The Headmaster's Report

Prize Giving 2022

Good evening, Honoured Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen, Staff and Port Rexians.

It is indeed a pleasure this evening to present to you the report on all the various activities at the Port Rex Technical High School for the past calendar year.

It was the year that we finally emerged from behind "the Mask" - where the Port Rex institution returned to default settings. Sport and Derby Days and Cultural activities returned. In retrospect we noticed the lingering effect of the lock-downs and school closures that we had to endure. The first observation is the renewed vigor that Port Rexians displayed in the sporting and cultural fields. The number of new clubs and societies established at school is a positive example of the need of the learners to participate and compete.

We have also become aware of the damage done to the Academic program at Port Rex. The lock-down and school closure had a definite negative impact on teaching, learning and assessment. It will take time and effort to remedy that.

Before reporting on the activities of 2022, we need to wrap-up 2021. The results of the Grade 12 class of 2021 were very encouraging. The overall pass rate was 90.4% with 55 Bachelor, 47 Diploma and 10 Higher Diploma Passes! That is in a High School where ALL the learners offer the subjects; Mathematics and Science! Our top learner was LIYANDA NGQEZA with an aggregate of 75.3% - including 3 subject A's and 3 subject B's.

It In December 2021 we said good-bye to Mr Jeremy Alexander, and Mrs Kiara Bridger.

At the end of this year we bid a sad farewell to Mr Chris Geldenhuys and Ms Gaby Bhana who will leave Port Rex. We thank them for their contribution and dedicated service.

This year the Port Rex family grew when the stork paid us a visit with the birth of Imogen Luff born to Mr and Mrs Donovan Luff.
Mr Waldi van Greunen got engaged to Esmarie Terblanche.

The Port Rex Staff participated in a Staff Development Seminar towards the end of January, which set the tone for the start of the Academic year. Our Guest Presenter was Mrs Lisa Potgieter.

During the Academic Awards Assembly in February; 113 learners received Merit Awards and 13 received Colours Awards for their academic work in 2021. This must be viewed against the fact that every learner at Port Rex THS takes Mathematics and Science as compulsory subjects.

The School Governing Body, under the leadership of Prof Emmanuel Adu, have played a vital role in supporting and encouraging teaching and learning - especially in up-holding the Code of Conduct. They have also released the necessary funds for urgent up-keep and maintenance projects around the Port Rex campus.

We missed the past two years Founders' Day celebrations, so it made this year a special occasion that will be remembered by all, past and present. Our guest speaker, Tom Swartz, a previous winner of Survivor South Africa gave a spirited speech that was very motivational. For the first time ever the Assembly was Live-streamed on Face-book and more than 4 000 people followed it.

The 30-year Reunion group was represented by Mr Denis Kieck, a past Head Boy of the Technical college.

Port Rex conducted a Winter School during the first week of the June holidays. Subjects offered were Mathematics, Technical Mathematics, Physical Sciences, Technical Sciences, Engineering Graphics and Design and English HL. 71 of our Matriculants attended the Winter School and proper revision was done to prepare them thoroughly for the final examinations.

On Thursday, 16 June the Motor Industry Workshop Association (MIWA) hosted the Motor Mechanics Show at Port Rex. The event was very well supported and we look forward to an even better event in 2023.

On 15 July our Class of 2022 celebrated the Matric Farewell. The theme for the evening was, "Under a Starry Night".



This has been a full, memorable and action-packed year for the Port Rex community and the efforts of our Port Rex learners have been nothing but remarkable, be it on the sports field, culturally or academic.

There were eight Cross Country races this year. Well done to the following athletes: Silas Adu, David Bwema, Kwanda Khutshiso, Daniel Krull, Latitha Mangcu and Bulelani Pasha. The highlight of the season was when David Bwema was invited to participate in the Eastern Cape Championships held in Bathurst and won the race!

The end of the 1st term our 1st Netball Team participated in the Merrifield Sports Festival. It was indeed an enjoyable event for our netball players, where they won 3 of the 5 matches.

