

REGISTRATION & IDENTIFICATION

Registration opens Thursday, July 17, 2025, from 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. and will reopen on Friday, July 18, 2025, at 7:30 a.m. A chaperone must be present to pick up registration packets for all attendees 12 and under. Youth and young adult attendees are required to wear identification badges or wristbands.

CHECKS

All clergy, chaperones, and individuals working with our youth must complete the Protect My Ministry requirements, which include the background check and Child Safety Training.

SAFETY MARSHALS

The Sons of Allen Ministry will provide security for this event. You will meet them during the mandatory orientation meeting. Please familiarize yourself with ways to identify members of this ministry and follow their directions.

BISHOP RONNIE ELIJAH BRAILSFORD, SR.

A native of South Carolina, he was born and raised in Clarendon County. He was elected and consecrated the 136th Bishop of the African Methodist Episcopal Church during the 50th Quadrennial General Conference held in Philadelphia, PA, July 2016. He has served as President of the AMEC Council of Bishops. Since August 2024, he serves proudly as the Presiding Prelate of the 10th Episcopal District of the AMEC for the state of Texas.

Prior, he served the 19th Episcopal District, comprised of 246 churches and over 54,000 members in South Africa from July 2021–August 2024. Also, he served the 20th Episcopal District of the A.M.E. Church with 223 churches and over 23,000 members in the African countries of Malawi, Zimbabwe, Tanzania, Uganda, and Mozambique from July 2016 to July 2021. During his tenure in Africa, 28 churches and over 5,000 new members were added. Fourteen churches were built, 19 churches were dedicated, 12 churches were planted and 16 churches joined the AMEC.

Bishop and Supervisor Brailsford visited over 240 churches and 28 AMEC schools, even in rural and remote areas, where safe to travel. Funds were raised to help provide school supplies for over 20,000 students and the staff. They provided funds and food for disaster relief for over 2,500 families. Medical mission trips served over 11,000 people with medical, dental, eye and dermatology services. They partnered to provide scholarships and school fees for 100 plus students. In addition, the United Methodist Church and Africa University partnership was started August 2020 and provides \$700,000 of four year full scholarships for 32 students. They raised funds for campus improvements and refurbished three buildings on Wilberforce Community College campus. The ministry was undergirded by monthly

Episcopal District wide prayer time!

Having graduated in 1976 as Valedictorian from Scott's Branch High School of Summerton, SC, he went on to graduate from the University of South Carolina, with a Bachelor of Science degree in Marketing. His Master of Divinity degree was earned at the Interdenominational Theological Center (ITC) in Atlanta, GA. where he was a Benjamin E. Mays Fellow and a John Middleton Scholar. An honorary Doctor of Divinity degree was bestowed upon him by A.M.E. University of Monrovia, Liberia in 2006. He did Studies in the Doctor of Ministry program at I.T.C. and earned his Doctor of Ministry degree in 2007 from United Theological Seminary. He has received many academic, professional and community honors.

His diverse professional career beyond the church includes working for the Southwestern Publishing Company with top salesman and management recognitions; Fellow and Mentor with the Congress of National Black Churches (CNBC); Fellow with Atlanta Economic Development Corporation (AEDC); Community Development Religious Consultant with Atlanta Neighborhood Development Corporation (ANDP) and Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company. He was licensed to preach on January 20, 1980 at his home church, Historic Liberty Hill A.M.E. Church in Summerton, SC. He served at Big Bethel AMEC in Atlanta, GA. Later, he pastored at Mt. Carmel AMEC, Gray Court, SC and Amanda Flipper AMEC, Decatur, Georgia.

His twenty-four years, from 1992-2016, at Bethel A.M.E. Church, Columbia, SC were highlighted by exceptional spiritual, numerical, and financial growth. In 1995 Bethel relocated from its landlocked Sumter Street site to 819 Woodrow Street, a \$5,000,000 campus with five connected buildings, 86,000 square feet, on 5 acres of land. The 1.5 city blocks offer 366 parking spaces and modern accommodations, including 120 classrooms and offices, a Christian Life Center and Gymnasium. A new school, Bethel Learning Centers, was founded, and accredited since 1995, educating thousands. A \$3,000,000 new school building was completed in 2008.

