



Publication - \$275

Ernie Barnes has enjoyed a lengthy career, of over 50 years, working for pork associations, including the National Swine Registration, the National Pork Producers Council and National Pork Board. He retired from the Pork Board in 2023 but continues to serve as the lowa State Fair's Swine Barn superintendent.

Mr. Barnes helped develop the first World Pork Expo in 1988, an event that he is still involved with today, initiated the Pork Alliance, the National Pork Producers Council's allied industry program, and created the Pork Action Group. Throughout the years, Mr. Barnes has formed grassroots organizations, encouraged Pork Checkoff involvement, assisted with legislative issues, introduced new production techniques, and coordinated educational events. 




