special purpose vehicle for housing bad loans that was created two decades ago is being wound down as it approaches the end of its lifecycle. The Stressed Asset Stabilization Fund (SASF) was established as a trust by the Government of India in September 2004. Its primary purpose was to isolate bad loans of IDBI Bank and create a separate entity to help the bank



achieve a cleaner balance sheet. SASF was set up with a defined life cycle of 20 years. A process has been initiated to evaluate about 400 non-performing loans that were transferred to the trust, and these loans have continued to remain non-performing. NARCL's purpose is to segregate and manage bad loans from multiple banks.





## Paysharp Private Limited Attains ISO 27001 Certification for Payment Aggregation

Paysharp Private Limited, an RBI in-principle approved payment aggregator based in Chennai, has achieved **ISO / IEC 27001: 2022 certification**, an internationally recognised standard for **information security management systems**. Paysharp primarily facilitates **non-card-based payments**, such as UPI (Unified Payments Interface) payments. Paysharp is an existing payment aggregator that has received in-principle approval from the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) to onboard merchants onto its platform.

## SBI Expands Dollar Bond Issue to \$1 Billion in Response to Declining US Yields



The State Bank of India (SBI) has increased its **dollar bond issue size**

to **\$1 billion from \$750 million**, with plans to secure the funds in the first week of December. SBI is making its second foray into international markets this financial year, with \$750 million underwritten by global banks and an additional \$250 million available through a green shoe option arranged by banks such as **HSBC and JP Morgan**. The bonds issued by SBI will be benchmarked against 5-year US Treasury bonds, likely priced at a spread of approximately above the benchmark, with a tenor of 5 years.

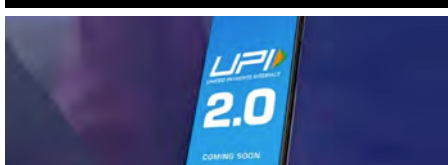
advantages to cardholders with varied spending needs, right from mass to

These banks are now permitted to close their unremunerative branches without seeking prior permission from the central bank, although they will require approval from the Registrar of Cooperative Societies of the respective state. This decision is aimed at streamlining the functioning of DCCBs and ensuring that the process of branch closure is conducted responsibly and transparently.



## UPI Transactions Through voice command from April 2024

The National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) has issued a circular directing banks, payment service providers, and other stakeholders to enable the 'Hello! UPI' feature in their apps by March 31. Starting from April, individuals will have the capability to make UPI transactions through voice commands. Reserve Bank of India (RBI) governor Shaktikanta Das had previously announced the launch of several new products, including 'Hello! UPI,' by the NPCI during the Global Fintech Festival in September.

## Cooperative Banks Must Approach RBI's Department of Supervision for Name Change

Cooperative banks wishing to change their names are required to contact the Department of Supervision (DoS) at the Reserve Bank of India (RBI). The name change requests of cooperative banks cannot be approved by the Central Registrar of Cooperative Societies (CRCS) or the Registrar of Cooperative Societies (RCS). The RBI has issued a directive



to urban co-operative banks, state co-operative banks, and district central co-operative banks regarding the "Banking Regulation (Amendment) Act 2020 - Change in Name of Co-operative Banks."

## IRDAI Establishes 12-Member Committee for Streamlining Insurance Policy Wordings

The Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI) has established a 12-member committee with the specific purpose of simplifying insurance policy wordings. The committee will be chaired by L Viswanathan, who is a member of the Insurance Advisory Committee (IAC). The committee's composition



includes the Secretary Generals of the Life Insurance and General Insurance Council, the president of the Insurance Brokers Association of India (IBAI), and the Principal Officer of the State Bank of India (Corporate Agent).

## RBI Report Indicates Forex Reserves Import Cover at 10.2 Months as of June-end 2023

India's forex reserves cover of imports on balance of payments basis has grown to 10.2 months as at June-end 2023. India's forex reserves cover of imports was at 9.6 months at end-March 2023. **Correlation with Forex Reserves Increase:** The growth in import cover is correlated with the rise in India's forex reserves, which reached \$595.051 billion at the end of June 2023 compared to \$578.449 billion at the end of March 2023. **Trade-Based Indicator - Import Cover:** Import cover, serving as a trade-based indicator, reflects the adequacy of reserves to cover the country's imports. **RBI's Gold**



**Holding :** According to RBI's Half Yearly Report on Management of Foreign Exchange Reserves: April - September 2023, RBI's gold holding increased to 800.79 tonnes of gold as of end-September 2023. **Debt-to-Reserves Ratio Improvement :** The ratio of short-term debt (original maturity) to reserves decreased to 20.8% at the end of June 2023, showing improvement from 22.2% at the end of March 2023.





## Walmart-owned PhonePe crossed 500 million lifetime registered users in 7 years

PhonePe, a fintech firm owned by Walmart, achieved a significant milestone with over **500 million registered users** on its platform. This milestone translates to 1 in 3 Indians being users of PhonePe, marking a substantial presence in the country. PhonePe stands out as the **first Indian internet company** to achieve such a large user base on a global scale.

## India's first 50-year bond fully sold on growing insurer demand



India's first **150-year Government Security (G-Sec)** was fully subscribed in an auction held. The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) accepted **54 bids for a total of ₹9,988 crore** at a cut-off yield of **7.46%**. The auction witnessed strong demand from investors, particularly insurance companies and pension funds. Prior to this auction, the longest available government bond in India had a duration of 40 years.

## LIC reports highest ever Half Yearly Profit After Tax at Rs 17,469 crore



The **Life Insurance Corporation (LIC)** achieved its **highest-ever half-yearly profit** in the first half of FY24, reporting a net profit of **₹17,469 crore**. This is its highest ever half-yearly profit. This was primarily due to the transfer of ₹13,768 crore from non-participating policyholders' fund to shareholders' account, which related to accretion on available solvency margin.

## IRDAI Establishes Committee to Boost Banks' Involvement in Insurance Product Sales

The Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI) has established a **high-level panel** with an objective to recommend measures to enhance the involvement of banks in making insurance products more readily accessible across India. Despite the extensive branch network of banks covering various regions of the country, their



contribution as corporate agents in the insurance sector remains relatively low. In the year 2022-23, banks accounted for only **5.93%** of non-life insurance premiums and **17.44%** of new business premiums for life insurance.

## SBI raises ₹10,000 crore via tier 2 bonds at a 7.8% coupon rate

India's largest public sector lender State Bank of India (SBI) announced that it has raised **₹10,000 crore** at a coupon rate of **7.81%** through its first **Basel III compliant Tier 2 Bond** for the current financial year – FY 2023-24. They have a tenor of 15 years, with the first call option available after 10 years. SBI's Tier 2 Bond issuance received an overwhelming response from



investors. It attracted bids worth **₹15,907 crore**, which is nearly 4 times the base issue size of ₹4,000 crore. There were a total of 98 bids for the bonds. It is to be known that this is the **first Tier 2 Bond issuance** by the Bank in the current financial year.

## NPCI's Bharat BillPay Teams Up with MyJio and Arzoo to Enter the business-to-business Sector

**NPCI Bharat BillPay Ltd. (NBBL)**, a wholly-owned subsidiary of National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI), has launched a new set of services under the **business-to-business (B2B) payments category**. NPCI Bharat BillPay will provide customized B2B services that include features like flexible invoice presentation, complaint management, and



Management Information System (MIS) capabilities, among others. The category is going live for the first time on the MyJio app for the Biller Arzoo with Axis Bank as the **Biller Operating Unit (BOU)**.

## Fedbank Financial IPO Set to Open on November 22 with a Price Band of Rs 133 to Rs 140

Fedbank Financial Services, a Non-Banking Financial Company (NBFC), will open its **initial public offering (IPO) of equity shares** on November 22, 2023, and close on November 24, 2023. The price band for the IPO



has been set at **Rs 133 to Rs 140 per equity share**, with a face value of Rs 10 each. The company aims to raise approximately **Rs 1,092 crore** from the IPO.



## S&P Global Forecasts Reduction in Indian Banks' NPAs to 3.5% and Net Interest Margin to 2.9% by FY25

Non-performing assets (NPAs) are **loan accounts where the principal or interest is due for a period of three months or more**. Import banks have been directed by the RBI to permit qualified jewellers importing

## RBI Levies ₹90.92 Lakh Penalty on Axis Bank and ₹42.78 Lakh Fine on Manappuram Finance for Regulatory Non-Compliance

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has imposed a monetary penalty of ₹90.92 lakh on Axis Bank Limited. The penalty is a result of non-compliance with certain directions issued by the RBI on various aspects, including '**Reserve Bank of India (Know Your Customer (KYC)) Directions, 2016**', '**Loans and Advances – Statutory and Other Restrictions**', '**Guidelines on Managing Risks and Code of Conduct in Outsourcing of Financial Services by banks**', and '**Code of Conduct for Opening and Operating Current Accounts**'. The penalty has been imposed under the powers vested in the RBI, as conferred by the provisions of **Section 47 A (1) (c) read with Section 46 (4) (i) of the Banking**

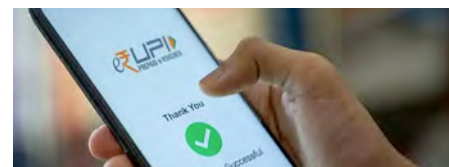

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) had launched the UPI Lite functionality in **September**



**2022** during its Monetary Policy Meet (MPC). According to the Federal Bank press release, the **transaction limits** for UPI Lite are as follows :

- **Per transaction limit:** up to Rs 500
- **Maximum cumulative usage per day:** Rs 4,000
- **Maximum balance in UPI Lite account at any point in time:** Rs 2,000

silver to remit advance payment for **11 days**. **Eligibility Criteria for Qualified Jewellers :** Qualified Jewellers eligible for importing silver are those as notified by the International Financial Services Centres Authority (IFSCA).

## RBI Instructs Bajaj Finance to Halt Lending Through 'eCOM' and 'Insta EMI Card' Products

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI), under section 45L(1) (b) of the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934, has directed Bajaj Finance Limited to cease the sanction and disbursement of loans under its **'eCOM'** and **'Insta EMI Card'** products. The directive is effective immediately, requiring Bajaj Finance to stop the sanction and disbursement of loans under the specified products. In December 2020, the RBI had directed private sector banking heavyweight HDFC Bank to cease new activities aimed at building digital businesses and told it to



stop taking on new credit card customers after the lender faced multiple data centre glitches. The central bank had lifted all the restrictions placed on HDFC Bank in March 2022. In March 2022, **Paytm Payments Bank** was barred from adding new customers by the RBI due to likely gaps in its technology systems.

## Centre for Advanced Financial Research and Learning Unveils Inaugural India Finance Report (IFR) Centered on Non-Bank Financial Companies (NBFCs) Sector

Presently, SBI offers Yono Global services in 9 countries. In September 2019, it started with the UK operations. SBI is continuing to invest in Yono Global to offer the best services available, SBI's deputy MD (IT) Vidya Krishnan stated at the three-day Singapore Fintech Festival (SFF).

## IREDA Unveils ₹2,150-Crore IPO with a Price Band of ₹30-32

State-run Indian Renewable Energy Development Agency (IREDA) has fixed a price band of ₹30-32 per share for its initial public offer (IPO). Investors can bid for a minimum of 460 shares in the IPO. This marks the first IPO by a government-run company since LIC’s entry into the market in May of the preceding year. IREDA is a mini-ratna under the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy (MNRE). It holds the status of a systemically important non-



deposit-taking non-banking finance firm (NBFC-ND-SI) and operates as an infrastructure finance company (IFC). An Initial Public Offering (IPO) involves the sale of securities to the public in the primary market. The primary market deals with new securities being issued for the first time and is known as the new issues market.

The program will be executed by NIFTEM Technology Innovation and Business Incubation Foundation (NTIBIF), a section 8 company technology business incubator (TBI) established by NIFTEM to foster entrepreneurship in the food processing sector.

