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From the Headmaster's Desk



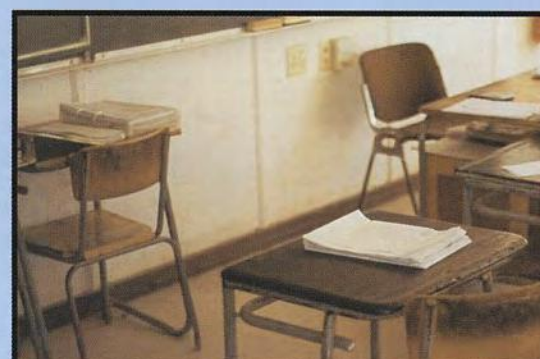

- The creation and revision of policies and procedures.

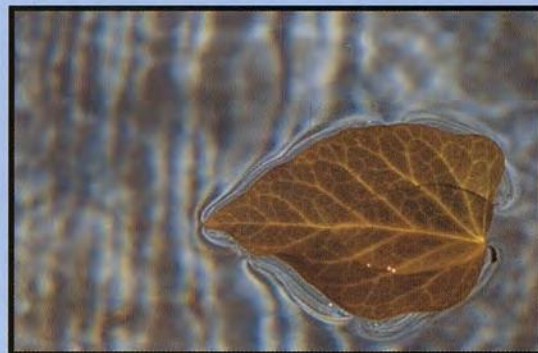

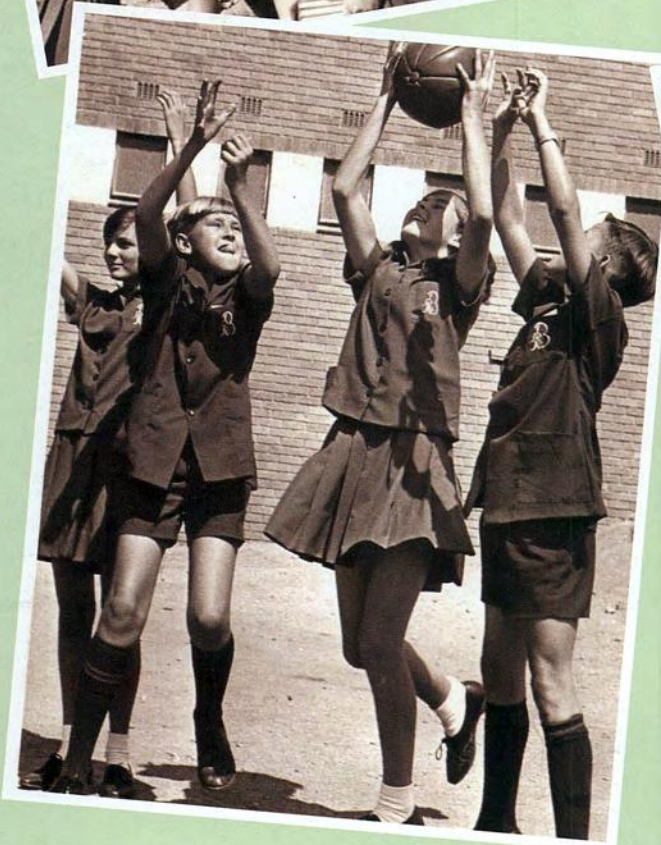
