BEGIN@BEDS CHECKLIST

Get these must-do items ticked off your list and you'll have a stress-free start to University life.

BEFORE YOU ARRIVE

- ✓ For UK-based students who have not yet applied for student loans, do so as soon as possible at [gov.uk/student-finance](https://www.gov.uk/student-finance) – you will need your student loan customer reference number (CRN) to complete online registration.
- ✓ Make sure you have arranged and paid for your accommodation, if needed. Find full details at beds.ac.uk/accommodation
- ✓ Healthcare, social work and teaching students should complete Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) and health checks. Admissions will have emailed you with information about these checks.
- ✓ Healthcare students should send details of their second referee if you have been asked to do so in your offer letter.
- ✓ If you have additional support needs, contact our Disability Support team via beds.ac.uk/disability
- ✓ Download your course/unit reading list at readinglists.beds.ac.uk and start familiarising yourself with the course materials and subject research.

Look out for important emails from our Registration team. The emails will be from noreply@beds.ac.uk. If you don't receive these emails, please check your spam or junk folders before contacting the team.



COMPLETE YOUR ONLINE REGISTRATION

- » For most UK-based students, registration is fully remote and supported online.
- » International students will need to come on campus to complete document checks with the International Admissions team.
- » Courses leading to a professional award will also expect you to show original documents at on-campus appointments.
- » For on-campus document checks, we will let you know what documents to bring with you.

Make sure you have the following documents available in electronic format before you start your online registration - you may be asked to upload them as part of the process.

- » A passport-style photo less than **2MB** file size, in one of the following formats: **.jpg, .jpeg, .png, .tiff**
- » Your offer letter
- » Student loan approval documents or your Customer Reference Number (CRN); if your funding comes from another source, supporting finance documents or fee-payment method
- » eVisa documents and share code (international students only)

WHERE DOES LEARNING TAKE PLACE?



ON CAMPUS

This is the learning you complete face-to-face, in lecture halls and seminar rooms with lecturers and other professionals who may co-deliver sessions. You also learn from your peers in the cafeterias, library, social spaces and even the gym - the campus is an educational environment so learning is everywhere.

THROUGH BREO

Bedfordshire's virtual learning environment (VLE) contains activities and resources you should engage with to drive your learning forward; it is also the hub for any distance learning you may be required to do.

IN-WORK OR OFF-CAMPUS PRACTICE

With our focus on career-powered education, you may have placement or off-campus experiences embedded into your course. In addition, our industry links open up opportunities for work experience, internships and involvement in live projects.

INDEPENDENTLY

This means completing reading and research on your own, putting your preparation skills to the test. Keep in mind that being able to source, evaluate and critique information independently has been linked to achieving higher grades!



LEARNING AT THE LIBRARY

You will have fantastic multimedia study resources at your fingertips in our innovative, well-equipped libraries.

LIBRARY RESOURCES

Our Luton and Bedford campus libraries offer a variety of study environments including rooms for group work, presentation practice and silent study. Each space is equipped with furniture and facilities to ensure you have a comfortable, accessible and inclusive learning experience.

When you study at the library, you will be supported by the latest technology, including PCs with a wide range of software

applications; laptops that can be borrowed free of charge; and audiovisual equipment. Our extensive, sector-leading digital library is available from most devices with internet access whether you are on or away from campus.

To assist with specific study needs, we offer induction loops; height-adjustable tables; flat-screen monitors; keyboards for visually impaired users;

and Keyboard-Pro software for developing typing skills.

Explore the full range of print and online books, journals, articles, databases, exam papers and dissertations with DISCOVER - the online, single-search tool that searches most electronic resources and the library catalogue in one go. It saves time by showing what is available to read online and what is on the shelves.

STUDY HUB

Based within our library facilities, Study Hub will help you develop your academic skills, which will lead to better grades and enhanced employability.

You can book a Study Hub appointment, which will be conducted however you feel comfortable: online, in person or over the phone. The service is available throughout the year, completely free and open to all our students.

You will also find a wide range of online materials on the Study Hub A-Z resources webpages. These cover key areas for success such as library resources, referencing, academic writing, maths, digital learning, Microsoft Office and study skills.

Bedford: The Hub, run by Beds SU, is the place to go to take a break, play pool and socialise with friends during the day; you can also join weekly craft sessions. In the evening, the Hub hosts evening events including club nights and sports socials.

At Bedfordshire, you will learn in an environment geared towards preparing you for the real world, from state-of-the-art simulation suites and specialist laboratories to industry-standard equipment, technology and software.