## Government of India (GoI) and Asian Development Bank Ink \$400 Million Loan Agreement to Enhance Urban Services through Improved Infrastructure, Service Delivery, and Governance Systems



India signed a \$400 million policy-based loan agreement with

the Asian Development Bank (ADB) to create high-quality urban infrastructure, improve service delivery, and promote efficient governance systems. Sub-programme 1, approved in 2021 with \$350 million financing, focused on establishing national-level policies and guidelines to improve urban services. Sub-programme 2 supports investment planning and reform actions at the state and urban local body (ULB) levels. The loan agreement for sub-programme 2 was signed between Juhi Mukherjee, joint secretary, department of economic affairs, ministry of finance, and Takeo Konishi, country director of ADB's India resident mission.

## Paytm Becomes Official Sponsor For 37th National Games



Paytm has been designated as the official sponsor for the 37th

National Games held in Goa. The 37th National Games were inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi at the Jawaharlal Nehru Stadium in Fatorda. This marks the first time that the National Games are being organized in the state of Goa. The event is scheduled to take place from October 26 to November 9, 2023.

## US International Development Finance Corporation Commits \$553 Million Funding for Adani Group's Port Terminal Project

The United States International Development Finance Corporation (DFC) has committed \$553 million (around Rs 4,600 crore) for the development of the Adani Group's deepwater shipping container terminal in the Port of Colombo, Sri Lanka. The West Container Terminal in the Port of Colombo is being developed by a consortium comprising Adani Ports and SEZ, John Keells Holdings, and the Sri Lanka Ports Authority. Adani Ports holds a 51% stake in the container terminal of the port, which also has a terminal run by China Merchants Port Holdings Co Ltd.



China Merchants Holdings Co Ltd and Sri Lanka Ports Authority are jointly developing Colombo's South Container Terminal, the first terminal under expansion in the Colombo port. The consortium will develop Colombo West International Terminal (CWIT) on a build, operate and transfer (BOT) basis for a period of 35 years. When commissioned, CWIT will be the largest and deepest container terminal in Sri Lanka.

## UCO Bank Suspends Online IMPS Transfers Due to Flawed Payments Emergence

The government-owned UCO Bank has suspended online Immediate Payment System (IMPS) transfers temporarily. The suspension was initiated after a technical issue was identified from November 10 to 13, 2023. During this period, funds from transactions initiated by customers of other banks were erroneously credited to UCO Bank account holders, while the bank did not actually receive the money. UCO Bank has taken a precautionary measure by making the IMPS channel offline. What does IMPS mean? IMPS, is an electronic fund transfer process through which money



is sent to the payee/beneficiary account instantly and in real-time. The National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) offers this service What are the services available under IMPS? IMPS offer an instant, 24\*7 interbank electronic fund transfer service capable of processing person-to-person, person to account and person to merchant remittances via mobile, internet and ATMs. What is the Daily Transaction Limit of IMPS?

## SEBI to Implement Regulatory Framework for Index Providers

Markets watchdog Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) approved providing flexibility to **Not for Profit Organisations (NPOs)** in raising funds through the social stock exchange and also decided to introduce a regulatory framework for index providers. SEBI will provide flexibility for fundraising by NPOs through the social stock exchange. In this regard, the minimum issue size in case of public issuance of **Zero Coupon Zero Principal Instruments (ZCZP)** for NPOs on the social stock exchange will be reduced to **Rs 50 lakh from Rs 1 crore**. Starting from September 2024, all fresh investments made by **Alternate Investment Funds (AIFs)** will be required to be held in dematerialized (demat) form. These platforms will be registered under the framework for **small and medium Real Estate Investment Trusts (REITs)**.



## Federal Bank Enters Exclusive Collaboration with Shuttler H S Prannoy

Federal Bank collaborated with India's Top Seeded Shuttler, **H.S. Prannoy**. H.S. Prannoy is currently world number 8 and a recipient of the **men's singles bronze medal** in the recent Asian Games. has been developed to **reduce risks** faced by investors in the eventuality of technical glitches at the trading member's end at both the primary site and disaster recovery site. **Purpose** : To provide investors with an opportunity to square off/close their open positions and cancel pending orders using the IRRA platform in case of technical glitches or unforeseen outages that render the trading member's site inaccessible. ## Sorin Startup Fund to Receive Backing from Small Industries Development Bank of India and National Small Industries Corporation Subsidiary

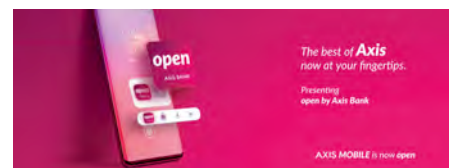

The bank has set a timeline of **six and a half months** for EY to complete the sale of the distressed debt portfolio. SASF, a **special-purpose vehicle**, was established two decades ago following the merger of term-lending institution IDBI Ltd with its subsidiary IDBI Bank to form a commercial bank. In 2004, the government permitted IDBI to transfer its distressed loans to IDBI Trust, managing ₹9,000 crore of distressed loans acquired under SASF from IDBI. The fund is undergoing winding down as it completes its **20-year life cycle**.

## ADB and GEF Collaborate to Launch Asia and the Pacific Natural Capital Fund



The **Asian Development Bank (ADB)** and the **Global Environment Facility (GEF)** have announced the establishment of the **Natural Capital Fund (NCF)**, which is a concessional fund designed to support projects that enhance food security while also protecting and restoring natural capital in **ADB's developing member countries (DMCs)**. GEF is supporting the NCF with an investment of **\$15 million**. The announcement was made at the **Asia-Pacific Natural Capital Forum** held on 7–9 November 2023, co-hosted by ADB and Stanford University's **Natural Capital Project**.

## RBI Grants Approval for Hinduja Group Directors to Join Board of Bankrupt Reliance Capital

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) grants approval for Hinduja Group's resolution plan for **Reliance Capital (RCap)**, paving the way for the group's takeover of RCap. RBI approves Hinduja Group to appoint **5 directors** on the board of RCap, contingent upon the **National Company Law Tribunal's (NCLT)** approval of the resolution plan. The 5 directors approved by RBI from the Hinduja Group are **Amar Chintopanth, Shardchandra V Zaregaonkar, Moses Newling Harding John, Bhumika Batra, and Arun Tiwari**.



Reliance Capital is the **third large non-banking financial company (NBFC)** against which the central bank has initiated bankruptcy proceedings under the **Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code (IBC)**. The other two were **Srei Group NBFC** and **Dewan Housing Finance Corporation (DHFL)**.

## First Tranche of Sovereign Gold Bond Investors Anticipate Golden Harvest

RBI imposed a fine of ₹1 crore on Indian Overseas Bank for non-compliance with certain directions issued by it on 'loans and advances – statutory and other restrictions'. Citibank is fined ₹5 crore for

## Madhya Pradesh Records the Lowest Daily Wages for Rural Agricultural Workers – RBI Data Compilation

According to the data compiled by the Reserve bank of India (RBI), the daily wages of rural agricultural workers in Madhya Pradesh are the lowest in the country. Comparison of Male Agricultural Worker Wages : As per the data the daily wage of male agricultural workers in rural areas in MP is just Rs 229.2 in the year ended March 2023. The daily wage of male agricultural workers in rural areas in Gujarat is Rs 241.9 in the year ended March 2023. National Average and State Disparities : The national average daily wage for



agricultural workers is Rs 345.7. Kerala pays the highest at Rs 764.3, while Uttar Pradesh and Maharashtra pay Rs 309.3 and Rs 303.5, respectively. Average wages of farm workers in Jammu and Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh and Tamil Nadu are Rs 550.4, Rs 473.3 and Rs 470 per person, respectively. Kerala again leads in non-agricultural workers' daily wages with Rs 696.6 per person.

## Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Takes Control of Mumbai's Abhyudaya Cooperative Bank, Disbands Board for a period of 12 Months

In yet another instance of the regulator taking action against a bank due to governance-related concerns, the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) had superseded the board of Abhyudaya Cooperative Bank for a period of 12 months. Satya Prakash Pathak, former Chief General Manager of State Bank of India, has been appointed as the Administrator to manage the affairs of Abhyudaya Cooperative Bank during this period. Legal Basis for RBI Intervention : The RBI invoked its powers under Section 36AAA, in conjunction with Section 56 of the Banking Regulation Act,



1949, specifically applicable to cooperative societies. In addition to the Administrator, the RBI has appointed a "Committee of Advisors" to assist in discharging duties. The committee members include Venkatesh Hegde (former General Manager, SBI), Mahendra Chhajed (Chartered Accountant), and Suhas Gokhale (former MD, COSMOS Co-operative Bank Limited).

At least 40 per cent of the proceeds is allocated for women borrowers, while the rest will support farmers, micro, small and medium-sized enterprises (MSMEs), and loans to purchase new two-wheelers, among others.

## HSBC India Collaborates with UK Export Finance to Aid Indian MSMEs



**T**he Hongkong and Shanghai Banking Corporation

Limited, India (HSBC India) and UK Export Finance (UKEF), the United Kingdom's export credit agency, intend to establish a financing programme of up to £100 million to support Indian Micro, Small and Medium enterprises (MSMEs) and corporates for financing their imports from the UK. This partnership is expected to enhance the availability of credit for Indian MSMEs and boost trade ties between the two countries. HSBC India and UKEF signed a Letter of Intent (LoI) to enable them to work together on opportunities relating to UKEF's guarantee-backed structures. India was UK's 12th largest trading partner in the four quarters to the end of Q2 2023, accounting for 2.1% of total UK trade.

## World Bank and Bangladesh Ink 5 Financing Deals Exceeding \$1.1 Billion

**Khan**, Senior Secretary of the Bangladesh Government, and **Abdoulaye Seck**, World Bank Country Director for Bangladesh and Bhutan. For IDA concessional loans, the maturity period is 30 years with 5 5-year grace period; the interest rate is 1.25% and the service charge is 0.75%

## State Bank of India's Stake in Jio Payments Bank Drops to 23% in FY23

**S**tate Bank of India's (SBI) shareholding in **Jio Payments Bank** fell to **23%** in FY23 from the 30% that it has maintained since inception, indicating its disinterest in the payments bank business model. The fall below 25% also means SBI will no longer be able to block special resolutions at its **7-year-old joint venture (JV)**. Meanwhile, **Reliance Industries (RIL)**, SBI's JV partner, acquired **10 million shares** on November 29 and 70 million shares on January 23. In the previous fiscal year (FY22), SBI invested ₹9.48 crore



in the joint venture. Reliance Industries (RIL) was among the 11 applicants approved by RBI to establish payments banks in **August 2015**. The bank commenced operations in **November 2016** in collaboration with SBI. The joint venture was established when **Arundhati Bhattacharya** was leading SBI. Bhattacharya is currently the chairperson and chief executive of Salesforce India.

## Indian Private Banks Record Largest Single-Day Government Bond Purchase in 7 Years

**I**ndian private sector banks executed the most significant **government bond acquisition** in a single session in 7 years, involving a substantial investment on behalf of a corporate entity, according to traders. These banks collectively acquired government bonds amounting to a net value of **83.43 billion rupees (\$1 billion)**, marking the most substantial purchase since **November 15, 2016**, as reported by Clearing Corp of India data. This surge propelled November's



overall buying above 200 billion rupees, following net sales of 101 billion rupees in October. An influx of approximately **1.7 trillion rupees** is expected over the next month as specific papers, including the **8.83% 2023, 4.56% 2023, and 7.68% 2023, reach maturity.**





## Razorpay Introduces 'Returnship' Program to Facilitate Women Rejoining the Workforce After Career Break

Fintech unicorn Razorpay has initiated a 'returnship' program designed for female professionals who have taken a career break and are seeking to re-enter the workforce. Last month, Razorpay introduced 'Resume with Razorpay,' offering a six-month internship to female professionals as part of their efforts to facilitate the return of women to the workforce.

**Eligibility Criteria for Women:** The returnship program is available to women who have taken a break of two or more years from their professional careers. Over 1,300 women have reportedly applied for the program.

## FDI shrinks 7.8% in second quarter of FY24

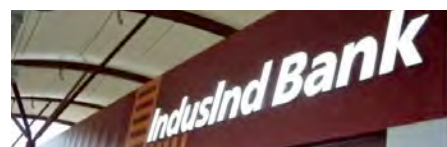
FDI equity inflows contracted 7.7% to \$9.5 billion in the July-September quarter of FY24. Data released by the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) showed this contraction in FDI inflow. Foreign direct investment (FDI) equity inflows stood at \$10.3 billion a year ago. Total FDI into India declined 7.8% on-year to \$15.3 billion in the July-September quarter of FY24 from \$16.6 billion a year ago. The total FDI includes equity inflows, reinvested earnings and other



capital. According to the data, the equity inflows declined 24% on-year in H1 of FY24 at \$20.4 billion. Singapore was the top source of equity inflows. It was followed by Mauritius, US, UK, UAE. Among the states, Maharashtra got the highest inflow of \$7.9 billion in April-September 2023-24. Karnataka followed Maharashtra.

