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
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Food for thought in Albania

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Female filmmakers in Lyon

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Skiing has no age limits in <u>Italy</u>

Slow food has never been a fad in Albania, with its deep-rooted farm-to-table traditions. We meet the modern-day foodies shining a light on the country's cuisine

f it comes from a bucket, it's going to be good," says Linda Alia, founder of Albanian Food Tours. We're currently on her Tirana food tour, walking down Rruga e Saraçëve, where sellers sit on upturned crates surrounded by buckets of plump tomatoes, oranges and piles of walnuts. Residents amble down this narrow street to prod and poke at pomegranates and plums, searching out the best produce. It's not difficult, since everything on sale is organic and locally-produced – labels that would earn each item a high price tag elsewhere in the world.

In Albania, this is the only way. Decades of isolation and trade embargoes during the 20th century meant pesticides and factory farming never developed here. Tirana's restaurants are still supplied by family-run smallholdings in the mountains and across the plains of this untamed country. "Processed food is not really in our cuisine," Linda says. "You won't find a McDonald's in Tirana."

After running a hostel in Tirana's trendy Blloku neighbourhood, Linda wanted to turn her restaurant recommendations into an experience championing traditional Albanian fare across the city. The first stop is breakfast. I forgo the staple spinach *byrek* (pastry) for a cornflour, leek and wild greens pastry made fresh that morning. "We use everything in Albania. We use the whole animal and dry meat for later, pickle everything and even use the rind of watermelons," says Linda. Like organic farming, nose-to-tail and leafto-root is ingrained in Albania's food history. When asked what her favourite dish is she says: "It's trahana. But it's hard to find in restaurants because it is like a porridge you make at home."

In his restaurant, Mullixhiu, chef Bledar Kola – who has his own version of trahana – champions traditional Albanian cuisine by elevating it to fine-dining standards. If you'd told the residents of the small, Alpine Albanian villages where trahana was born that it would end up on the tasting menu of arguably Tirana's finest restaurant, they might have laughed. This hearty porridge of fermented oats is the epitome of 'peasant food', designed to fill stomachs and fuel cold days of tilling the land and rounding up stray

sheep from the mountainside. At Mullixhiu, Bledar's trahana is given a touch of sophistication by the sharpness of fermented mulberries cutting through, and purslane sauce adds a salty, sour complexity.

The atmosphere at Mullixhiu is like a wooden mountain cabin, with its low, rustic wooden ceiling and lampshades adorned with drying gorse flowers. It's a million miles away from Le Gavroche in London, where Bledar trained when it had three Michelin stars. He also did a stint at Noma in Copenhagen. "They all raised their eyebrows when I said I wanted to return to Albania and offer fine dining here," Bledar says. "Traditional Albanian cooking doesn't work with French style, but cooking New Nordic at Noma is where I realised I could take Albanian food and place it on the world gastronomy map."

The New Nordic food movement is all about the local and the seasonal, turning simple, staple ingredients into works of art on a plate. This fits perfectly with Albania's inward-looking culinary

foundations. Bledar has a personal relationship with each of his producers – his brother, Nik, makes the malty rye bread in his bakery around the corner. "When the season comes, they call me," Bledar says about the mushroom producers in north Albania. The squashes at the restaurant's entrance came from Lezhë.

"They came from north Albania," Bledar says, gesturing to the sacks of flour piled in the corner. "We don't import anything. Even the wine is Albanian." And why not? Albania has a viticulture tradition dating back to the 1st century and the vineyards remain small, family-run affairs. "Because things got so big in agriculture across the globe, we are now seeing a movement towards scaling back and focusing on farm-to-table experiences," Bledar explains. "But agriculture never got that big in Albania - we have always been naturally farm-to-table."

At Uka Farm between central Tirana and the airport, Flori Uka has a plot of land spanning two hectares. He continues a project set up by his father in 1996. His father was Albania's first Minister for Agriculture after the fall of Communism, and set up Uka Farm as a natural lab for agricultural students. Flori doesn't like the term 'organic farming'. "Organic is like an office term," he says. "I prefer 'natural' or 'forest' farming. At Uka, we follow the principles of the forest. Nobody waters the plants in the forest, yet there is balance and harmony." Uka Farm uses no pesticides. "I encourage war between the insects. Uka Farm is a five-star hotel for insects," Flori declares proudly. "Everything is about the natural balance." Dinner here is in a barn-like space where a wood fire crackles in the centre. There is no à la carte menu, but seven starters and a main meat dish. Starters change with the season and can include crispy cornbread soaking in sour cream sauce and crunchy carrots and broccoli served simply. "Everything is 100% Albanian. What cannot be sourced from the farm comes from Albanian producers," Flori says. The meal culminates in a shared meat dish, as is Albanian tradition – lamb baked for hours with potatoes dripping with flavour. Farm tours and workshops are available, and Uka Farm runs a kindergarten for young children, teaching them about sustainable farming.

So, while the rest of the world works hard at decreasing the carbon footprint of large-scale agriculture, the chefs, farmers, bakers and food guides of Tirana can rest easy. The buzzwords of sustainable dining – farm-to-table, nose-to-tail, leaf-to-root – are already deeply ingrained in Albania's food tradition.


In Lyon, where cinema was born, female filmmakers are shaking things up in the industry's male-dominated system

ff W inning an award felt like a lot of pressure, a 'what will I do now?'" says Laurène Fernandez, a recent graduate of Lyon's film school, La CinéFabrique. Her first film, an animated four-minute short about the residents of an apartment block in Lyon complaining about their neighbours, won third place in the 2022 Cinef Prix at Cannes Film Festival.

Exactly 130 years ago in March, the first motion picture was created in Lyon. Black and white, silent, grainy and just a few minutes long, *La Sortie de l'Usine Lumière à Lyon (Workers Leaving the Lumière Factory in Lyon*), showed people coming out of a workplace near the present-day Institut Lumière. It was filmed by the Lumière brothers, and their former factory and home is now a museum dedicated to cinema. Laurène's short film, *Les Humains Sont Cons Quand ils S'empilent (Humans are Dumber When Crammed up Together)*, was a product of its time. Produced in 2021, just after the pandemic, she interviewed people living cooped up in large apartment buildings in the city. "People were reluctant to tell me about their own experiences and difficulties, but they loved moaning about their neighbours," says Laurène.