The Rugby Club had a very competitive season where we fielded 10 age-group teams in local Derby's. Our under 14's had a season filled with matches that was decided in the final few minutes which for Port Rex, without a feederschool, is something very special. The under 15's had a similar season with most of the matches decided in the last few minutes with memorable victories over Stirling HS and the double wins against Cambridge and Grens HS. Our under 16's had a successful pre-season tour to the Kirkwood Festival, winning 2 out of 3 matches played. That was followed by a beautiful victory against Grens HS. The first team had another good season regardless of the results. Worth mentioning is the double win over Cambridge HS.

Port Rex was represented at the Craven Week Rugby Tournament by Deputy Head Prefect Michael Antwi.



After a Covid absence Cricket was slowly introduced back onto the extramural program. Only a hand-full of matches were played during the 1st term. With-in the next 3 weeks more matches are scheduled and we are awaiting some positive out-comes

Boys and Girls Hockey started with a flurry. After several matches the teams started to gel and some good performances especially the win against Baysville HS. Our girls' team consisted of very young players that will develop into some fine competitors.

Our First Aid Club led by Mr Rogerson had a busy year with eight home derby days. 15 team members obtained the Internationally recognized Level 3 Certificates from St John's Brigade.

The Blood Donation Peer Promotors received National recognition from SANBS for delivering 115 pints of blood so far during 2022, with one more opportunity remaining.

It can be said that in 2022 the Cultural Society enjoyed the attention of the school. The Cultural Day was held on 5 August. On that day, Port Rex hosted various schools, parents and pupils. As a school we can say with great confidence that the cultural day of 2022 was a huge success. All funds raised will be utilized for an Out-reach Program during 2023.

2022 saw the start of two new clubs at Port Rex Technical High School such as the Book Club and the Eco Club and the return of the Chess club after a great absence.



A very Special Thanks to the support of the Governing Body, coaches and managers of all the different sporting and extra-mural codes - who have devoted so much time and effort in Conditioning, Training and Tours. I am especially impressed by the number of Clubs and Societies that appeared over the course of the year, initiated by members of the Port Rex staff. Your self-less dedication is noted and much appreciated.

That concludes my Annual Report for 2022. An interesting fact is that my Report for 2019 was 9 pages long. In 2020 it was only 3 pages. In 2021 I reported from 5 pages, and tonight I am using 7 pages! A clear indication that our Educational Program is back on track (back to normal).





Creative Arts



Creative Arts at Port Rex focuses on the pathways of Drama and Visual Arts. We hope that the Visual Arts will aid technical learners in Engineering Graphics and Design and in the Workshop Theory.

The learners in Grade 8 and 9 have Creative Arts class twice a week and learn both theory and complete practical tasks. In Visual Arts, the Grade 8's studied Fashion Design and used the principles and elements of design to create their own fashion pieces which included headwear, jewellery and bags.

The Grade 9's applied the same principles of Visual Arts to create a 3 Dimensional letter out of any material they chose. Social Sciences



The Grade 8 and 9 groups had a very good year. Our Grade 8s had to complete a project in which they had to analyse a settlement. This enriched their knowledge about the structure of a settlement and the reasons why the settlement developed in that specific area and what has led to its further development. They especially enjoyed Term 4 History when we discussed World War I and how "The Great War" shaped modern society. The learners were very interested to learn about how warfare has changed over the last 100 years.

The Grade 9 group tackled Map work with enthusiasm, eager to learn more about how to interpret coordinates and to make practical use of these numbers and degrees. The learners enjoyed learning about how modern food production and genetic manipulation changed the food we consume and how modern food production technologies have helped to curb famine in many countries.

The Grade 9s were tasked to complete an investigation about how Apartheid negatively impacted South Africa. This task brought something historical to the fore as they had to interview adults who lived and experienced the effects of apartheid and they learnt first hand how unfair laws can tear a society apart.


Electrical Technology

For many years, the Electrical workshop was under-equipped and struggled to cope with the demands of the syllabus.