## Indraprastha Gas Limited and IndusInd Bank Collaborate to Facilitate Digital Rupee Transactions in Delhi NCR

IndusInd Bank has partnered with Indraprastha Gas Limited (IGL) to introduce digital rupee transactions in Delhi NCR. The collaboration enables customers at selected IGL stations to make payments using the Digital Rupee, the Central Bank Digital Currency (CBDC) launched by the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) in 2022. The Digital Rupee solution



is available on both iOS and Android platforms, ensuring a user-friendly experience. It offers various features such as peer-to-peer (P2P) and peer-to-merchant (P2M) payments with complete UPI QR interoperability.

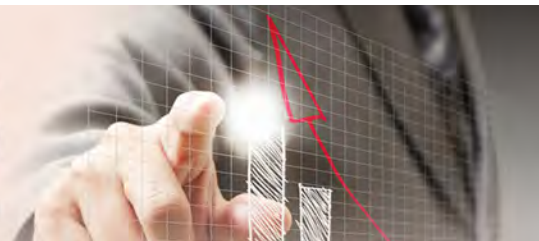
## RBI Directs 25% Increase in Risk Weights for Commercial Banks' Consumer Credit Exposure to 125%

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has asked institutions to increase the risk weights with respect to consumer credit exposure of commercial banks by 25% to 125%, merely a month after flagging the high growth in certain components of consumer credit and asking NBFCs, banks to strengthen internal surveillance mechanisms. The 25% risk weight increase applies to personal loans but excludes certain categories such as housing loans, education loans, vehicle loans, and loans secured by gold and gold jewellery. RBI has also decided that the consumer credit



exposure of NBFCs, which are categorised as retail loans, will now attract a risk weight of 125%, up from 100% before. This excludes housing loans, educational loans, vehicle loans and loans against gold jewellery and microfinance/SHG loans. The increase in risk weights will only be applicable if the NBFCs are in the AAA, AA or A categories where the risk weights are lower than 100%. The deadline for implementing the board-approved limits is set for February 29, 2024.

Korean companies have invested more than 5.6 billion dollars since April 2020 and this is expected to grow to 50 billion dollars by 2030.

Governor of Eastern Province of Sri Lanka Senthil Thondaman, High Commissioner of India to Sri Lanka Gopal Baglay, and SBI Chairman Dinesh Khara graced the event. Recognizing SBI's 159-year-long presence, Mrs.



Sitharaman praised its commitment to growth at home and abroad, especially

during the Sri Lankan economic crisis. SBI's endeavours facilitated the smooth extension of a Line of Credit worth 1 billion dollars by the Government of India to Sri Lanka.

## Govt authorises SBI to issue and encash Electoral Bonds with effect from November 6 to 20

The Government of India has authorised the State Bank of India SBI, in the 29th Phase of sale, to issue and encash Electoral Bonds through its 29 Authorised Branches with effect from the 6th to 20th of this month. The Electoral Bonds shall be valid for 15 calendar days from the date of issue and no payment shall



be made to any payee Political Party if the Electoral Bond is deposited after the expiry of the validity period. The Electoral Bond deposited by an eligible Political Party in its account shall be credited on the same day.

## Fiscal deficit in H1 hits 39% of BE; Railways, Roads, Fertilizer Ministries lead spending

Fiscal deficit in the first half (April-September period) of the current fiscal year reached over 39% of the Budget Estimate (BE). Fiscal deficit for April-September period of FY24 was higher than 37% for the corresponding period of the last fiscal. Railways, fertiliser, and road ministries led the government spending during the first half of the current fiscal as per the Controller General of Accounts



(CGA) data released on 31 October 2023. The ministries that need to increase spending in the coming six months to achieve the budget target include Petroleum & Natural Gas and Co-operation. Fiscal deficit is the difference between expenditure and income. Net tax revenues for the April-September period were ₹11-lakh crore (49.8% of annual estimate).





## Fitch raises India's mid-term potential growth rate to 6.2%

India's mid-term GDP growth forecast upgraded by Fitch to 6.2% from 5.5%. Rating agency Fitch raised India's gross domestic product (GDP) medium-term growth forecast by 70 basis points to 6.2%, from 5.5% earlier. This cut is mainly due to a large reduction in the estimate of China's supply-side growth potential by 0.7 percentage points. The agency said in its report that the potential growth of the emerging market has weakened due to China's slow pace.



## India's IIP Grows By 5.8 Per Cent In September 2023

The Quick Estimates of Index of Industrial Production (IIP) are released on the 12th of every month with a six-week lag and compiled with data received from source agencies, which in turn receive the data from the producing factories/establishments. For the month of September 2023, the Quick Estimates of Index of Industrial Production (IIP) with base 2011-12 stands at 141.6. The Indices of Industrial Production for the Mining, Manufacturing and Electricity sectors for the month of September 2023 stand at 111.5, 140.6 and 205.9 respectively. These Quick Estimates will undergo revision in subsequent releases as per the revision policy of IIP.

## India's overall exports in October 2023 were estimated at USD 62.26 Billion; an increase of 9.43 percent over USD 56.90 Billion in October 2022.

## The government clears 110 applications for imports of laptops, other IT hardware products worth about USD 10 billion

The government has cleared 110 of the total 111 applications, including those of Apple, Dell and Lenovo, that sought permission for imports of IT hardware products like laptops and computers on the first day of implementation of the new system. Other companies that received import approvals include HP India Sales Pvt Ltd, ASUS India, IBM India, Samsung India Electronics, Xiaomi Technology India, Cisco Commerce India, Microsoft Corporation (India), Siemens Ltd, Bosch Ltd, Redington Ltd,



Ingram Micro India, and Oracle India. The Ministry of Commerce and Industry has made some changes to the rules. Now, IT hardware made in Special Economic Zones (SEZs) can be brought into the Domestic Tariff Area (DTA) without needing special permission. The authorisation for these imports is valid until September 2024.

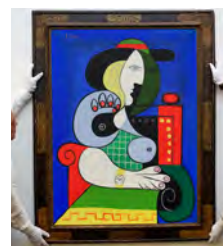


## BIS approves India's first-ever indigenous charging standard developed for light EVs

The Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) has approved India's first ever indigenously developed AC and DC Combined Charging connector standard for light electric vehicles (LEVs). This is also the world's first-ever combined AC and DC charging connector standard for light electric vehicles. NITI Aayog, the Department of Science and Technology, ARAI, EV makers, and the Bureau of Indian Standards came together to develop this national standard.

## 'Femme à la Montre' Becomes Second Most Expensive Picasso Ever Sold

Pablo Picasso's 1932 painting "Femme à la montre" sold for more than \$139 million at a Sotheby's New York auction, making it the most valuable work of art sold globally at an auction this year. The nine-digit price made it the second-most-expensive Picasso painting to sell at auction, behind "Les femmes d'Alger (Version 'O')," which fetched \$179.3 million, including a buyer's premium, at Christie's in 2015. "Femme à la

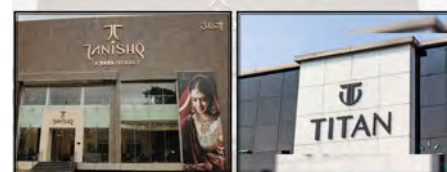


montre," which translates from French to "Woman with a Watch," is a portrait of

the artist's lover Marie-Thérèse Walter seated in a throne-like chair against a blue background. "Femme à la Montre" is dated to 1932 and was previously part of the collection belonging to art collector and philanthropist Fisher Landau.

## Titan tops Rs 3 lakh crore market-capitalisation

Titan crossed ₹3 lakh crore in market value in a glittering testimony to the local consumer's swift ascent along the luxury gradient. Titan became only the second company from the Tata Group to cross a valuation threshold earlier breached by Tata Consultancy Services (TCS).



Titan is also the second company in the retail sector, after DMart's parent Avenue Supermart, to surpass this benchmark.

## Standard and Poors Global predicts India's economic growth at 6.4 per cent for fiscal year 2024-25

India's economic growth is likely to rise at 6.4 percent for fiscal year 2024-25, according to Standard & Poors (S&P) Global. In its Economic Outlook for Asia Pacific, growth this year and the next is on track to be the strongest in emerging market economies with higher domestic demand. This projection is in line



with many agencies, though lower than the government and RBI projection of 6.5 percent.

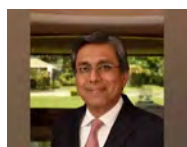

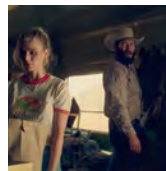

## Mumbai jumps to fourth rank in Knight Frank Prime Global Cities Index; Delhi secures 10th spot

Prime Global Cities Index Q3 2023 has been released by real estate consultant Knight Frank India. **Mumbai has got fourth place among 46 cities globally** in terms of price rise of luxury homes. **Mumbai was ranked at 22nd place in Q3 2022.** So, its rank improved by 18 places. National Capital Region (NCR) moved to 10th rank in July-September of 2023 from 36th rank in the year-ago period. **Manila is in the top spot of ranking with a 21.2% annual rise in prices.**

## Adaptation Gap Report 2023: Funding to developing nations declines 15% despite international pledges and rising costs



**C**limate adaptation funding declined by 15% to developing countries: Adaptation Gap Report 2023. According to the 2023 Adaptation Gap Report, Climate adaptation funding from the **World Bank and bilateral sources has declined by 15 per cent to around \$21 billion in 2021.** Climate adaptation funding has declined despite the pledge to **double the funding to \$40 billion per year by 2025 at the 26th COP of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change in Glasgow.**

## India ranked 117th among 129 nations in the inclusiveness index by the US varsity

**I**ndia is ranked 117th in the list of 129 countries in the world in the inclusiveness index published by the Othering and Belonging Institute (OBI) at California University, United States. Smaller countries like **Bangladesh (106) and Israel (115) were placed better than India.** The index examines inclusivity in terms of race, religion, gender, sexual orientation, disability, and the general population using **several measures India was ranked last (129) in religion inclusiveness, 121st in gender, 108th in disability, 87th in race, 40th in the general population, and 39th in LGBTQ.**



**New Zealand finished first in the index for the second consecutive year. Portugal recorded its best showing by securing second place (up from 5th place in 2022)** followed by the **Netherlands in third place.** Iran was placed at the bottom of the global list. Yemen, which has been devastated by the Saudi-led invasion, performed poorly followed by the Comoros Islands, a former French colony located off the southeastern coast of Africa.