She used the recordings from these interviews as the audio footage for her film: one man who relentlessly breaks down walls and carries out renovations in his flat; a woman who hoovers five times a day. But Laurène's film has a dark twist: the over-zealous vacuuming woman beheads her husband and puts his decapitated head out with the rubbish



in the building's bins. She's working on adapting and extending it into a full-length TV series and is interviewing the neighbours for new material.

The Institut Lumière is heavily involved in La CinéFabrique, and film courses at the city's various universities. Multi-award-winning actress and the first female president of the Institut Lumière, Irène Jacob, believes film is important no matter your background.

"We don't all come from the same place, but cinema allows us to project ourselves into someone else's world for a short time," says Irène. A regular guest at the Festival Lumière, Lyon's prestigious film festival, Irène grew up in Geneva but always felt a great affinity to Lyon — not just for its cinematic legacy, but because this was the city her father came from.

Irène starred in her first film, *Au Revoir Les Enfants* (*Goodbye, Children*), in 1987, and went on to have a hugely successful career. Over almost four decades, she's seen the industry evolve enormously, particularly for women.

"There's an extraordinary movement happening," she says. "We've realised that a woman can imagine being a physicist, or a cameraperson. I'm shocked now if I arrive on set and there's not a good gender split. These days, we want to see male make-up artists and female bosses: the imagination isn't restricted by gender norms." The roles available to women may be infinitely more varied, but French actresses are still paid less on average than actors, and as film director Charlène Favier found, prone to lower funding. "I got a grant of just over a million for my first full length film," she says. "Women starting out tend to get no more than two million, but men are regularly granted five or six."

Charlène's first full-length film, *Slalom*, was one of the Official Selection Films at Cannes Film Festival 2020. It's an uncomfortable watch at times, following the story of an abusive relationship between a ski instructor and his teenage student who is training for the French ski championships. And as Charlène divulges, it's partly autobiographical.

An avid skier, Charlène grew up in Bourg-en-Bresse, 70km outside of Lyon, but spent much of her childhood at nearby ski stations. It draws on a mixture of her own lived experiences and the power dynamics and dubious relationships Charlène saw among some of her contemporaries.

She is optimistic about the future of female filmmakers, who now make up roughly a third of all film directors in France. "We're breaking into an industry that was almost exclusively male, so there's a long way to go," Charlène says. "But there are lots of women directors starting to appear, so the gap should get smaller and smaller."

Regardless of your gender, Lyon is the place to be if you want to break into the arts. "The city of Lyon does an amazing job of supporting arts and culture. Culture [gets] the second biggest budget here and it shows: cinema, theatres, concert venues, museums... you could see a different show every night of the week," says Courtney Geraghty, the theatre manager of Lyon's feminist and inclusive theatre, the Théâtre de la Croix-Rousse. She's the first woman ever to hold the role.

"For a long time, about 90% of people I encountered working in theatres were women, but around 90% of the directors were men," says Courtney. "Luckily, there's a new generation of female directors changing things, but we know that women get less funding. That's why I voluntarily present more female directors than men; to defend the place of women in the arts." Bucking the national and international trend, at least 50% of plays shown at the Théâtre de la Croix-Rousse have female directors. It's a statistic that underlines Lyon's status as a bastion for women in the arts. *** Wizz Air flies to Lyon**

Age is just a number. We head to the Italian Alps to discover the secret of skiing well into your golden years

etting older is like owning an old car - it requires constant maintenance. One part breaks and, just as you're fixing that, another part falls off or rusts. You run less efficiently, and things squeak. And yet Siro Dorigo, aged 75, purrs

like a pristine Bugatti as he weaves down a ski slope in the beautiful Dolomite resort of Arabba like a man half his age. To me, he's a beacon of hope.

I turned 50 last year. My body feels less vintage classic, more battered second-hand car. I have torn ligaments, a herniating disc, bone spurs, a dodgy shoulder and a split kneecap. Having taken up and fallen in love with skiing just seven years ago, the physical degradation worries me. I'm late to the party and I don't want it to end.

I fear it will all be over by the time I'm 60. But should I worry? I've seen plenty of grey hair on the pistes. There must be a way to keep carving into older age.

And so, I've come to the Dolomiti Superski area in northern Italy – 1,200km of slopes in a jaw-dropping UNESCO World Heritage Site. Italy has the secondhighest life expectancy in Europe after Spain, so it's the ideal place to unearth the secrets of ski longevity. I begin in Arabba. I've spent the morning with Siro, who recently retired after 50 years as an instructor or *maestro*. He's analysed my technique, honestly and bluntly, with the aid of a fellow instructor, and translator for the day, Alberto (a mere 25). I get little adjustments, big adjustments, mantras to remember, plus some hard lessons.

"A good technique will help you ski longer," Siro tells me as we settle down for lunch and a bottle of wine. "It means less stress on your body."

Good technique. Noted. What other secrets does he have for a long ski life?

"Always move. If I am not skiing, I am doing something. You must stay fit." Do you go to the gym? "No." Do you stretch? "Never."

Do you have a careful diet? "I eat meat, I drink wine, I don't eat much fish... I live a normal life," adds Siro. "I have a passion for being a ski instructor, a passion for exercise. Passion is important."

Surely something must change as you get older. Your speed, your technique, how much you ski. "Yes, of course, I have less energy, my muscles aren't as

strong," admits Siro. "But ski equipment means skiing is easier now. You just have to listen to your body."

My next stop is Cortina d'Ampezzo, a chic, picturesque town that will co-host the 2026 Winter Olympics with Milan. Towering above its winding streets is the run which will decide downhill gold next winter. A few hundred meters away, however, is one of the most fabulous and fearsome black runs in Europe: the Forcella Rossa.

There's an exclusive club in town called the All Blacks (yes, they did 'borrow' the name). To join, you must ski the Forcella Rossa 100 times in a season. To renew membership, it's a mere 50 times.

I'm sitting with four All Blacks. They are: Elisabetta Zocconi, 76, Franco Gherlinzoni, 70, Pietro Fazzini, 75, and Vincenzo Gaspari, 79. Elisabetta and Franco have both won the prize for most runs in a season, clocking up more than 200 each time. "You can only do this many when you're retired!" says Franco.

Vincenzo is a professional racer who represents Italy in the 'Masters' category. For him, the Forcella Rossa is a "hobby". Pietro is an inspiration to all late starters; he only began skiing when he retired at 60.

