


EVOLUTION OF THE CORPUS

Number of available articles





1.93 million in CAD given to journals during the fiscal year 2024–2025

This income, which supports the editorial work done by journals, comes from agreements made with libraries as part of the POA or from the commercialization of subscriptions sold to institutions.




World distribution of consultations





I. Background

poa Partnership for Open Access

Objective: Enable open access publishing in Canada without article processing charges (diamond open access).



poa

Practically, the POA is a series of agreements with libraries that want to support all the scholarly journals on Érudit, including those in open access.





POA Supported Journals

→ Diamond OA journals now make up the majority of the scholarly collection.

→ More than 40 journals have flipped to OA since the start of the POA.

Changes to government funding for scholarly journals

- Starting in 2028, the journals funded by SSHRC and/or the FRQ will be required to be diamond open access.

II. New Formula for Partnership Support

In 2018, Érudit's Scientific Committee began working on a new formula to distribute funds from the POA, one that would not rely on the legacy subscription model.

Principles used by the Scientific Committee for the new formula :

- Simple, robust, and reproducible
- Beneficial to the majority of journals
- Transparent and predictable, with a gradual implementation

Érudit will start implementing the new formula in 2027.

sustainability

The new formula is just one of many strategies implemented by the community to ensure the sustainability of open access journals.

consistency

The new formula is based on the values and objectives of the POA and allows POA funds to be distributed in a manner consistent with its mission: to enable open access publishing.

rebalancing


The new formula recognizes the contribution of all journals to the dissemination of research.

A few clarifications

- For subscription-based scholarly journals, this change applies only to POA agreements, not to traditional subscriptions.
- The new formula will not require journals to switch to open access: the method of dissemination on the erudit.org platform remains the decision of each journal.
- To ensure budgetary predictability for journals, a transition plan will be in place for the first three years.
- Cultural journals are not affected by this change.

III. Summary

- The new formula for partnership support provides long-term support and ongoing funding for journals flipping to open access and those that are already open access.
- It aims to recognize each journal's contribution to the dissemination of research.






Facing down crawlers (bots)




- Recently, **over 50% of global internet traffic** has become automated, with 3/4 of that traffic generated by malicious bots.

 - Compliance with rights and licenses




Anubis versus bots



Implementation of an advanced filtering system





Constant adaptation to the increasing sophistication of bots in the context of an arms race



- Always in service of our mission:


