
Alvarez, Julia In The Time of the Butterflies

Bronte, Emily Wuthering Heights



Dickens, Charles Great Expectations





A collection of tales told by Scheherazade to amuse the cruel sultan and stop him from executing her as he had his other daily wives.


Dumas, Alexandre The Three Musketeers




Fitzgerald, F. Scott The Great Gatsby



Heller, Joseph Catch-22

A surreal novel about a group of American fliers in the Mediterrean area during World War II. One of the fliers tries to convince his comrades that he is insane so that he will be relieved of duty.

Hemingway, Ernest The Old Man and the Sea

This is the triumphant yet tragic story of an old Cuban fisherman and his relentless, agonizing battle with a giant marlin far out in the Gulf Stream.

Hemingway, Ernest The Sun Also Rises

This novel about the post-World War I "lost generation" follows a group of American and English expatriates in Paris on a trip to Pamplona, Spain.




Hinton, S. E. The Outsiders






Hurston, Zora Neale Their Eyes Were Watching God

Huxley, Aldous Brave New World


Huxley's classic prophetic novel describes the socialized horrors of a futuristic utopia devoid of individual freedom.

One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest



London, Jack The Call of the Wild



The adventures in the northern wilderness of a dog who is part wolf and how he comes to make his peace with man.


Marquez, Gabriel Garcia One Hundred Years of Solitude

This novel tells the story of the Buendia family, set against the background of the evolution and eventual decadence of a small South American town.




Montgomery, L. M. Anne of Green Gables


O'Brien, Tim The Things They Carried


Orwell, George **1984**

Portrays life in a future time when a totalitarian government watches over all citizens and directs all activities.





Paterson, Katherine Jacob Have I Loved

Remarque, Erich Maria All Quiet on the Western Front


The horrors of war as told through the eyes of a young German soldier in World War I.


Shelley, Mary Frankenstein


Smith, Betty A Tree Grows in Brooklyn

Depicts the hardships and suffering endured by the Joads as they journey from Oklahoma to California during the Depression.




Steinbeck, John Of Mice and Men This novel depicts the tragic tale of a simpleminded man and the friend who loves and tries to protect him.

The narrative of a boy who lived through Auschwitz and Buchenwald provides a short and terrible indictment of modern humanity.


