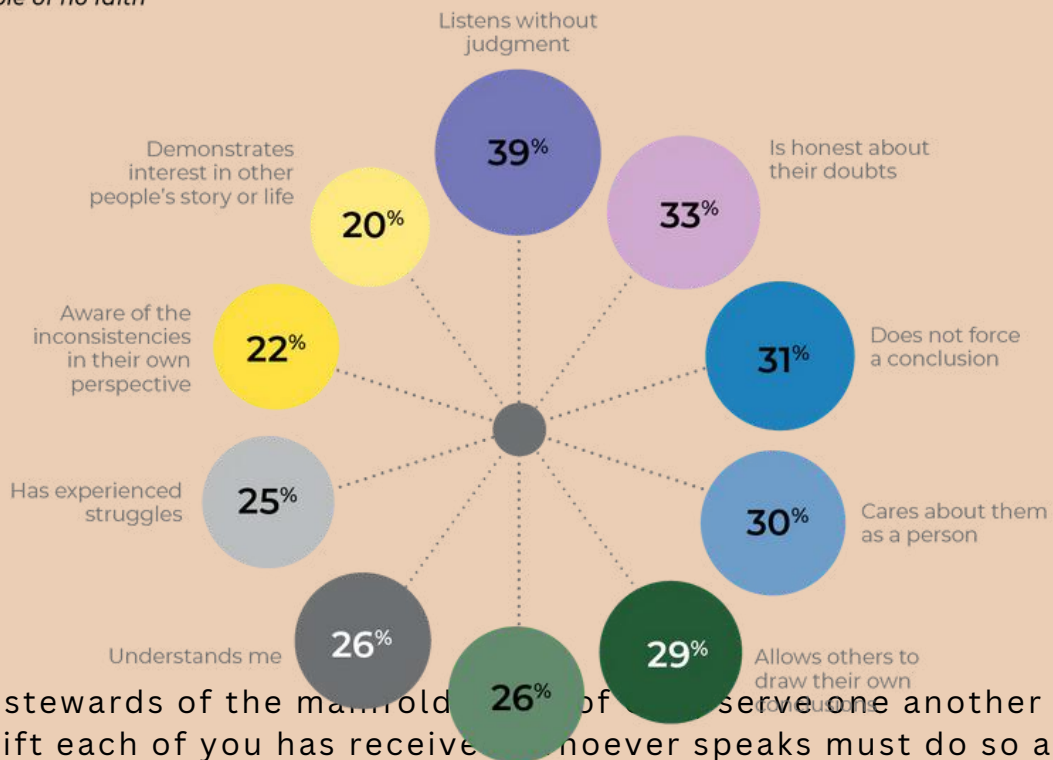

My daughter Aliya Garner, grandson Franklin J. Tate IV, and Johann Yarborough, all celebrated birthdays in Atlanta. Then it was off to Birmingham Ala, to surprise my Goddaughter, Erica Barnes at her birthday celebration. This reunion brought much joy to us all. There was lots of laughter and “happy” tears.

While in Birmingham, Franklin suggested we visited the Birmingham Civil Rights Museum because he wanted to see Mrs. Rosa Parks sitting in front of the bus, which he’d seen a picture of on social media. This help me understand some good can come to children from social media.

When we parked outside the museum and got out of the car, I noticed the 16th Street Baptist Church, directly across the street. It wasn’t open for touring at the time, but the outside had just as much history to glean from. While touring the museum, it was very hard for them to understand why we as a people were treated that way. I explained to them that we were not looked upon as equals by most, and the civil rights movement was our way of standing up, demanding our rightful place on God’s earth and reminding our opposers that according to their constitution, all men and women were created equal, with certain inalienable rights. I also explained they were learning the history of what has happened in the past, and I was being reminded and at times reliving some of the things I had gone through in the past. This brought about more tears, that were not so happy. To God be the glory for all He is doing.

