## MESSAGES FROM THE DIRECTOR

The big news over the last few weeks has, guidelines will have minimal impact for us at least, been the Air Quality here in Bangkok. Once again, I want to thank everyone who has contributed their thoughts and concerns over this issue. Everyone who contacted us did so in a really positive way and has helped to improve the environment around the school.

As you will know, we have installed over 80 air purifiers in classrooms and other rooms around the school this week and, as part of our contract with Coway, will be serviced regularly.

Like all international schools in Thailand. last week, we received updated guidance from OPEC on how we should respond to times of poor air quality. I am delighted to say that we already exceeded their requirements and apart from a few technical changes, these changed

on us.

When events like the poor air quality happen, it is all too easy to feel powerless and that there is nothing we, as individuals can do. However: that is mindset that stops things improving. Perhaps only in a small way, but it would help if more of us car shared in the morning to reduce the emissions from cars and the congestion. Is there someone who lives near you whose children also go to Charter that you could share the school run with? It might even mean a more relaxing morning for you? Similarly, do you need to keep your engine running when you are waiting to collect your children after school?

All of these small changes can help and do add up!

I hope that you all enjoyed our wonderful Chinese New Year celebrations earlier in the week. Both the Primary and Secondary concerts were a great celebration on Chinese culture, both traditional and modern.

To continue the theme of internationalism. we will finish the 1/2 term with International Day. A focus for our year-round emphasis on developing Global Citizens, celebrating our cultures and coming to gather as one big Charter community.

## WHAT'S HAPPENING...



### **KINDERGARTEN - N**

We have had a wonderful time celebrating Chinese New Year in Kindergarten. First we made Lanterns to decorate our inside play area using star patterns and ribbons.

We also redecorated our home corner kitchen to resemble a Chinese themed restaurant where the children have enjoyed pretending to make some Chinese foods like playdoh Chinese New Year cookies and salapao. The children then roleplayed selling their food with their customers giving them money in the form of gems or coins in Aug pau red envelopes.









### **NOISY YEAR 1K**

Throughout our English lessons, we have explored the fascinating relationship between sound, poetry, and rhyming, and how they contribute to the overall effect of a poem. We've learned that sound in poetry is not just about words but also about the rhythm, pace, and musicality they create. By covering 'Hand on the Bridge' by Michael Rosen, we discovered how rhyming word patterns can shape a poem's flow and enhance its meaning.

We have been sound investigators around the school and during our IPC lessons, we made a list of sounds so that we can find out what sounds there are and how they are made. We recorded our findings on a piece of paper and used tables to group the sounds in various ways, sounds made by animals, people, nature and machines. In the end, the little poets created their poems using sounds and rhyming words we collected during our sound hunt.



#### **A ROARING SUCCESS: DINOSAUR WORLD VISIT**

As part of our IPC topic, Footprints From the Past, which focuses on dinosaurs, our school had the incredible opportunity to welcome a special guest from Pattaya Dinosaur World. Khun Alexander, the owner, and his son, Niko, brought prehistoric history to life for our students in the most exciting way.

The visit featured some of their impressive dinosaur hand puppets, which captivated the children from the moment they were revealed. With lifelike features and movements, these puppets provided a unique and interactive way for the students to engage with the fascinating world of dinosaurs. The children were thrilled to stroke the "dinosaurs," sparking a tangible connection to their learning.

Khun Alexander also patiently answered the children's many questions about dinosaurs, sharing his vast knowledge and passion for these ancient creatures. This hands-on experience left the students both amazed and inspired, making their journey into the past one to remember!
