CRUISE

Cruise is one of the BVI Ports main revenue streams.

The Cruise Pier at the Cyril B. Romney Tortola Pier Park, which accommodates cruise ships, is operated by the Tortola Pier Park Limited, a limited liability company owned by the BVIPA.

Smaller Cruise Ships will often anchor at our Harbours such as:

- Road Harbour, Tortola
- Sophers Hole, Tortola
- Beef Island
- St. Thomas Bay, Virgin Gorda
- North Sound, Virgin Gorda
- White Bay, Jost Van Dyke
- Great Harbour, Peter Island
- The Bite, Norman Island
- Setting Point, Anegada

In order to facilitate this business we have to work with several partners such as:

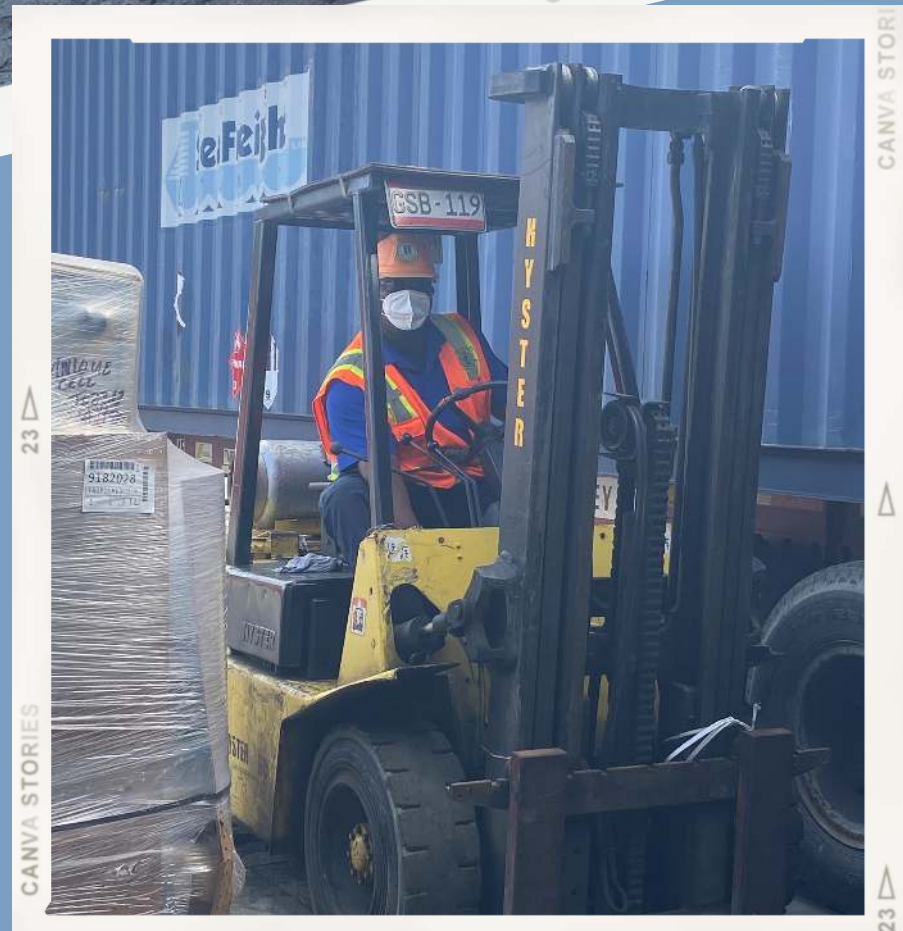

CARGO

The Port Purcell facility is the main cargo port, through which the bulk of cargo entering and leaving the Virgin Islands is processed due to the facility's ability to accommodate a number of large ships simultaneously.

Virgin Gorda is also a cargo port, facilitating cargo through the St. Thomas Bay Jetty.



CARGO

Types of Cargo:

- Break Bulk (general cargo)
- Containerized (storing a number of pieces of freight)
- Wheeled Cargo (roll-on/roll-off)

The BVIPA does not own any ferries but we do have several Ferry Terminals that service domestic and international ferry routes.

These terminals or jetties are located at:

- Road Town , Tortola
- West End , Tortola
- St. Thomas Bay, Virgin Gorda
- Gun Creek , Virgin Gorda
- Dog Hole, Jost Van Dyke
- Trellis Bay, Tortola
- Anegada
