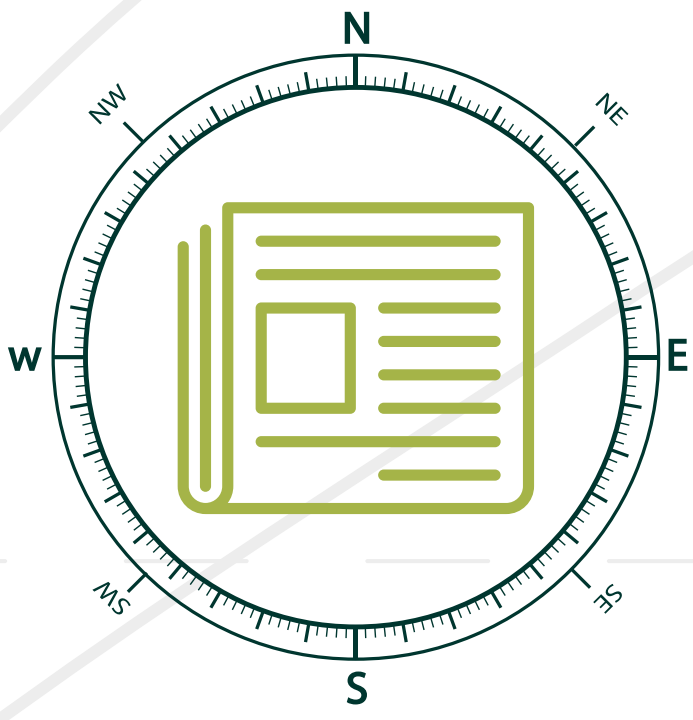


HOW OUTDOOR EDUCATION SHAPES LIFE SKILLS

YEAR 6 AND RECEPTION BUDDIES CELEBRATE SPRING

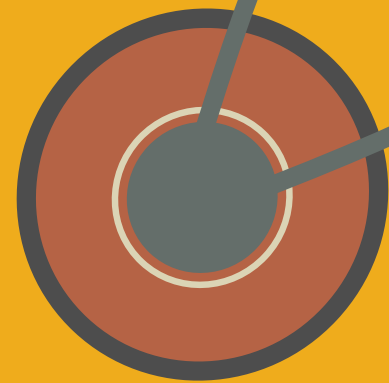

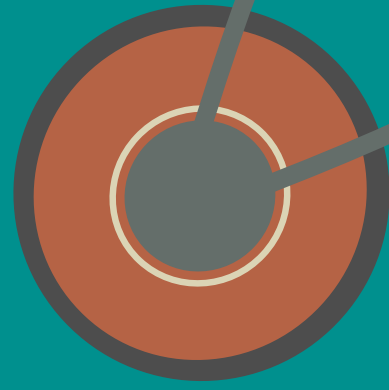
ACADEMIC SCHOLARS VISIT BLOOMSBURY CENTRAL BAPTIST CHURCH

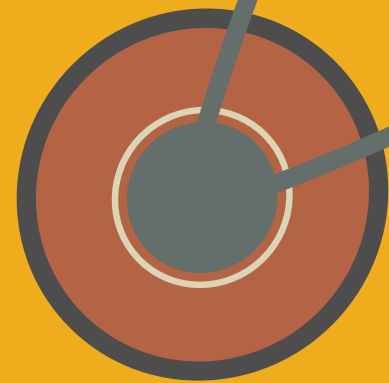
UNITED LEARNING LEADERSHIP PROJECT

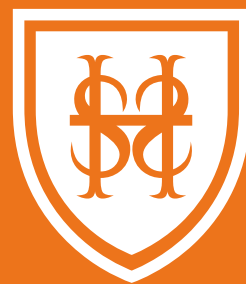
