Resident and Non Resident Rates



Resident Rate applies to customers who live and/or own property in the Tahoe City Public Utility District water & sewer service area. Residents within the service area receive reduced rates for many of our recreation fees, as a portion of their property taxes are used to support TCPUD parks and recreation services. If you feel you may qualify as Resident, please email us (recreation@tcpud.org) with proof of your physical address (i.e. valid driver's license, TCPUD Utility Bill) showing a physical address within the district and the registrant's name.

Wait Lists:



If a program is full & a waitlist is available, you will have the option to enroll your child(ren) on the waiting list.

If space becomes available, you will receive an email stating availability in the program, program details and a link to sign up for the available spot.

Please note, the link is only available for 24 hours.

Refunds & Cancellations:



TCPUD reserves the right to cancel any activity. If TCPUD cancels an activity, a full refund will be issued.

If a participant cancels at least 5 working days before the activity start date, 80 percent will be refunded.

No refunds, full or partial, will be issued if a participant cancels within 4 working days before the activity start date, or fails to attend an activity or class.

Note: All schedules and rates are subject to change.



THINGS TO KNOW



Inclement Weather:

In the interest of safety for all, we will cancel or postpone a program or close a facility due to inclement winter weather conditions such as snow and ice. In the event we cancel any programs due to inclement weather, we will communicate closures as soon as possible.

Scholarships:

The Youth Scholarship Fund was developed by TCPUD Parks & Recreation Department to assist local youth to participate in sports and activities. Funds are available to youth ages 17 years and younger and offers a maximum cash subsidy of 50% per program registration, with a \$150 max per child per year.

To be considered, a Scholarship Application must be submitted. Applications are available by emailing recreation@tcpud.org or calling (530) 583-3440. All information is confidential.

Contributions are accepted to help children that would otherwise be unable to participate in a class or program. Please contact the TCPUD Recreation Department before making a scholarship fund donation at recreation@tcpud.org.

Read below to learn about significant investments our Board of Directors has made to protect and improve our water and sewer systems and provide outstanding recreation opportunities.

Water Treatment Plant Now Delivering Water to West Shore Customers

We're pleased to announce the completion and grand opening of the new West Lake Tahoe Regional Water Treatment Plant. This project represents a transformative investment in TCPUD's water system to provide a permanent, drought-resilient source for drinking water and fire protection for the West Shore of Lake Tahoe.

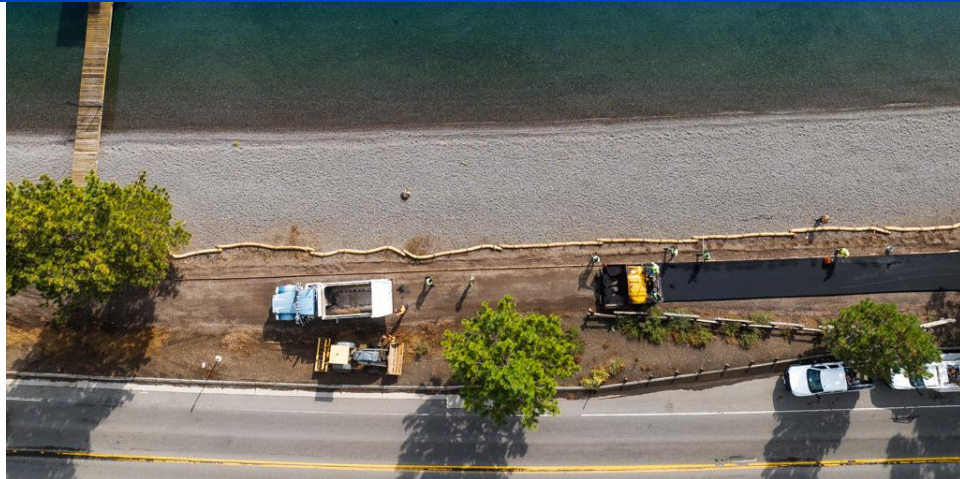
Located near Chambers Landing, just north of Tahoma, the new state-of-the-art facility replaces the temporary seasonal plant and will now provide a year-round water supply sourced directly from Lake Tahoe. The project strengthens our water supply and enhances fire protection capabilities.

The project included construction of an underwater pump station and intake pipeline in Lake Tahoe to supply surface water to the treatment plant. The treatment plant uses advanced technology including membrane ultrafiltration and ultraviolet disinfection to ensure exceptional water quality.