## IEA World Energy Outlook 2023: Fossil fuel demand to peak by 2030, urgent investment shift needed

**A**ccording to the World Energy Outlook 2023, Fossil fuel demand would reach its peak by 2030. Under existing policies of governments, Global emissions are on track to raise temperatures by 2.4 degrees Celsius. **Oil and natural gas demand will reach its peak before 2030.** The rise of electric vehicles (EVs) is contributing to the shift from fossil



fuels. Liquefied natural gas (LNG) demand in 2050 will be 15 per cent lower than projected earlier. At present, investments in clean energy and infrastructure are around **\$1.8 trillion as compared to \$1 trillion in fossil fuels.**

## Asia Rankings 2024: India surpasses China with highest number of universities

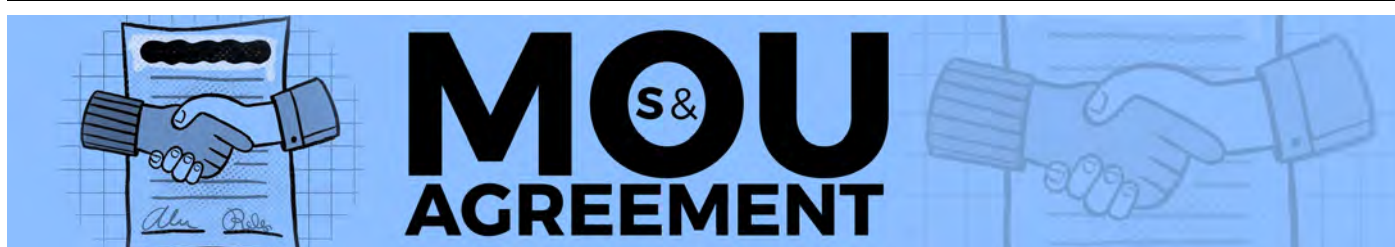

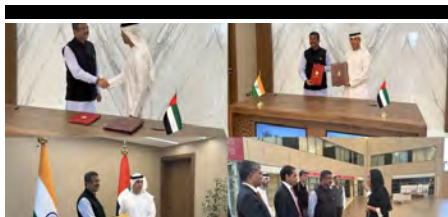

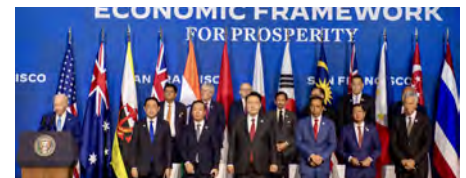

## Pakistan successfully conducts training launch of Ghauri Weapon System

Pakistan successfully conducted a training launch of the **Ghauri Weapon System**. This test comes shortly after another significant missile test, demonstrating the country's commitment to enhancing its missile capabilities. Prior to the Ghauri Weapon System test, Pakistan conducted a flight test of the Ababeel Weapon System. The primary objective of this test was to strengthen Pakistan's deterrence capabilities. In 2021, Pakistan successfully conducted a test flight of the locally developed **Fatah-1 Guided Multi-Launch Rocket System**. This rocket system has a range of **140 kilometers**, contributing to Pakistan's overall missile capabilities.

## India successfully test-fires 'Pralay' missile off Odisha coast



India achieves a successful test-firing of its **surface-to-surface short-range ballistic missile (SRBM) named 'Pralay'** from the Abdul Kalam Island off the Odisha coast. The missile is developed by the **Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO)**, emphasising its indigenous origin.

## China approves the world's first passenger-carrying flying taxi Ehang's EH216-S

Ehang, a Chinese drone manufacturer, has received regulatory approval from the **Civil Aviation Administration of China (CAAC)** for its autonomous air taxi, the EH216-S AAV. This marks the first instance of an **unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV)** being certified to carry



passengers in China. Ehang claims to be the **first company globally** to have achieved regulatory approval for an autonomous passenger-carrying UAV, indicating its pioneering role in the field.

## NASA Launches Sounding Rocket for INFUSE Mission

The **National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA)** launched a sounding rocket as part of its **Integral Field Ultraviolet Spectroscopy Experiment (INFUSE) mission**. The INFUSE was launched from the White Sands Missile Range in **New Mexico**. It was launched to **study the**



**Cygnus Loop**, a supernova remnant. The INFUSE mission is expected to collect information about the Cygnus Loop for a few minutes. The observations are made from a height of **150 miles (240 km) above Earth's surface**.

## ECI Develops 'ENCORE' In-House Software for Comprehensive Candidate and Election Management



The Election Commission of India (ECI) has developed an in-house software known as ENCORE, which stands for **"Enabling Communications On Real-Time Environment."** This software is designed to facilitate

complete candidate and election management. ENCORE provides a seamless facility for Returning Officers to **manage candidate nominations, affidavits, voter turnout, counting, results, and data management in a real-time environment**.

## Google to assemble Pixel phones in India from 2024



Google, Inc. set a 2024 target to assemble its **Pixel line of smartphones** in India. The flagship device will feature the latest iteration of the Tensor chip, which was designed in India for global use. The Tensor chips were

first introduced in 2021, coinciding with the launch of the Google Pixel 6. While these **'system-on-chip' processors** were conceptualised by the company in 2016, they took five years to develop for use. The latest is the **3rd generation** of the Tensor chip.





## NASA Plans 2027 Launch of Nancy Grace Roman Space Telescope for Milky Way Observation

The National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) is in the process of preparing for the launch of the Nancy Grace Roman Space Telescope, set to take place by the year 2027 to observe the Milky Way galaxy. The Roman Space Telescope is a NASA observatory with the **primary goal** of addressing fundamental questions in the fields of dark energy, exoplanets, and infrared astrophysics. The Roman Space Telescope is designed as a long-term monitoring system, representing **“time-domain astronomy.”** This field focuses on the study of how the universe changes over time, capturing dynamic celestial events.



## Government Launches ‘Krishi 24/7,’ India’s First AI-Powered Agricultural News Monitoring and Analysis Solution

The Department of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare (DA&FW) collaborated with the Wadhvani Institute for Artificial Intelligence (Wadhvani AI) to develop Krishi 24/7. Krishi 24/7 is India’s first AI-powered solution designed for automated agricultural news monitoring and analysis. The development of Krishi 24/7 received support from Google.org, which helped facilitate the project.

## IARI Introduces Pusa-2090 Paddy Variety to Address Stubble Burning, Offering Farmers an Additional 30 Days with Shorter Maturation Period

The Indian Agricultural Research Institute (IARI) has successfully developed the Pusa-2090 Paddy Variety as a strategic measure to address stubble burning issues.

This variety has a shorter maturation time, which provides farmers with 30 extra days.

Paddy crop is usually transplanted in June. It is usually ready for harvest only in late October. Due to this, farmers have very little time to prepare their fields to sow the next wheat crop. IARI has developed Pusa-2090, an improved version derived from a cross between Pusa-44 and CB-501, an early-maturing Japonica rice line. It matures in a shorter duration of 120-125 days while maintaining comparable yields, addressing the core issue of



stubble burning. Stubble burning is a method of **removing paddy crop residues** from the field to sow wheat from the last week of September to November. Stubble burning is a process of setting on fire the straw stubble, left after the harvesting of grains, like paddy, wheat, etc. It is usually required in areas that use the combined harvesting method which leaves crop residue behind. The process of burning farm residue is one of the major causes of air pollution in parts of north India, deteriorating the air quality.

## Samsung Introduces its Generative AI Model, Samsung Gauss

Samsung has unveiled its **first generative AI model**, named ‘Samsung Gauss,’ at the Samsung AI Forum 2023. Samsung Gauss is a **large language model** designed to understand human language, answer questions, generate text and images, assist in writing and editing emails, and summarize documents. Samsung Gauss comprises three main tools: **Samsung Gauss Language, Samsung Gauss Code, and Samsung Gauss Image.** Samsung Gauss Language is capable of **understanding human language** and answering queries similar to **ChatGPT.** Samsung Gauss Code works in conjunction with



the company’s code assistant, **‘code.i,’** assisting with code generation and providing support for code description and test case generation through an interactive interface. Google, which is the **first major tech company** to challenge ChatGPT with its Bard platform, doubled down on its efforts by introducing generative AI updates across its portfolio, including for Google Meet, Google Slides and Google Chat.



## IIT Madras Researchers Create App for Inter-City Goods Transportation with Zero Commission

Faculty members, students, and alumni of the **Indian Institute of Technology Madras (IIT Madras)** collaborated to design and develop a mobile application called '**OptRoute**' for efficient goods transportation within cities. The 'OptRoute' app connects drivers directly with consumers and operates without charging any commission or on-boarding fees. Payments from consumers go directly to the driver, eliminating intermediaries. The first version of the app has been developed and commercialised through OptRoute Logistics, a start-up incubated at IIT Madras. Prof. N.S. Narayanaswamy from the Department of Computer Science and Engineering co-founded the start-up. The basic ideas behind the App were presented during the **2020 Genetic and Evolutionary Computation Conference** (<https://doi.org/10.1145/3377930.3389804>) held in Cancun, Mexico.

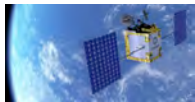

This development solidifies Eutelsat OneWeb’s presence in the Indian market, with OneWeb India already holding licenses from the **Department of Telecommunications** for providing satellite-based broadband services. OneWeb India has received in-principle approval to

## Microsoft Introduces AI Chips to Address Growing Demand for Alternatives to Nvidia Among Developers

Microsoft has introduced its **first custom-designed artificial intelligence (AI) chips** for cloud applications, addressing the demand for alternatives to Nvidia, which currently dominates the AI processor market. Microsoft’s AI chip offerings include a general-purpose chip called Cobalt, based on Arm designs, and a specialized AI “accelerator” named Maia. The new processors will support Microsoft’s Azure cloud services, including OpenAI and Copilot,



enhancing the capabilities of these services through optimized AI processing. ‘**Project Maia**’ is described by Microsoft as a deep learning framework that engages in chess playing to explore the interaction between humans and AI, showcasing a practical application of AI technology. The new AI chips will be integrated into Microsoft’s Azure data centers, indicating a strategic move to enhance AI capabilities within the cloud computing infrastructure.

## China claims world’s fastest internet with 1.2 terabit-per-second network

**Huawei Technologies Co. and China Mobile Ltd.** have built a **3,000 kilometre (1,860-mile) internet network** linking Beijing to the south, which the country is touting as its latest technological breakthrough. The two firms teamed up with Tsinghua University and research provider Cernet.com Corp. to build what they claim is the world’s first internet network to achieve a “stable and reliable” bandwidth of **1.2 terabits per second**, several times faster than typical speeds around the world. The Chinese



firm in August made waves when it released a **5G smartphone** with a sophisticated made-in-China processor, inspiring celebration in the Chinese state and social media. The majority of the world’s Internet backbone networks typically operate at a speed of just **100 gigabits per second**. In **February, Nokia**, a global rival to Huawei, announced achieving **1.2 terabits per second over “metro distances”** of about 118 km on an optical network in Europe.

## Flying Wedge Defence and Aerospace becomes first ever entity to secure DGCA Type certification for indigenous unmanned aircraft technology

**Flying Wedge Defence and Aerospace** has become **India’s first-ever private firm to secure a Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) type certification** for indigenous unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) technology. Flying Wedge’s achievement is noteworthy as it signifies the development and certification of indigenous UAV technology, distinguishing



it from Indian firms that have relied on technology imports, especially from China. Under the DGCA’s regulatory framework, **no drone, aircraft, or aeroplane** can operate in India without DGCA-type certification. This stringent certification process is regarded as a vital step in ensuring the safety and reliability of unmanned aircraft within the country.

## Jio and OneWeb Acquire Licences for Satellite Internet Services



Jio Satellite Communications and OneWeb, backed by Bharti Enterprises, have received licences from the government to provide **broadband internet services to end-users using satellite**. Both companies now have pan-India Internet Service Provider (ISP) licenses, which are essential for delivering internet connectivity through satellite or mobile networks. The Department of Telecommunications (DoT) has already granted OneWeb and Jio Satellite the **global mobile personal communication by satellite services (GMPCS) licence** that is required to offer satellite-based broadband services in India. Four of the remotest locations in India have already been connected with JioSpace-Fiber including **Gir (Gujarat), Korba (Chattisgarh), Nabrangpur (Odisha), and ONGC (Jorhat, Assam)**. Notably, Jeff Bezos-led Amazon and Elon Musk's Starlink are also eyeing the satellite communications space in India, and have sought a GMPCS license.

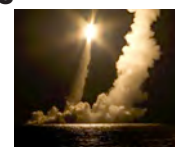

## Russia Successfully Tests Bulava Ballistic Missile Designed for Nuclear Warheads

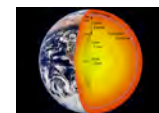
Russia conducted a successful **test launch of the Bulava ballistic missile**, which is designed to carry nuclear warheads. The Bulava ballistic missile is a newly developed Russian submarine-launched **Intercontinental Ballistic Missile (ICBM)**. Development of the Bulava missile began in 1998. The first powered flight test of the Bulava missile occurred in September 2005, followed by its first submerged test launch in



December. The Bulava missile was designed to be deployed on Russia's Borey-class ballistic missile submarines (SSBNs). It was designed to be the backbone of Moscow's nuclear triad and has a range of over **8,000 kilometres (close to 5,000 miles)**. It is **12-13.5 m** in length and has a diameter of approximately 2.0 m. **Launch Weight: 36,800 kg** It is a **three-stage solid-fuel missile**.