In 2019, we were fortunate to receive a donation from Nelson Mandela Metropolitan University of Programmable Logic controllers that enabled us to teach our syllabus effectively. Mr Ettiene Theron also saw the need for a workshop upgrade and Port Rex used funding to help supply our workshop with equipment which not only brought our facilities up to standard, but made ours one of the best equipped Technical High School Electrical Workshops in the country.

In Grade 10, the syllabus teaches the learners to wire a house completely and in Grade 11 and Grade 12 we concentrate on single phase and 3 phase starters and oscilloscopes and Programmable Logic Controllers. Learners are able to enter tertiary education in the Electrical Field with the knowledge they have gained or enetr the workplace at places like Mercedes-Benz, Volkswagen nd similar electrical companies.

Mechanical Technology: Fitting & Machining

Mechanical Technology is still very popular in the workshop choices. The Fitting and Machining is the workshop where the learners start their studies if they would like to study Mechanical Engineering after their schooling at Port Rex.

The Grade 10's are beginning to understand the demands of the main workshops. There are learners who are manufacturing excellent articles and some are still battling with the general hand skills.

The Grade 11's are finding the work more challenging and need to apply themselves so that they can achieve the success that they deserve.

The Grade 12's are coping well in the workshop and are producing excellent articles.

We are confident that most of our Matric learners will find employment or be accepted in tertiary institutions and we would like to wish them everything of the best for the future.

Mechanical Technology: Automotive

The Automotive workshop has enjoyed a successful year.
Mr J Bekker joined the motor workshop in 2021 and has made a significant contribution in the last two years, assisting with the training of the Grade 10 to 12 learners regarding the various PATS they were required to complete.

In Grade 10, the students were required to learn about workshop safety, both basic and various power tools. In addition, they had to make a gauge plate, carry out micrometer, vernier and telescopic gauge measurements on engine components. They had to identify different engine components visually and practically, remove and repack tapered wheel bearings with grease as well as adjust them correctly, remove, re-assemble and inspect disc and drum brake systems, as well as performed a minor service on a vehicle. They also practically learned to use a multimeter, which included setting it up correctly when testing a vehicle's battery voltage.

In Grade 11, the students were required to learn about valve and ignition timing on engines, carry out practical timing belt and setting of the engine valves timing on various engines, including a 4-cylinder and 6cylinder in-line and V6 engines respectively. They also adjusted valve clearances using a feeler gauge on a four-cylinder engine, identified firing order, carried out specific engine measurements using outside micrometers, feeler gauges, telescopic gauges and vernier callipers, worked on final drives and differentials, and did a research PAT on modern ABS braking and supplementary systems.



COMING SOON

In Matric, the learners were required to carry out valve timing on V6, 6-cylinder in-line, as well as 4- cylinder petrol engines. Furthermore, they physically tested running vehicles for compression and cylinder leakage, carried out wheel balancing on a vehicles wheel assembly, carried out inspecting a vehicles efficiency regarding the fuel delivery system in terms of the ideal air/fuel ratio by using an emission gas analyser to check for harmful exhaust gases while it is running.

The highlight of the year was certainly the collaboration between Port Rex THS and MIWA (Motor Industry Workshop Association), and the successful hosting of the Motor Mechanics Show/Competition at Port Rex on Youth Day. MIWA works closely with the Retail Motor Industry (RMI).

The event was extremely wellorganised with a vast array of entertainment on offer, to the wide range of private motor industry related organisations and businesses who were advertising through their stalls, as well as the numerous lucky draw prizes and free giveaways.

The automotive workshop had 12 Port Rex learners from Grades 11 and 12 participate in the motor mechanic competition. There were three rounds and as they completed the various motor mechanic related tasks, they eventually crowned a competition winner - Ashley Joel in Grade 11. In addition, he was recently been selected as the Deputy Head Prefect for 2023. All learners who participated, were awarded great prizes, with Ashley receiving an incredible prize worth approximately R6000 in value. We are extremely proud of all learners who participated. What a fantastic and exciting year it has been!







D - Discipline


