# Hallam CC makes Crimicar Lane its Home

**I**n a significant move for grassroots cricket in South Yorkshire, Hallam Cricket Club has officially made Crimicar Lane its new primary home ground, marking a new chapter in the club's long and storied history.

Founded in 1804, Hallam CC is one of the oldest cricket clubs in Yorkshire and has traditionally played at the historic Sandygate ground in Sheffield. However, the club's rapid growth and evolving safety concerns have prompted a strategic shift. With the rise of power-hitting in modern cricket—especially at Premier League level—Sandygate's short boundaries became a safety issue, leading to balls frequently leaving the ground and posing risks to nearby residents.

Following expert advice from the England and Wales Cricket Board and sports consultants Labosport, Hallam CC began transitioning its first and second team fixtures to Crimicar Lane as early as 2019. The ground, formerly a fallow school

sports field, offered significantly longer boundaries and better infrastructure for competitive cricket.

Crimicar Lane has since become a vital hub for the club's operations. The move has allowed Hallam CC to expand from three to five senior Saturday sides, and the ground now hosts a wide range of cricketing activities, including junior matches, All Stars programmes, and community events. The club also rents Birkdale School Playing Fields for additional fixtures, showcasing its commitment to inclusivity and growth.

Chairman Matt Davies highlighted the importance of Crimicar Lane in the club's development: "We've been fortunate to have leaders with the foresight to expand and bring cricket to a wider audience. Crimicar Lane has given us the space and flexibility to do just that".

The ground has also become a social hub, hosting popular events like All Stars Fridays, complete with BBQs and local food vendors, drawing in families and spectators

from across Sheffield. With over 350 members and a thriving junior section, Hallam CC is positioning itself as a model for community cricket in the region.

As Hallam Cricket Club

continues to grow, Crimicar Lane stands as a symbol of its ambition and adaptability—blending tradition with modern needs to ensure cricket remains accessible, safe, and enjoyable for all.

## FA Cup Draw Throws Up Fantastic Contests

**The draw for the First Round Qualifying of the Emirates FA Cup has delivered a set of compelling fixtures for South Yorkshire's remaining contenders, with four clubs preparing for high-stakes clashes that could shape their cup journeys.**

One guaranteed local success story will emerge from the tie between Wombwell Town and Stocksbridge Park Steels, ensuring at least one South Yorkshire side progresses to the Second Round

Qualifying. Wombwell Town earned their place with a spirited comeback victory over Newark Town, winning 3–2 in the Preliminary Round. They now face a significant challenge against Stocksbridge, who enter the competition at this stage as a Northern Premier League side. A large crowd is expected at the Recreation Ground for what promises to be a memorable occasion.

Meanwhile, Rossington Main have been handed one of the most eye-catching ties

of the round, as they welcome FC United of Manchester to the Kalkut Community Stadium. The fan-owned club, formed in 2005 in response to the Glazer family's takeover of Manchester United, is renowned for its passionate support and travelling fan-base. This will be the first-ever meeting between the two sides, and Rossington will be hoping to rise to the occasion in front of what is expected to be a bumper crowd.

Hallam FC, fresh off an

impressive 3–0 win over City of Liverpool, face a stern test against Ashton United, one of the promotion favourites in the Northern Premier League's top division. The match will be played on Sunday, August 31, a day later than the other fixtures, which are scheduled for Saturday, August 30.

With local pride and progression in the world's oldest football competition at stake, South Yorkshire's clubs will be hoping to make headlines and continue their cup adventures.

**IN BRIEF:** Rotherham Titans launched their pre-season campaign with a commanding 59-7 victory over Hull Ionians under the lights at Clifton Lane. In a match played in warm conditions, the Titans ran in nine tries, showcasing attacking flair and defensive discipline.

# South Yorkshire Sides Face Tough Tests

**This weekend's sees the start of the Isuzu FA Vase fixtures and we have eight clubs in action promising a thrilling round of action as South Yorkshire clubs face off against a mix of local rivals and ambitious teams from across the North.**

Doncaster City travel to Abbey Hey. Based in Gorton, Manchester, Hey compete in the North West Counties League Premier Division. Despite a rocky start to the 2025–26 season, including heavy defeats to Ramsbottom United and Pilkington, they remain a dangerous side at home.