September 15, 1963, Addie Mae Collins, Denise McNair, Carole Robertson, Cynthia Wesley. The Four Little Girls, killed in the bombing at the 16th Street Baptist Church, where twenty others were injured in a clear act of racial hatred. The church was a key civil rights meeting place and had been a target of frequent bomb threats. We also learned Johnny Robinson, a 16 year old teen was shot by police, Virgil Ware, a 13 year old teen, was killed outside the city by a white teen while riding on the handlebars of his older brother's bike, both were also killed that day, September 15, 1963.

On another corner of this historic block, we toured Kelly Ingram Park. Where violence raised a nationwide public outcry in May of the same year, when Birmingham police and firemen attacked mostly children and high school student civil rights demonstrators with nightsticks, dogs and fire hoses. The park served as a central staging ground for large scale demonstrations during the movement. It is now the setting of several pieces of sculpture related to the movement.

While at Kelly Ingram Park, my granddaughter, Christine Tate was compelled to give after reading the sign: "Prostrate Cancer Please Help" held by a man sitting in the park. I told her some give some of what they have, God bless you for giving all you had.

As we were about to leave the park, a woman from the Mayor's office approached us and informed us of up and coming celebrations to commentate the 60 years that has passed since September 15, 1963. She asked to interview each of us to see how we felt about what happened to Addie Mae Collins, Denise McNair, Carole Robertson, and Cynthia Wesley.

I encouraged my children that even though what we as a people go through may be painful at times to look back on, it doesn't negate the fact that it happens. So let us march on in Jesus' name until victory is won. Anita Garner

The Evangelism Aspect of the Holy Communion

The Lord's supper is an act of God directed toward humans. It is also an act that originated two thousand years ago at a supper in Jerusalem. The Lord's supper is often called, "Holy Communion," a coming together of bread with body, wine with blood, God with creatures and believers with one another.

The Holy Communion serves to lift a person beyond mere me-ness. Communion is a good time to express to one another a prayer that asks for the blessing of peace from Jesus.

St. Luke A.M.E. Zion Church carries the mission of Holy Sacrament to the sick and shut-in members of the church. This takes place once a month in their homes. During this important time, Holy Communion is shared with persons confined to their homes. They are given the bread which signifies Jesus broken body, and the wine which signifies Jesus spilled blood. A total of thirteen members received the Sacrament during the month of May. Following the administration of the Holy Communion, members are given a good news tract entitled, "I Am the Way, the Truth, and the Life." A prayer of peace is prayed for the members at the close of the Holy Sacrament.

Pre-Pentecost Prayer Study

Pre-Pentecost Prayer Study

Every Friday in the month of May the Western New York Conference came together for a Pre-Pentecost prayer study: Going Behind the Veil in Prayer. During this study all were encouraged to move beyond the outer court and grow in intimate fellowship with God. This is possible because relating to Him in prayer is our birthright as adopted sons of the Father. Going behind the veil is communing with God at the deepest level, a level in God that goes beyond religious experience. It's more than being deeply touched during a high point in a service during worship, it's a supernatural lifestyle and not a one-time event.

Week 1 – May 5th: To begin the prayer study we look at scriptures that revealed the truth about who we are in Christ, who God created us to be and how He wants us to live. Participants were encouraged to proclaim out loud what these scriptures revealed about their identity.



An hour-long prayer wheel was introduced to assist in exploring different aspects of prayer and extending the time we spend praying. The hour was broken down into twelve 5 minute segments.

Before launching into intercession for others, corporate prayer, or even personal prayer, participants were presented with a “Spiritual Checklist”. The following questions were asked:

1. Have I confessed all known sin?
2. Are all my relationships with others made right?
3. Are you seeking to glorify God above all things?
4. Are you depending on the Holy Spirit for guidance?
5. Are you trusting God in spite of what se

Pre-Pentecost Prayer Study - Con't

Week 2 – May 12th: We are invited into companionship and participation with God. There are two sides to prayer – there is fellowship prayer, then there is participation with God. God has purposes in which He wants us to partner with Him. He's looking for people who are willing to give themselves to the spiritual labor of prayer.

God invites each one of us as children of God into the very counsels of the Godhead. The Holy Spirit is living in us and willing us to move in to a place where we sit down in the very presence of the Father and of the Son and we engage in counsel with them. Lord, what will You have me to do? Lord, I need You every moment of this day, I can't make it without You.