In 1983, he married Carolyn Elizabeth Irvin. She is an Itinerant Elder. They have three children: Veronica-Carol, Ronnie, Jr. and David; a daughter-in love, Erica; and seven grandchildren, Harper, Kyndal, Gracen, Dawson, Roman, Brendan & Kai. He is a very devoted husband, father, bishop, and community leader.

REV. CAROLYN ELIZABETH IRVIN BRAILSFORD

Rev. Carolyn Elizabeth Irvin Brailsford is the Episcopal Supervisor of the Tenth (Totally Texas!) Episcopal District of the African Methodist Episcopal Church, and is an ordained Itinerant Elder. A native of Valdosta, GA (she was the first Miss Black Valdosta), Supervisor Brailsford received her vocal training at Spelman College with a Bachelor of Arts Degree, Magna Cum Laude; and Indiana University (IU) at Bloomington with a Master of Music Degree, With Distinction. She undertook further studies in Ethnomusicology while at IU.

Prior to serving in the Tenth Episcopal District, she served in the Triumphant Twentieth Episcopal District and launched The WMS Education Project with Sarah's Scholars, a collaboration with the Sixth Episcopal District North Atlanta Conference WMS. This education initiative in Malawi and Zimbabwe provided tuition for over 100 students in primary, secondary, and professional schools. Additionally, she and Bishop Brailsford raised funds for school supplies for over 20,000 students in the 35 AME Church schools. She involved the missionaries in three Medical Health Initiatives that were brought to the District, which served over 11,000 people with dental, eye, dermatology and general health exams and services. She and Bishop provided funds and food for disaster relief for over 2,500 families. In addition, the United Methodist Church and Africa University partnership was started in August, 2020, and provides \$700,000 of four year full scholarships for 32 students.

Supervisor Brailsford also served in the Noble Nineteenth Episcopal District in South Africa where she provided outstanding leadership for their exceptional WMS and YPD (who often ministered in song with her); the Women In Ministry and MSWAWO, for which she and Bishop Brailsford inspired and organized the powerful Family Enrichment Seminar series for both clergy and lay families. Supervisor Brailsford was the creative force and organizer for "A Taste of Africa", the night of entertainment for the Global Development Council 2024 in Johannesburg, South Africa, where leaders of the global AME church were treated to African cuisine, African fashions, choral music, dance, and a Spiritual Experience not to be forgotten!

An accomplished musician, Supervisor Brailsford has served on the faculties of Spelman College (14 years), and Allen University as Vocal Instructor, Choir Directress, and Instructor of African American Music, a class which she initiated at both institutions. She also served as Minister of Music & Worship Arts and Choir Directress at Bethel AME Church (Columbia, SC), from which Bishop Brailsford was elected. She was Founder of the highly recognized CaBrailSong School of Vocal Arts, a life-changing ministry of spiritual enrichment, vocal training, and choral experiences for hundreds of youths and young adults for over

BISHOP GREGORY VAUGHN EASON, SR.

The Right Reverend Gregory Vaughn Eason, Sr., was born in Metter, Ga., and is the son of Reverend William and Mrs. Geneva Washington Eason. He graduated from East Georgia State College in Swainsboro, Georgia in 1981 with an Associate of Arts Degree. He matriculated at Morris Brown College, in Atlanta, Georgia in 1983 (where he graduated Magna Cum Laude with a degree in Political Science). He continued his education and was conferred the Master of Divinity degree from Turner Theological Seminary at the Interdenominational Theological Center, Atlanta, GA., in 1986. He received his Master of Theology degree from Columbia Theological Seminary, Decatur, GA., in 1988, where his thesis was titled, "Suffering, Liberation and Violence: A Study of God's Presence in the History of Black America." Bishop Eason received his Doctor of Ministry degree from Columbia Theological Seminary in May 2011. His project dissertation was titled, "Radical Hospitality, Re-envisioning a Downtown Historic Congregation."

