These numbers are a testament to the hard work and dedication of our learners, who have shown commitment throughout the year. Each portfolio represents hours of study, practice and perseverance.









Led by KWETB Chief Executive Dr. Deirdre Keyes, the event featured an inspiring address from Bernie Bradley, the Irish Human Rights and Equality Commission (IHREC) Public Sector Duty Training Manager, who spoke about the importance of equality, diversity, and inclusion, the responsibility of public bodies to uphold human rights in Ireland and to continue to meet their Public Sector Human Rights and Equality Duty.

Ken Scully, Director of Schools, acted as MC for the occasion, anchoring the proceedings to a celebration of our staff cohort's completion of the IHREC e-learning module to our commitment to EDI throughout the ETB.

Dr. Keyes highlighted KWETB's core values and reaffirmed the organisation's commitment to embedding the Public Sector Duty within its Statement of Strategy, ensuring that equality and human rights remain central to all operations.

In Summer 2023, Ann Kearney, HSE Manager of Services: Home Care Support Services, approached Naas FETC with a challenge presented to them: all HSE Homecare Workers were required to hold a QQI Level 5 Healthcare Award.

This programme was designed to build on the learners existing knowledge and expertise, address gaps, and to fit into their daily work pattern. ### Maths Week Ireland 2025 Celebrated at Naas Youthreach with Interactive Workshop and Ministerial Visit



Naas Youthreach celebrated Maths Week Ireland 2025 with a special interactive workshop on Thursday the 16th October 2025 which included a visit from the Minister for Further Education and Training James Lawless, TD. Maths Week Ireland is one of Europe's leading festivals of its kind, celebrating mathematics and promoting a positive attitude towards maths in everyday life, education and work. The theme of Maths Week 2025 is encouraging curiosity and confidence in maths through real-world problem-solving.



Mathematical literacy is a crucial life skill that empowers young people to navigate everyday challenges, from managing finances to making informed decisions. For learners who may not have thrived in traditional classroom settings, hands-on, creative approaches to maths can build confidence and demonstrate that mathematics is both accessible and essential for future success.

The Naas Youthreach event featured an engaging workshop delivered by Tiago Hirth, a maths enthusiast and energetic presenter known for his innovative approach to maths outreach. Tiago's workshops demonstrate that maths is everywhere, not just in textbooks, mixing mathematical concepts with card tricks, magic and interactive demonstrations. Designed to be both educational and entertaining, Tiago's sessions make maths accessible to all participants regardless of age or ability

The workshop focused on interactive, group-based activities that made maths enjoyable and relevant for young people.



The event took place at Naas Youthreach, Jigginstown Commercial Centre, Newbridge Road, Naas West, Co. Kildare.


