We've been busy [welcoming our 2024–25 UOTeach cohort](#) over the summer months. UOTeach is a highly focused one-year teacher licensure program for elementary multiple subjects and middle-high school education subject areas. UO Teacher Candidates, alongside their coursework, are placed directly in a learning community with an experienced practicing professional beginning the year as an active observer and progressing to take on instructional responsibilities.

The tuition cost to attend the UOTeach program as an Oregon resident is over \$33,000! Scholarship support is key to making sure these students receive the support when they need it most. Thanks to donations to our College of Education scholarships, 30 UOTeach students received an average of \$8,275 this year to support their academic goals!
