PRESHOW

The Northern Arts and Cultural Centre showcases local performers in the lobby for an hour before each NACC presentation. You can find out about these preshows on our website, on the event page, under preshow information. Our doors open one hour before the show. This provides a great opportunity to meet up and take in the ambiance of our lovely atrium. During this time the concession is open, the local art exhibit is on display, and the lobby is set up with tables and chairs to allow patrons to watch in comfort.

MONTHLY ART EXHIBIT

Every month, NACC showcases the work of a different local artist with an exhibit on display in the lobby during our presentations. You can find artists' profiles and examples of their work on the home page of the NACC website. And you can buy artwork from our box office, with the majority of the proceeds going to the exhibiting artist. The artwork becomes available for pick-up at the end of the month, when that artist's exhibition is over. As well, we will have one exhibit a year for emerging talent.

NACC CANDLE ICE CAFÉ

Our concession offers a wide selection of snacks and beverages, including beer and wine. You can purchase a reusable NACC cup sponsored by NWT Brewing Company and bring wine or beer with you into the theatre to enjoy during the performance.

ETIQUETTE

PIQSIQ

(PRONOUNCED "PILK-SILK")

With a style perpetually galvanized by darkness and haunting northern beauty, sisters Tiffany Ayalik and Inuksuk Mackay come together to create an Inuit-style throat singing duo, PIQSIQ. Performing ancient traditional songs and eerie new compositions, they leave their listeners enthralled with the infinity of possible answers to the question "what is the meaning of life?"

With roots in Nunavut's Kitikmeot and Kivalliq, the sisters grew up in Yellowknife, Northwest Territories. Their love of katajjaq, Inuit throat singing, began in childhood and has bonded them throughout their lives. After years of forging this hard-won skill, they developed their own form blended with their love of haunting melodies and otherworldly sounds.

As PIQSIQ, they perform improvisational looping live, creating a dynamic audience experience that changes with every show. PIQSIQ incorporates their dark and ethereal style into their recordings and have produced four studio albums to date. Inuksuk and Tiffany continue to blend magic with sound to further develop their entrancing style for both national and international audiences.

A CREE TAKEOVER | BY RENELTTA ARLUK
INSPIRED BY THE YOUTH OF FROG LAKE FIRST NATION

CO-PRODUCTION WITH AKPIK THEATRE

The groundbreaking Pawâkan Macbeth is Indigenous playwright, Reneltta Arluk's reimagining of Shakespeare's darkest play into Cree history, legend and cosmology. Set in Plains Cree territory in the 1870s, before the establishment of First Nations reserves, Pawâkan Macbeth takes place in a time when First Nations warred with each other and the Canadian Government over territory, food supply and trade. Harsh environments brought immense fear, starvation, and uncertainty together to awaken the darkest of Cree spirits, the Wihtiko – an evil being with an insatiable appetite for human flesh.

Inspired from stories shared by Indigenous Elders in Frog Lake First Nation following protocol, Arluk has created a new,

visceral experience of Macbeth; a convergence of Shakespeare's language, modern English, and Cree. As historical wars are waged with the Cree and Nakoda against the Blackfoot, Macikosisân (Macbeth), a great Okihcitâw (warrior), becomes consumed by the cannibal spirit Wihtiko. He plots with Kâwanihot Iskwew (Lady Macbeth), to kill their Chief, Okimâw Wîpâstim (Duncan). Pawâkan Macbeth is a terrifying journey through love, greed, honor and betrayal, with trickster beings that lie like truth.



TRIO MEDIAEVAL

GRAMMY-NOMINATED GUESTS FROM NORWAY

ANNA MARIA FRIMAN / LINN ANDREA FUGLSETH / JORUNN LOVISE HUSAN

The crystalline voices of Trio Mediaeval have captivated audiences since the group was founded in Oslo in 1997. The Grammy-nominated trio's core repertoire features sacred monophonic and polyphonic medieval music from England, Italy and France; contemporary works written for the ensemble; and traditional Norwegian, Swedish and Icelandic ballads and songs. The group's fruitful relationship with the legendary ECM Records, collaborative spirit, and busy touring schedule has earned them worldwide renown.