Doncaster City, meanwhile, are still finding their feet in the Northern Counties East League Division One, sitting mid-table with 4 points from

their opening four games. This clash offers a real opportunity for the South Yorkshire outfit to make a statement against higher-tier opposition.

Club Thorne Colliery have started the season strongly in NCEL Division One, winning all three and drawing one of their opening matches. Their attacking form has been impressive, and they'll be confident heading into the fixture against Horbury Town, newly promoted to the NCEL Premier Division, have had a mixed start with one win, one draw, and one loss. Their recent 2–2 draw with Barton Town showed resilience, but they'll need to be sharp to overcome Thorne's momentum.

It's a trip over the Pennines for Worsbrough Bridge Athletic who travel to Lancashire side



Euxton Villa. Villa play in the North West Counties League Premier Division. Their season began with a narrow FA Cup defeat to City of Liverpool, but they remain a competitive side with solid home form.

Worsbrough Bridge Athletic, have had a decent start with 6 points from 4

games. This tie could be one of the most evenly matched of the round.

Penistone Church are also travelling over the hills with a trip to FC St Helens, also in the North West Counties League Premier Division, St Helens have had a tough start to the season, including a narrow FA Cup loss to Glossop North End. They'll be eager to bounce back on home turf.

Church, on the other hand, are flying high in the NCEL Premier Division, currently second in the table with 11 points from 5 games. Their attacking flair and defensive solidity make them favourites in this tie.

Handsworth take on Nostell Miners Welfare who are struggling in NCEL Division One, sitting second bottom of the table with four straight de-

feats. It's a trip to Merseyside for Rossington Main to take on Litherland Remyca who play in the North West Counties League Premier and whose form has been inconsistent.

Maltby Main, currently mid-table in NCEL Division One, will host Stockport Georgians who are in their first season in the North West Counties League. They've made a solid start to their debut season win three and drawing one of their first five game, scoring 13 goals in the process.

Swallownest, face a stern test against City of Liverpool FC, who play in the North West Counties League Premier Division. The Merseysiders will hope for a better return to South Yorkshire after their mauling at Hallam in the FA Cup on Sunday.

had to go off with a hamstring issue, while Gilchrist was also forced off, seemingly due to a knee problem.

It was turning into a game where the medical room was busier than the goalmouth. It did lead to a chance though, substitute Luca Navarro worming into some space before curling the ball over. Louis White created an opportunity when he lobbed the ball over Elliot Owen, but a starfish save from Townsend prevented the goal.

In the second half, the game really began to heat up. Stocksbridge got off to a flyer, pushing hard to find the lead. Sam Kay should have it. He hit the ball as perfectly as you could from 30 yards but Ashton goalkeeper Jordan Eastham pulled off a save that any Premier League goalkeeper would have been jealous of by tipping the thunderbolt onto the bar.

Not long after, Luke Rawson had an opportunity but was forced at too wide an angle and Eastham was able to deal with that. The worst news of the game was to come. Luke Burke and Paul Iggulden went for a 50/50 and

their bodies collided. Iggulden appeared to get his arm jammed in-between his and Burke's body and went down in pain. He went off injured and news coming out of Stocksbridge following the match confirmed he'd be out for several weeks.

After Ashton survived the initial barrage, they were able to get the better of the game again but did struggle to cause many problems for Ben Townsend. But, you only need once chance.

Stocksbridge cleared the corner, but didn't get it out of their own third. Ashton came again and played the ball across the box to Sam Baird, the defender left unmarked as one of Stocksbridge's own dropped to the line. He duly finished from close range, giving Ashton the lead.

But that lead was very close to lasting less than 60 seconds. Stocksbridge immediately got onto the attack and Rawson laid the back to substitute Jack Degruchy whose curling shot was once again met by a stunning save from Eastham.

Ashton's manager Steve Cunningham had said when signing Eastham that they had got the best goalkeeper in the division. On the performance in this game, he wasn't wrong.