FOR ART AND DESIGN

Spacious studios with access to a 3D workshop; print room; set-design studios; stop-motion suite; and green-screen room. Equipment and technology include AutoCAD; 3D-modelling and avatar fashion software; Mac computers with Creative Cloud, Dragonframe and TB Paint.

FOR BUSINESS AND LAW

London Stock Exchange Group trading room; new business analytics suite; simulated moot court to practise court proceedings; a range of immersive simulation software including Simulate (Aviation); Semrush (Marketing); Opera (Hospitality Management); Sage and STATA (Accounting and Finance).



FOR COMPUTER SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING

CCNA Academy computer networking suite; games, animation and graphics studios with VR technology; National Instruments electronic engineering laboratory; forensics and IT security laboratory; specialist automotive engineering lab with advanced automotive engine demonstrators; a robotics research lab; machine and product design workshop.

FOR EDUCATION AND ENGLISH

Realistic mock classrooms including for early years; Forest School for training in outdoor learning and play; SEND and early years sensory unit; wide range of indoor and outdoor sports facilities including multi-use games area; well-resourced library.

FOR NURSING AND HEALTH

Brand-new simulation units at Luton and Bedford, taking you from mock home to hospital; simulated wards with medical-grade mannequins at Aylesbury, Bedford and Luton; mock operating theatre with anaesthetic equipment and recovery room; a simulation 'flat' with a moving/handling room; physiotherapy suite; two clinical-training ambulances.

Research laboratories including a cell culture lab and analytical science suite; specialist forensic laboratory with insectary; mock crime-scene flat; industry-standard technology for high-end pharmaceutical experiments such as protein purification and characterisation and Bio-Rad gel electrophoresis.

FOR PSYCHOLOGY

Industry-standard laboratories and computing environments including a biological and cognitive psychology lab, cognitive neuropsychology lab, and VR lab; eye-tracking software; physiological data-acquisition system; and EEG recording equipment.

FOR MEDIA

Broadcast-standard, HD multi-camera television studios; industry-standard radio facilities; Mac-equipped newsroom; Netflix-approved cameras; location-recording equipment; industry-standard 3D green-screen room; digital video-editing suites; and Adobe Creative Cloud software.

FOR SPORT AND PHYSICAL ACTIVITY

Six CASES-accredited laboratories; sports rehabilitation centre; strength and conditioning facility; community exercise clinic; multi-use games areas; external sports pitches. Equipment includes hydrostatic weighing tank; ECG machines; breath gas and blood analysers; Catapult GPS tracking; In-Play performance analysis; and a high-speed, motion-capture 3D camera system.

- » A family chat group so you can easily keep in touch with home.
- » A mapped or bookmarked list of key locations in your new town (university, train and bus stations, post office, nearest supermarket and so on).
- » Another list of places you would like to visit - restaurants, pubs, shops, parks, local attractions and surrounding countryside. You can include London on your list – it's just 25-40 minutes away by train.

FIRST DAYS AT UNI

Although you may feel a little homesick at first, we do everything possible to support you until you have settled in and made new friends.

- » We have existing Bedfordshire students on hand from day one to help new students settle in and answer questions about University life.
- » You also have a personal academic tutor who will provide you with academic and pastoral support.
- » You have the opportunity to talk to your course leader as well as meeting other staff from your School and Faculty.

If you're worried about your finances, our **Money Advice team** can provide you with support on a wide range of money matters, from budgeting to funding.