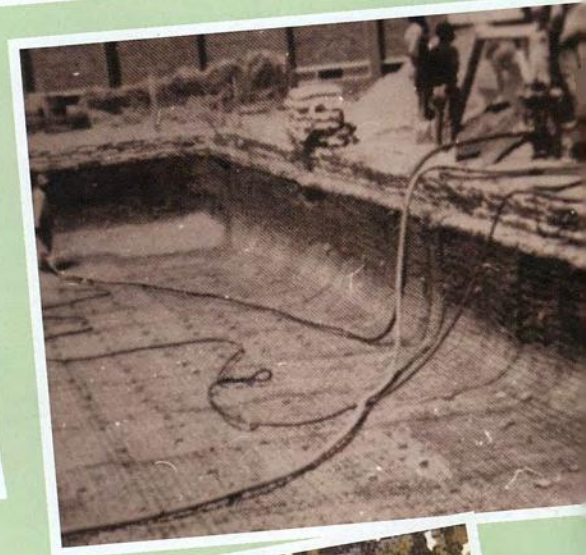
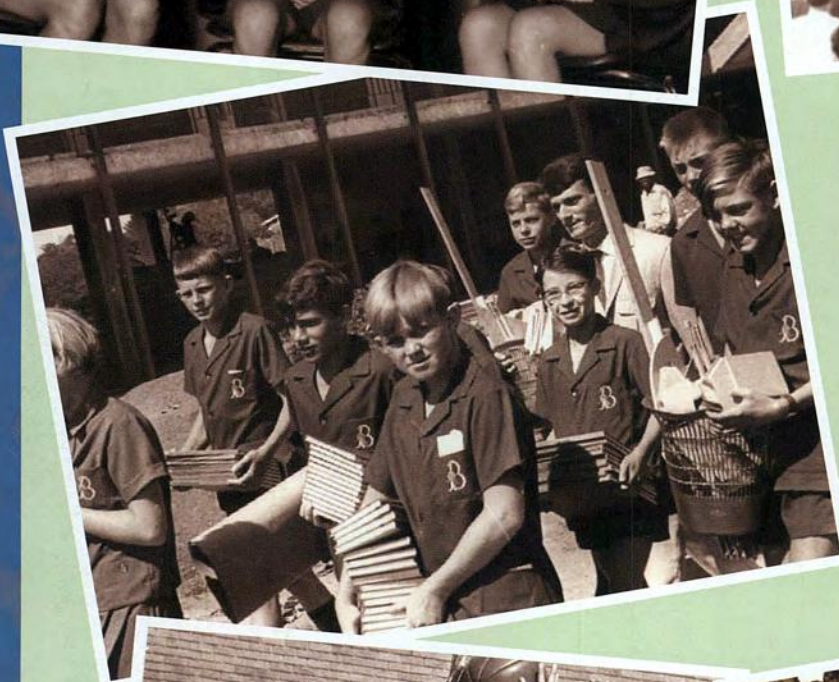
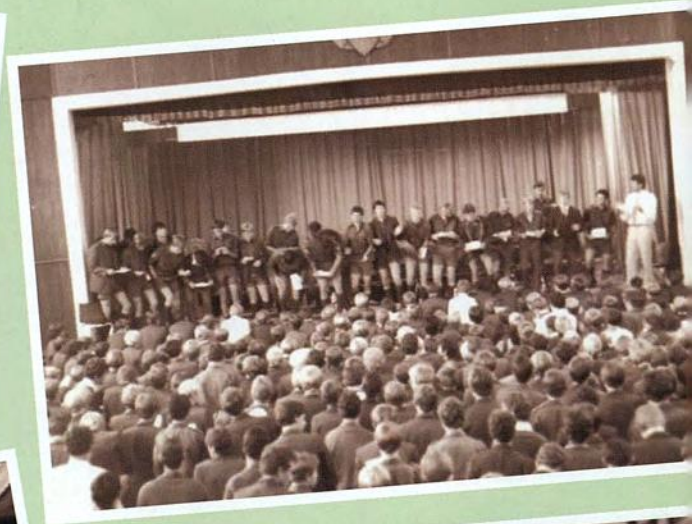
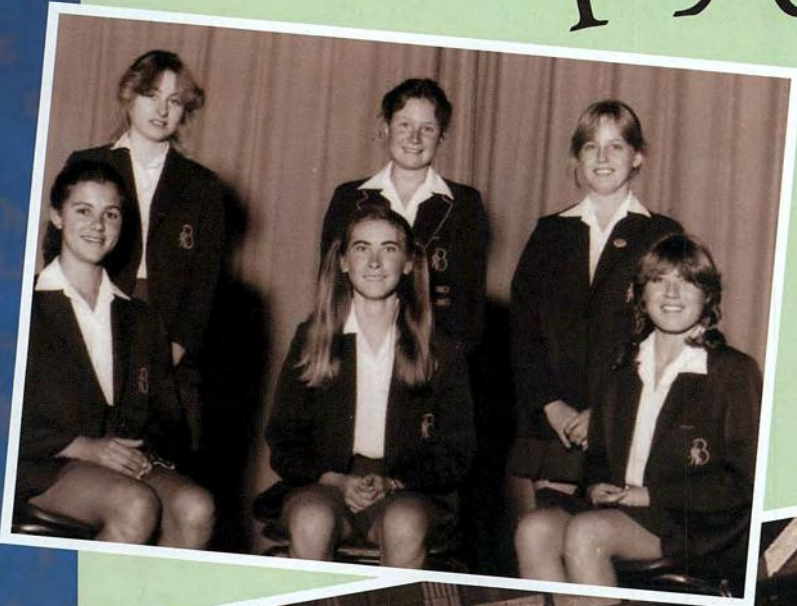
In conclusion, I must emphasise that even in these turbulent times, Bryanston High School will succeed and grow from strength to strength!

