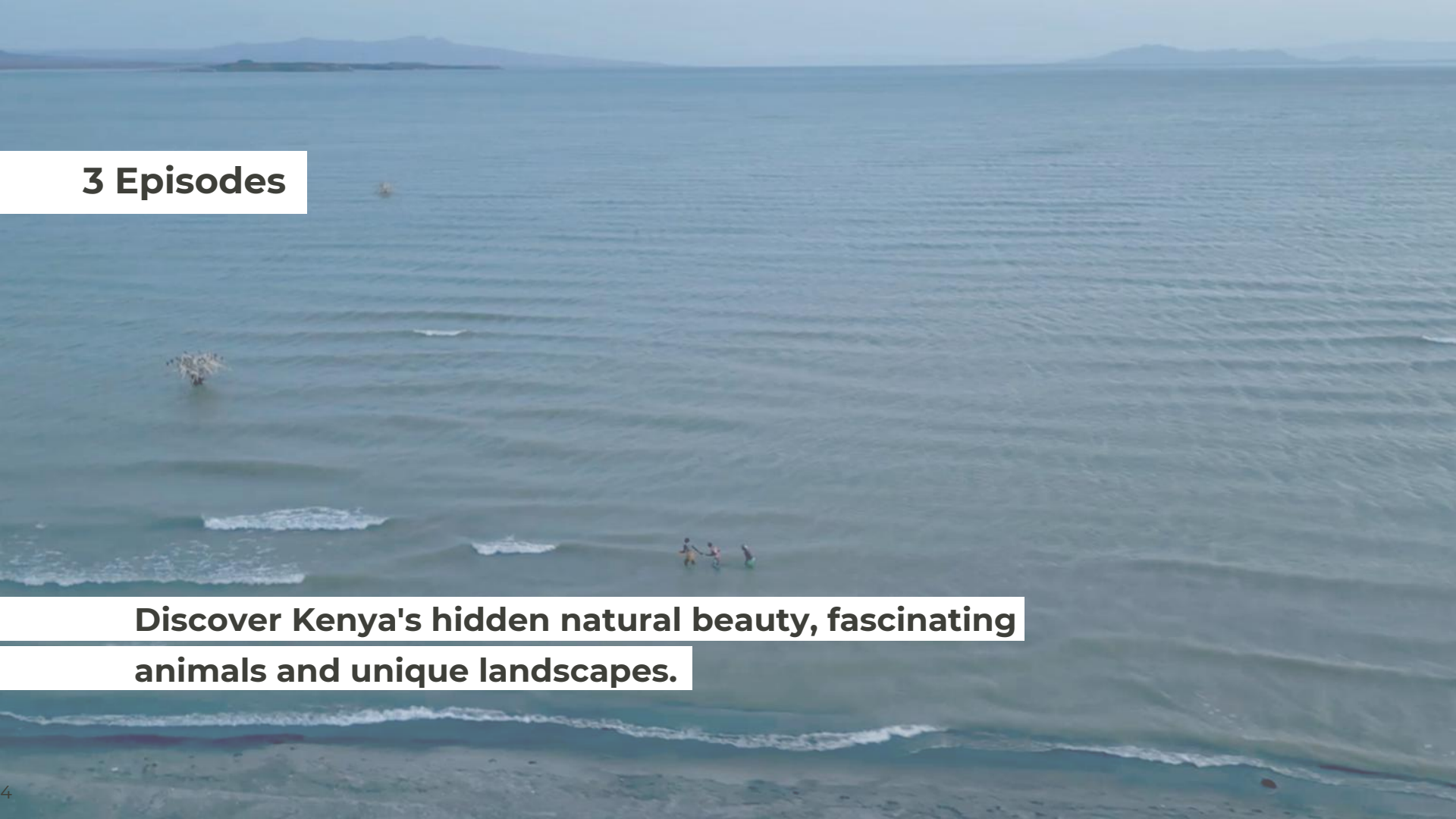


# Series Synopsis

# Episode 1

## *In the Kakamega rainforest*

Kakamega Forest, Kenya's last rainforest, is home to hundreds of tree and bird species, and seven kinds of primates. Once on the brink of destruction, it's now being protected by conservationist Wkesesa and others.

Projects like energy-saving Upesi stoves help reduce deforestation, while locals continue to draw on the forest's healing plants.



# Episode 2

*By the Indian Ocean*

In Arabuko Sokoke, Kenya's last coastal forest, locals catch butterflies for global botanical gardens, easing pressure on natural resources.

Mwaka Mwatsuma searches daily for rare specimens. Meanwhile in Kilifi, surfer Sammi Mkuzi dreams of launching a local kite school to rival expat-run ones.



# Episode 3

*By Lake Turkana and out in  
nomad country*

Lake Turkana, Kenya's largest inland lake, stretches across 6,400 km<sup>2</sup> into Ethiopia. Its salty waters host fish, algae, birds, and Nile crocodiles.

On the southeastern shore lives the El Molo, Kenya's smallest ethnic group. Elder Raphael Lenapir remembers a time when they hunted hippos and crocs.
