The Theme for Tenabrae 2025 is "Lamentations at the Cross". Tenebrae is a Latin word for "darkness". In Christian tradition, Tenebrae is a service that is held during the three days preceding Easter Sunday.

PSPC is observing Tenebrae during the Holy Week with a choral presentation and concurrent art exhibition. The objective of this Tenabrae reflection is to lead the participants on a reflective spiritual journey through the passion narrative. During the service, there is a gradual dimming and extinguishing of candles as the service progresses. This leaves the place in total darkness at the end of the service.

The Arts Fellowship (TAF) coordinates the concurrent exhibition. The ministry philosophy of the Arts Fellowship and the ministry objectives of the Tenebrae Reflections is: art is a gift from God to edify His people and to reach the world. Each year, we invite artists to use their God-given talent to participate in this event.

We thank God for calling the following Christian artists - Wong Shih Yaw, Emily Spencer Seck, Isaac Lim, Ng Guat Tin, Leong Yiat Teng, Andy Choy, The Shepherd's Staff Collective and Diana Chou to be God's servants to fulfil their vocation of artmaking in the body of Christ for the Tenebrae Reflections. 


1989: Diploma in Fine Arts (Painting), Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts (NAFA), Singapore.

JESUS PRAYS IN GETHSEMANE

Artist's Statement

This painting extracts four symbols to portray Jesus' prayer in Gethsemane, three of which are from the Tenebrae song "Forsaken in the Garden": a cup ("Father, Father, take this cup away"); a kneeling figure ("Hear me as I pray"); an eye with tear drops ("Do you taste my tears?"); and olive branches (olive grove as the setting). A fragmented cross (broken people), and a heart at its centre, is the focus, depicting Jesus' submission to God the Father's will to die on the cross, where his heart would break from obedience and love, and blood shed, to redeem sinners.

Peter is crouched in guilt, sorrow and shame, having denied Jesus. Nevertheless, Jesus graciously waits for all to repent and turn back to Him – the True Light – symbolised by the blazing fire.

The background is in shades of twilight, as darkness descends. Although Jesus faced the dark moment of bearing humanity's sin and God's wrath against sin, out of love for us, He ultimately emerges triumphant. This amazing grace is the reason for our hope.