Trio Mediaeval's first of eight albums on ECM
Records, Words of the Angel, landed on Billboard's
Top 10 and was a Stereophile "Recording of the Month."
Further releases on ECM followed in 2004 with Soir, dit-elle
and in 2005 with Stella Maris. The first three recordings,
produced by John Potter, consisted of medieval and
contemporary works. In 2007, the trio teamed with the
Norwegian percussionist Birger Mistereggen on a recording
of Norwegian ballads and songs entitled Folk Songs,
produced by Manfred Eicher. Folk Songs was nominated
for the Norwegian Spellemannprisen and for a Grammy

Award for "Best Chamber Music Performance." A Worcester Ladymass (2011) was also on Billboard's Top 10 list, and was selected by the German Record Critic's Award as one of the best new releases in the "Early Music" category. The trio's Aquilonis was named a "Top Music Recording of 2014" by the New York Times. In 2017, Trio Mediaeval and jazz trumpeter Arve Henriksen released Rímur — medieval and folk music from Iceland, Sweden and Norway. In 2020 Trio Mediaeval produced the album Solacium on the Norwegian label 2L, with Grammy-winning Morten Lindberg as producer/engineer. In 2023, 2L releases Trio Mediaeval's latest recording, An Old Hall Ladymass.

Since 2006, the trio has embarked on a number of collaborative projects with Norwegian jazz/ improvisational musicians. These collaborations have led to concerts and radio broadcasts at the Bergen Festival (where the trio was Artist-in-Residence in 2007), Molde Jazz Festival, Wigmore Hall, West Cork Music Festival, as well as performances in Norway, Holland, Italy and Germany.

TRIO MEDIAEVAL

"Singing doesn't get more unnervingly beautiful," wrote Joshua Kosman of the San Francisco Chronicle, who declared their San Francisco debut "among the musical highlights of the year." He added, "To hear the group's note-perfect counterpoint - as pristine and inviting as clean, white linens - is to be astonished at what the human voice is capable of."

Performance Director & Storyteller

Maggie Mercredi is Denesoline from Gani Koe' and is a member of the Kai Taile' Dene First Nation.

With a vivid imagination since childhood, she could visualize the stories heard around her, understanding them, then re-sharing them in her own way. She was introduced to the performing arts as a young adult, inspiring her to learn more about theatre. She joined various performance groups, became a cofounder of an Indigenous theatre group in the North, graduated from the Centre for Indigenous Theatre in Toronto, and completed storytelling and music residencies at the Banff Centre for the Arts. With the skills and knowledge gained, she has written, directed, and produced for many venues. She has also

coached groups in theatre and performance skills training. Maggie is honoured and excited with the opportunity to write alongside other artists in bringing alive the stories we carry from our language, our ancestors, our parents, our family, friends and communities for the future generations to enjoy, long after we are gone.

David Gon is Tlicho. He was born in Yellowknife and raised in the bush with the traditional way of life. He then moved to Behchoko to start school. He grew up listening to the beat of the drum and watched people dance to the rhythm. He taught himself how to play when he was 12 years old, on a guitar his father bought him. David later formed a band called 'Captain Eddy'. David has written his own songs and recorded albums of original music. His music is the expression of the value of the old ways as well as the new, using the traditional Dene drum, reflecting early influences and admiration of the wisdom, stories and songs of the land, his ancestors, the Elders and the hopes and dreams of the young people. David has performed at Expo 86 in

CASSANDRA BLONDIN BURT Storyteller

Cassandra (River) Blondin Burt is a two-spirit Dene Poet, Artist, and Earth Medicine Maker. Their work is grounded in the exploration of healing through cocreation with earth and story. Cassandra believes that the radical act of being inrelation to our other-than-human-relations is an act of political and personal rebellion, and a pathway for collective and personal transformation and healing.

