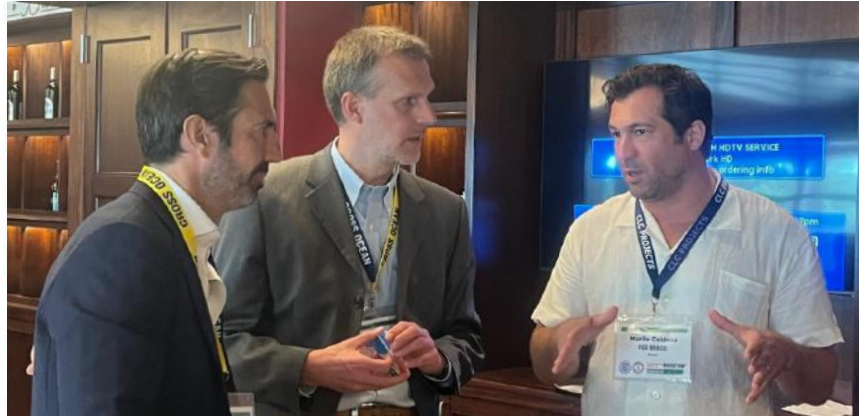

Total Movements Handled the End-to-end Logistics of 2 x 643 MT Coke Drums



The coke drums totalled over 10,200 FRT for one of the largest oil refinery in India.

Scope of work:

Road Transportation from Supplier's Factory to the nearest Jetty, Rolling-on the Drums onto the Barge, Barging to the port closest to the refinery site, inland delivery and placement to the Foundation. The operation required meticulous planning and coordination, given the massive dimensions and weight of the cargo.

Key highlights and challenges included:

1. End-to-end multimodal coordination, including marine and inland logistics
2. Operations carried out during foul weather and heavy monsoon rainfall, demanding strict safety controls
3. Navigating tide constraints at both ports
4. Securing Marine Warranty Surveyor (MWS) approvals for the sea voyage
5. Managing road transportation challenges due to poor infrastructure and ODC movement restrictions

Ulog Coordinated the Transport of Three 7.5m Cooling Vaults



The origin was Izmir (Turkey) with the final destination in Villa Constitución (Argentina)

The operation began in Izmir, where ULOG handled reception, loading on board, and the chartering of a breakbulk vessel.

In Antwerp, Ulog carried out a strategic transshipment: unloading, storage, and reloading onto a ro-ro vessel with breakbulk capability.

Finally, the cargo was discharged at Zárate and Ulog managed the overland transport to destination.

In Argentina, Ulog studied the route, arranged road permits, and coordinated escorts, ensuring a safe and on-time delivery without setbacks.