Stocksbridge had a few late chances, the closest being a scramble from a corner when Kay once again was in the thick of it. His close range shot was blocked off the line. Kurtis Turner also got a slight connection on a corner which came close to turning the ball in.

But no goal was coming and Stocksbridge got a tough lesson at a team likely to be challenging for promotion. Despite playing well, no points would return to Sheffield. Worst of all, the casualties of Iggulden and Deakin could cost points later down the line. Stocksbridge will have to adapt, and quickly.

On Wednesday evening, Steels then went down in a first home game at Step 3 for 12 years to the team promoted with them last season, Cleethorpes Town.

Another goalless first half kept Steels in it but then a controversial opener from Adam How gave the visitors lead. Goals from Nicky Walter and Reece Kendall put Town 3-0 up before Thomas Poole pulled one back in injury time.

MANAGER COMMENTS



Manager Ian Richards didn't mix his words after the Cleethorpes defeat on Wednesday evening.

I thought it was an even balanced game. We had two great chances in the first half, the keeper made a great

save from one of them.

"But then it was a poor and unacceptable decision from the officials where the ball was out and in fact over the line in the technical area but they played on and from that they went and scored.

"It frustrating when you put hours and hours of preparation into a game and then you get a decision that would be unacceptable in an Under 9 game."

# Bradbury Scores, Hallam Earn Historic Point

**Brandon Bradbury's early goal gave Hallam their first ever point at home in the Pitching in Northern Premier League Division One East, before an incredible effort from range levelled it for the away side after 30 minutes.**

Craig Denton started the game with three changes from his side's FA Cup win over the weekend, with Fer-

guson, Warren and Litchfield replacing Smith, Lipka and Howarth, with the last two dropping to the bench. Before the game, Sandygate witnessed a minute's silence for all those connected to Hallam who have sadly lost their lives in the past 12 months, including the much-loved club president, Uriah Rennie. And after just 10 minutes on the clock, the Countrymen took

the lead. Benni Ndlovu punt forward was latched onto by Brodie Litchfield, who squared to Brandon Bradbury, tapping home his second in as many games.

And straight after that, Hallam had three golden opportunities for a second. The first when Charlie Staniland hit the post on the half-volley, eventually resulting in a corner. Moments later, defender Stephen Brogan had a chance from the spot after Paulo Aguas was taken out; his attempt was saved, resulting in another corner. From this set-piece, goalkeeper Jack Hall made another brilliant save to stop the Countrymen doubling their lead, going down to his right to keep out a great effort from close range.

After 30 minutes, Bradford (PA) equal-

ised through a great effort from range by midfielder Prince Egbulu, making it 1-1 for the first 45 minutes.

Eight minutes after the break, Hallam were certain they should have been playing against ten men, when a Countryman got taken out on the half-way line; the player eventually got a warning. Play continued and Litchfield had the ball in the back of the net before the assistant raised his flag.