Their thoughts on skiing later in life align with Siro's. None of them go to the gym, yet none of them stop moving. "If you ski without any exercise before, it's dangerous," says Franco. "My advice is to do sport all year. If you don't, do some exercise before the season."

"I play golf, I climb, I walk during the summer," says Elisabetta. "I skied 94 days last season. During Covid, when the lifts stopped, I climbed the mountain so I could ski down. I never stop."

"I like to walk with friends, I climb, I do via Ferrata," says Pietro. "Like Elisabetta, I ski about 100 days a season." "I play basketball two hours a week," says Vincenzo. "I am always in competition with cycling, running or skiing. I'm all sport!"

When I suggest that they might watch what they eat and drink, they all laugh. "Of course, we have a drink at the end of the day," says Pietro.

"And halfway through it!" adds Elisabetta with a grin. "The important thing is, you need to do something, skiing or something else, that makes you feel good at the end of the day. When we finish skiing for the day, we think about where we'll ski tomorrow."

In fact, only Vincenzo lives locally. The others all move to Cortina for the winter – they love the town and the skiing that much.

The ingredients for ski longevity are becoming clearer. No to gyms, special diets and abstinence. (Okay, I'm sure they'd do no harm.) Yes to regular exercise, to moving more and good technique. Perhaps most importantly of all, yes to doing something that brings you joy for as long as you can.

And so, the following morning, I ski the Sellaronda, which is located around the Sella group in South Tyrol and Trentino – a bucket list 40km circuit of four different valleys. Maybe it's Siro's coaching, maybe the All Blacks' inspiration, but I feel no signs of age.

As I queue for a chairlift I chat with a 70-something woman from Hawaii who's skiing alone while her friends stay back at their hotel.

"Why?" I ask. Her answer sums everything up. "Because one day I won't be able to do this."

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

Abu Dhabi is now home to the world's largest artificial wave facility. We discover how the UAE became the hottest new destination for surf culture

'm at the edge of a sprawling lake on Hudayriyat Island, its surface stretching almost the length of a horizontal Burj Khalifa. I'm waiting for what they call 'the best man-made wave in the world'. A surfer hovers in the centre, delivered by jet ski, when suddenly the turquoise water rises and pitches forward, creating a perfect wave that charges toward him as he readies himself.

The rider springs up, carving the face with fluid precision as it rolls across the lake. He disappears under a curtain of water into what might be the biggest barrel ever produced in a wave pool, emerging victorious before the lake returns to glass. This is the work of surfing legend Kelly Slater – an 11-time world champion who's designed artificial waves for decades – and Modon, Abu Dhabi's master developer. Together at the newly opened Surf Abu Dhabi they've created a breakthrough: a wave pool that's shattered records thanks to its sheer size, drawing serious surfers to an unlikely desert destination that previously had no real appeal to boarders.

The wave is created by a colossal 100-tonne foil, which is pulled through 80 million litres of natural sea water, pumped in from the Arabian Gulf then treated with reverse osmosis. Surf sessions here don't come cheap – ranging from AED600 (€155) for a 45-minute white-water taster session to an eye-watering AED15,000 (€3,900) for a private 90-minute session for six surfers, who share 20 to 24 waves. But general manager Ryan Watkins claims its entirely worth it, and the reputation of the wave Above A surfer tackling one of Surf Abu Dhabi's perfect artificial waves



quality speaks for itself, with boardriders lining up to try it. Within the first few months of opening, the lagoon had been surfed by everyone from world champion surfers Stephanie Gilmore and Gabriel Medina to actor Chris Hemsworth. And this February, the desert city will be flooded with pros as it hosts a leg of the prestigious WSL Championship Tour at Surf Abu Dhabi, with more than 50 of the best surfers from around the globe competing.

There's no doubt there's a whole lot of exclusivity about the place. Surf Abu Dhabi has pegged itself as the first five-star surf experience in the world, and in the opening months it was virtually impossible to secure a spot. But in true UAE style, those who are not surfing can watch the action at two chic beach clubs on the lake. Nalu Surf Club has an upmarket bar lounge and pool overlooking the lagoon, and Ilios Beach Club offers a high-end Mediterranean dining experience plus a luxury pool with a frontrow view of the waves.

Fully open to anyone with the cash to surf it, Ryan maintains that "the wave at Surf Abu Dhabi is a wave for everybody. We would rather have fewer waves per hour, but then every one of them has the potential to be the best wave of your life," he says. As we chat, three-time big wave world surfing champion Grant Baker is out in the water. "It's his second session," says Ryan. "He says it's one of the most incredible things that he's ever witnessed. He's used to surfing absolutely massive waves, and he's blown away by how perfect this wave is. Then, straight after his session, we'll have 10-12

people in the water – who are absolute first timers, who've never surfed before in their lives. We're going to run beautiful little one-to-two foot waves for them, and they're going to get out of the water absolutely blown away."

Visitors can choose between four settings, a beginner 'Beach Break' white-water wave, a small, clean 'Cocoa Beach' wave for surfers who have learned the basics and are looking to progress, a 'Point Break' for intermediate surfers, and an advanced setting named 'Kelly's Wave', with a barrel and high-speed section only for experts. "We really can give everybody the best session of their life," says Ryan. "People arrive here with this genuine excitement and enthusiasm that they're going to get to surf the best man-made wave in the world and every single person who gets out of the water goes straight back to the counter and says, 'when can I book again?'"

Kelly Slater knew that if anywhere was capable of pulling off this feat of engineering, it would be the UAE. "We knew that if somebody could build something to the best quality, it would be in this part of

the world," he told *SurferToday*. Even he says it's hard to believe an artificial wave this perfect exists. "I've surfed hundreds of incredible waves across the world and this wave in Abu Dhabi stacks up well against some of the best waves on Earth. I've drawn on that travelling surf education to design the wave at Surf Abu Dhabi."