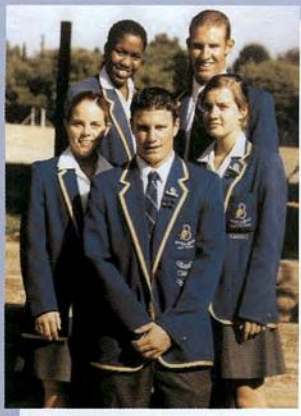
This year saw the successful integration of the conventional prefect body and the Representative Council of Learners. According to GDE policy, "authoritarian" institutions such as prefect bodies are to fall away and be replaced by an elected RCL. This has not affected Bryanston High School greatly, since the prefect body has traditionally been democratically elected.

Regular meetings were held, conducted by the President, Simon Maskell, after school on Mondays or during the Tuesday registration periods. Run according to a strict agenda, prepared beforehand, the meetings were focused and proved very fruitful, eliciting prompt response from the governing body, where suggestions relating to the school were concerned. The RCL is the voice of the pupil body and has been instrumental in facilitating developments in the school, from simple improvements to the school's facilities to decisions on uniform regulations and extra-curricular activities offered by the school.

The Executive, consisting of Emma Burrows, Cheska Liackman, Josephine Leepile and Sean Crommelin saw to the management of vital portfolios within the school, each with their own committee. In this way, the practice of leadership capabilities was encouraged throughout the rest of the school body, whereby other pupils, not elected onto the RCL, took charge of certain duties. Pupils in lower grades were also trained, as they worked on the various committees. This ensures experience and continuity in the school's leadership.

Part of the success of the RCL lies with Mrs Webb, who has spent the last few years developing the practical "mechanisms" of the integrated body, in order for its successful functioning. It is pleasing to note that Bryanston High has been approached by many other schools for the secret "recipe" for the successful functioning of a dynamic RCL.

Another factor ensuring the success of the RCL body is a clear understanding of leadership qualities and wisdom displayed in the pupil vote, since the vote rests solely with them. The voters were not disappointed this year. No one will forget the touching endorsement of the success of this year's leaders, in the standing ovation given to Simon by the entire school body at his farewell speech!

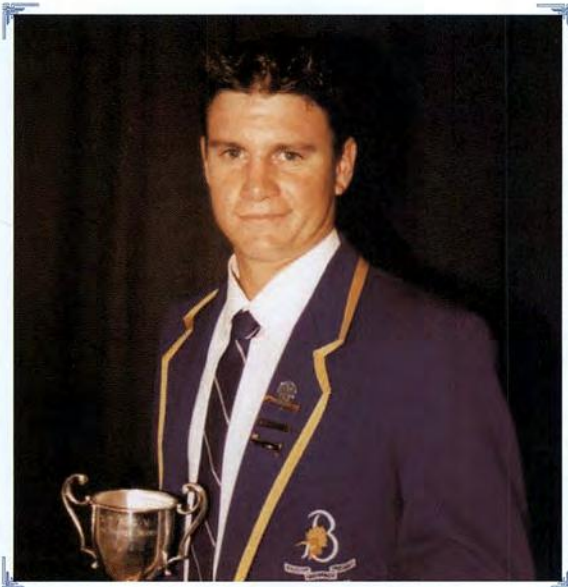

Bryanston High School, I am proud to have led this amazing school for the past 12 months. It has been an honour and privilege and I hope that I have lived up to your expectations.