Because God has raised us up together with Jesus Christ, and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, we do not grapple hand to hand with demons in the earth realm – we exercise authority over them from our seat of authority in Christ Jesus in the third heaven. We do not meet the enemy in his own territory but rather we deal with him from a place far above his activity.



How to Grow in Faith:

1. Ask God to increase your faith.
2. Focus on obeying God.
3. Spend time reading and hearing God's word.
4. Spend time with other believers.
5. Spend time in fervent prayer.

Week 3 – May 19th: The relationship of faith to prayer. Biblically, faith is considered a belief and trust in God based on evidence but without total proof. Faith holds a common theme: trust. To have faith means to have trust. It doesn't end at trust. Rather, trusting the Word of God is an act of faith. By putting our complete trust in God, like Abraham did, we can better align our actions with God's commandments. Therefore, having faith is a twofold process: trust and action.



Week 4 – May 26th: All joined in a powerful Spirit filled time praise and worship to our great God. The Holy Ghost truly showed up and showed out. What a mighty outpouring of the Spirit of God. Participants lingered on the Zoom line well past the closing of the session. Praise God.

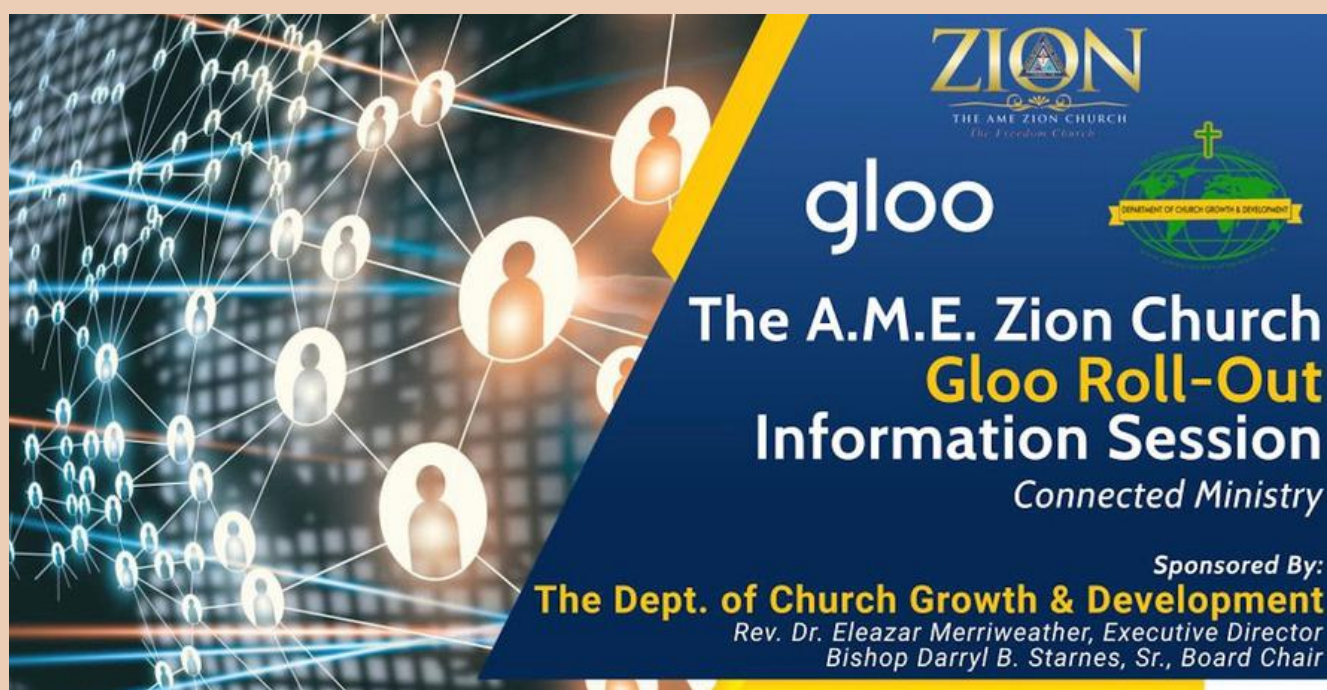