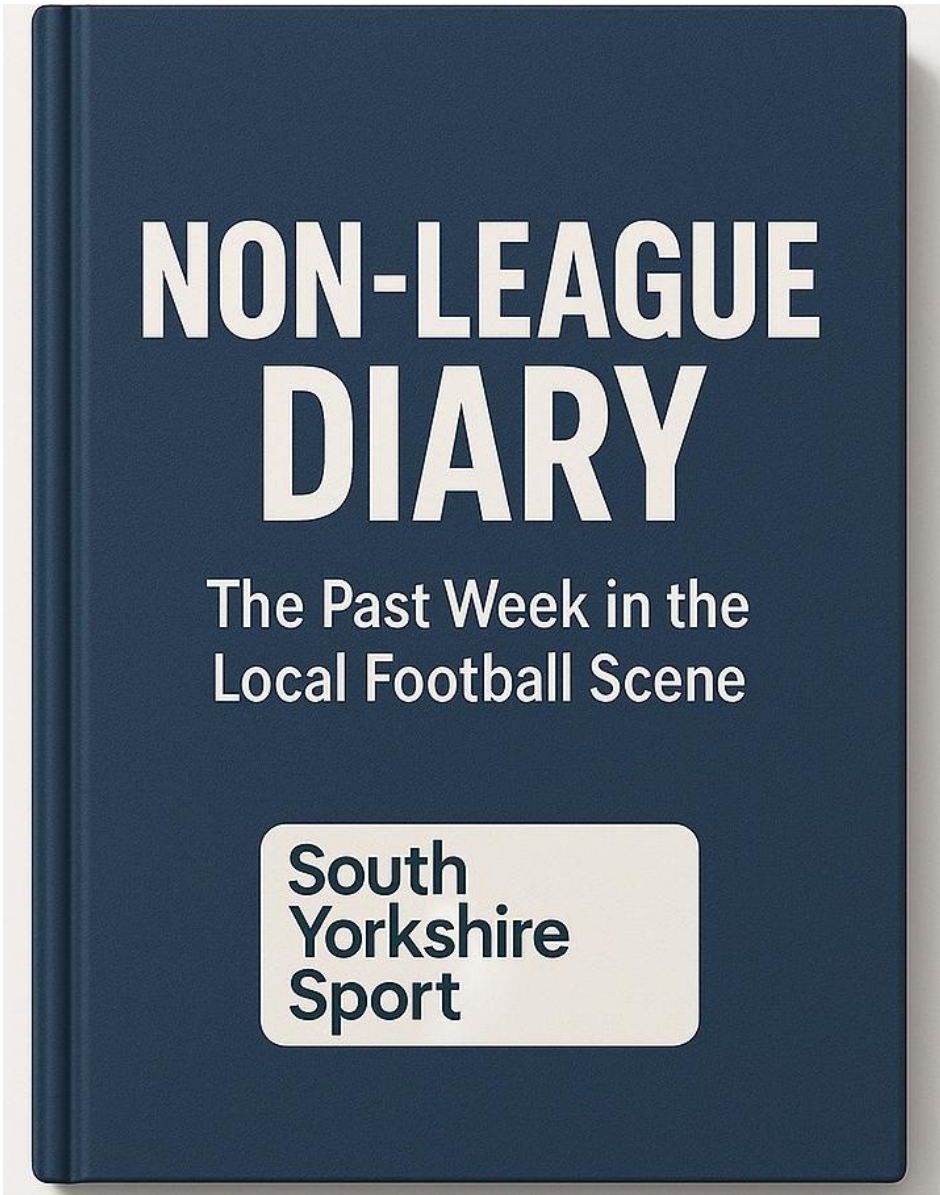

# Swallownest Take Four Points From Two Home Battles

## Dronfield Crushed in Derby Blow

Swallownest FC picked up four points from six in the United Counties League Division One, earning a hard-fought draw against Stapleford Town before securing a late win over Shirebrook Town.

In front of a crowd of 81 at the Swallownest Siro, Swallownest and Stapleford Town played out a goalless draw in a match that was high on effort but low on clear-cut chances. Both sides struggled to break down well-organised defences, with mid-field battles dominating the flow of play.

Swallownest looked the more likely to score in the second half, with Patrick Muirhead and Kian Tansley probing the Stapleford back line. However, the visitors held firm, and neither side could find the breakthrough. Despite the lack of goals, the Saxons will take positives from a solid defensive display and a clean sheet against a competitive opponent.

Swallownest then returned to action midweek and delivered a more attacking performance, coming from behind to defeat Shirebrook Town 2–1 in front of their home supporters in a thrilling end to the game.

After a cagey first half, Swallownest took

the lead through Patrick Muirhead in the 58th minute. Just two minutes from the end it was almost heart-break for the home side as Shirebrook restored parity.

However, with the game heading toward a draw and going into added time, Swallownest pushed forward in search of a winner and their persistence was rewarded with a later winner

The win lifts Swallownest’s spirits and adds momentum ahead of their next fixture.

For Dronfield Town it was a week of contrasting fortunes in the United Counties League Division One, beginning with a spirited 2–2 comeback draw away at Pinchbeck United before falling to a heavy 5–1 defeat in their derby clash with Staveley Miners Welfare.