Surf Abu Dhabi may have caught the attention of big names in surfing, but it's by no means the first surf spot in the region, or even the first artificial wave. Al Ain Adventure (formerly Wadi Adventure) in eastern Abu Dhabi opened the first surfing lagoon pool in the UAE in 2011 – with small rolling waves for beginners and three-metre waves for expert surfers (surf sessions start from a more affordable AED290/€75) and it's a little-known fact that surfers can also catch natural waves during the winter months in Dubai in Umm AI Quwain and Sharjah from beaches facing the Arabian Gulf. Co-owner of Surf House Dubai, Scott Chambers, was one of the first to surf in the region 30 years ago off Jumeirah Beach and now supplies the boards guests use at Surf Abu Dhabi. His company also teaches beginners to surf on Dubai's natural waves at Sunset Beach (lessons from AED225/€58) and organises surf-related Below A children's class at Surf House Dubai Bottom Surfers on Sunset Beach in Dubai



incredible that in a very short space of time, we've seen the progression of surfing in this country," he says.

Scott agrees. "The level is going to go through the roof, because you just have that repetition," he says. "On Sunset Beach, we sometimes have to wait weeks for waves, and then you might catch a wave for like five or 10 seconds, but at this wave pool, you get a ride for like 45 seconds and you have priority, no one else is trying to catch the same wave, no one else is going to be in your way. Obviously, it is different in the ocean. So surfers are still going to practice in the real thing, but Surf Abu Dhabi is going to make the surfing level a lot higher."

But no matter how you surf, "we're all part of a tribe," says Ryan. "We're a bunch of nomads looking for waves, but how cool that this once-in-a-lifetime experience is finally available." **surfabudhabi.com Y Wizz Air flies to Abu Dhabi**

events for the local community in the UAE. He agrees the new wave pool is great for the local surf scene. "There's no other wave pool that comes close to that experience," says Scott. "It's five-star service – so you walk in, someone takes your board, starts waxing it for you, then puts the fins on for you. There's no paddling while you're there, everything's jet ski assist. Once you catch the wave, the jet ski is right there to pick you up and take you back to the spot. It really is five-star surfing."

The surfing community hopes this world-class surfing facility will help produce a champion surfer from the region. "One of our goals here is to get an Emirati team to strongly represent in the 2028 Olympics in California," says Ryan, who has hired an Olympic surf coach. Since the artificial wave pool opened a few months ago, he has already seen Emirati surfers progress to heights they never would before. "They are getting absolutely barrelled, they're starting to do big top turns and so on. It's






RAISE A GLASS in Chisinau



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Rock of ages


The city of AlUla is billed as the world's largest living museum, where ancient stories capture the world's imagination. We travel to Saudi Arabia to uncover its secrets

ur sand buggy hurtles over a hill and comes to an abrupt stop. To the left of us is a soaring wall of sandstone covered in ancient etchings of ostriches, which is why the area is called Wadi AlNaam, or Ostrich Valley. Travellers, merchants and pilgrims have passed through here for thousands of years, pausing to etch pictures of the flightless birds that once roamed the region into this porous rock canvas.

We're discovering these clues about the area's ancient civilisations as part of a treasure hunt, combining a thrilling drive with a gorge hike, some light canyoning and puzzles to solve. It's just one of many ways tourists are invited to explore AlUla, one of the Middle East's oldest – and newest – adventure playgrounds.

The petroglyphs before us are some of the thousands that can be found in AlUla, in remote northwest Saudi Arabia. Here, the staggering geology dominates the landscape: lofty red-hued mountains, peculiar-shaped boulders, Twiglet-esque spires of rock and honeycomb-textured cliffs punctuated by oases of bright green citrus and palm trees. As we travel around, square cavities can be seen all over the rock formations. These innocuous holes, I'm told







by Mashari Albelawi, our *rawi* (storyteller), are tombs from the ancient Dadanites and Lihyanites Kingdoms. "They're high up because the ground has eroded over the years. We think ground level was higher centuries ago," says Mashari.

The grandest examples of these tombs are nearby in the UNESCO-recognised area of Hegra. Here, more than 100 burial sites – complete with cave drawings and elaborate carved façades, some as high as buildings – have been immaculately preserved, being almost undisturbed for 2,000 years. "Imagine Petra [in Jordan], but tenfold," says archaeologist Dr. Helen McGauran, when I meet her at the annual Ancient Kingdoms Festival. "As an archaeologist, it's a dream place to come," she says.

After Petra, which sits about 500km to the north, Hegra was the second most important city of the Nabataean people. This ancient civilisation once controlled areas of Egypt, Saudi Arabia, Israel and Syria until the Roman Empire seized the land. The Nabataeans were almost forgotten until Petra was uncovered by a Swiss explorer in 1812, although locals had been using the caves for years.





That means the understanding of this place is still evolving. "History is being re-written with every archaeological dig," says narrative experience expert Leila Chapman. It was in Hegra that the remains of Hinat, the ancient Nabataean woman who made global headlines in 2023, were found in 2015. Archaeologists and experts in forensic science were able to determine her appearance using advanced technology, feeding it anthropological and archeaological data about the human remains found. including bones, skin and hair. Her head was digitally re-built based on her skull shape, then a sculptor brought her face to life using a 3D printer. The trueto-life figure can be seen at the Hegra Welcome Centre at the entrance to the ancient burial sites. "The stories that we've already told here are stories that catch the world's imagination. There aren't many places that do that," says Helen.

"AlUla is an epic scale of time that's articulated in so many different ways... this isn't just a place of monuments and relics, [it] has a large local community," says Leila. Visitors can uncover stories of the area through immersive experiences, such as the living theatre Incense Road Experience. Here,





participants journey through a maze of real mudbrick houses in AIUIa's Old Town, meeting characters of the past in a multi-sensory world of incense-filled rooms with animated surprises created by the I-AM design team.

It's not only AlUla's history and geography that is evolving, either. This February, alongside those ancient cave drawings, modern artists will be erecting installations between the towering monoliths as part of the AlUla Arts Festival. And Wadi AlFann, or the 'Valley of the Arts', has been designated as a permanent outdoor gallery where artists are building works to be revealed in 2026. "Set in a terrain as monumental as the AlUla desert, it has the potential to shape the course of art history in real time," says Wadi AlFann's curator Iwona Blazwick.

Other tourist experiences here range from 'oasisto-table' dining experiences, and unique pop-up events by world-class chefs like Jason Atherton, to concerts in Maraya, a mirrored building that blends into the surrounding rocks thanks to 9,740 panes of reflective glass (Mariah Carey and Usher have already performed here). And adventure seekers can swing through the desert between sandstone formations on



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a giant 85m zipwire cable or walk across a sky-high suspended stairway.

