

Business rates

Required to register your business premises for business rates (also called nondomestic rates). Visit our webpage to register your Business Rates online.



Planning permission

This may be required for any change of use of the property, physical changes to the property, installation of some types of signage for the property (company logo, names, etc). We recommend you consult with landlord first if premises are leased.



Trading Standards

Trading Standards support and encourage businesses by providing advice and information to help businesses comply with the law. This includes product safety, intellectual property, fair trading e.g. product description, age restricted goods, animal welfare, and more.

Licensing