## Formation of Earth's Mysterious New Layer Linked to Deep Infiltration of Surface Water: Study

The formation of new enigmatic layer - E prime layer - at the outermost part of Earth's core is a result of **"surface water penetrating deep into the planet,"** altering the composition of the metallic liquid core's outermost region, a study by an international team of researchers, including those from Arizona State University (ASU) revealed. Earth comprises 4 primary layers: an inner core at the planet's



center, surrounded by the outer core, mantle, and crust. Upon reaching the core-mantle boundary about **1,800 miles** below the surface, this water initiates significant chemical changes, influencing the core's structure. This reaction leads to the formation of a hydrogen-rich, silicon-depleted layer at the outer core, resembling a film-like structure.

## Zurich Insurance set to acquire 51% stake in Kotak General Insurance for Rs 4,051 cr

Switzerland's Zurich Insurance is set to acquire a 51% stake in Kotak General Insurance for INR 4,051 crore. Within 3 years from the initial acquisition, Zurich plans to buy an additional 19% stake in Kotak General Insurance. Zurich's investment represents the single largest investment by a global strategic insurer in an Indian non-life insurer. The acquisition is expected to be completed by **June 30, 2024**. Zurich will invest **INR 1,609 crore** in Kotak General Insurance as fresh growth capital to support the company's operations and expansion.



## AU Small Finance Bank board approves merger with Fincare SFB

Fincare Small Finance Bank (SFB) is set to merge with AU Small Finance Bank (SFB). The merger is scheduled to take effect from **February 1, 2024**. The merger scheme is contingent on approval from the respective shareholders of AU SFB and Fincare SFB, as well as regulatory bodies including the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) and the Competition Commission of India (CCI).

## Yes Bank acquires additional shares in JC Flowers ARC, raises stake to 9.9%

YES Bank has acquired additional shares in J.C. Flowers Asset Reconstruction (JC Flowers ARC) to reinstate its stake to 9.9% in the company. The bank acquired **24,643,558 equity shares** of JC Flowers ARC at Rs 29.68 per equity share, having face value of Rs 10 at a premium of Rs 19.68 per unit for an amount aggregating to Rs 731,420,804. On November 28, 2022, the bank had acquired 9.9% of the equity



share capital of JC Flower ARC, which

fell to 5.01% as a result of certain corporate actions in JC Flowers ARC. YES Bank reported a **47.4% year-on-year (YoY)** growth in net profit for the quarter ended September to Rs 225 crore. Total income from operations increased by 25% on year to Rs 7,921 crore.

## Berkshire Hathaway Divests 2.46% Stake in Paytm for Rs 1,371 Crore, Incurring a 31% Loss per Share



**B**illionaire Warren Buffet's Berkshire Hathaway Inc has sold its entire 2.46% stake in Paytm for Rs 1,371 crore through an open market transaction at a loss of about 31% per share. Berkshire Hathaway initially acquired a 2.6% stake in Paytm at a cost of Rs 1,279.7 per share, amounting to an aggregate value of Rs 2,179 crore. According to the bulk deal data available with the NSE, BH International Holdings offloaded 1,56,23,529 shares, or 2.46% stake, in Noida-based Paytm.

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## Competition Commission of India (CCI) Clears the Acquisition of Additional Stake in Niva Bupa Health Insurance

Fair trade regulator Competition Commission of India (CCI) has approved the acquisition of an additional stake in Niva Bupa Health Insurance Company by Bupa Singapore Holdings Pte. Bupa Singapore Holdings is a shareholder of Niva Bupa and a subsidiary of international healthcare group The British United Provident Association Ltd (Bupa). Niva Bupa Health Insurance provides insurance policies in India, while Fettle Tone LLP is a special purpose vehicle (SPV) set up by private equity firm True North Fund. In September,



True North announced the sale of a 20% holding in Niva Bupa for Rs 2,700 crore. The United Kingdom (UK)-headquartered Bupa aims to become a majority shareholder in Niva Bupa Health Insurance through this deal. True North had become the majority shareholder in Niva Bupa in 2019 after acquiring a 51% stake from Anljit Singh's Max India.

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### Indian Air Force to organize air show on Nov 23-24 at Air Force Station in Ambala Cantonment

Indian Air Force will organize an air show on **November 23-24 at Air Force Station in Ambala Cantonment.** **Surya Kiran and Akashganga teams** will showcase their skills in the sky alongside the aircrafts of the Indian Air Force. Regarding security, he said that orders have already been issued **under Section 144 to prohibit the flying of drones near the Air Force station.**

### Defence Minister Rajnath Singh to attend 10th ASEAN Defence Ministers' Meeting-Plus in Jakarta



Defence Minister **Rajnath Singh** will attend the **10th ASEAN Defence Ministers' Meeting-Plus (ADMM plus) in Jakarta, Indonesia,** from 16th of November to 17th of November, the Ministry of Defence. On the sidelines of the ASEAN Defence Ministers' meet, **Singh will also have bilateral meetings with the Defence Ministers of participating countries.** Since 2017, the ADMM-Plus Ministers have been meeting annually to bolster cooperation between ASEAN and the Plus countries. **Indonesia is hosting the meeting as it is the chair of ADMM-Plus.**

The MiG-21 was the first supersonic fighter in service of the IAF, inducted in 1963, and played a significant role in various conflicts. The conversion of the squadron reflects the Indian Air Force's commitment to modernize its fleet while ensuring the protection of the nation's airspace.

## Indian Armed Forces to Induct Nirbhay Long-Range Attack Cruise Missile for Targets Beyond 1,000 km

The Indian armed forces will be inducting the long-range attack cruise missile Nirbhay into their inventory to strike targets at ranges over 1,000 km. Nirbhay Cruise Missile is a long-range sub-sonic cruise missile. It is India's first indigenously-produced cruise missile.



The missile was developed by the Bengaluru-based Aeronautical

Development Establishment, a lab under India's Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO).

## Indian Navy Unveils 4th Anti-Submarine Warfare Craft, Named 'Amini'

'Amini', an Arnala class of ship for the Indian Navy, was launched at L&T Shipbuilding's facility in Kattupalli, Tamil Nadu. 'Amini' is the fourth ship of the 08 x ASW Shallow Water Craft (SWC) project initiated by the state-owned Garden Reach Shipbuilders & Engineers Ltd (GRSE). The ship is designed to undertake anti-submarine operations in coastal waters, as well as low-intensity maritime operations (LIMO) and mine-laying operations. The launch ceremony was presided over by Vice Admiral Sandeep Naithani, Chief of Materiel. The ship has been named Amini to signify the strategic maritime importance



accorded to the island of Amini at Lakshadweep, located about 400 km west of Kochi. The contract for building eight ASW SWC ships was signed between the Ministry of Defence (MoD) and Kolkata-based GRSE on April 29, 2019. The first ship of the project is planned to be delivered in early 2024. The ASW SWC ships will have over 80% indigenous content, thereby ensuring that large scale defence production is executed by Indian manufacturing units, generating employment and capability enhancement within the country.



## India and Nepal Kick Off the 17th Iteration of Joint Military Exercise SURYA KIRAN



The Nepal Army Contingent, consisting of 334 personnel, has arrived in India for the 17th edition of the Joint Military Exercise SURYA KIRAN. This annual event takes place alternatively in India and Nepal, and this year, it will be conducted in Pithoragarh, Uttarakhand, from 24th November to 7th December 2023. The Indian Army contingent, led by a Battalion from the KUMAON Regiment, comprises 354 personnel. On the other side, the Nepal Army contingent is represented by the Tara Dal Battalion. The primary aim of SURYA KIRAN is to enhance interoperability in jungle warfare, counter-terrorism operations in mountainous terrain, and Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief under the United Nations Charter for peacekeeping operations.

He became the first Prime Minister to fly the Tejas on a sortie. The aircraft took off from the Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd (HAL) Airport in Bengaluru. Light combat aircraft (LCA) Tejas has been developed by the Aeronautical Development Agency (ADA) in collaboration

## Indian Navy Unveils 25T Bollard Pull Tug 'MAHABALI' in Gujarat

October 1, 1977. The induction of IL-38 aircraft marked a significant milestone, ushering in a modern era of airborne long-range maritime reconnaissance and anti-submarine warfare capabilities in the Indian Navy.

## Sweden's Saab secures India's first 100% FDI in defence project

Swedish defence company Saab's has reportedly become the first foreign company that has bagged 100% FDI in India's defence projects. Sweden's Saab will set up a new facility in the country that will manufacture shoulder-fired rockets. The FDI proposal, valued under Rs 500



crore, was cleared in October, 2023. Currently, India allows only 74% FDI in the defence sector under the automatic route. Beyond that, clearance can be obtained on a case-by-case basis.

The 2nd edition of Joint Military Exercise AUSTRAHIND-23 is being conducted between the **Indian and Australian army contingents**. 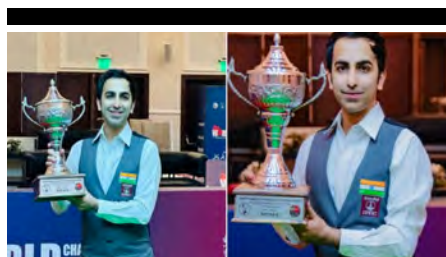

The International Cricket Council (ICC) Board met in Ahmedabad and "confirmed the terms of the suspension" of Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC) and also the shifting of the age-group showpiece. South Africa hosted the U19 WC in 2020.



## Pankaj Advani Clinches 26th World Title at IBSF Billiards Championship 2023 in Doha

India's Pankaj Advani has lifted his 26th world title as he won the World IBSF Billiards Championship 2023 in Doha, Qatar. Pankaj defeated opponent Sourav Kothari with a 1000-416 margin in the final. Advani stormed into the final with a convincing victory over fellow Indian Rupesh Shah. He defeated the Gujarat cueist 900-273.

## Indian Junior Hockey Team Won Bronze Medal In 11th Sultan Johor Cup 2023

The junior Indian men's hockey team beat Pakistan 6-5 in a shootout at the Taman Daya Hockey Stadium in Johor Bahru, Malaysia to win the bronze medal at the Sultan of Johor Cup 2023. In the Sultan of Johor Cup 2023, India had topped Pool B to make it to the semi-finals but lost 6-3 to Germany in their final-four match to drop down to the



third-place playoff. In the final match, Germany emerged as the champion of the 11th Sultan of Johor Cup, securing the gold medal by defeating Australia 3-1 in a penalty shootout.

## ICC Board suspends Sri Lanka Cricket's membership of ICC with immediate effect

Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC) has been suspended by the ICC with immediate effect because of extensive government interference in the board's administration. Though the ICC has termed the sanction a "suspension", in reality, it is a warning as the ICC seeks to prevent further government interference in the running of SLC. When the ICC suspension came, it was the elected SLC board headed by Silva that was running



cricket in the country. SLC is the second Full Member to be suspended by ICC in the last four years after Zimbabwe Cricket was suspended in 2019 for similar reasons.

## Australia captain Meg Lanning quits international women's cricket after winning 7 World Cup titles

Australia captain Meg Lanning has announced her retirement from international cricket. Lanning declared it is "the right time" to end her 13-year-long stint as an Aussie cricketer. Lanning has represented Australia in 241 matches - six Tests, 103 ODIs and 132 T20Is. She walks away from the international stage with 8,352 runs in total



which includes 17 international hundreds. She is Australia's most prolific runscore in all formats. The 31-year-old is a seven-time World Cup winner, five of which she has won as captain.

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## Novak Djokovic Wins Record 7th ATP Finals Title After Down- ing Jannik Sinner In Straight Sets

The top-ranked Djokovic won a record-breaking seventh ATP Finals title with a straight- set victory over home favourite Jannik Sinner. He started 2023 with a record-extending 10th Australian Open title and went on to claim his 23rd Grand Slam singles trophy at the French Open, breaking Rafael Nadal's mark.



## Vidya Pillai clinch the World 6 Red Women Championships title at Doha

In the World 6 Red Women Snooker Championships, Vidya Pillai secured Gold to clinch the title of World Champion. In the final, she defeated compatriot Anupama Ramachandran by 4-1 frames, who settled for Silver. Vidya earlier defeated top seed Bai Yulu of China by 4-3 frames in the semi-final round.