Bishop Eason's denominational service in the A.M.E. Church includes President, Connectional Council for the A.M.E. Church; Vice Chairperson, Trustee Board Atlanta North Georgia Annual Conference; Chairperson, Search Committee for President/Dean, Turner Theological Seminary, ITC; Chairperson, Georgia Annual Conference Board of Examiners; and Chairperson, Atlanta North Georgia Annual Conference Board of Examiners, where he was responsible for training new ministers for ordination in the A.M.E. Church.

Bishop Eason serves on the following boards: The World Methodist Evangelism Institute; Morris Brown College Trustee Board (Emeritus), and the Trustee Board of Turner Theological Seminary.


Bishop Eason's pastoral ministry in the 6th Episcopal District (Georgia)started at Saint Mark, Wadley and Hickman Tabernacle in Augusta, Ga (1984-1986); Saint James, Thomson (1986-1988); Saint James, Monticello (1988-1990); Saint Philip, Savannah (1990-2004); Flipper Temple, Atlanta (2004-2005); Big Bethel, Atlanta (2005-2013); Saint Paul, Atlanta (2013-2016) and Flipper Temple A.M.E. Church in Atlanta (2016-2024).

He has contributed to several publications and productions. Among his writings And published works are, "Looking at AIDS Through the Eyes of God" (A.M.E. Church Review, 1990); "Dreams and Nightmares" (A.M.E. Church Review, 1995); Evidence of Transformative Ministry (A.M.E. Church Review, 2012); "A Small Boy with a Big Fish," an article in the African American Study Bible, and a joint venture of The Congress of National Black Churches and Zondervan Publishing House. He has also served as a commentator for "This Far by Faith: African American Spiritual Journeys," a joint production of Blackside, Inc. and the Faith Project, which aired on PBS Television.

Bishop Eason has been bestowed many honors including being inducted into the Martin Luther King, Jr. International Board of Preachers at Morehouse College; a member of The International Society of Theta Phi, ITC; The Bishop Henry McNeal Turner Image Award for Outstanding Community Service and Hall of Fame, Turner Theological Seminary; and a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc.

At the 52nd Quadrennial Session of the African Methodist Episcopal Church in August 2024, he was elected and consecrated the 148th Bishop in the history of the A.M.E. Church. Bishop Eason currently serves as the Presiding Prelate of the 20th Episcopal District encompassing Malawi, Zimbabwe, Tanzania, Uganda and a portion of Mozambique. He presides over 7 annual conferences, 238 churches and 33 schools (primary, secondary and high schools). Bishop Eason was also nominated to serve as Chairperson of the International Health Commission of the A.M.E. Church.

Dr. Waters is also featured in the documentary Juneteenth: Faith and Freedom, winner for Documentary of the Year. Presented annually since 1949, the Wilbur Awards recognize excellence in the communication of religious issues, values, and themes in public secular media and includes among its' past winners Oprah Winfrey, Jane Pauley, Mister Rogers, CBS Sunday Moming, ABC's 20/20, Meet the Press, Vanity Fair, and The New York Times. He is also the recipient of the Children's Book Council's Youth Book Prize for Social Justice, among other literary honors. Publisher's Weekly calls his latest non-fiction book Something in the Water: A 21st Century Civil Rights Odyssey a "blistering critique of white supremacy and racial injustice" that "should be

Dr. Waters is the former vice chair of Foot Soldiers Park and Educational Center in Selma, Alabama, and an executive board member of the Perkins School of Theology at Southern Methodist University (SMU) in Dallas, Texas. He earned bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees with honors at SMU where he founded the SMU Civil Rights Pilgrimage and presently serves as an adjunct professor teaching doctoral and masters-level courses in ministry and popular culture and Black church studies. He is also a principal with MYWaters Consulting, LLC, which offers racial equity training, consulting, and educational

resources to leaders in business, organizations, and schools. Presently, Dr. Waters is pursuing a second doctorate, a PhD in African American Preaching and Sacred Rhetoric, at Christian Theological Seminary in Indianapolis, Indiana.

He is also a recipient of the B'nai B'rith Harold M. Kaufman Memorial Award in Social Ethics and Southern Methodist University's Distinguished Alumni Emerging Leader Award. An Emerson Collective Fellow, Dr. Waters has conducted research on storytelling and democracy.

Dr. Waters is married to the Reverend Attorney Yulise Reaves Waters. They are the proud parents of four children.
