Council has revised its Place Naming Policy and invites you to comment on the draft.


Council often receives requests for naming of streets, parks, reserves, facilities, and plaques. The policy helps Council make decisions about requests.



ome of you long time Winchelsea residents may remember Dave Williams from days gone bye when, he, Ricky Campbell, and I ran a used car business on Willis St. where the Winchelsea Veterinary Hospital operates now. After we sold the property Dave moved to Tassie to be with his daughters who lived in Hobart.

Dave's brother-in-law, Donny, died recently from cancer and it was decided to have a commemorative wake a couple of Sundays ago at Chelsea Yacht Club. (We were all yachts' people and Donny was a boat builder).

We all had a great time and Donny was farewelled in a suitable manner.

I contacted Dave to let him know that I had covid. He informed me that a large number of people at the Wake had been infected, including him and his family.


Why hadn't I had the vaccine? Well it was just on 6 months since I had the previous jab and I was booked in for the next but it hadn't happened.



New research from National Seniors Australia and Challenger reveals 80% of older people are feeling the impact of higher living costs. The number 'severely' impacted is expected to rise over the next 12 months.

The National Seniors Social Survey (NSSS) of 5,700 people aged 50 and over also asked people about their concerns around cost-of-living increases.

The results show 90% of survey respondents are 'concerned' about keeping up with rising living costs, with one quarter 'extremely concerned'.

Health costs, energy prices and groceries are the three top worries. Housing affordability is also a concern, particularly in the long term.

Severe cost-of-living impacts are felt across all income levels and age groups. However, certain types of older people are hit hardest:

- · renters
- · low-income households
- people in their 50s
- larger households (3+ people)
- people in rural and remote areas

National Seniors Australia Chief Advocate Ian Henschke said the survey results confirm what we have long suspected, "If you're an older person renting or on a low income, you're more likely to be hit hard by rising living costs."

"Older people in rural and remote areas, those in larger households (3+) and people in their 50s are more likely to be struggling."

The findings reinforce National Seniors' federal budget call to index the Age Pension quarterly during times of high inflation. "The Age Pension is adjusted twice a year in March and September. Rather than have pensioners wait six months, government should increase payments quarterly when inflation is high," Mr Henschke said.

"Another key measure would be to exempt work income from the income test for all government payments, so recipients can work more without penalty. Simply let people work, pay tax, and get Centrelink out of the way.

### Winchelsea RSL: ANZAC Day

Inchelsea RSL is pleased to announce Tuesday, April 25th ANZAC Day 2023 at the Eastern Reserve 10.30 am. All welcome, flowers and wreaths can be placed during the ceremony. Join the RSL for morning tea after the service.

This is an important part of life in Winchelsea, we commemorate the sacrifice and remember the service of so many from all walks of life. The promise of the young who went, many buried on foreign soil, never to come home to our shores again. This is why we take the time out of our busy lives to remember and pay tribute.



The story we thought this year to retell is of two brothers, they were close in age and came from our tight community. The reason these tragedies affect the whole town is the close ties of relationships and neighborhood. A small country town is a microcosm of Australia and how these issues were highlighted nationwide.

#### **Bernard Michael ALSOP**

Bernard, sometimes known as "Barney" or "Bern" was born at Winchelsea on the 25th of January,1896, the eighth child of the fourteen children of George and Ann Helena Alsop nee Wright. He was born when the family lived at "Fairview Villa" in Austin Street Winchelsea. He attended the Winchelsea State School and later worked as a boundary rider on "Wormbete Station" on the Deans Marsh Road. On the 29.07.1915 he took the





initial medical at Winchelsea with Dr. Eddie, the local doctor.

Enlisting in Melbourne on the 04.08.1916 he trained at Geelong, embarking on the "Port Melbourne" on the 21.10.1916, arriving in England on the 28.12.1916. Training with the 4th Division Machine Gun Company. On the 07.09.1917 he proceeded to France. Barney and his brother Frederick transferred to be together in the same company. He was with his brother, when Frederick was killed in action on the 17.10.1917 on the Western Front. He returned to Australia on the "Miltiades", disembarking in Melbourne on the 05.09.1919 and was discharged on the 13.09.1919. On returning to civilian life, he went to work at Bourke Street, Myer, Melbourne as an apprentice hairdresser. He married Hilma Mathison in 1924 and opened his own hairdressing business in Oakleigh. Bernard and Hilma had four children, two sons and two daughters. He died in Melbourne on the 16.02.1976 and is buried at Bulla Cemetery, Melbourne.