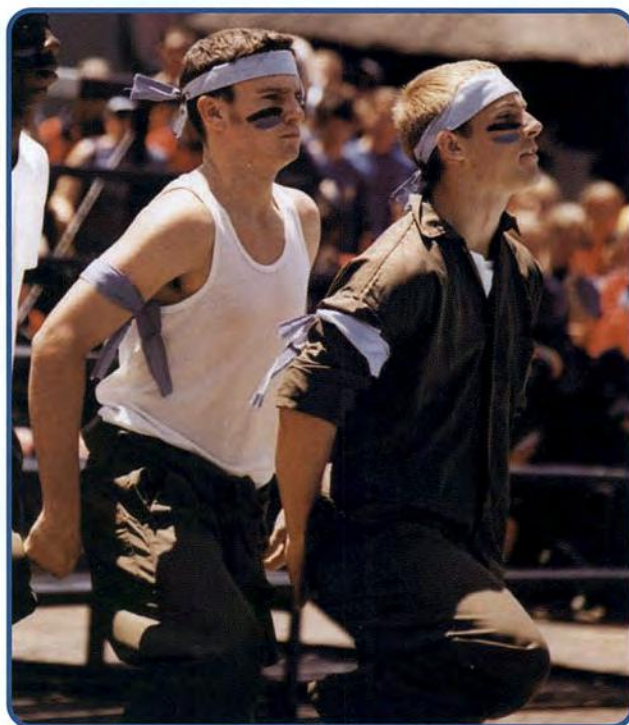

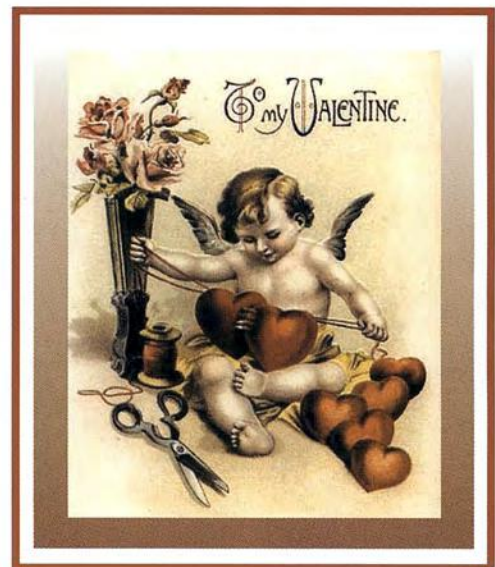
Valentines Ball

Comedy is never easy. That terrible thing called "timing" terrifies the best of actors. We have worked hard at playing lines in different ways to find fresh and fun



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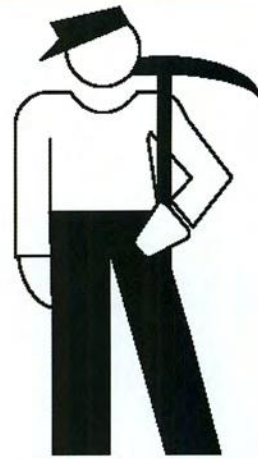

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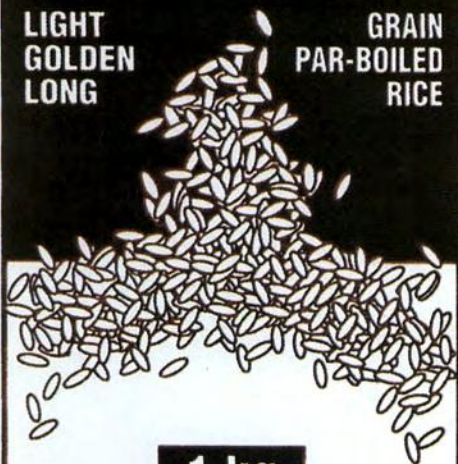
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
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Netball Team

Every year Sagewood School hosts a wonderful festival to keep the words and drama of Shakespeare alive.

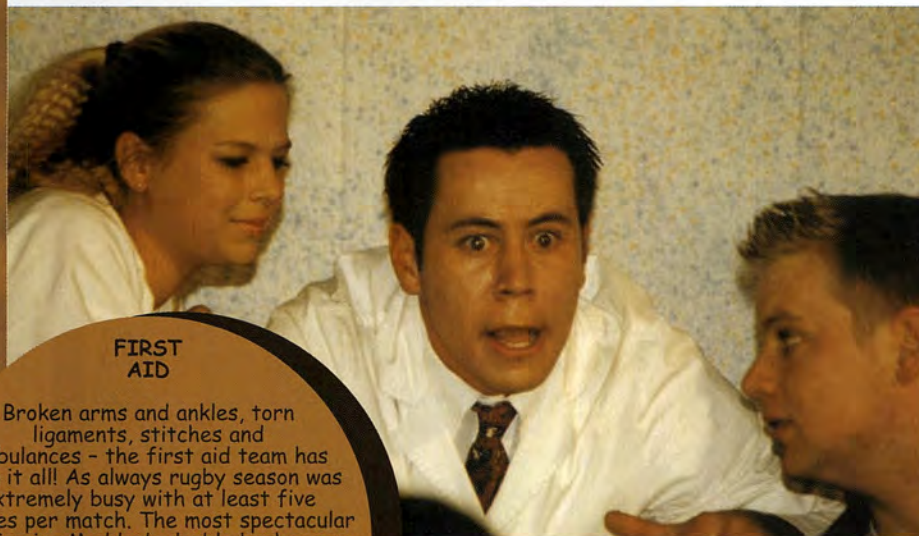
This year, we performed a "Celebration of Shakespeare's women", exploring all the various facets of this complex "species" through the words and works of William Shakespeare.

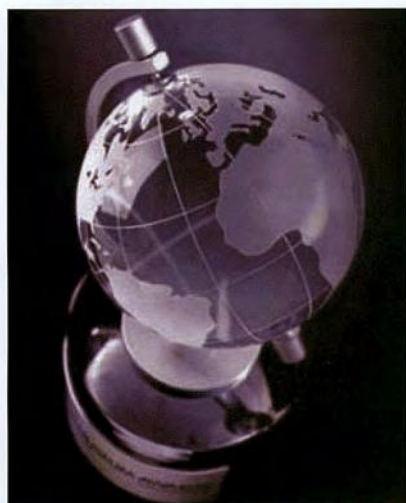
Grade 10 History Excursion