We opt for a different aerial view of the 22,500km² area, hovering above the sandstone formations around Hegra on a Hero Balloon Flight. From a bird'seye view we get a very rare perspective, floating at sunrise in between formations that have been shaped by wind and water for some 900 million years.

Silently soaring above, we spot a desert fox between the rocks. Many species such as ostriches and the Arabian leopard have become extinct in these parts, due to historic hunting, desertification and over-grazing. But AlUla's rewilding programmes have reintroduced desert wildlife such as gazelles, oryx and ibex to the landscape. "Sharaan Nature Reserve in particular has been doing fabulous regeneration work to build out the eco-system that will eventually host the Arabian leopard," says Melanie De Souza, from the Royal Commission for AlUla. An unforgettable experience is spotting these recently reintroduced creatures on safari in a vintage 4x4.

When night falls in the desert, Hegra After Dark tours begin. Visitors are transported by horse-drawn carriage to tombs illuminated by lights and brought to life by some 40 costumed performers, plus smells, taste and hands-on activities to take them on an



evocative journey to the days of the Nabataeans. For a quieter look at the night sky, stare at the stars from Banyan Tree AlUla's stylish tents for a nod to the nomadic lifestyle of the ancient traders of the area. It's a fitting way to end our days exploring this extraordinary place, which Leila describes as "a living museum". It's certainly one that has to be seen to be believed.

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
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
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Today, the Vltava draws Prague's people to its waters, just as it has for generations. We catch up with those who keep the river's culture thriving

ild, powerful and life-giving, great rivers have long inspired the people who live near them. In the Czech Republic, one waterway's influence ranks above all others: the Vltava, the river that cuts through the historic capital of Prague like a broad, shiny ribbon.



Sometimes known by its German name, Moldau, the Vltava is celebrated in the best-loved segment of Bedřich Smetana's symphonic poem, *Má vlast*, a composition adopted as a second national anthem for Czechs. And it's also one of few rivers with its own gemstone – the elegant green moldavite, which was first found close to its banks in the pastoral South Bohemian region. The river has also served as inspiration to the city's celebrated painters and writers, while its steady flow through the centuries helped to create and expand the trade routes that caused the first permanent settlements to be founded here over 1,000 years ago.

Running from south to north with a curve through the urban centre, the Vltava is overlooked by the spires of Prague Castle. It makes for a swoon-worthy setting at the heart of a metropolitan area home to two million inhabitants. And many of those residents don't just live and work close to the river: instead, some define their very lives by their time on the water. We meet some of Prague's most passionate river keepers.

an enviable location on the Smíchov neighbourhood's Vltava embankment, directly across from the curvaceous Dancing House dreamed up by architects Frank Gehry and Vladimir Milunić. Standing on Slavia's park-like lawn, next to a yard filled with boats, club trainer Martina Součková describes the river as a source of national identity. "Czechs are proud of the Vltava," she says. "It's a symbol of the Czech Republic."

It might run across half the country, but the river seems to find its truest sense of place in the capital, where a number of protective weirs (barriers) regulate its flow as it passes the city's collection of Gothic, Baroque and Neoclassical buildings. Here, the river becomes smooth and glossy for long stretches – ideal conditions for rowing.

"When you're riding on that boat, nothing bothers you, you only hear the

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clicking of the oarlocks and the oars slapping the water," says Martina. "That's the most beautiful moment, just enjoying the movement and being connected to the water."

Founded in 1885, Slavia is one of the oldest sporting clubs in the country, with around 250 current members. Some who row here do it just for fun, says Martina. Others compete – and sometimes win – at high-level international events. Still, others might just be seeking a moment of calm. "I really love what I have here by the river in the morning," she says. "It's much quieter here. Even though we're in the centre, we have a lot of peace." **vkslavia.cz**

When Karel Kroupa started working at Lod' Pivovar in 2017, he had no idea of the challenges he'd face running a brewery built onto an old Prague riverboat. "The first problem was that we don't have a drain," he explains. As such, all of the brewery's wastewater has to be pumped onto a tugboat and hauled off for treatment elsewhere. "It's quite complicated. And the next problem is that the boat is always moving."

That repeated rocking means Lod' Pivovar – literally, "Boat Brewery" – usually needs an extra week or two to condition its beer. But that might be an advantage, as the brewery's lagers have won a number of awards and accolades. Although Lod' Pivovar is technically a ship, it can't travel anywhere - the engine had to be removed to accommodate the weight of the brewery's kettles and tanks. Unlike the nearby tour boats, the brewery's permanent anchorage on the Dvořák embankment gives it a role of attracting visitors to the area, instead of taking them away.

Karel loves the view from his "office," where he can take in impressive sunsets. But his most cherished time is dawn. "I start at 5am," he says. "The colour of the sky is purple and red, and the water is like a mirror, so it looks like there are two suns. Everything is calm, and I watch the sunrise over the Vltava as I sample the beer we brewed the day before. It's perfect." **Iodpivovar.cz**

Living less than 100m from the river

gives Kateřina Klozarová easy access to one of her favourite activities: dipping in the ice-cold Vltava throughout the winter. Many of the local *otužilci*, or "hardeners," say that regular immersion in cold water improves circulation, reduces inflammation and strengthens the immune system.

But for Kateřina, it goes much deeper, helping her forge new friendships and maintain strong connections to the natural world. "It's just a lifelong love," she says. "A true love."

As part of her exercise routine, she swims in the river roughly twice a week,



either close to her home in Prague's colourful Holešovice neighbourhood, or in the Braník district to the south of the city, where the otužilci have their clubhouse. "You always meet someone there," she says. "After cooling down, we chat together by the fire, or get a beer or a coffee from the refreshments stand."

For Kateřina, entering the water on the clubhouse steps is "a matter of the heart," a favourite setting on a river that serves as a symbol of national pride. "If only because it flows right through the capital," she says. "And Czechs are a nation of boaters, so we love it for this reason, too." **otuzilci-praha.cz**

As a literal force of nature, the Vltava requires careful management, as evidenced by the dangerous floods that inundated parts of the capital in 2002 and 2013. With an eye on the future, teams of landscape architects, urban planners and hydrological engineers are currently working on nine major river projects, all under the leadership of IPR Prague, the city's institute of planning and development. The goal is to improve both the natural environment and public safety, with new floodplains and parks, in addition to restored wetlands, improved biodiversity and safer wildlife migration.

