






Children Served by Age:




Children Served by City:


* RESOURCE & REFERRAL PROGRAM


Child care providers learn about the Child & Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) at a Cafecito y Conexiones, led by a Resource & Referral Supervisor.



Early Support Before Deployment

A mother reached out to Help Me Grow concerned that her 14-month-old son wasn't yet talking. With her family preparing for military deployment, she hoped to get support before moving out of state. The Family Navigator advocated for an early referral and helped expedite an evaluation. Within weeks, her child began therapy, ensuring continuity of care as the family transitioned to their new home.





Reaching for Brighter Futures

During Fiscal Year 2024 to 2025, former SFCS parent Sircoya Williams returned to share her journey and present a donation on behalf of the California Medical Facility.



Hello, I'm Sircoya Williams, and in 1999 I moved from New York to Fairfield, California with my daughter, determined to build a strong foundation for our future. As a single parent with no family nearby to help with child care (my own mother was a working mom), I took on the challenge of working and going to school to earn my Psychiatric Technician license.

Along the way, I connected with Solano Family & Children's Services (SFCS); they helped me access reliable, high-quality child care at a reduced cost. That support gave me the peace of mind to stay focused on my goals.

After obtaining my license, I began a new career and no longer qualified for assistance — a proud milestone that marked my growing independence.

Over the years, I had two more children, continued advancing in my career, and remained committed to supporting my family on my own terms. As of December 2024, I serve as the Acting Warden at the California Medical Facility in Vacaville.

The support I received from SFCS helped make that growth possible. It was a resource I used to stay on course. I continue to give back to this community by supporting fundraisers, donating, and showing up for local efforts. This community has done so much for me and my family, and I am dedicated to paying it forward.

I am an extreme advocate for programs that help working parents, as I once needed help myself. Affordable child care opens doors, but it's the determination of parents that carries them through. My experience is proof that with the right tools and support, anything is possible.

The services and resources provided by SFCS have made a profound difference in my personal journey.

"This service has been helpful as a student parent and now as a single working parent. Without subsidy I don't know how we would survive. Healing Through Counseling and Connection

A father was referred to Help Me Grow Solano seeking play therapy or group socialization for his young daughter. During their conversation, he shared that his child had experienced several traumatic events, including the loss of her mother. The Family Navigator listened with care, discussed the importance of emotional support, and provided counseling referrals that would meet the child's needs.

With gentle encouragement and follow-up, the father gave consent to begin therapy for his daughter and even decided to seek counseling himself. Today, both are receiving ongoing mental health support and continue to make progress together.


