When I go through another set of doors, I am inside the Library. The circulation desk is on the right, the fiction desk is to the left, people at both desks can help me.



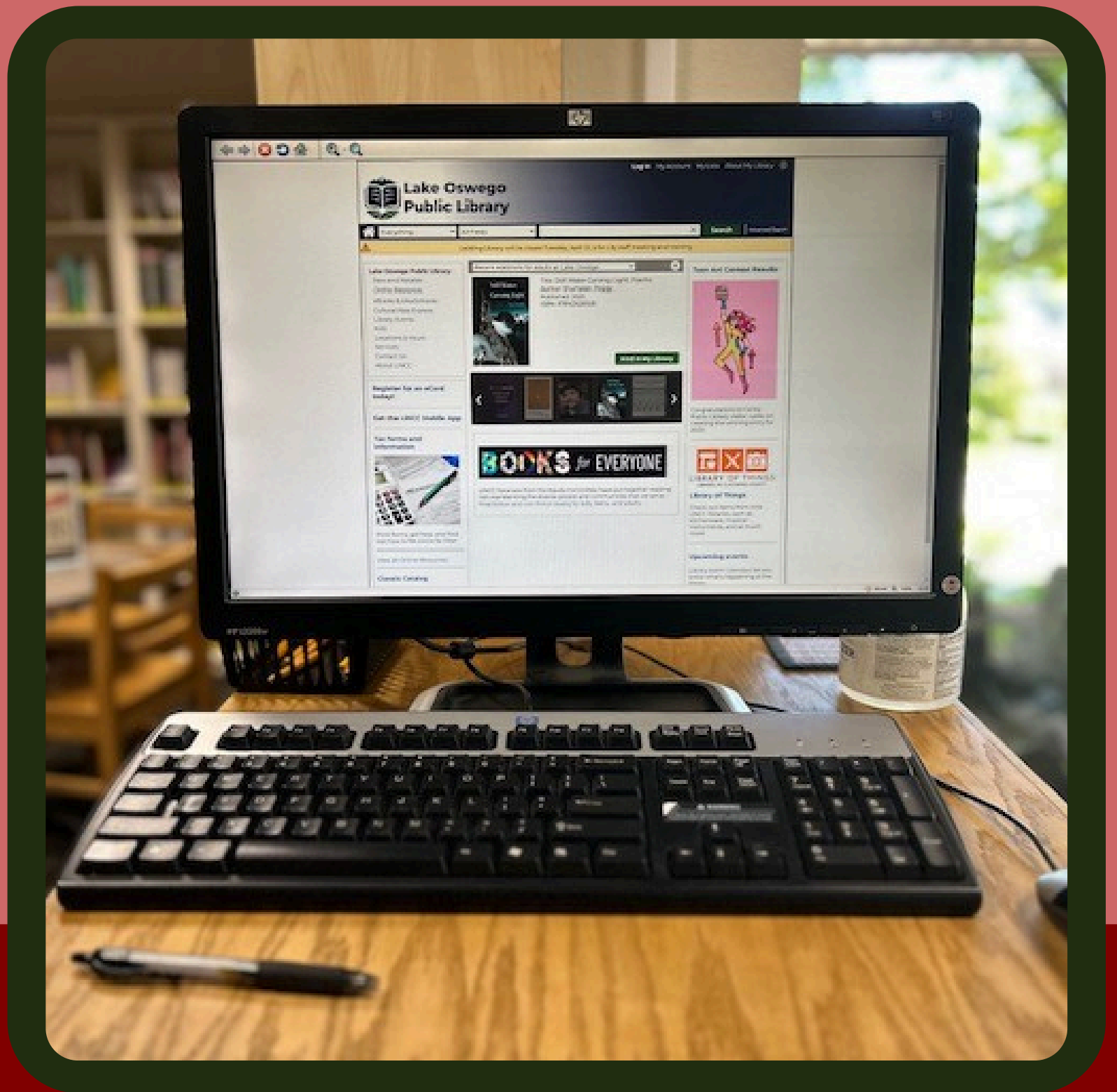
There is a restroom and a drinking fountain at the Library.