Kristina Ullmannová, head of the institute's Office of Public Spaces, says that the situation requires a holistic approach. "We've focused attention on the Vltava as a whole — not just the river as such, but the entire area," she says.

Major changes are coming at Troja and on Rohan Island, where a huge new park is being created on a long-neglected brownfield site close to the city centre. "The development of the park will preserve its natural extensive character, but will provide much better conditions for residents, including direct contact with water," she says.

The city's relationship to the river has changed, explains Kristina. But if anything, its importance has only deepened. "For centuries, the Vltava was an essential resource and transport route for the city," she says. 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The Drinks Where to go for a top tipple

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Mystery Hotel Budapest

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Living up to its enigmatic name, the Mystery Hotel is housed in the 19th-century Symbolic Grand Lodge of the Hungarian Freemasons. The interior design is the big draw here – as imaginative as it is intriguing. The Great Hall's magnificent ceiling shifts through a kaleidoscope of colours, while the not-so-secret Sky Garden rooftop bar offers killer views over Pest's architectural highlights (enjoyed best with a Mystery Spritz in hand).


The rooms are a playful mix of Neo-Baroque drama and contemporary comfort – think velvet headboards, marble bathrooms and quirky artwork (spot the Girl with the Pearl Earring taking a selfie and Mona Lisa sporting sunglasses and a VIP pass to Budapest's famous Sziget Festival).

At The Great Hall restaurant, classic Hungarian dishes get a modern makeover beneath those mesmerising ceiling panels. The bijou wellness area downstairs feels like a tropical oasis, with a steamy hot tub surrounded by lush plants – it's like taking a dip in a hidden botanical garden. And yes, there are plenty of hidden doors, interesting light fixtures and mysterious symbols to discover – though the exceptionally friendly staff are anything but cryptic.

Market Street Hotel Scotland

Located at the boundary of Edinburgh's old and new towns, adjacent to Waverley railway station and a two-minute walk from the beautiful Princes Street Gardens, Market Street Hotel is perfectly located for exploring. Nowhere in this handsome and historic city is far from reach – in fact the Royal Mile, Scottish National Gallery and famous castle are all within a five-to-tenminute walk.

Inside, Scotland's first Design Hotel delivers on all counts: design by FG Stijl combines contemporary furniture with



traditional, tartan-inspired textiles, while each room's complimentary mini-bar is generously stocked with Scottish treats including Innis & Gunn beer. Tunnock's Caramel Wafers and Edinburgh Gin. Even the coffee comes courtesy of local favourites Gordon Street Coffee. who have created the Nor' Loft roast especially for the hotel. It's named after the hotel's glass-fronted rooftop restaurant and bar, where you can enjoy a cocktail and a bite in the evening and a full Scottish breakfast (complete with Stornoway black puddina) the following morning. Now that's what they call a Scottish welcome.







FORM Hotel Dubai

In the historical Al Jaddaf neighbourhood, FORM Hotel brings Scandinavian-cool to the desert. This design-forward hotel ditches opulent excess for clean lines and considered comfort. Rooms let you pick everything from your pillow type to your preferred artwork, while floor-to-ceiling windows frame views of the glittering skyline. The rooftop pool is a haven, and the café's specialty coffee will satisfy even the pickiest barista. A refreshing change from Dubai's usual gilded offerings.



Chapter Roma Rome

Hidden in Rome's atmospheric Jewish Quarter, Chapter Roma transforms a 19th-century palazzo into an industrial-chic hideaway. Raw steel, exposed brick and graffiti-style art create an edgy contrast to the building's classical bones. Rooms blend original features with modern luxuries and street art swagger. The ground-floor bar draws a cool local crowd, serving up cocktails and aperitivi. This is where Renaissance grandeur meets contemporary Roman attitude – and it works beautifully.



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
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BULGARIA - SOFIA

Located close to the Teatro Real in Madrid. the restaurant blends reclaimed brickwork with subtle uplighting, turning the focus rightly onto the food itself. The creative menu is split into the Garden. the Sea and the Pasture, and features innovative dishes such as 'fake risotto' - a fennel-based plate 'wrapped with riverside mist and parmesan soil' - and bacalao (salt cod), cooked at a low temperature with a smoky béchamel sauce and crispy cauliflower. Don't forget to save room for dessert, either - the likes of 'green chromatic'. made from vegetables, is a surprising hit. desborre.es/en



Reykjavík For a taste of modern Iceland without the downtown prices, head to Satt. In Hotel Natura and found right by the airport, the restaurant's clean Scandinavian design matches its straightforward approach to local cuisine – think perfectly cooked Arctic char and slow-braised lamb that falls off the bone. The weekend brunch buffet is worth planning your morning around. A savvy choice for top dining that won't break the bank. sattrestaurant.com



Best Bagel Basilica

Located near St. Stephen's Basilica, Best Bagel Basilica brings authentic New York flavours and attitude to Hungary's capital. The stars of the show are their handcrafted goldenbrown bagels (made using traditional boiling and baking methods), but the delicious filling combinations (think smoked salmon with dill cream cheese, prosciutto with honey or avocado topped with seeds and microgreens) are worth raving about, too. **bestbagel.hu**



Donna Copenhagen

It's easy to judge a restaurant on its 'instagrammable' desserts. But when Donna's pretty panna cotta rose lands on your table, you'll find it hard not to grab your phone. And it's the same problem with the pavlova stacked high with juicy red berries and perfectly piped vanilla cream. Yet you'll find the flavours live up to the hype, and this Italian eatery in Copenhagen is not style over substance.