## Anish Bhanwala wins bronze medal in men's 25m rapid fire pistol event at ISSF World Cup Final 2023

In Shooting, Indian shooter Anish Bhanwala won the bronze medal in the men's 25m rapid-fire pistol event at the ISSF World Cup Final 2023 in Doha, Qatar. Competing at the Lusail Shooting Range, Anish Bhanwala



scored 27 out of 35 for third place in the final. It was also the first medal for India in the men's 25m rapid fire pistol event in the ISSF World Cup Final history.

also present on the occasion. The first-ever Khelo India Para Games will be held from 10th to 17th of next month.

## ICC Bans Transgender Players From International Women's Cricket

The International Cricket Council (ICC) banned transgender cricketers from participating in women's cricket at the highest level in a major policy decision. Transgender players who have undergone any form of male puberty will be banned from competing in international women's sports, whether or not they have undergone surgery or gender transition treatment. The decision came two months after Canada's Danielle McGahey



became the first transgender cricketer to feature in an official international match when she featured in the Women's T20 match against Brazil. Bowling teams in men's ODI and T20s will be imposed a five-run penalty if the bowler exceeds the 60-second limit of bowling the next over for the third time in an innings,

## Punjab defeats Haryana to clinch 13th senior men's national hockey championship in thrilling penalty shootout in Chennai

Punjab claimed the Gold medal after their penalty shootout triumph over defending Champions Haryana in the Final of the 13th Hockey India Senior Men's National Championship 2023 at the Mayor Radhakrishnan Hockey Stadium, Chennai. Meanwhile, Tamil Nadu overcame



Karnataka in penalty shootouts to claim the Bronze Medal. Punjab defeated Haryana 2-2 (9-8 SO) to clinch the title. Punjab started the match strong, scoring the first goal in the 13th minute by Harjeet Singh.

## India's Pioneer Female Supreme Court Justice, Justice Fathima Beevi, Passed Away

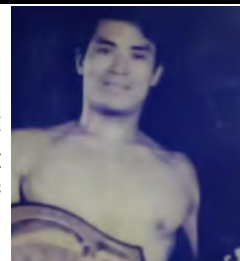

These cities were acknowledged for **"their strong commitment to harnessing culture and creativity as part of their development strategies, and displaying innovative practices in human-centred urban planning"**.

## P Vasudevan Takes Over as the New Head of RBI's Fintech Department

 **P Vasudevan** was appointed as the new head of the **Reserve Bank of India's (RBI) fintech department** earlier this month (November 2023). With this, Vasudevan has become the **second top official** of the department since its formation in early 2022. Vasudevan takes over from the outgoing chief, **Ajay Kumar Choudhary**, who reportedly retired from the position.

## Cayman Islands: Removal from anti-money laundering "grey list"

The Financial Action Task Force (FATF) has **removed the Cayman Islands from its grey list**. It has **added Bulgaria to the grey list** in its review **published on 27 October 2023**. **FATF has also removed Panama, Jordan and Albania from the grey list**. FATF



has added Bulgaria to the grey list. The Cayman Islands was added to the grey list in 2021. It was in the news during the investigation into charges made by Hindenburg Research against the Adani Group.

## AI named Collins Dictionary word of the year; Bazball, made famous by English coach Brendon McCullum, also finds a berth

The abbreviation of artificial intelligence (AI) has been named the Collins Word of the Year for 2023. Lexicographers at Collins Dictionary said the use of the term had "accelerated" and that it had become the dominant conversation of 2023.



Other words on Collins's list include **"Nepo Baby," "Greedflation,"** and **"Bazball"**. The word **"Permacrisis,"** defined as "an extended period of instability and insecurity" was the **Collins Word of the Year in 2022**.


## Chile becomes 95th member of the International Solar Alliance

**Chile** has become the **95th member of the International Solar Alliance (ISA)**. It handed over the instrument of ISA ratification during the meeting of **Ambassador Juan Angulo of Chile** with the Joint Secretary (Economic Diplomacy) in the Ministry of External Affairs. The meeting was held in New Delhi.



**International Solar Alliance (ISA)** was co-founded by India and France. India and France jointly launched the **International Solar Alliance (ISA) on 30 November 2015 at COP21 in Paris, France**. Presently, **116 countries are signatories to the ISA Framework Agreement**.

## Kasaragod in India Becomes the First District to Officially Declare Tree, Flower, Bird, and Species

 **Kasaragod** district of Kerala has achieved the distinction of becoming the first district in India to officially declare its own tree, flower, bird, and species. This recognition reflects the region's unique biodiversity and natural heritage. The official tree of Kasaragod district is the

**'Kanjiram' (Strychnos nuxvomica Linn)**. The tree derives its name from 'kasara,' meaning wormwood, which is linked to the origin of the district's name. This declaration aims to contribute to the conservation of these trees and prevent their unnecessary felling.



## Uttarakhand is set to become the first state to implement a Uniform Civil Code

Uttarakhand is set to become the first state to implement the Uniform Civil Code (UCC). The state government is likely to convene a special session of the legislative assembly for this purpose. The Uttarakhand government had on May 27, 2022, set up the expert committee for the implementation of the UCC and to check all relevant laws that control personal citizen matters for people living in the state. The five-member committee, led by former Supreme Court judge, **Justice Ranjana Prakash Desai**, is expected to hand over its report to the government soon. The Uniform Civil Code (UCC) is mentioned in Article 44 of the Constitution. Gujarat is also planning to implement the Uniform Civil Code before the 2024 Lok Sabha elections.

## World's first 3D printed temple comes up in Telangana's Siddipet



The world's first 3D-printed temple has been unveiled by Telangana. The world's first 3D-printed temple is a ground-breaking structure located at Burugupally in Siddipet district. The innovative construction, achieved through a three-month 3D printing process, is a significant technological milestone. Spread over 4,000 square feet and situated at a height of 35.5 feet, this temple has three different parts.

## Wood Mackenzie Report Predicts India's Rise as the Second-Largest Solar Module Manufacturer by 2025

According to the Wood Mackenzie report, India would become the world's 2nd largest solar module production region by 2025. In its latest report, Wood Mackenzie has forecasted that India will overtake Southeast Asia as the second-largest module production region by 2025. India's ascent is attributed to the strong incentives provided under the **Production-Linked Incentive (PLI)** scheme. India and the United States have jointly announced plans for more than 200 gigawatts (GW) of module capacity since 2022. The world's fastest growing renewable energy market is offering around **USD 2.5 billion** in subsidies under the PLI scheme for expanding solar PV module manufacturing capacity. Under Tranche-I of the PLI scheme, with an outlay of Rs 4,500 crore, Letters of Award (LoA) have been issued for setting up of 8,737 megawatts (MW) of fully integrated solar PV



module manufacturing units (manufacturing of Polysilicon, Wafers, Cells and Modules). Under Tranche-II, with an outlay of Rs 19,500 crore, the LoAs have been issued for setting up of 39,600 MW of fully/ partially integrated solar PV module manufacturing units, through which 12 GW of polysilicon capacity, 28.8 GW of ingot-wafer capacity, 36.2 GW of cell capacity and 39.6 GW of module capacity is envisaged. The capex outlay for setting up these integrated module capacities is estimated to exceed Rs 1 lakh crore. The top 5 countries in solar manufacturing are China (80% of the global market), Vietnam (5%), India (3%), Malaysia (3%), and Thailand (2%). Wood Mackenzie is a global consultancy firm specializing in renewables, energy, and natural resources.

## 7 changes in Senior Citizens Savings Scheme rules: More people can invest, more time for retirees, stricter penalty

The Finance Ministry has introduced changes to the Senior Citizen Savings Scheme in a notification dated 7 November. The Centre has allowed the spouses of the deceased government employees to open **Senior Citizen Saving Scheme (SCSS) accounts**. **Earlier, the spouses of deceased government employees were not allowed to open SCSS accounts.** **Through the Budget, the maximum deposit limit for the Senior Citizen Savings Scheme was increased from ₹15 lakh to ₹30 lakh.** Increased maximum



deposit limit has been made effective from April 1, 2023. Senior Citizen Savings Scheme (SCSS) is a savings scheme supported by the government. It is available to individuals aged 60 years or older, or those who have retired at the age of 55 years or above. Under this scheme, accounts can be opened with a minimum amount of ₹1,000 and a maximum of ₹30 lakh. The SCSS offers 8.2 % per annum interest rate. The tenure of the scheme is five years. It can be extended.



## GST collections rose to ₹1.72 lakh crore in October 2023



GST collections increased to ₹1.72 lakh crores in October 2023. This is the **second-highest-ever level, next only to April 2023**. GST collection for October is 13% higher compared to a year ago. In October 2022, the collection stood at Rs 1.52 lakh crore. The highest-ever Goods and Services Tax (GST) revenue was recorded in April 2023 at Rs 1.87 lakh crore. The average gross monthly collection of GST in the FY24 is Rs 1.66 lakh crore. This is 11% higher than the year-ago period.

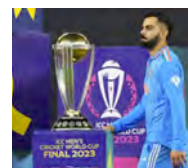
## SBI and LIC should be recognised as Maharatnas

## Australia lifts ICC Men's Cricket world cup beating India in Ahmedabad; Virat Kohli awarded "Player of the tournament" title

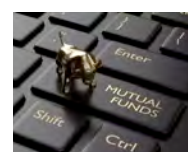
Australia lifted the ICC Men's Cricket World Cup defeating India by six wickets in the final at the Narendra Modi Stadium in Ahmedabad. Chasing a modest target of 241 runs, Australia completed the task in 43 overs for the loss of four wickets with a gritty century knock of Travis Head, after some initial setbacks.



He made 137 and was declared **Player of the Match**. Earlier, India managed to post 240 runs in the stipulated 50 overs. Virat Kohli was awarded with the **"player of the tournament"** title for his exemplary performance.

## Maharashtra, Gujarat and Karnataka lead mutual fund investments in India

Gujarat and Karnataka have surpassed Delhi to secure the second and third positions, respectively, in holding the highest equity mutual fund assets during the September quarter. Gujarat's equity asset increased to ₹2.21 lakh crore, Karnataka's to ₹1.99 lakh crore, while Delhi's equity asset dropped to ₹1.94 lakh crore. According to the study conducted by Geojit Insight, based on **Association of Mutual Funds in India (AMFI) data**, **Maharashtra** accounted for the lion's share of ₹7.47 lakh crore of the overall industry equity asset of ₹25.85 lakh crore. Gujarat



and Karnataka contribute 8.5% and 7.7%, respectively, to the overall equity assets, while Delhi's share is at 7.5%. Similarly, **Uttar Pradesh** had toppled West Bengal and Tamil Nadu to occupy the 5th position. Gujarat accounts for 7% of SIP inflows, amounting to around **₹1200 crore**. On the debt side, Delhi retains its second position with assets worth ₹2.02 lakh crore, while Gujarat and Karnataka have debt assets of ₹1.06 lakh crore and ₹1.22 lakh crore, respectively.

The scheme aims to provide drones to 15,000 selected Women SHGs from 2023-24 to 2025-2026 to provide rental services to farmers for agriculture. Aligning to the vision of Hon'ble Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, the scheme seeks to empower women Self Help Groups (SHGs) and bring new technologies through drone services in the agriculture sector.

## Cabinet approves continuation of Centrally Sponsored Scheme for Fast Track Special Courts for further three years

## Free Foodgrains for 81.35 crore beneficiaries for five years: Cabinet Decision

The Cabinet led by Prime Minister has decided that the Central government will provide free food grains to about 81.35 crore beneficiaries under the Pradhan Mantri Garib Kalyan Anna Yojana (PMGKAY) for a period of five years with effect from 1st January, 2024. This is a historic decision that places PMGKAY amongst the World's biggest social welfare schemes



aimed at ensuring food and nutrition security for 81.35 crore persons, at an estimated cost of Rs. 11.80 lakh crore over a 5 year period. Free food grains (rice, wheat and coarse grains/ millets) under PMGKAY for 5 years from 1.1.2024 will strengthen food security and mitigate any financial hardship of the poor and vulnerable sections of the population.