Currently, the treatment plant is delivering water to approximately 530 customers in the McKinney-Quail water system and can deliver almost one million gallons of water per day. Designed for a regional water supply, the treatment plant may be expanded to meet the needs of up to 2,400 West Shore customers from Tahoma to Timberland.

Dianne Feinstein West Shore Tahoe Trail Reconstruction Project Keeps Rolling

TCPUD invested \$4.8 million in 2025 to reconstruct 2.4 miles of this iconic trail between Sunnyside and Blackwood Creek. Originally built in the 1970s, the recently renamed Dianne Feinstein West Shore Tahoe Trail has benefited from TCPUD's regular maintenance, but after nearly 50 years, full reconstruction was necessary.

Reconstruction addressed pavement failure, slope and alignment issues, vehicular and pedestrian visibility, trail safety, ADA compliance, and drainage.

In 2026, we'll turn our sights toward rebuilding the section of trail between Sunnyside and 64-Acres in Tahoe City.

We are grateful for funding support through the TOT-TBID Dollars at Work program and the Tahoe Fund.



The Grass is Greener at Tahoe City Golf Course

Fore! Look out for improved golf course conditions in years to come thanks to our successful project to replace Tahoe City Golf Course's aging irrigation system. The old irrigation system at Tahoe City Golf Course had been in place since 1976, well beyond the typical 30-year lifespan for mountain environments. The newly installed system is more water efficient, provides better turf coverage, and will create a better golf experience for customers.

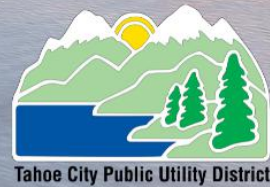

Water Rate Assistance Program

Eligible low-income customers can save 25-50% off your water bill!



Need Help with Your Water Bill? TCPUD's Rate Assistance Programs Can Help!

TCPUD offers a low-income rate assistance program for residential water customers. Qualified applicants will receive a rate reduction equal to either 25% or 50% of the current $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch monthly residential water metered base rate.

Rate assistance is available on a first-come, first-served basis. To be eligible for the Program, participants must:

-  Reside as a primary resident at a TCPUD water service address.
-  Be responsible for paying the TCPUD water utility bill.
-  Have water consumption that has not exceeded the Tier 1 water limit for the prior 12 months (8,000 gallons per month)
-  Annually submit a completed Program application

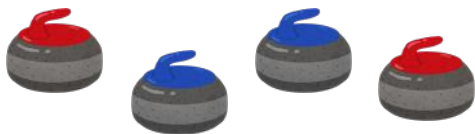

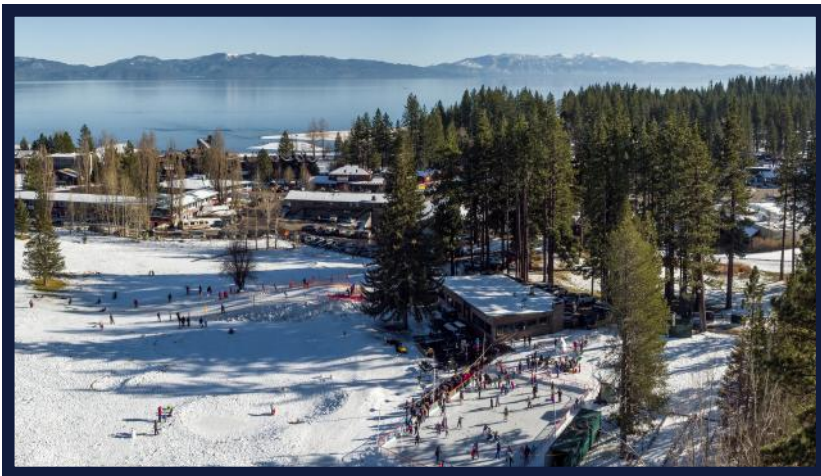
Looking for winter activities the whole family can enjoy? Come to the Tahoe City Winter Sports Park, an all-inclusive winter recreation destination like no other. The park features a safe sledding hill, 4 km of cross-country skiing and snowshoeing trails, and an ice skating rink.

Reservations for the 2025/2026 season are encouraged, and while a limited number of walk-up spots will be available, we cannot guarantee space without a prior reservation for peak times over weekends and holidays. Season pass purchases and reservations can be made online at tcpud.org/winter.

Currently, the park will open for ice rink use only. Snow is needed to operate the Sled Hill, Cross-Country Ski & Snowshoe Trail. Reservations for these activities will be made available when there is enough snow in the forecast to open these features.

This fun winter adventure has a very small learning curve and you will be out exploring on the snow in no time. We carry snowshoes in a variety of sizes for adults and children and are available to rent when you reserve your snowshoeing session.