Located on the ground floor of Hotel Bella Grande, it's split into three separate areas with red and pink tones throughout. Our tip is to book a table in the candy-flosshued antique atrium courtyard below a square of sky. Here you could be anywhere – a palazzo in Rome or a Las Vegas casino – but what you get is cocktails and authentic Italian food served with a side of rizz in a lively setting. The spaghetti al tartufo is a rich truffle-topped pasta served from a huge hollowed-out Pecorino wheel, and the moreish rigatoni al ragú is made with braised beef and a grandma-will-never-tell tomato sauce. The choice of pizzas, arancini 'snacks' and tuna crudo are all crowd-pleasers, too. Can't decide? You can order à la carte or go for a five-course set menu, and the friendly staff will help you decide what will taste best on the night and get the most 'likes'. **hotelbellagrande.com**



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Where to go for a strong cocktail across the WIZZ network



Röda Huset Stockholm

Meaning 'Red House' in Swedish, Röda Huset is one of Stockholm's best-loved cocktail bars for good reason. Located in – you guessed it – a red building right at the heart of the city, Röda Huset was created by Hampus Thunholm, who is obsessive about finding innovative traditional and surprising new techniques to bring Swedish ingredients to life in a glass. On the top floor of the building (the others house the equally excellent Röda Huset restaurant), you can enjoy views of Sergels Torg square while sipping one of Thunholm's creations. They include the house special, Sweet Vernal Grass With Good Creme: a concoction of cream from Jylland flavoured with grass, Absolut Elyx vodka, Galliano and green apples. Despite its dairy content, the drink is clear and served with a large block of ice with a single blade of grass frozen at its centre. For something even more unusual, the Carrot combines 'sweet and sour carrots from the farmers pantry' with Linie Aquavit, while the Cucumber cocktail blends carbonated cucumber with vodka, wheat and dill. **rodahuset.nu**



The latest venture from Vasilis Kyritsis and Nikos Bakoulis, the celebrated mixologists behind the Greek capital's beloved Clumsies, Line is a chic bar located just outside downtown Athens. Together with Dimitris Dafopoulos - the drinks guru behind the Three Cents mixer brand - the team have created a progressive drinks menu, with everything made from scratch in-house. That doesn't just mean house beers and ferments, but also a growing selection of 'whyins' - their answer to grapeless fruit wines, which include apple, pomegranate and orange flower varieties. Partly crafted in the name of experiment, the why-ins are also made in anticipation of the effect climate change is likely to have on grape harvests in the future. Tasting them, however, needn't be too serious: try a Message from Scotland, which combines Scotch with coffee and mushroom leftovers, orange flower why-in and jasmine. It might sound a little strange but trust us: you're in safe hands. **lineathens.gr**



Abel's Wine Bar Bucharest

In Bucharest's Old Town, Abel's is a small but perfectly formed wine bar and the ideal spot to try Romanian wines, as well as vintages from some lesser-known producers around the world. Expect excellent local examples such as Furmint Urme produced by Familia Darabont in the north of the country, and sparkling Carassia from Transylvanian winery Carastelec. If you need a bite to balance out the wines, there are delicious cheese and charcuterie boards. **abelswinebar.ro**



Le Lion Bar de Paris Hamburg



The WIZZ Management Trainee Program means that even the sky isn't the limit for soon-to-be graduates. We spoke to the team involved to find out more etting your foot on the career ladder as a graduate can be a daunting prospect - but not for Benedek Havass. During his final year at the Budapest Business University in 2022, Benedek applied to join the WIZZ Management Trainee Program a scheme that offers university students in Hungary a one- or two-year training role within one of Wizz Air's office-based teams while they're still studying.

"The idea is for students to work part-time, around their studies, with the potential for a full-time role after graduation," says Benedek. He joined the team permanently after graduating, and has since worked his way up to become WIZZ's Employer Brand Manager – meaning he's responsible for the selection of future management trainees. "We want to build a talent pipeline by recruiting university students into junior roles. We ask them to commit to 20-40 hours per week," she says. "This gives them a really good grounding in their role and department, whether that's in operations, commercial, HR or finance."

Unlike short-term work experience, which may not provide much hands-on experience, the WIZZ Management Trainee Program creates meaningful roles for the students involved. "It benefits everyone," says Evgenia. "Our trainees are entrusted with major projects where they contribute valuable insights and fresh perspectives. This allows them to work alongside fulltime employees as dynamic counterparts, enhancing the company's approach to key topics."

Alongside being paid for their work, and the possibility of a job at the end of the program, trainees also enjoy other benefits, such as access to LinkedIn Learning and networking events. "The benefits are unique," smiles Benedek. "I fell in love with aviation quite early, and the scheme has really

kick-started my career in the industry. The training is excellent, and students have the chance to move into different departments if they want to after the first year. They also benefit from the perks of being a WIZZ employee, such as significantly discounted flight tickets – which is great when you're a student and want to explore the world."

Since it launched in 2022, 67 trainees have enrolled in the scheme – and 90% have stayed on in a full-time role after finishing the program.

"WIZZ has a unique company culture, and aviation is different from other industries," says Evgenia. This, she explains, means "there's a real advantage in harnessing young minds fresh out of university, getting them engaged with the industry and developing them. We're growing talent from scratch in the hope they become the next generation of leaders."

The program, which is conducted in English, is open to students from all nationalities. And although it's currently only operating in Hungary, there are hopes to roll the scheme out in other Wizz Air bases. Alongside onboarding before the traineeship commences, there are also inbuilt feedback and development phases to ensure students receive meaningful insight as they learn - just one of the reasons the program was awarded gold at the 2024 Zynternship awards, which assesses early-career programs in Hungary.

And, while the roles involved may be office-based rather than up in the clouds like their crew colleagues, that doesn't mean trainees don't still enjoy the buzz of working for a pioneering airline. "Sure, as a company we fly these huge metal aircraft in the sky but if you dig a bit deeper, we are connecting people," says Benedek. "Each passenger has a unique story, and we are helping them experience the world. I'm really proud to work for a company that helps people to have a better world view, a better life, and to connect with their loved ones."

Your onboard safety

Please show consideration for your fellow passengers and pay attention to the following information. Remember that by purchasing your Wizz Air ticket, you have accepted the Wizz Air General Conditions of Carriage (available in full at **wizzair.com**)

Safe handling of hand luggage

Ensure that your larger hand luggage remains safely stowed in the locker and the smaller ones are under the seat in front of you for take-off, landing and whenever instructed by the crew. Passengers seated in the emergency rows and first row must store their cabin bags in the overhead lockers. Take care when opening lockers, as falling items may injure fellow passengers. In case of evacuation, all baggage must be left on board, and the instructions of the cabin crew must be strictly followed.

Safety equipment

It is an offence to tamper with or remove safety equipment, including adult and infant life vests, infant safety belts or extension belts. You are not allowed to remove or damage any onboard informative placards.

Sharp items

To dispose of sharp items (e.g. hypodermic needles), contact a cabin crew member. Do not leave it behind.