## Cabinet approves Terms of Reference for the Sixteenth Finance Commission

The Union Cabinet chaired by the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi has approved the Terms of Reference for the Sixteenth Finance Commission. The Terms of Reference for the Sixteenth Finance Commission will be notified in due course of time. The 16th Finance Commission's recommendations, upon acceptance by the government, would cover the period of five (5) years commencing April 1, 2026. Article 280(1) of the Constitution lays down that the modalities for

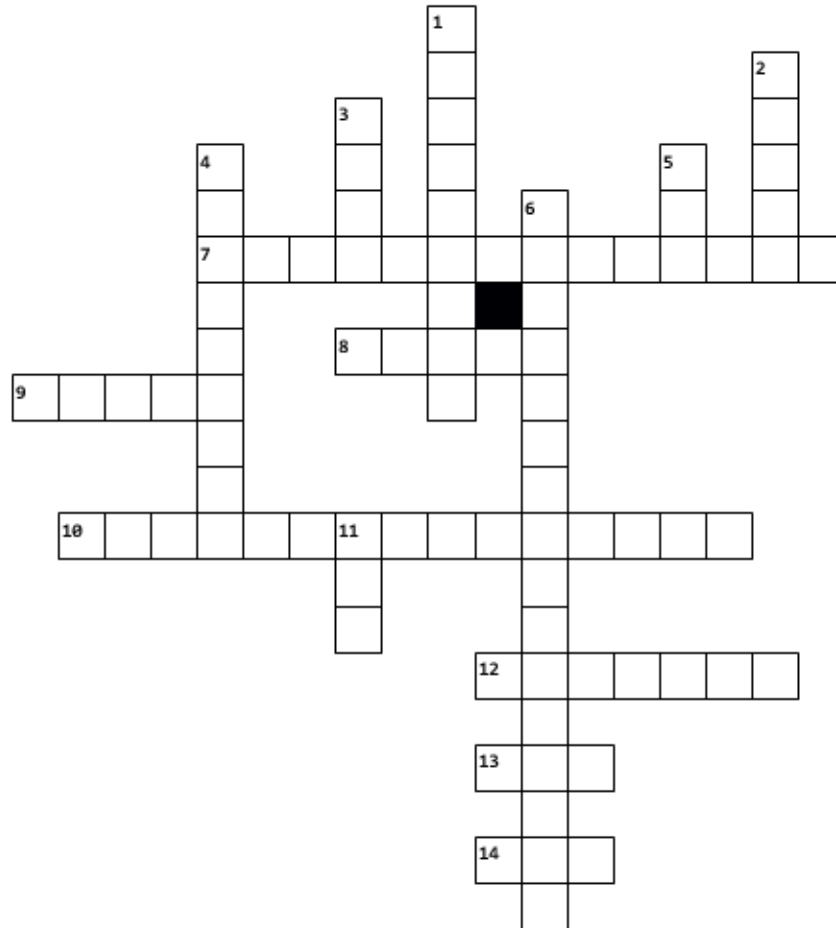

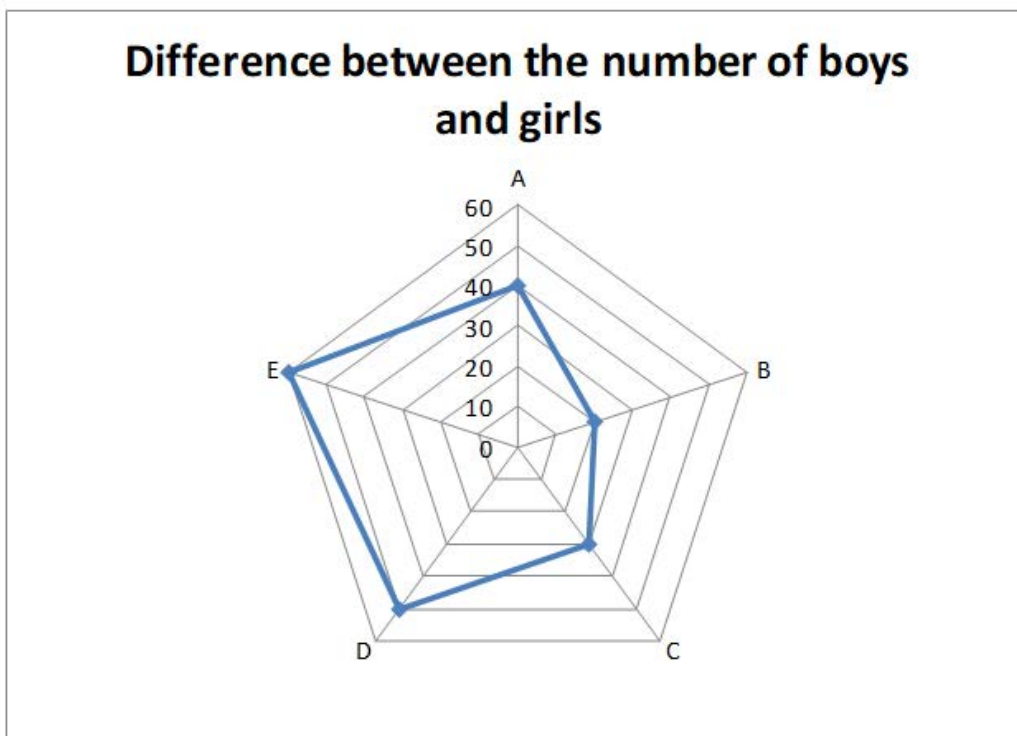

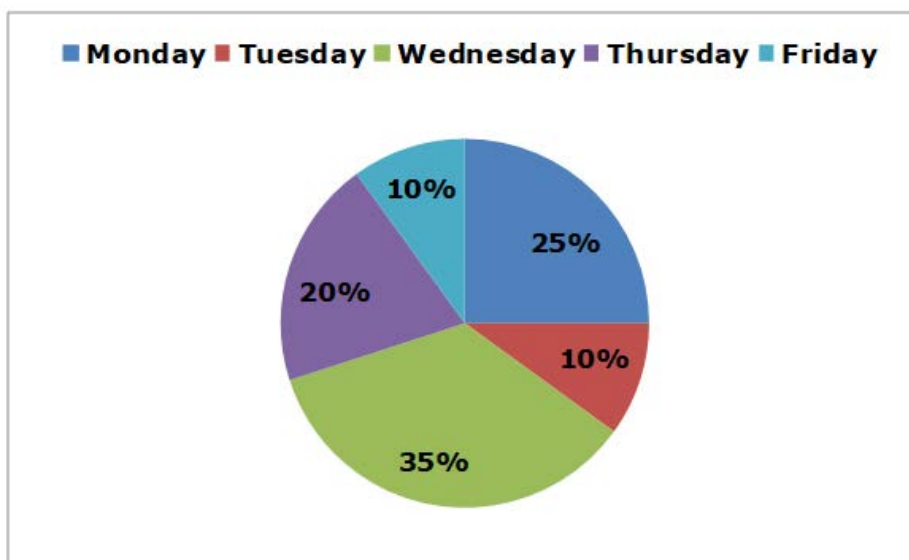

Supported: "Supported" means to express agreement, approval, or endorsement. In this context, it does not accurately convey the idea that Mehbooba Mufti is disapproving of the killing and the rise in attacks.

Decline: It means a decrease or downward movement. It does not accurately convey the idea that there is an increase in such attacks, which is the focus of Mehbooba Mufti's statement.

#### **B) Celebrated, Continuation**

Celebrated: It means to express joy, happiness, or approval. It is the opposite of what is intended in this sentence, where the context is about

expressing disapproval for a tragic event.

Continuation: "Continuation" means the ongoing or uninterrupted nature of something. It does not fit the context because it doesn't convey the idea of an increase or rise in attacks.

### **C) Ignored, Plateau**

Ignored: It means to deliberately pay no attention to something. It is not the correct word, as it implies neglect rather than the strong disapproval expressed by "condemned."

Plateau: "Plateau" means reaching a stable or unchanging level after a period of growth. It does not accurately describe the situation of an increase in attacks mentioned in the sentence.

### **89. Answer: D**

The error in part (D) is the incorrect use of "were."

The correct word to use in this context is "with." "With" is used to indicate a circumstance or condition accompanying an action or event. In this sentence, it is used to describe the condition of the pollution level in Delhi, which is "very poor," along with the accompanying information about the AQI.

### **90. Answer: D**

The error in part (D) is the incorrect usage of the verb "suggest." The correct form is "suggesting." In this context, it should be in the present participle form to indicate an ongoing action or state. The sentence is describing the current situation where sources are suggesting that President Joe Biden is unlikely to attend, so "suggesting" is the appropriate form.

### **91. Answer: A**

The error in part (A) is the subject-verb agreement. The subject of the sentence is "A 24-year-old Indian student," which is singular, so the correct verb form should be "has" (singular) instead of "have" (plural).

The correct sentence:

"A 24-year-old Indian student has been stabbed with a knife in the US state of Indiana and is reportedly in a critical condition."

### **92. Answer: C**

The error in part (C) is the use of "by." In this context, "by" is not the appropriate preposition. The correct preposition to use in this sentence is "of" to indicate that the grant is of a certain amount (₹392.52 crore).

### **93. Answer: B**



The sentence "She wanted to scale the mountain, but her fear of heights held her back" is incorrect. In this context, "scale" is used as a verb, meaning to climb or ascend, but it should be "climb the mountain" instead. "Scale" in this sentence does not convey the intended meaning correctly, as it suggests resizing or measuring the mountain's size.

**94. Answer: D**

The sentence "He decided to evaluate a delicious dish by trying it at a local restaurant" is incorrect. In this context, "evaluate" is used inappropriately. Evaluation typically involves assessing, analysing, or judging something for a specific purpose, such as quality, performance, or suitability. Trying a delicious dish at a restaurant doesn't really involve evaluation but rather personal enjoyment or tasting. The other two sentences use "evaluate" correctly to indicate a more formal assessment or analysis.

**95. Answer: B**

The sentence "He attempted to demonstrate his gratitude by giving her a heartfelt thank-you card" is somewhat unusual in its use of "demonstrate."

In the context of expressing gratitude with a heartfelt thank-you card, the

word "demonstrate" may not be the most natural choice. A more suitable word for this context could be "express" or "convey."

"He attempted to express his gratitude by giving her a heartfelt thank-you card."

"demonstrate" is typically used to show or explain something, such as a process or concept, rather than an emotion like gratitude. The other two sentences use "demonstrate" correctly in the context of showing or explaining a scientific experiment and a concept.

**96. Answer: A**

"The company decided to implement a new employee training program." In this sentence, "implement" is used correctly to indicate the action of putting a new employee training program into practice. This demonstrates a proper use of the word.

**Incorrect option explanation:**

"The chef tried to implement a gourmet recipe for the team-building exercise."

In this sentence, "implement" is used incorrectly. The word "implement" typically refers to putting plans, strategies, or systems into action. It doesn't make sense to "implement" a gourmet recipe for a team-building exercise. The word "prepare," or

"cook" would be more appropriate in this context.

"She wanted to implement a novel of suspense to her morning routine."

In this sentence, "implement" is used incorrectly. "Implement" is used for introducing or applying plans, strategies, or systems, and it doesn't fit the context of adding a novel of suspense to a morning routine. The word "add," or "incorporate" would be more suitable in this context.

### **97. Answer: C**

"The two parties were able to compromise and reach an agreement on the contract terms."

In this sentence, "compromise" is used correctly to describe reaching an agreement by making concessions.

#### **Incorrect option explanation:**

A) "She compromised with her friend by eating ice cream for breakfast."

This sentence uses "compromise" incorrectly because eating ice cream for breakfast is not a typical act of compromise. A compromise typically involves finding a mutually agreed solution. "She compromised with her friend by eating ice cream for breakfast," a more suitable word for conveying the idea of making an agreement with her friend could be "negotiated" or "settled." For example:

"She negotiated with her friend, and they decided to have ice cream for breakfast."

B) "The detective compromised the crime scene by collecting too much evidence."

In this sentence, "compromised" is used incorrectly. "Compromised" here implies damage or jeopardizing the crime scene, which is not the intended meaning. The detective should have preserved the crime scene, not compromised it. "The detective compromised the crime scene by collecting too much evidence," a more suitable word for describing what the detective did would be "contaminated" or "tainted." For example:

"The detective contaminated the crime scene by collecting too much evidence."

### **98. Answer: C**

Here are explanations for option I and option III:

"In addition to having a natural defense system against external threats, another example of such an animal is the armadillo, whose 'bulletproof' body is truly a marvel."

Option I: start with "In addition to," which effectively introduces the concept of animals having natural defense systems against external threats. It then smoothly transitions

to the specific example of the armadillo and describes its 'bulletproof' body as a marvel. The sentence structure is clear and logical.