At Eslaforde Park, Dronfield battled both their opponents and a difficult pitch. After a scrappy first half, Pinchbeck took control early in the second period with two quick goals from Freddie Shinn. However, manager Chris Millington’s substitutions proved decisive. Callum Mawbey reduced the deficit on 70 minutes, converting after good work from Sam Bebbington. Then, with nine minutes remaining,

Jack Bancroft coolly finished to level the match. Dronfield nearly snatched victory in the dying moments, but efforts from Mawbey and Dan Shelbourne narrowly missed the target.

That resilience was tested again just days later in a local derby at Staveley’s Inkersall Road. Despite a slow

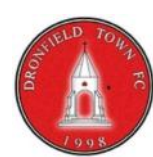
start and an early goal from Joel Ward, Dronfield responded well. Jack Bancroft’s persistence led to Liam O’Brien curling home a superb equaliser. The visitors looked composed heading into the break, and O’Brien nearly gave them the lead early in the second half.

However, the game

turned on 62 minutes when Charlie Stewart inadvertently turned the ball into his own net. From there, Staveley capitalised on defensive lapses and added three more goals through Jack Deakin, Joel Ward, and a thunderous strike from Matthew Parkin. Dronfield’s frustrations were compounded by two

sinbin dismissals late on, ending the match with nine men.

Despite the scoreline, Dronfield were competitive for long spells and will take positives from their attacking play. They now sit eighth in the table and will look to bounce back when they host West Bridgford at Stonelow Stadium on Saturday.

# Sheffield FC Celebrate Winning League Return

**Sheffield FC marked their return to the FA Women's National League with a 1-0 home win over Kidderminster Harriers. The Division One Midlands clash between the two promoted Regional League Premier Division champions was keenly contested.**

Harriers, making their tier 4 debut, had the better of the first half, but crucially failed to score. Eloise Harris outstripped Dina Sarayreh to break into the area, but her shot was tipped over via the bar by Leah Kellogg.

Amber Lawrence headed against the bar as Sheffield survived a second close call inside the opening ten minutes. As if to highlight that it was not going to be the visitors' day, Sheffield's Becky Kendell headed against an upright when cutting out a cross, the ball could easily have gone either side of the post. Kellogg saved well from an angled strike by Liv Woolston and Izzie Whittick curled one inches past the far post from wide on the left in the last action of the first half.

The half was not all one way traffic, but Sheffield were unable to unduly worry Harriers keeper Katy Smith. The key moments of the second half came just past the hour mark. Kendell swung in a free kick from wide on the left and it was Lauren Winter who got the decisive contact with a header for the game's only goal.

Harriers had an excellent chance to level a few minutes later when they were awarded a penalty. Millie Rogers hit it low, but Kellogg diving to her left made the all important save and then safely clutched the ball.

Where Sheffield's goal had led a charmed life before the interval, it would be fair to state that Harriers received the benefit of the

doubt in the referee's eyes in the game's final quarter.

Imo Fowler had her shirt pulled by Whittick as she was advancing towards the area but having escaped the grip, Fowler was unable to maintain balance and stumbled inside the area. Fowler received a caution for what was a natural reaction, but from the referee's angle it was possible to understand his decision.

With the game in stoppage time Smith and Lexie Butterworth challenged for ball a few yards outside the area. Butterworth won the header and the ball continued its progress goal wards, but with the players having collided in mid-air, the referee blew just before the ball crossed the line. Butterworth and Sheffield were, looking at the incident from the side of the pitch unlucky to denied what would have assured victory without any nervy ending.

There is no VAR in the FAWNL and to date only a handful of domestic games have had VAR in operation. What would have been made of those incidents and also how long would have been spent in arriving at a decision can only be speculated.

Barnsley opened with a 3-1 home victory over Worcester City, all three of their goals being scored by debutants. Barnsley led 2-0 at the interval through Tanya Fozzard and Amber Sewell.

Worcester pulled one back with a fine strike towards the end, but their hopes of snatching a point were quashed when Helen Lynskey netted in the closing minutes.

Doncaster Rovers Belles lost 3-0 on their visit to Huddersfield Town in Division One North. Town's line up was rich in tier three (or above) experience and I expect them to be challenging for the title next spring. The Belles team had plenty of tier four experience, but as was proved by last season's champions Middlesbrough, it needs a strong squad to step up to the Northern Premier Division. Middlesbrough's NPD debut saw them beaten 5-0 at Burnley who have invested strongly.

