Every once in a while it is good to look back to see where we have come from.

As we report in 2018, we have taken some time to look back 10 years at our growth, and accomplishments. We hope you will marvel, as we have, at what a group of dedicated people can do when working from opposite sides of the world, to care for children, families, and their futures.

August 2018, in a remote village of eastern Malawi, a group of Canadian Humanitarian volunteers arrived for a day of health care services. We travelled on a two rut trail to the village school, to find over a 1000 people waiting to greet us. They sang and danced their welcome in such a warm and gracious way. A chief representing over 50,000 people informed us that we were the first foreign people to come to the village, the first time health care would be delivered near their homes. He thanked us for treating them as human beings, for giving them dignity, and for ensuring they were no longer invisible to the world.

This is the very essence of the work of Canadian Humanitarian. To reach those who are invisible, offer them a voice, an opportunity to change their future, and become who they truly are.

Thank you for being part of this effort. From the children, their families, and communities who you have served from a distance, or with your own hands, thank you for changing their world in one generation.







Scholarship Program

Canadian Humanitarian offers Scholarships to students in several different ways

Post-Secondary Education Support:

As our students graduate from High School, they also advance from the regular program to the Scholarship Program.

With this assistance, they are able to complete College, University, Technical or Vocational Training programs.

The Scholarship Program covers their tuition fees, textbooks, educational supplies, and provides a living allowance.

Education Scholarships:

High School students who are enrolled in our program in areas that do not yet have full Education Support Centers also receive support through the Scholarship Program.

The Scholarship provides them with uniforms, school supplies, tuition fee coverage, and funds for personal needs.

A special Scholarship Coordinator oversees this program to ensure students are attending classes, keeping and submitting expense receipts, and providing updates on their grade standing monthly. High School students are supervised by a volunteer adult mentor who ensures their needs are being communicated to the Coordinator.

The benefits are numerous for the students; they learn to budget and manage money, they take responsibility in reporting their progress, and learn how to set and achieve goals. As they progress through their years of post-secondary learning, they become independent, competent, adults.

In return adult students give back volunteer hours to help young students in Canadian Humanitarian after school centers, helping with music, drama, or sports clubs, reading or tutoring time.

Manji-Burghardt Scholarship

The Manji-Burghardt Scholarship is a prestigious academic scholarship that students in the Scholarship Program can apply to recieve.

It was established in 2013 by the generous contributions of Dr. Rizwan Manji and his wife, Jackie Burghardt. Rizwan and Jackie have both excelled during their academic careers, due in part, to the opportunity to access scholarships. They have a desire to motivate and support Ethiopian youth as they find success at a high academic level.

The Manji-Burghardt Scholarship is offered to four exceptional students each academic year.

The Award:

Top 2 candidates each receive a one-time award of a new laptop and \$1,000 ET Birr cash. Place 3 and 4 candidates each receive a one-time award of \$10,000 ET Birr to use for tuition and school costs for the year.