Option III: "Moreover, in the realm of animals with natural defense systems against external threats, the armadillo whose 'bulletproof' body is truly a marvel."

Option III begins with "Moreover," which signals the addition of information to the previous statement or discussion. It then addresses the topic of animals with natural defense systems, focusing on the armadillo as an example. This creates a logical progression in the explanation.

**99. Answer: B**

The correct answer is option b - only II

"70 percent road accident deaths in India during the last year and of the total road accident deaths, a majority were due to over-speeding." This statement correctly combines the two pieces of information: 70 percent of road accident deaths and

the majority being due to over-speeding. It accurately represents the relationship between these two facts.

**100. Answer: E**

Option I: Furthermore, resembling a strawberry, a new creature possesses a captivating appearance that could easily be mistaken for a jewel or gem in the unexplored world of unfamiliar creatures found in the ocean.

"Furthermore" to introduce an additional point or idea related to the ocean's fascination.

Option II: Moreover, resembling a strawberry, a new creature possesses a captivating appearance that could easily be mistaken for a jewel or gem in the unexplored world of unfamiliar creatures within the ocean.

"Moreover" to convey the meaning of the abundance in the creatures of the ocean. It tells about the new creature which looks like a jewel or gem.

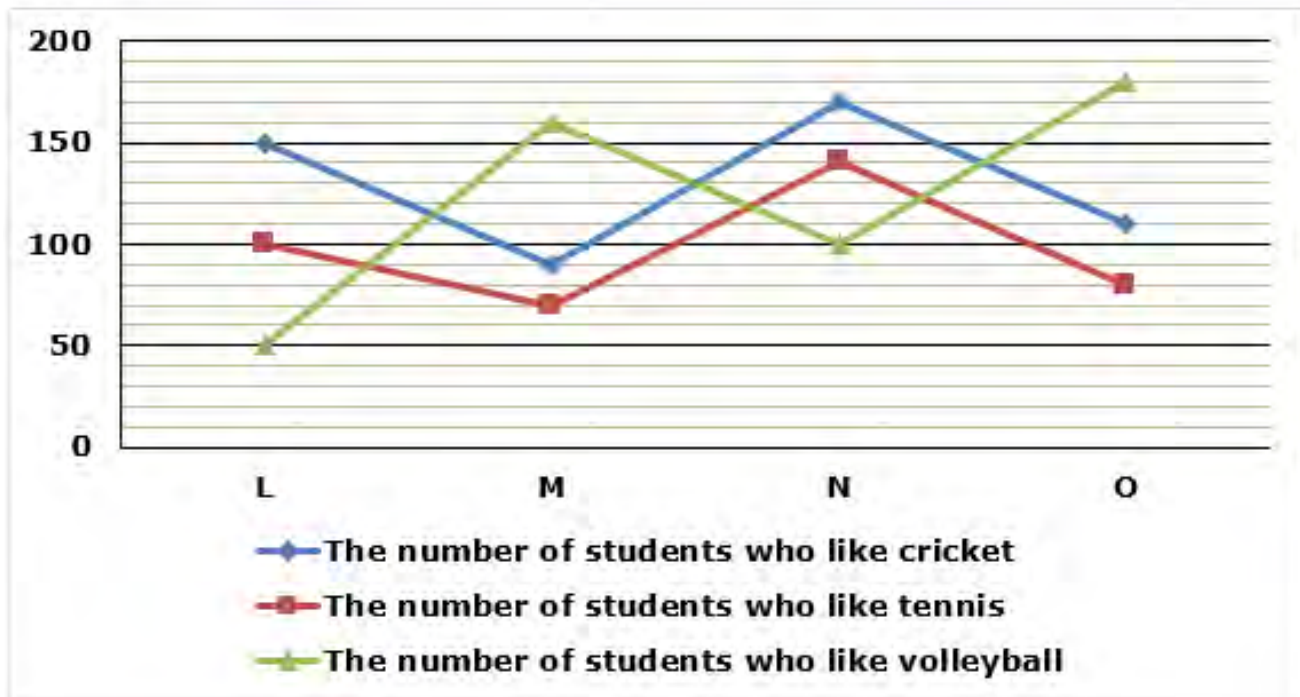

However, spices do more than flavour a dish; They are also used to cool and warm the body during hot or cold weather. Yogurt is commonly used to flavour dishes or as a sauce to chill spicy dishes. Many Indian dishes are cooked in vegetable oil, but peanut oil is popular in northern and western India, mustard oil in eastern India, and coconut oil along the western coast, especially in Kerala. Gingelly (sesame) oil is common in the south since it imparts a fragrant, nutty aroma. In recent decades, sunflower, safflower, cottonseed, and soybean oils have become popular across India. Butter-based ghee, or deshi ghee, is used frequently, though less than in the past.

Many types of meat are used for Indian cooking, but chicken and mutton tend to be the most commonly consumed meats. Fish and beef consumption are prevalent in some parts of India, but they are not widely consumed except for coastal areas, as well as the north east. Some leaves commonly used for flavouring include bay leaves (tejpatta), coriander leaves, fenugreek leaves, and mint leaves. The use of curry leaves and roots for flavouring is typical of Gujarati and South Indian cuisine. Sweet dishes

are often seasoned with cardamom, saffron, nutmeg, and rose petal essences.

Eating is usually with family and friends, with the homemaker on the table keeping an eye on the table, bringing and offering more food. ### 74. Doughty(adjective)

**Brave and persistent**

**Synonyms-** Fearless, Dauntless, Determined

**Example-** His doughty spirit kept him going



### 75. Pragmatism(noun)

**Thinking about solving problems in a practical and sensible way rather than by having fixed ideas**

### 76. Toppled(verb)

**To become less steady and fall down; remove (a government or person in authority) from power**

**A large fire which burns a lot of buildings, land, forests, etc.**

**Serving or tending to provoke, excite, or stimulate**

**To become more unpleasant because you do not deal with it successfully**

**A group of people who share the same work or interests**

**To have a bad effect on something**

**Synonyms-** Encroach, Infringe, Trespass

### 84. Pugnacious(adjective)

**Eager or quick to argue, quarrel or fight**

**Synonyms-** Encroach, Infringe,

**Antonyms-** Dodge, Miss

**Example-** Her work is impinging on her social life



### 85. Discretion(noun)

**The freedom and power to make decisions by yourself**

**Synonyms-** Choice, Option, Judgment

**Antonyms-** Indiscretion

**Example-** Local authorities should use their discretion in setting the charges



### 86. Evocatively(adverb)

**In a way that makes you remember or imagine something pleasant**

**Synonyms-** Reminiscent, Redolent, Vivid

**Antonyms-** Unmindful, Heedlessness

**Example-** He writes evocatively about his upbringing



### 87. Expunged(verb)

**Obliterate or remove completely (something unwanted or unpleasant)**

**Synonyms-** Delete, Remove, Erase

**Antonyms-** Restore, Insert, Forge

**Example-** The kind of man that could expunge an unsatisfactory incident from his memory



### 88. Disparagingly(adverb)

**A critical or unkind way that shows you do not respect someone or something**

**Synonyms-** Adversely, Critically

**Antonyms-** Approvingly, Agreeably

**Example-** She denied they had a relationship but she never spoke disparagingly of him



### 89. Grappled with (phrase)

**To try to deal with or understand a difficult problem or subject**

**Synonyms-** Struggle, Contend, Cope

**Antonyms-** Unbalance, Refuse, and Cancel

**Example-** Two officers grappled with the gunman



### 90. Rubble (noun)

**Pieces of broken brick, stone, etc**

**Synonyms-** Debris, Remains, Ruins

**Antonyms-** Cleanliness, Possessions

**Example-** Rescue workers managed to pull two injured people out of the rubble



### 91. Imperative (adjective)

**Very important or urgent; giving an authoritative command**

**Synonyms-** Peremptory, Commanding

**Antonyms-** Unimportant, Optional

**Example-** Immediate action was imperative



### 92. Retaliating (verb)

**To get revenge; make an attack in return for a similar attack**

**Synonyms-** Fight back, React

**Antonyms-** Mercy, Forgiveness

**Example-** The blow stung and she retaliated immediately



### 93. Circumspection (noun)

**The quality of being wary and unwilling to take risks**

**Synonyms-** Prudence, Caution

**Antonyms-** Recklessness, Incaution

**Example-** Circumspection is required in the day-to-day exercise of administrative powers



### 94. Ceasefire (noun)

**An agreement between two groups to stop fighting each other**

**Synonyms-** Armistice, Truce, Peace

**Antonyms-** War, Conflict

**Example-** The latest ceasefire seems to be holding



### 95. Despicable (adjective)

**Deserving hatred and contempt**

**Synonyms-** Contemptible, Reprehensible, Degrading

**Antonyms-** Respectable, Reputable

**Example-** A despicable crime



### 96. Herald (verb)

**To be a sign that something is going to happen soon**

**Synonyms-** Harbinger, Precursor

**Antonyms-** Conceal, Suppress

**Example-** The early flowers are heralds of spring





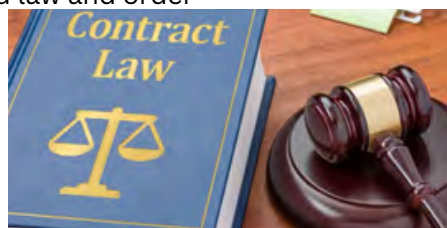
### 97. Abrogation(noun)

The act of formally ending a law, agreement, or custom

**Synonyms**- Repudiation, Revocation, Repeal

**Antonyms**- Institution, Introduction

**Example**- He seemed to abrogate his duty to withhold law and order

The quality of being very important and deserving respect

**Synonyms**- Holiness, Piety, Virtue

**Antonyms**- Wickedness

**Example**- The builders did not care about the sanctity of life



### 99. Labyrinth(noun)

An intricate or confused matter or condition

**Synonyms**- Complexity, Intricacy, Perplexity

**Antonyms**- Simplistic, Simplified, Uncomplicated

**Example**- A labyrinth of conflicting political interpretations



### 100. Morbid(adjecive)

Relating to or characterized by disease

**Synonyms**- Ghoulish, Diseased, Pathologic

**Antonyms**- Wholesome, Healthy

**Example**- A morbid condition of some part of the body



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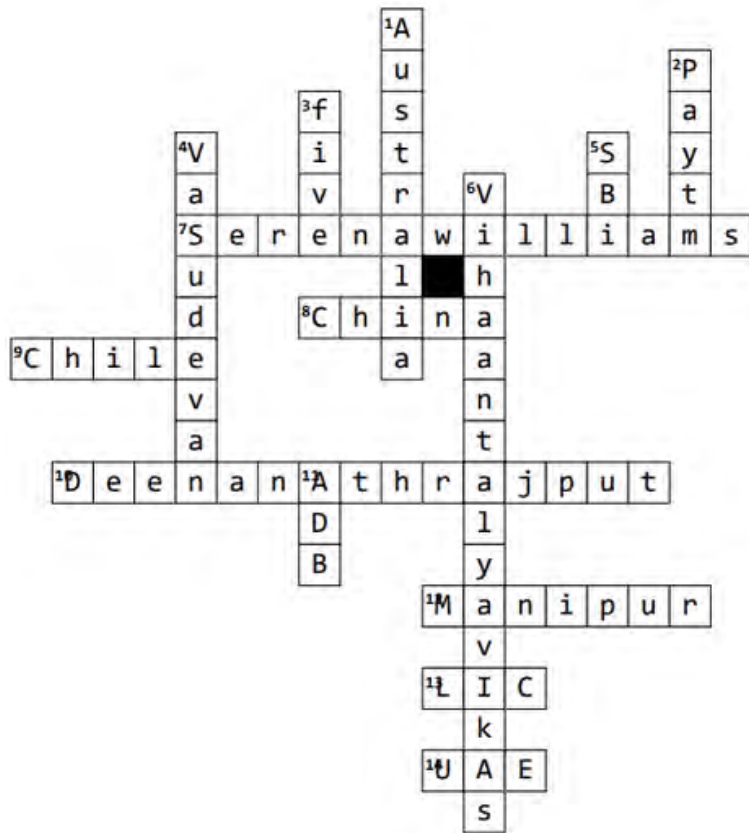
