Here we are, nearing the end of another academic year. As I look over the many highlights of 2015, I can't help but feel the buzz in the air and the anticipation of where we are going.

Our first function of the year was our staff long service awards with numerous staff being recognised for reaching various milestones in their chosen careers. We were also introduced to 6 new "young" academic staff which gives us an amazing blend of youth and experience. In addition, on the administration side we have appointed a full time marketing professional as well as an experienced Head Groundsman.

Shortly after our long service award evening, Bryanston High was once again recognised by the GDE as the "Top School" in the northern suburbs.We have won this coveted award for five successive vears. At this award ceremony a number of accolades were bestowed on some of our teachers and learners alike for their performances during 2014. Mrs B Weir was acknowledged as the top Consumer Studies teacher in our district and Kiara O'Connell was recognised as the top learner in the Northern Suburbs with 9 distinctions. While we did not achieve a 100% pass rate our class of 2014 achieved a very impressive 160 distinctions. In 2014 Bryanston High started the Academic Council to assist learners in grade 11 and 12. This initiative is intended to assist leaner's to raise their marks through voluntary extra tuition. The success of this programme has surpassed our wildest expectations and as a result it has been extended to include the lower grades. I would encourage learners in the programme to persevere and take full advantage of this opportunity afforded them by their teachers.

While we acknowledge we are first and foremost an academic institution, we do strive to provide a holistic education which includes cultural, sporting

and social responsibility programs. On the cultural side we found ourselves in the middle of an amazing production of "Our House". Our learners and staff spent many hours in rehearsal prior to presenting it to their parents, friends and the broader Bryanston community. Our thanks to Mrs Cook, Mrs Turvey, Miss Smith, Mrs Buttrick and Mr Malabana for their passion and commitment. Despite Eskom's best efforts to set the cast and production back, they overcame all obstacles and presented a fantastic show that entertained us thoroughly.

On the sports field we continue to see improvement year by year. Our win ratios in almost all sporting codes have risen this past year with success rates of 60 - 70% becoming the norm. This is not without hard work from our sportsmen, sportswomen and their coaches. Training like never before, teams were jockeving for space on the fields in the first and second terms - all of them at 6am in the morning in preseason training, let alone the regular afternoon practices. On some mornings there were as many as 6 different codes all putting in the hard yards. Let's not forget the coaches who were also out there at 6 am most mornings with their teams and then still putting in a full day's teaching, followed by an afternoon of coaching and then preparing for school in the evenings.

During the year we had outgoing tours by the hockey boys and girls, cheerleading and rugby. We also had teams attending coaching clinics in anticipation of the season ahead. It is this dedication that brought our sportsmen and women the success they achieved. This, I believe, has contributed to the general increase in enthusiasm for sport at the school and resulted in an increase in the number of participants and parents attending the various sports dinners.

During the latter part of the rugby season we hosted an English touring team. While we lost the match itself, we certainly left a favourable impression on the visiting coaches and staff. My thanks to the many parents who hosted our visitors and to Mrs Anna Rossouw and the Rugby Parents Committee for providing a true South African spit braai with all the trimmings for our visitors.

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Worth singling out is our Athletics Team. They worked exceptionally hard during the July holidays in preparation for the athletics season in the third term. After having won the C League in 2014, they were promoted to the B League in 2015 and set themselves the lofty goal of winning the B League. While many would have been content to just retain a spot in the B League, this was not the case. As the season progressed, they started to rack up some impressive results and crowned it all off by WINNING the B League. They now find themselves in the A League for 2016. Well done!

To all our coaches, sports men and women and supporters – WELL DONE! You deserve all our support and encouragement.

On the support side, we have seen an improvement in the levels of parental and peer support .I am convinced that this has contributed to the successes we have seen on the sports fields . I would really encourage you to attend our home Derby Days and where possible the away games as well. Let's grow Bryanston Family.

In between all the mainstream activities on the campus our learners and staff have been very busy with activates such as Miss Pizzazz, Miss Elegance, Mr Bryanston, the LAN Club, Warrior Races, the Midmar Mile, inter-house sport, LIA, grade camps, councillor camps, debating, the Matric Dance, Paarlauf and numerous charitable projects. Thanks to all who gave up their time to make these events a success. A word of special thanks go to Mr Malabane and the Driver Ed Programme. Mr Malebane has again undertaken what many might shy away from, and that is teaching our 17 year olds how to correctly tackle the South African roads. Sam, you are one of the bravest men I know.

We are indeed fortunate to have Mr John Skelton as our Principal. Mr Skelton brought his experience to his position as Head of the school. Mr Skelton leads a dynamic Senior Management Team comprising staff with years of experience combined with the energy of youth. Anyone involved in the governance of a school will very quickly realise that no two days are ever alike. With 900 learners, their parents and the GDE to serve, the value of a capable and competent SMT cannot be underestimated. We are privileged to have a SMT that continues to manage the day to day functions of the school efficiently, with integrity and often with compassion and empathy.


At the awards evening teachers who have added to the" Bryanston Brand" were also rewarded. Congratulations.

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

She had no idea who I was. To that girl, thank you for the humbling experience and if you still don't know who I am, my name is Luke and I have had the greatest 5 years at this school. Also in case you were wondering...I passed my driver's license.

My face might not always show it, but I really do love this school.

My first experience of Bryanston High was in 2010. I came here for the school's open day. The councillors then taught us Bani Wa Tela. When we asked what it meant, the current head boy responded saying "if you come here next year they'll translate it for you." I have been passionately singing Bani Wa Tela for the past 5 years and I still have no idea what it means.

You have often heard Mr. Skelton stand up here and speak about being a True Blue Bryasntonian and I never quite understood what it meant until this year when I was watching the U15 girl'shockey.

A very cheerful girl named Lulu was giving it her all defending the Bryanston goal. Late in the game she was hit in the mouth with a hockey ball, which was travelling at speed. She fell down and was bleeding at the mouth. I was expecting to see an ambulance arrive. She got up and was assisted off the field. It wasn't even a minute later and she was telling the coach to let her get back onto the field. Watching her, I finally understood what it meant to be a True Blue Bryanstonian.

With all of my experiences here I have summed up some of my fondest memories at this school: The first was when I was in grade 8. I used to play cricket and I opened the bowling. It was an early Saturday morning and we were prepared for a long 50 over game against Fourways. Mr. Lawrence thank you for impacting the way Irun and for seeing my talent before I did, for always supporting me and for always cheering me on.

To the grade 8s: It is never too late to get motivated. It doesn't matter what happened at your old school, you are at Bryanston now. When I was at primary school I didn't become a prefect because the teachers didn't see any leadership qualities in me but rather than letting the teachers' views of me define who I am, I opted to use that as motivation. Not to prove the teachers wrong but to prove to myself that I can be aleader.

To the grade 9s: You have all picked your subjects and some of you have picked difficult ones. I want you to try and stick with those subjects that you picked and not just drop them because everyone just drops things when something becomes hard. So I dare you to stay with your subject choices because can you imagine what would have happened if Nelson Mandela had decided to just drop and quit and say "I'm just going to stop."

To the grade 10s: Next year you are voting for councillors and I urge you not to change who you are in order to get votes, don't try and be someone you aren't in order to get people to like you.

And the grade 11s: Next year you are leaders of the school-Thope that you become the leaders you promised when you ran for councillor.

And to the matrics of 2015, one thing I always consider is that if a single teacher can't teach us all the subjects... then how can they expect a single student to learn all the subjects. Thank you Mr. Skelton and staff for your guidance, encouragement, dedication, and the firm talks when needed.