SKYE CONSORT & EMMA BJÖRLING

A CELTIC TREAT

Skye Consort & Emma Björling perform trans-Atlantic arrangements of songs and tunes from Sweden, Norway, Ireland, Scotland, England, Québec, Acadia, the USA, as well as original compositions. Each musician brings their own individual interpretation to these traditions to create this extraordinary collaboration, consisting of voices, fiddle, nyckelharpa, cello, bouzouki, banjo, and percussion. Collectively, the band present an assortment of whirling polskas, groovy reels, passionate love songs, breathtaking hymns, and original compositions.

All with the group are seasoned instructors eager to share their knowledge and love for their musical traditions.



Emma Björling (lead voice, shruti box, percussion) is an award-winning Swedish singer, composer, arranger, active in the renowned Scandinavian bands Kongero and Lyy. Both bands have toured the world, and are busy in the European folk-trad scene. Emma regularly teaches and conducts workshops all over the world.

Alex Kehler (fiddle, nyckelharpa, vocals) In addition to his work with Skye Consort, he is a member of La Nef, Soulwood, Kehler Williams duo, Les Siffleurs de Nuits, and Triton.

Amanda Keesmaat (cello, vocals) Principal cellist of Arion Baroque orchestra, Amanda Keesmaat has also performed with Les Charbonniers de L'Enfer, OktoEcho, Jean-François Bélanger and Projet ClaireObscur..

Seán Dagher (cittern/bouzouki, banjo & vocals) is the artistic director of La Nef and an active performer, arranger, and composer of music from various folk and classical music traditions. He won the OPUS "Creation of the Year" award in 2014 for Sea Songs and has been nominated for numerous Adisq awards.

SKYE CONSORT has been accompanying singers since 2000 and has recorded 5 CDs with singers such as Matthew White, Shannon Mercer, and Michael Slattery on the ATMA, ANALEKTA, and OMBÜ record labels.



SEÁN DAGHER is widely known for his recordings with the Assassin's Creed video game series, including Black Flag. His renditions of sea shanties and other songs from the games have been streamed some 70 million times. His own Shanty of the Week video series receives thousands of views each week, and has a loyal following the world over.



NORDTING - The Northern Assembly

- a nomadic people's parliament of the North

- a separatist movement for the Arctic.

NORDTING is an enthusiastic and challenging mix of political rally, gala show and power point lecture. Staged as a peoples' assembly, the ambition is to investigate questions concerning power, identity, art and economy in a local, northern context. NORDTING addresses everything from global issues around geopolitics, climate change and capitalism, to very local issues from the place the assembly is held. Everything is adjusted for each new location there is local history, local guests and local issues put up for vote.

Since the beginning in 2014, NORDTING has arranged peoples' assemblies all over the Arctic, from Alaska to Greenland, from Iceland to Norway. Thousands of people have made their voices heard. Assemblies have voted yes or no to oil drilling, fish farming, mining, independence for the North, new street names, new airline routes, new national days and taxation of the rich.







NORDTING

There has been lottery, cheering, praying, flagging, singing, chanting, moving, voting and thinking around what it means to be an Arctic inhabitant.

The point of departure for NORDTING is the North, but the issues addressed - of power, economy, local identity, ownership to resources, separatism and populism - are very much global and common for us all.

NORDTING is a staged performance that deals with identity and power structures of the North, NORDTING comes all the way from the other side of the Arctic, from the North of Norway, with an amazing, thought provoking and humorous cocktail of gala show, powerpoint lecture and community meeting.

MOZONGI

DANCE COMPANY: NYATA-NYATA

Mozongi (Return) is a piece about time, and more precisely, about the physics of time. The step is weight and weight is time. Not repetition, but persistence. The structure of Mozongi thus unfolds through the contrasts of movement and of immobility, of the one and of the many, in order to give shape to a primordial conflict - that of time which consumes space.

For more than three decades, Zab Maboungou/Compagnie Danse Nyata-Nyata has traced the trajectories of a revised and corrected contemporaneity. Zab Maboungou assumes the general and artistic direction of the company, founded in 1987. As its choreographer, and through her renewed art of rhythms and vibrant space, he creates works with powerful gestures that stage the bodies of committed artists of dance and music, both active and meditative, who transform our relationship to time and life.