#### Frederick Benedict ALSOP

Frederick who was called "Ted" was born at Winchelsea on the 15th of February 1897, the nineth child of the fourteen children of George Bernard and Ann Helena Alsop nee Wright. The family lived at "Fairview Villa" in Austin Street, Winchelsea. Ted attended Winchelsea State School, he then went to work in Geelong. He enlisted at Winchelsea on 08.07.1916 and had his medical with Dr.

Eddie, he had to produce a letter from his parents giving him permission to enlist.

Attached to the 2nd Machine Gun Company. He embarked on the "Port Lincoln" on the 20.10.1916, arriving in England on the 28.12.1916 then on France on the 07.09.1917. Just over a month later. Ted was killed in action holding the line, on the 17.10.1917 by shell fire at Passchendaele Ridge on the Western Front. When news of his death reached Winchelsea the flags at the Shire Office in the Main Street flew at half-mast. His brother Bernard who was with him when he died and was affected very badly by his death. In 1921, his mother requested a photo of Ted's grave, but the Army could still not find it in 1923. He is commemorated at Ypres Cemetery Menin Gate Memorial, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium – grave reference panel 31.

## The Climate Report

#### **Judy Cameron**

### What is the main goal of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC)?

The IPCC was created to provide policymakers with regular scientific assessments on climate change, its implications and potential future risks, as well as to put forward adaptation and mitigation options. Through its assessments, the IPCC determines the state of knowledge on climate change.

#### Why can the IPCC be trusted?

Key to the IPCC's credibility is the fact that this is a science-driven process and the rigorous peer-review process ensures its reports cannot be politically motivated. Essentially the IPCC's reports provide the science that governments can use to guide and justify their own climate action.

#### Is Australia part of the IPCC?

**Monty Python** 

The IPCC appointed more than 700 experts from 90 countries to develop the Sixth Assessment Report. Australia is well represented in the author teams, with 40 Australian experts invited to participate. Australian experts are also invited to review draft reports.





### What are the conclusions of the IPCC Sixth Assessment Report?

The report outlines that climate changes will increase in all regions of the globe over the coming decades and that even with 1.5°C of global warming, there will be increasing heat waves, longer warm seasons, and shorter cold seasons – which will become more intense at 2°C of warming.

The report finds that every tenth of a degree of additional warming will escalate threats to people, species and ecosystems. Even limiting global warming to 1.5 degrees C— a global target in the Paris Climate Agreement — is not safe for all.

### What are the 5 main effects of climate change?

- Hotter temperatures. As greenhouse gas concentrations rise, so does the global surface temperature. ...
- · More severe storms. ...
- · Increased drought. ...
- A warming, rising ocean. ...
- · Loss of species. ...
- · Not enough food. ...
- · More health risks. ...
- · Poverty and displacement.



#### **Chief Health Officer Update**

here were 5,772 COVID-19 cases reported in Victoria this week, an increase of 11 per cent on the previous week.

#### Steps to protect yourself and others

With increasing cases and hospitalisations, now is an important time to take steps to help reduce transmission and the impact on the health system. Now is the perfect time to get your 2023 booster vaccine if you're eligible.

Protecting yourself from getting infected is the best way to protect yourself and the community. If you don't get Covid, you can't spread Covid.

These six steps can help you stay ahead of Covid:

- Wear a mask: a high-quality and well-fitted mask can protect you and others from the virus
- Get your 2023 booster: new bivalent vaccines targeting Omicron variants

are available at your GP or local pharmacy. To find out if you're eligible for your next booster, visit the Coronavirus website

- Let fresh air in: open windows and doors when you can, it reduces the spread of the virus
- 4. Get tested: if you have symptoms, take a rapid antigen test
- Stay at home: if you have Covid, you should stay at home for at least five days and until you have no symptoms
- Talk to your doctor: if you are at risk of falling very sick, you may be eligible for COVID medicines

#### 2023 boosters

Eligible Victorians who have not had a Covid vaccination or confirmed infection in the past six months can now receive their 2023 booster. This is irrespective of how many prior doses a person has received. The national eligibility change follows advice from ATAGI. Vaccination continues to provide the best protection

against becoming severely unwell or dying from COVID-19.

For those not infected or vaccinated in the past six months, a 2023 booster is recommended for:

- · All adults aged 65 years and over
- Adults 18-64 years who have medical comorbidities or disability with significant or complex health needs

For those not infected or vaccinated in the past six months, a 2023 booster should be considered for:

- Adults 18-64 with no risk factors for severe Covid
- Children and adolescents aged 5-17 who have medical comorbidities or disability with significant or complex health needs

Victorians are encouraged to book a free booster appointment through their local GP or pharmacy. You can find your nearest vaccination provider through the Vaccine Clinic Finder.



Council offers three-year-old and four-year-old programs, which are free thanks to Victorian Government funding.