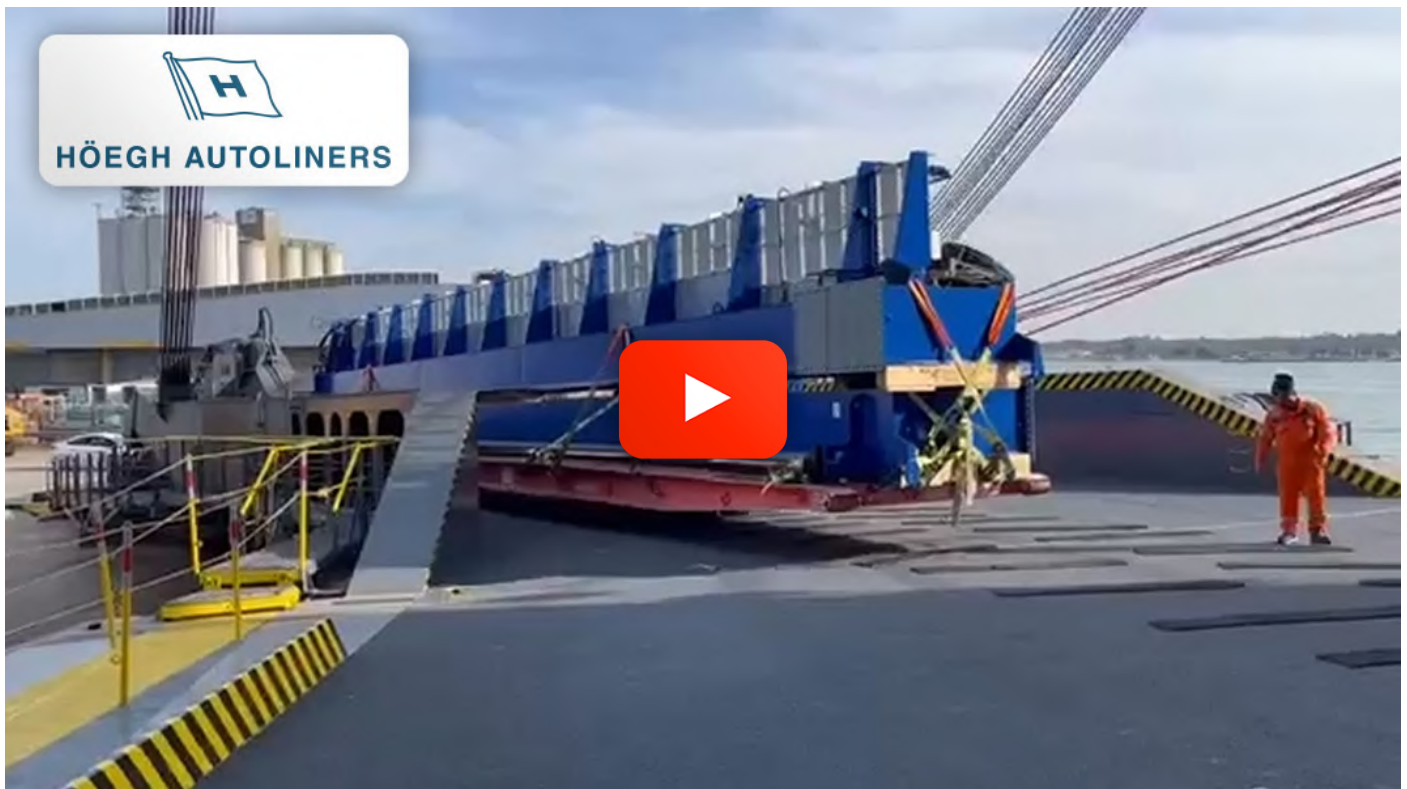

Liebherr Container Cranes with the Doyle Shipping Group Transported 2 Liebherr RTGs to Port Kembla, New South Wales via Höegh



The shipment, coordinated with logistics partners Höegh Autoliners and NEPTUMAR UK LIMITED covered staggering 17,500 nautical miles from the United Kingdom to Australia in under 50 days!

The cranes will be reassembled and deployed in the south-eastern region of Australia, where they will play a key role in distributing containers to the national rail network, improving freight efficiency and connectivity across the region.

MFC Extreme Moved a 10m High, 170mt Mooring Buoy & 24mt Anchors & 85mt Shackles



After receiving, storing, and consolidating cargoes at MFC JAFZA facility from various origin points the entire shipment, totalling a massive 1,072 metric tons, was moved in an overnight operation.

This colossal cargo was transported on SPMTs and a 37-trailer-long convoy.

Due to the complexities of this logistical move, MFC was granted special permissions to move the cargo, roads were temporarily closed and modifications were made to the route so that the move could be conducted in the shortest time.

The buoy and its accessories were then placed on the charter vessel, with all customs clearance formalities duly completed as per schedule.

Atlas Heavy Wins the Breakbulk Americas Project PowerAwards for 2025



The award was presented for the 2025 Power Move: Best Use of Equipment at the Breakbulk Americas event in Houston, Texas on October 2nd 2025. The project entailed the delivery of two of the largest storage tanks ever constructed on U.S. soil at the time. Each tank measured an astounding 164' 9" x 19' x 20' 2" and weighed 933,900 lbs, with a gross transport weight of over 1.25 million lbs. This project pushed the boundaries of engineering, coordination, and endurance, spanning thousands of miles across land and sea from the Port of Catoosa, Oklahoma, to Vandenberg Air Force Base, California via the Panama Canal.

Brasil Project is proud to be participating in the pioneering project of the Digital Urban Tram (BUD), which has just been inaugurated in Parana! Brasil Projects are responsible for the entire complex operation of importing the equipment, connecting Shanghai (China) to the Port of Paranagua (PR), ensuring that this innovative technology arrived safely and efficiently to the people of Parana. Parana is the first state in South America to test this transport solution, an electric vehicle that travels on a virtual rail through magnetic induction, combining the capacity of a tram with the flexibility of a bus. A real revolution in public transport! Brasil Projects were honored to see this project inaugurated in a special ceremony attended by Governor Ratinho Junior, marking the beginning of this testing phase that promises to transform travel in the Metropolitan Region of Curitiba.

Whisky to Hokkaido! COLI Transports Distilling Equipment from Antwerp to Tomakomai, Japan



Discharge delivery in full swing After the successful ocean transport from Antwerp to Tomakomai, Japan, the next phase of the brewery equipment logistics project is now well underway. Following discharge at the Port of Tomakomai, the first cargo units were carefully stored for two weeks to complete customs clearance. Since this week, local transports have commenced both by day and night ensuring the smooth onward delivery to the distillery site. This shipment involved: - 43 pieces of whisky distillery equipment - 170 tonnes 3,000 cbm of cargo - Complex truckbargevessel coordination - Night convoys and just-in-time handling.
