Maths & English

Higher Level Apprenticeships

If you're not sure university is for you, the Apprenticeship Hub team can support you with higher-level apprenticeship applications, so you can gain a degree-level qualification whilst earning a wage. A Level 4-5 apprenticeship is equivalent to a university-level programme, such as a foundation degree or HNC/D and is an industry recognised qualification.





The path you start out on will depend on where you're heading.

A Level & A+ Programmes

Sixth Form Academic Route (Level 3)

Quick overview:

Typically, students choose to study three A Level subjects over two years. However, you can choose to study two A Level subjects and one A+ Programme (BTEC Extended Certificate – equivalent to one A Level) over two years.

To study, you will need:

A minimum of five GCSEs at grade 5 or above including maths and English Language in subjects relevant to your chosen course.*

What you can do next:

You can progress to university, a university level course here at NSCG, a higher apprenticeship at NSCG or to employment.

In 2023, 59% of entries achieved high grades A*- B in their A Level results.

T Levels

Sixth Form T Level Route (Level 3)

Quick overview:

A T Level is an industryrecognised, two-year course that is an alternative to A Levels and vocational programmes. They bring classroom learning and an extended industry placement (at least 45 days) together on a course designed with businesses and employers.

To study, you will need:

Typically, a minimum of five GCSEs at grade 5 or above, including maths and English Language, in subjects relevant to your chosen course.*

What you can do next:

You can progress to university, a university level course here at NSCG, an apprenticeship at NSCG or to employment.

In 2023, 85% our first cohort of T Level students achieved distinction grades or above.

Vocational Programmes

Sixth Form Vocational Route (Level 3)

Quick overview:

Choose from a wide-range of courses which you will study for two years.

To study, you will need:

A minimum of four or more high grades at GCSE in subjects relevant to the course you'd like to study, including maths and/or English Language at grade 4 or above.

What you can do next:

You can progress to university, a university level course here at NSCG, an apprenticeship at NSCG or to employment.

In 2023, 47% of Level 3 vocational programme students achieved high grades of DDD or above (equivalent to three 'A' grades at A Level).

Apprenticeships

Available at Levels 2 to 5

Quick overview:

Apprenticeships are great if you want to jump straight into the world of work, earn a wage and pick up technical and practical skills while you study for a nationally recognised qualification.

To study, you will need:

Two or more GCSEs at grade 4 or above in subjects relevant to your course. However, in some sectors, employers ask for a minimum of grade 4/5 in maths and English.

What you can do next:

You can progress to a higher level apprenticeship, full-time course at NSCG or full-time employment.

Our apprenticeship achievement rates are more than 13% above the national average.

Progression & Skills Pathways

Level 2, Level 1 & Entry Level

Quick overview:

If you're not quite ready to join a Level 3 programme, our vocational Progression Pathways allow you to study at Entry Level, Level 1 or Level 2 and will prepare you to progress onto a higher level.

Alternatively, if you want skills based training in areas such as hairdressing, beauty and construction, you'll start your journey on a Level 1 Skills Pathway, before progressing to higher levels.

GCSE Maths & English

If you haven't yet achieved grades 9-4 in these important subjects, maths and/or English sessions will be on your timetable and you'll retake qualifications alongside your main course.



If you are an academic learner and want to progress to university or a higher apprenticeship, our two-year A Level or A+ Programmes could be a great option for you.

Most students study three subjects. But if you have a track record of high achievement, you might decide to study four A Level subjects, or take an Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) as your fourth subject. You must be comfortable studying for, and taking, external exams because that's how most A Level subjects are assessed at the end of the two years.

An A+ Programme lets you combine A Level subjects with a BTEC Extended Certificate for a better balance of exams and coursework.

If this is you:

- · I don't mind being assessed by exams.
- I like theories, ideas and facts.
- I want to study three subjects in depth.
- I intend to go on to university or get a higher apprenticeship.
- I'm happy doing independent study and research outside the classroom.

Then an A Level programme could be for you!



T Levels bring classroom learning and an extended industry placement together on a course designed with businesses and employers.

Each T Level includes an in-depth industry placement that lasts at least 45 days*. Students get valuable experience in the workplace; employers get early sight of the new talent in their industry.

Up your credentials with one of our challenging vocational courses.

A two-year BTEC Level 3 Extended Diploma is equivalent to three A Levels.

The focus is on coursework, with a balance of hands-on practical experience and some external assessments - a great choice if you know the kind of area you want to work in. And they are also widely-recognised qualifications to get you into university, apprenticeships or employment.

If this is you:

- I'm organised and good with deadlines.
- I like working on a few assignments at the same time.
- I want to focus on one subject that relates to my chosen career.
- I want to go on to university, get a higher apprenticeship or a job.

Then a vocational course could be for you!

We offer a wider range of career-based courses that will allow you to develop your skills and knowledge vocationally.

You'll need:

- A minimum of four or more high grades at GCSE in subjects that are relevant to the course you'd like to study, including maths and/or English Language at grade 4 or above.
- Level 2 Diploma with overall Merit in a relevant subject and maths and/or English Language at GCSE grade 4 or above.
