ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

FIVE QUESTIONS FOR DANNY COLONTRELLE, CLASS OF 1998

Danny Colontrelle '98 stopped by campus to talk to the graduating class, and we couldn't pass up the opportunity to dig a little deeper and glean some wisdom from Pirate dad, decorated war veteran and all around good guy.



- 1 You grew up in an atmosphere of the importance of sharing one's gifts beyond our own four walls. How did that shape who you are today and how is that philosophy shared with your children now?

Besides my parents doing a heavy load of the lifting, teachers, coaches, my friend's parents all helped me get to where I am today. Mistakes were made, lessons learned and growth and maturity happened, but I always knew that this community was behind me. It was a pretty awesome feeling for someone as they navigated their teens through their early 20s, especially when I was overseas. Everyone thinks in terms that giving back has to do with a monetary figure. When you are young, or at least when I was, giving back meant making this community proud of your accomplishments because of the support it provided. Now I'm in a position to be one of those who supports the local kid and hopes he and she pass it along to the next generation.

- 2 It's relatively rare for a Saint Edward's School graduate to pursue a career in the military. What do you think is unique about you or anyone else who chooses to serve in that capacity?

You learn what sacrifice really is and what it means. You also realize how good life is and how good we have it. My personal military career started probably unlike most. You will read later about my mom crying at the dinner table. It's Christmas break of my senior year in high school, a football coach calls from West Point Military Academy and stops by the house the next day, and then the journey began. That was the only college application I filled out. I didn't know what I was getting myself into, which might have been a blessing. I just took it day by day, until I made my way back to Vero Beach.

- 3 Like so many Pirate graduates, you left Vero Beach and the comforts of home to pursue your own dreams, but you also returned to raise your family and make a positive impact on the community that helped shape you. Why?

I never wanted to leave. I remember my mom crying at the dinner table because I refused to fill out college applications. Fortunately, I took the long road to get back here with West Point and my time in the Army. My dreams were always to come back and take over the family business. This town is a great place to grow up in and one to raise a family. But it is also a little bit of a curse for people who grew up here, because it’s real easy when things get a little rocky to run back to Vero.

- 4 Do you have a favorite memory from your days as a Pirate?

I really just enjoyed the tightness and closeness of the school. As I stated in my answer to the first question, I knew there were multiple teachers and coaches at Saint Edward’s who made sure I stayed the course. You spend a lot of your teenage life at school without your parents (although my mom did work at Saint Edward’s while I was there, so it was a little different); the teachers and coaches take on a second parent role to watch you grow and succeed. Knowing that you had these people pulling for you and not wanting to disappoint them created a recipe where you wanted to be the best at academics and athletics.

- 5 If you had one piece of advice to share with the Class of 2024, what might it be?

Never back down from a challenge, whether it be physically or mentally. Those challenges are where you will see your most growth by either finding out what it takes to succeed or learning from your failure and making sure that it doesn’t happen again. It almost becomes a winning mindset, and you have to be wired a little differently. Some might call it ignorance but to this day, whether it is playing sports, coaching one of my kids’ games, or helping them with a project or homework, my thought is we are going to win and we are going to ace this project even though we don’t always.