Council-operated kindergartens are Anglesea Kindergarten, Helen M Kininmonth Pre-School Winchelsea, Jan Juc Pre-School, Kurrambee Myaring Kindergarten in Torquay, Lorne Kindergarten and Torquay Kindergarten.

Kurrambee Myaring Kindergarten's Anni O'Brien teaches three-year-old and four-year-old programs.

"There are so many benefits for a child to attend three-year-old kinder," she said. "It's their first start in developing a love of learning, which they'll carry with them for life. It also supports them to be able to build connections and to be OK saying goodbye to their families."

#### Good prospects for Easter gold hunt

t's a great time to get out and search for gold on the back of recent discoveries across western Victoria. Last month a prospector using a metal detector discovered a 4.6kg nugget in Victoria's Golden Triangle in the state' west. The find is valued at around \$240,000. A gold nugget worth about \$200,000 was also discovered in the same area in 2019.

In Victoria, hobby gold hunters must

possess a miner's right, allowing them to keep any gold they find. There are over 76,000 active miner's rights in Victoria and the rush to get involved shows no sign of slowing with almost 4,000 purchased in during 2023. A miner's right can be purchased for \$26 from Services Victoria.

With more Victorians hunting for gold, it's important that prospectors are doing the right thing, keeping safe and protecting the environment.

It is important prospectors understand the access requirements of their preferred location, keep up to date on weather forecasts and are aware of local road conditions.

They should always tell someone where they are going, when they will return and should always be beware of any old mine shafts in the area.

Fossicking and recreational prospecting is permitted in state forests and in designated areas of some national, state, historic and heritage parks. The use of mechanical equipment or explosives is not allowed, vegetation and Aboriginal objects must not be removed or damaged.

## Why do i see and smell smoke?

With fire restrictions easing in some parts of the State, and calm autumn conditions, hundreds of private resident burn-offs, agricultural burns and planned burns are expected to take place over the coming weeks.

While current conditions are ideal for burning, weather patterns may cause smoke to linger over parts of the state overnight and through to early morning.







FFMVic Chief Fire Officer Chris Hardman said our climate is changing and that means finding the right days for safe and effective planned burning is also changing. Planned burns are a critical part of a statewide bushfire risk management program.

"Reducing fine fuels such as grass, leaves, bark, shrubs and fallen branches means fires are less intense and slower to spread, making it more likely that firefighters can keep bushfires small and contained before they pose a risk to communities.

"We must go ahead with the planned burning program while conditions are suitable, and it is safe to do so to avoid an increased fire risk in the future.

"Smoke could be a result of private resident burn-offs, planned burns and agricultural burns. "Victorians can also sign up for planned burn notifications to prepare for any impact on their health or activities."

CFA Chief Officer Jason Heffernan urged Victorians to conduct private burn-offs safely.

"While the Fire Danger Period has ended in some areas, it is still important that residents check the local conditions are safe and appropriate for burning off – both on the day and the days following," he said.

"We ask the community to register their burn-off as this ensures if someone reports smoke, the incident can be monitored and acknowledged early.

"If possible, landowners should also notify their neighbours and others nearby who may be sensitive to smoke."





## Dogs seized from alleged illegal breeder near Geelong

SPCA's Major Investigations Team has just concluded a second law enforcement operation in under a week after receiving a new confidential tip-off from the community.

Inspectors attended a rural property near Geelong on Thursday and seized six dogs for animal welfare concerns under a Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 1986 warrant.

The warrant was executed as part of an investigation into an alleged illegal puppy breeding operation with serious animal welfare concerns.

The animals were found in unsanitary, unsafe conditions and required medical attention upon arriving at RSPCA Victoria's vet clinic. Charges have not yet been laid while investigations are ongoing.

RSPCA Victoria Inspectorate Team Leader – Major Investigations, Lisa Calleja, said "The welfare of these animals was very poor when we found them, and we are now caring for them while we investigate further."

"The reports and tip-offs provided by members of the public to RSPCA Victoria are sources of vital information that are crucial in assisting our investigations into alleged animal welfare offences.

In Victoria, dogs and cats must be sold from a registered domestic animal business, a private residence, or a place where an animal sale permit is in place.

It is an offence under the Domestic Animals Act 1994 to sell animals in public places such as parks, roadsides, and car parks in Victoria.

Offences under the DAA carry a penalty of 164 units for individuals, equating to \$30,326.88. Offences under the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 1986 carry a penalty of 250 penalty units, equating to \$46,230 or imprisonment for 12 months.

All reports made to RSPCA Victoria's Major Investigations Team must be lodged via https://rspcavic.org/tip-offform or by calling 9224 2222.

Facebook messages and emails through unofficial channels do not constitute an official cruelty report.