Belles begin life at this season's new home venue of Millmoor when they host York City on Sunday. Belles have played there before, in the 1995 Women's Cup semi-final when they had relative home advantage against Arsenal (who won and then went on to lift the trophy). Millmoor adds to a lengthy list of grounds used

by Belles since the introduction of a national league structure in 1991.

Stockbridge Park Steels make a belated Adobe Women's FA Cup debut on Sunday when they host Cherry Burton. They had hoped to play in last season's competition, but were undone by a series of timings. They submitted their entry while still known as Mosborough and that was ac-

cepted.

Meanwhile (in a cross-over time wise), the opportunity to move from Mosborough and set up a home base at Stocksbridge saw a name change and while everything was bona fide in Mosborough ceasing to be and Stocksbridge being born, Stocksbridge were unable to persuade the FA to let them participate in last season's competition.

# New Format Shakes Up FAWNL Cup

**This season's FA Women's National League Cup has a much revised format. All 72 FAWNL clubs, along with 16 PGA teams of clubs in the Women's Super League, compete in one of 22 initial groups of four teams.**

There is a maximum of one PGA team in a group.

As Sheffield United Under-21s (along with other PGA teams nationwide) showed in last season's County Cups, the PGA teams will not be push overs for the FAWNL sides.

Once the groups are completed, the competition splits into straight knock out format for Cup and Plate. The 22 group winners along with 10 best placed runners up enter the Cup.

The other 12 runners up along with the 20 best third place teams enter the Plate. The two third place teams with the worst record and all fourth place teams are eliminated. It will be a major shock if any PGA teams exit at the group stage.

Doncaster Rovers Belles were beaten 5-1 away to Hull City in their Group S opener. Laila Abadi netted what was a consolation at 4-0 down for Belles, one of whose former players from their WSL days, Hope Knight bagging a hat trick for Hull.

Barnsley meet Sheffield United Under-21s in this week's other Group S fixture at Sheffield FC's Home of Football tonight (Thursday). Also in action tonight are Sheffield FC who visit Lincoln United in Group P whose opening game saw Derby County win 4-1 at Notts County.

Mustafa Hussain (62) and skipper Imran Khan (52) helped relegation battlers Shiregreen to 230 all out away to fourth-placed Whitley Hall, for whom Callum Bethel took 4-63. # Oughtibridge Stun Collegiate to Clinch Play-Off Glory Again

The 2025 play-off final took place last night under grey skies at the War Memorial Sports Ground.

Visitors and reigning champions, Sheffield Collegiate won the toss and elected to field.

Home team Oughtibridge brushed off the effects of losing a couple of early wickets to post a 151-5 from their 12 overs.

The innings was built around Oughtibridge's number three, Sajith Warnakulasuriya, who struck 78 from 31 balls. A competitive total, but one Sheffield Collegiate will have fancied chasing down having already surpassed the total on six occasions this season.

Sheffield Collegiate, the Division South A champions, unleashed their opening pair of Dylan McDonald and Thomas Currie, who set about the run chase with considerable aplomb and inside 9 overs, without being parted, it was all over.

Currie played the support role, with 38 not out whilst McDonald smote an unbeaten 105 from 44 balls with 5 4s and 10 6s.

So Collegiate would meet the winners of the second semi, which was played last Thursday evening, between Division South B runners up Sheffield Transport and Division North winners Oughtibridge.

Batting first, Transport made a steady start, reaching 56 without loss inside 5 overs. But when the prolific and hard-hitting opener Yograj Kote was dismissed for 37, the Transport innings subsided to 111 all out as Danuka Hettiarachchi snaffled 5-17.

Oughtibridge calmly knocked off the runs for the loss of 2 wickets with time to spare (N Arif 64\*).

Last night's final concluded the South Yorkshire Alliance Works Midweek Cricket League season, played under almost continuous blue skies, with hardly any disruption from the weather. As always, the cricket was competitive and Oughtibridge were worthy winners. Who will challenge them next season – the 98th year of the League!
