Developing Books

eet Elishama. He is a faithful church member in a local congregation in Cotonou, in the West African country of Benin. It's one of the most under-resourced regions in the world. Benin is often referred to as the birthplace of voodoo, which is deeply ingrained in the culture, even within the Christian community. The believers in Benin remain vulnerable to syncretism (mixing religions) as many churches are led by pastors who lack any formal training to study and preach the Bible.

Thanks to your generous support, Langham has invested in developing biblical literature that equips pastors across French-speaking West Africa. That means Elishama and his pastor have more books in the right language and context to open God's Word. Elishama says: "Cultivating an intimate relationship with God comes down to cultivating a relationship that brings you closer to the Word of God."

With your support...

Between July 2021 and June 2022, Langham Literature has:

- Supplied 14,635 Bible-centred books to 700 Majority World (MW) colleges across 79 countries. 11,154 of these books were supplied to 693 colleges free of charge through the Library Grants programme.
- Distributed 32,722 Bible-centred books to MW pastors, students and ministry partners in need of study materials. 18,971 of these books were supplied free of charge to participants at, or coordinators of, Langham Preaching seminars/clubs.
- Been actively involved with 23 indigenous publishers, in 20 different

countries, in the production of 36 local language titles. Additionally, 14 local writers in 12 countries were supported through Writer Grants.

- Published 50 books: 38 of these were by MW authors or contributors; 15 of these were by Langham Scholars.
- Supported the publication of 3 ground-breaking one-volume Bible commentaries (the Latin American Bible Commentary Portuguese translation, African Bible Commentary Amharic translation and the second edition of the Slavic Bible Commentary in Russian). Langham Literature was also actively involved in 19 other Commentary projects.

Equipping Scholars

eet **Dr Hikmat Kashouh**. Hikmat is a Langham Scholar who gained his PhD from the University of Birmingham (UK) with support from Langham. In addition to his teaching and writing, he leads Resurrection Church Beirut — a vibrant and growing missional network of churches in Beirut, Lebanon. Under his leadership, the church has pursued God's radical call to love our enemies. Through sacrificially serving Syrian refugees, the church has not only made disciples but also been transformed themselves.

Thanks to your support, Langham equips Majority World leaders who return to their countries to shape their nations with a biblical worldview.

Hikmat says: "I am very aware that I am where I am today because of the people who believed in me, and it is my desire to do the same for others, creating opportunities for them, especially if they are underprivileged."

With your support...

Between July 2021 and June 2022, Langham Scholars has:

- Supported 85 PhD students from 44 Majority World (MW) countries in theological doctoral programs. 22 of these scholars are new scholars who commenced Langham scholarships during the 2021-22 academic year.
- Celebrated the graduation of 7 scholars, all of whom have returned to serve in the Majority World. They join a fellowship of more than 325 graduated Langham Scholars serving around the world.
- Supported 5 current doctoral MW scholars and 3 postdoctoral scholars, with study residencies for concentrated

periods of study, or research and writing projects, in centres where there is access to excellent library resources and a research community.

- Held 3 in-person regional scholar consultations for current Langham Scholars and 15 virtual gatherings. Held 2 in-person regional forums for graduated Langham Scholars. Consultations and forums provide opportunities for scholars to network, receive pastoral care, share research, collaborate, and be more effective in serving the church and theological institutions.
- Langham Scholars had at least 38 books and 10 articles published – 10 of these were by women.

Training Pastors

eet Jocabed. She is a Preaching Club coordinator in Panama, focusing on pastors in the indigenous Gunadule (Guna) community. Many of these pastors live on remote islands where fellowship and resources are scarce. They see the Preaching Club (known as 'escualita') meetings as a vital lifeline. Jocabed says: "When we have Langham Preaching meetings, these pastors feel great because it's not only about studying the bible, it's about having a community. The Langham meetings are very important for them." Jocabed and the other members of the Langham Preaching team in Panama are keen to contextualise the bible so that it is relevant to the pastors' everyday realities.

Thanks to your generous support, more and more pastors such as those on remote islands in Panama, receive the encouragement and training they need to keep serving their congregations and building the Church to maturity in Christ.

With your support...

Between July 2021 and June 2022, Langham Preaching has:

- Equipped 9,813 pastors and lay leaders to teach God's Word (1,400 of these individuals are local indigenous Facilitators and Preaching Club coordinators). Training has been led by 669 local Facilitators, who are equipped and working together in teams to train others.
- Held 276 in-person and virtual preaching training seminars in 63 countries in need of solid biblical

preaching. 34% of the seminars were virtual (online). There are 104 Langham Preaching Movements in 89 countries around the world.

- Shepherded 1,143 preaching clubs of 7-10 pastors and leaders meeting regularly for ongoing training and mentoring.
- Held 8 global or regional consultations, forums or leadership meetings, involving at least 98 leaders and/or coordinators from across the world to review, learn, train and plan.

Langham UK and Ireland in numbers

angham UK and Ireland is so grateful for the generosity of donors which enables its mission and ministry, under God, to advance.

The pie charts below provide a summary of the financial performance for the year 2021-22 (figures subject to final external audit).

Langham Partnership UKI raises funds from UKI supporters which are then used to fund programme activity.


At the same time, it operates as 'banker' for the programmes and receives funds

from other Langham Partnership entities across the world (USA, Canada, Hong Kong, Australia and New Zealand) and deploys these to fund programme activities.

In 2021-22, 83% of expenditure related to the three programme streams of Literature, Preaching and Scholars.

All of this expenditure, generously funded by UKI donors and other Langham entities, supports the global impact presented in this booklet.

Langham Partnership UKI Income 2021-22 (provisional)