Skating teaches balance, improves strength and encourages kids, and adults, to keep trying. Ice skates and skating aids are available for rent.

Sledding

Family fun for everyone. Spend a session sliding and laughing on our man-made sled hill. Disc rental is included with the purchase of your sled hill session. No outside sleds permitted. Please be aware this is a small hill and appropriate for ages 10 and under.

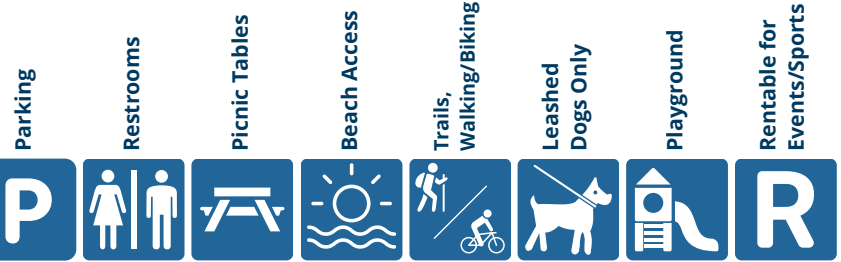

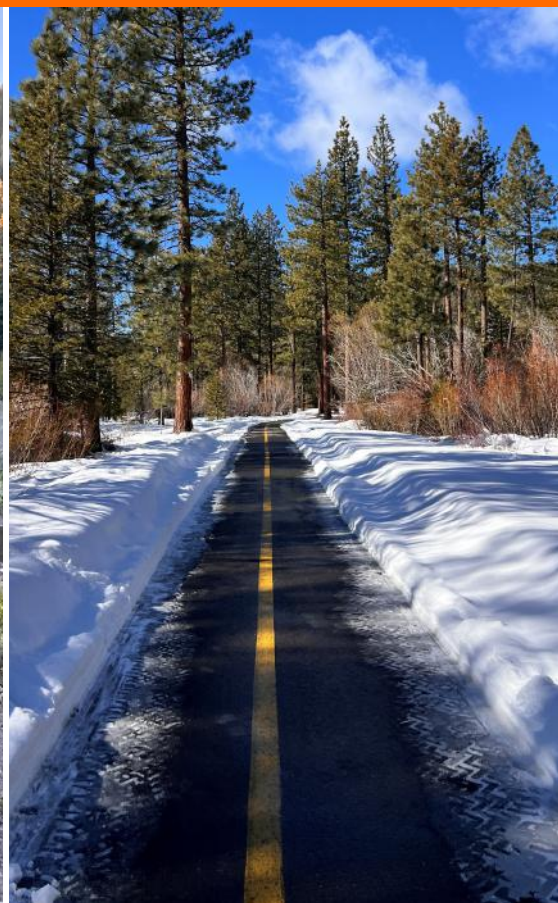

MULTI-USE TRAIL SYSTEM

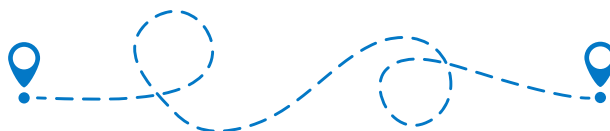
The perfect way to enjoy the Tahoe seasons and tour the North and West Shore of Lake Tahoe is by using our 23-mile multi-use trail network. Our recreational trails are open to bicyclists, e-bikes, walkers, joggers, strollers, and even anglers enjoying the views. Please leash your dogs, keep an eye out for maintenance workers & equipment, and be respectful of other users.

During winter, the TCPUD parks crew will keep portions of the trail clear, from Dollar Hill down the West Shore to Timberland, and the Truckee River Trail to the Olympic Valley intersection conditions permitting. NORTH LAKE TAHOE Multi-Use Trail System

Share the Path. Be kind. Be safe. Take care.

This is a multi-use trail system enjoyed by bicyclists, pedestrians, skateboarders, joggers, and dog walkers alike.

- Keep right, pass left when safe
- Bikes yield to pedestrians
- Alert when passing
- Use safe speeds. Speed limit 15mph
- Class 1 and 2 E-Bikes permitted
- Blaze a trail of kindness
- Always use a light at night
- Look and listen, be respectful
- Keep dogs on a short leash – Pack out waste!
- Use caution when crossing driveways
- Obey all trail and roadway signs
- Move to the side when stopping – Do not block the trail
- Pack out your litter!
- Watch for and yield to trail maintenance equipment and crews
- Motorized vehicles are prohibited