Founder of the renowned Zab Maboungou/Compagnie Danse Nyata Nyata, artist-choreographer and performer, professor of philosophy and author, Zab Maboungou has distinguished herself on all fronts

of artistic and cultural action. Her contribution, remarkably, unites and transcends identities and genres, without ever diluting the knowledge and practices it has, with a consistency that has never been denied. She

has innovated and developed with a view to proposing a living art, that is to say an art which goes beyond stories and communities, and wants to stage beings and their time.


INTERNATIONAL GUESTS FROM DENMARK

About taking, creating, and giving space, and preferably remembering to do so before falling on your ass where the bench ends.

Uppercut Danseteater is a diverse and international dance company that was founded in 1982 by Cher Geurtze and Ann Crooset as one of the first modern companies in Denmark

BENCHED is a classic Uppercut Danseteater piece, in the way that the individual dancers' background, stories and strengths both as persons and performers, are brought

to the stage. With a starting point in the dance genres they have trained in - such as break, contemporary dance, street dance genres and capoeira - BENCHED fuses the many languages of dance into a dynamic physical performance that encompasses all of life's emotions: Joy, anger, confusion, humor, love, compassion, frustration... the list goes on.


NORMAN GLOWACH AS

JOHNNY COLE

CELEBRATING HIS METIS ROOTS

For fifty years, Norman Glowach has been playing music in Yellowknife. He started playing the drums, but he also sings and plays guitar. Growing up in Yellowknife, Norm has been fortunate to play many styles of music. At an early age he played in school bands and stage bands. Professionally, he's played old time music, fiddle music, country music, rock & roll, jazz and blues. These musical experiences all come out in the music he writes and records. He has run his studio, Spiritwalker Productions, for over 30 years in downtown Yellowknife. Norm credits the driving force behind his

persona Johnny Cole and the musical Meet Me at the Rex to be the pictures and stories of his family's history. Norman started Meet Me at the Rex eleven years ago when he began searching for ancestors on his mother's side. At that time, he was working at the NWT Archives. This gave him the understanding of how to access data from the various levels of archives in Canada. As information and images came forward about his ancestors, songs started to come to him. At that point he didn't have the idea of creating a production containing these songs - he was just trying to understand his roots. He began to understand his ancestors' role in the development of Canada. In his search, Norm was able to find French and Irish roots in the Red River Colony who mixed with Indigenous peoples, creating the Métis who populated Western Canada. As the show was coming together, long-time friends came forward to give him direction. One friend told him the roots he was writing about had a common theme: a story that was similar to that of many other Métis in our country. This gave focus to the project and has been a theme in shaping this show. Norm's family roots run deep in Canada. Over the years, the branches



stretched to Yellowknife. The production is called Meet Me at the Rex as an homage to Norman's grandparents, who were the owners of this popular cafe from 1941 -1966. The Rex was a meeting place and home to many stories of how his family came to Yellowknife. He chose the 1950's time period to tell the story as this was an important era for the Café. Norm has said, "At times I've felt like my ancestors were guiding me in the writing of the songs, the searching for information and are present during the live productions". A thrilling, engaging, educational, and intergenerational outreach program in Dettah and Ndilo, Northwest Territories

The XR Connection: NACC's Performance/Motion Capture Workshop Series was an initiative in partnership with Dech_ita Nàowo that engaged youth from Dettah and Ndilo through storytelling, virtual reality, and animation. The workshops allowed participants to develop a story, characters, and scripts, which were turned into two immersive storytelling

experiences: Sedeè & Dechita, Zoo & Nodi

The workshops were structured in a way that:

- The Elders presented stories and advised the Youths about what it was like in the time that the Youths' stories were set.
- The Youths developed their own story and scripts. They then performed the actions of the 3D characters in

the story using Motion Capture (MOCAP) Suits.



• Professional artists were involved along the way to ensure the quality and completion of the projects.