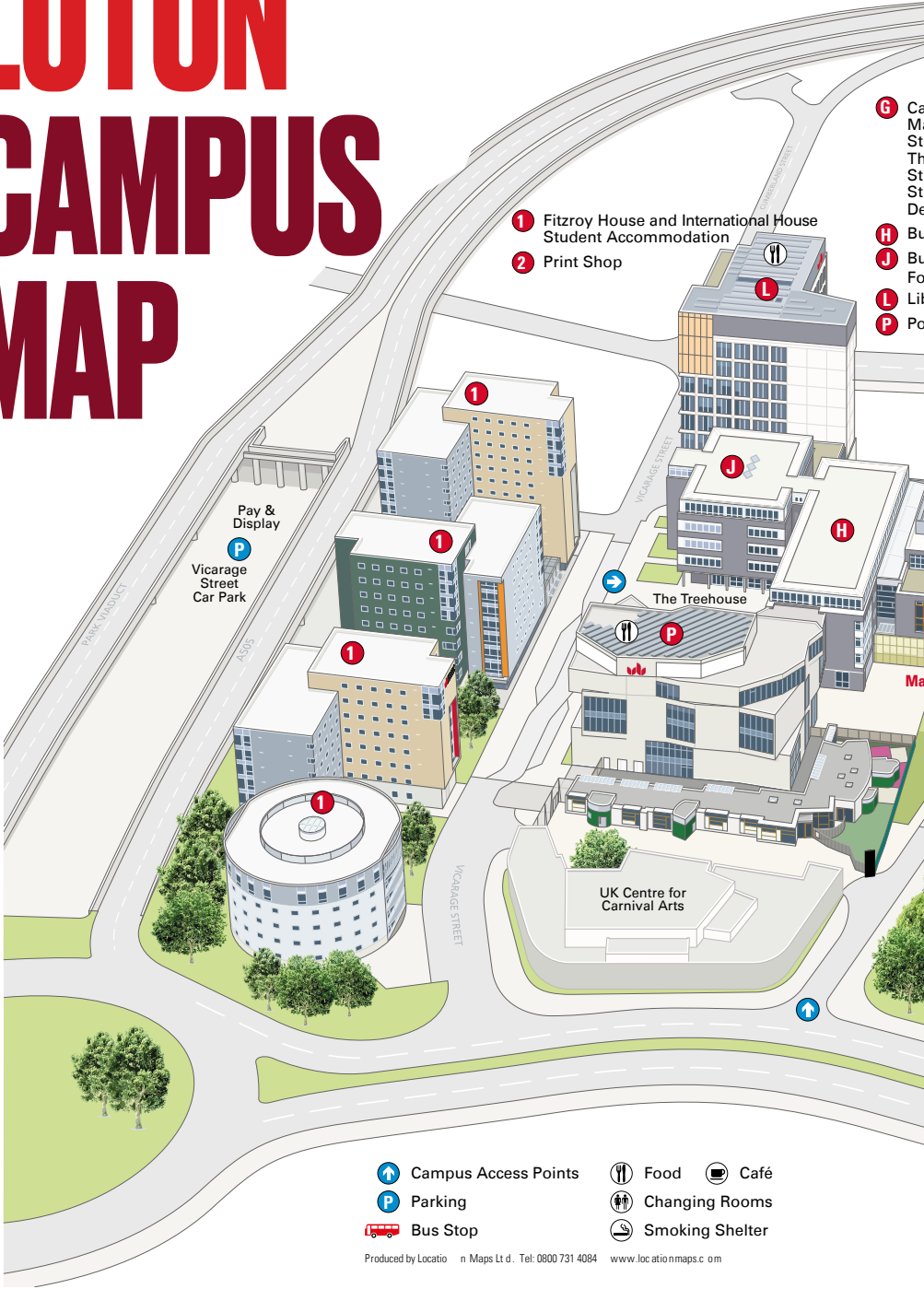
If you want to find your faith community, the **Community and Faith teams** can offer you guidance as well as somewhere on campus to relax, reflect or pray.