Turbulence management

Turbulence can occur unexpectedly. Whenever seatbelt signs are switched on, remain seated, keep seatbelts fastened and stow away large electronic devices. For your safety, we recommend that you keep your seatbelts visibly fastened at all times when seated.

Safety of infants on board

Wizz Air has a clear procedure for infant (a child under two) restraint systems. You can only use the single hook infant seatbelt - vests/slings cannot be used with the infant seatbelt. Wizz Air only accepts aft-facing car seats when an extra seat is purchased. **However, during take-off, landing and whenever the seatbelt sign is switched on, infants should sit on an adult's lap** with the **seatbelt fastened**. Life vests for infants are available and are provided whenever flying over water. All lavatories are equipped with a changing table. Do not leave children unattended in the cabin.

Lithium batteries

Portable electronic devices (PED) such as phones, laptops and tablets can contain lithium batteries. When damaged, faulty or overheated, these batteries can catch fire and explode. If you recognise any issues with your device, inform the cabin crew immediately.

Charging electronic devices on board using a portable battery charger is forbidden.

Electronic devices

Some electronic devices can be used during the flight with WLAN/Wi-Fi/Bluetooth turned off.

Larger electronic devices that cannot be held comfortably in one hand, exceed ca. 1kg in weight and do not qualify as handheld devices (e.g. laptops, notebooks etc.) must be stowed in the overhead stowage compartments for takeoff, landing and whenever required by the cabin crew. If in doubt, please ask your cabin crew.

Inflight health tips

Read these tips on how to stay fit when travelling.

Before your air travel

Consult your doctor before travelling if you have any medical concerns. Pregnant women and those with heart or respiratory problems, blood diseases or ear, nose and sinus infections should seek medical advice before flying. Crew members are entitled to call for medical assistance pre-flight if they deem it necessary and are in doubt about your fitness for the flight.

Medical supplies on board

Keep any medication you may need in your hand luggage and in its original packaging. Inform cabin crew of allergies or illnesses. If you are seriously ill or travelling post-surgery, you will need a medical certificate confirming that you are fit to fly. If you have limited mobility, are hearing- or sight-impaired, pregnant, or unable to understand/react to safety instructions, you will be unable to sit in the emergency exit rows or the front row. If you start to feel unwell during the flight, do not hesitate to talk to the cabin crew.

Nut allergy

During our WIZZ Café service we offer peanuts and some snacks containing peanuts/nuts traces. If you have any allergies we strongly encourage you to take all necessary medical precautions before flying, and to inform the cabin crew during boarding about your allergy.

Why smoking is banned on flights

Airlines started banning smoking in the late 1980s and by 2000 it was made illegal across the world. Here are the reasons why

Secondhand smoke: Secondhand smoke contains over 7,000 chemicals, including at least 70 known carcinogens. Breathing these harmful chemicals in the confined space of an aircraft poses serious health risks.

It impacts air quality:

Cigarette smoke can circulate in the confined air and lead to unpleasant odours. It impairs the air quality and jeopardises how the cabin pressure system functions, which can result in a lack of oxygen at high altitude.

It's a fire hazard: A lit cigarette can ignite flammable materials, potentially leading to a catastrophic fire in the cabin. Extinguishing fires mid-flight is challenging.

Electronic cigarettes/vapes/IQOS can cause concern: Therefore

they are also not allowed on in the cabin. While e-cigarettes produce vapour rather than smoke, the visible vapour can be mistaken for traditional cigarette smoke, causing confusion and potential alarm among passengers.

Dry air conditions: The dry air in the aircraft cabin can make fuel more flammable.

Smoke detectors: The smoke detector in the toilets is linked to a warning system. When triggered,

the smoke detector notifies cabin crew through a control panel in the cockpit and triggers an audible alarm throughout the aircraft cabin. This system helps cabin crew swiftly address emergency situations related to smoke on board.

Overheating batteries: Vaping, IQOS and e-cigarettes work with lithium-ion batteries that are more likely to overheat or explode while being used.

SMOKING ON A PLANE COULD LEAD TO: • Fines of up to €3,000

- A ban from flying with that airline for life
- As per the applicable law, smokers on board may face prosecution.

Remember, lighting up during a flight is not only illegal but also jeopardises the wellbeing and safety of everyone on board. The ashtrays in the passenger cabin and restrooms are not an optional design element and not an invitation to smoke. Cabin crew members are trained to extinguish smoke and fire and eliminate any potential danger.

Your security

...is one of our top priorities. In order to ensure a smooth and pleasant flight, please read the following rules of conduct

We encourage you to...

- Follow crew instructions, which will keep you safe
- Be respectful towards everyone on board
- Use suitable language, and stay calm and cooperative

...so you can:

- Travel in a pleasant and peaceful atmosphere
- Relax on board
- Get to your destination as soon as possible



- Smoking on board (including classic cigarettes or e-cigarettes, pipes, vapes), might result in a fine of up to €3,000 or prosecution. Additionally all existing Wizz Air flight bookings will be cancelled
- Consuming alcohol that was not purchased on board. Alcohol is served at the crew's discretion to passengers of legal drinking age. The crew reserves the right to stop serving alcohol to any passenger who is, or appears to be, intoxicated
- Being under the influence of drugs or substances that may affect your behaviour or self-control
- Damaging the aircraft or onboard equipment
- Wasting, polluting or contaminating the cabin
- Endangering the safety of the flight by any means
- Breaching, or refusing to follow, crew instructions
- Harassing fellow passengers and/or crew members in any way (including sexual harassment)
- Threatening or being aggressive towards fellow passengers and/or crew members
- Being violent or behave in a hostile, erratic manner
- Filming or photographing the cabin crew without their permission

...or face the consequences:

You are fully responsible for your behaviour. Disruptive behaviour on board and before boarding will not be tolerated and will be reported to the authorities. You will be held legally and financially responsible in all cases.

The following consequences* will occur for such misconduct:

- Denied boarding
- Diversion of the flight and prosecution.
- Reimbursement of cost of diversion:
 €10,000-€80,000
- Criminal procedure and court litigation*
- Cancellation of all of your existing Wizz Air flight bookings
- A ban from flying with Wizz Air in the future
- Penalty/fine or arrest by local police:
 - Smoking on board, including in the lavatory: up to €3,000*
 - Unruly behaviour due to intoxication: up to €5,000 and two years in prison*
 - Endangering the safety of an aircraft: up to five years in prison*