The Library is a place where I can look at books.



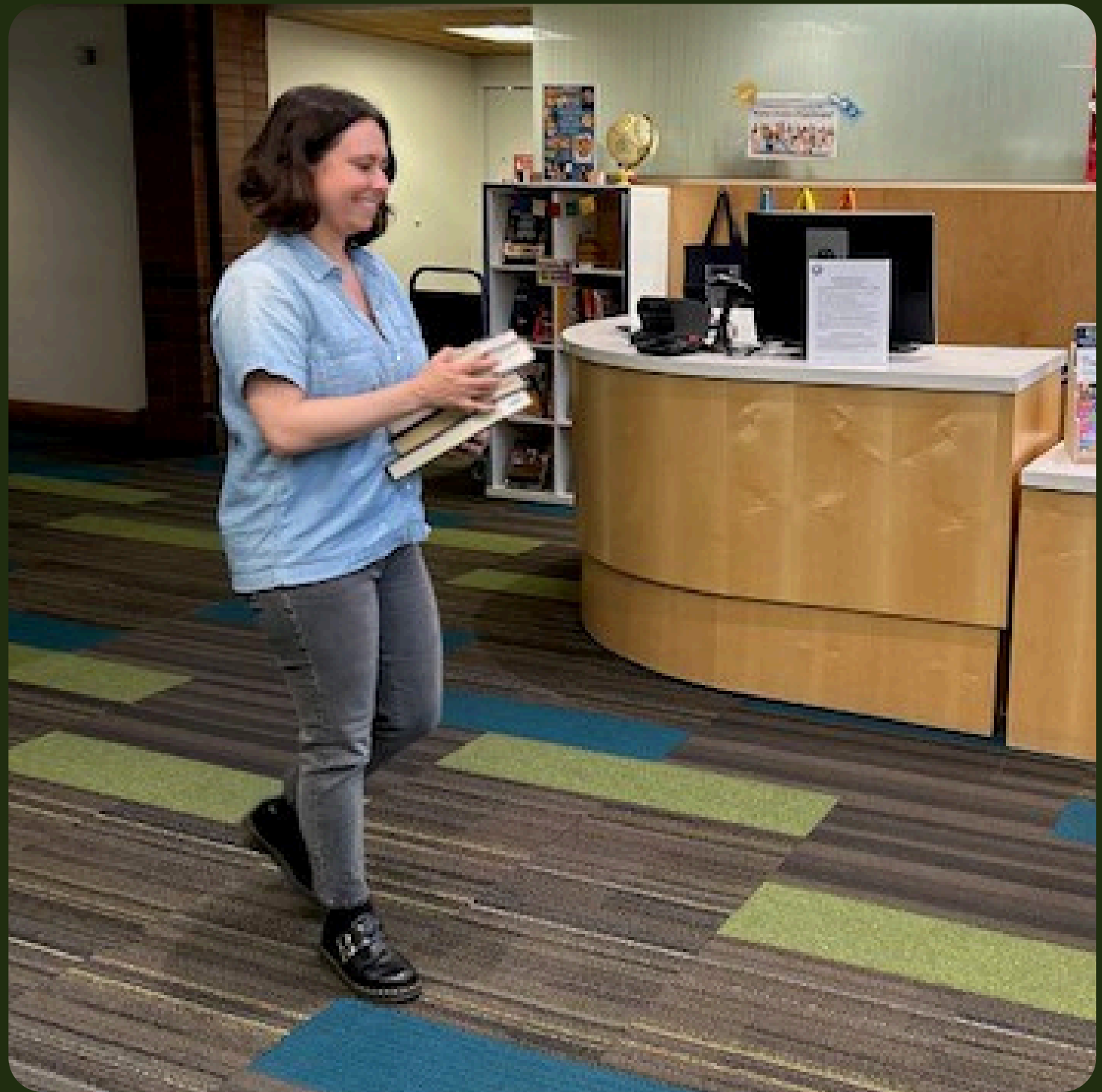
There are computers where I can use the library catalog to find books and materials. I can type in the name of a book and the Catalog will tell me where to find it.