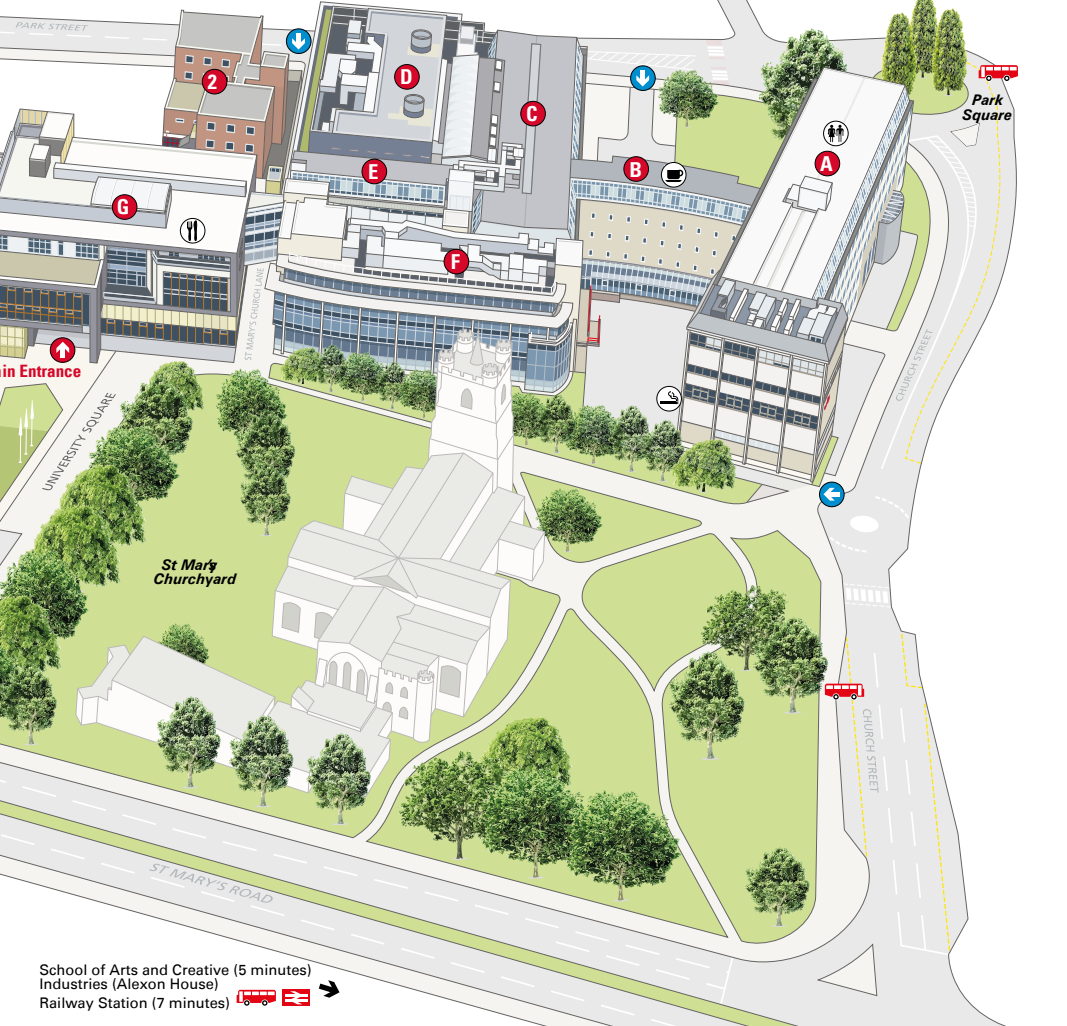

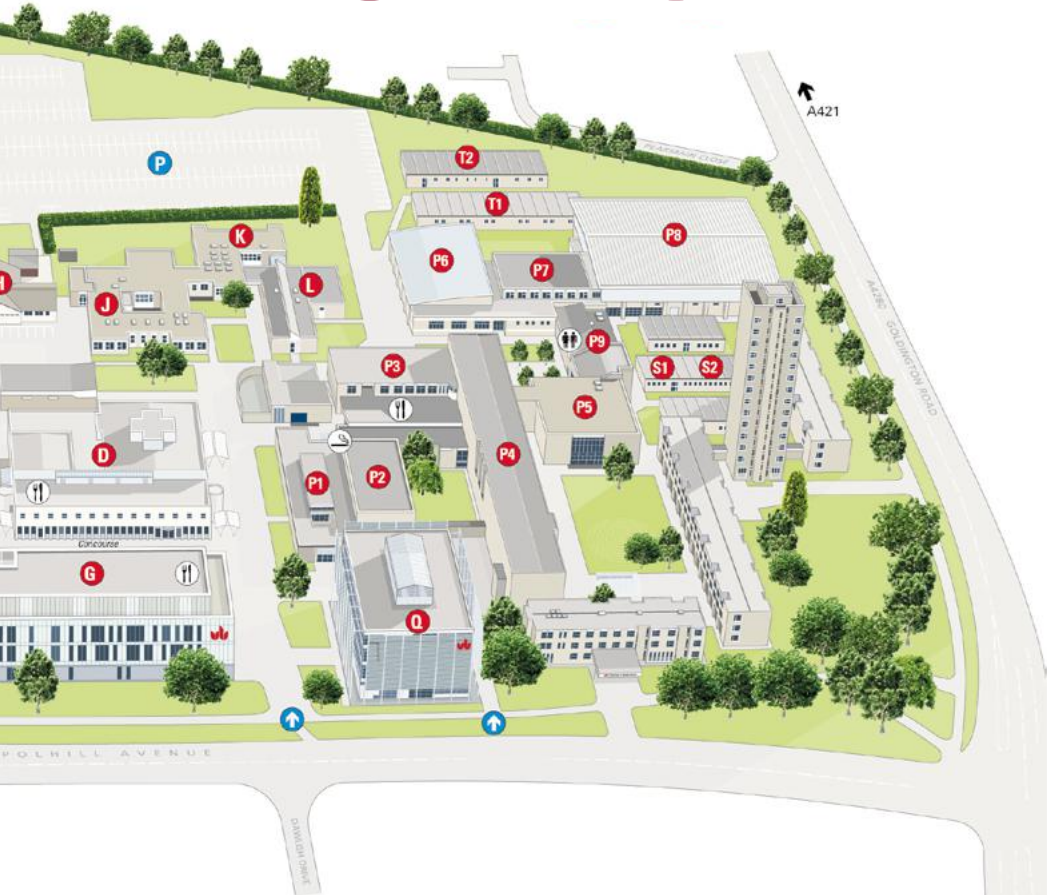
