JOIN IN WITH OUR SERMON SERIES ON EATING WITH JESUS

The Bible begins and ends with meals.

God's first invitation to humans was to eat; the first conflict in the Bible is over a forbidden meal; the last act of Jesus before his death was to share a meal with his followers; the final vision of the Bible was of a massive, joyful banquet.

Jesus spent a huge amount of time eating with people. His first miracle was a response to a catering crisis and he earned a reputation as a glutton and drunkard because he spent so much time eating and drinking. Gloriously and unapologetically he ate and drank with the people others rejected or shunned.

At our Sunday evening services from now until the beginning of Lent we are investigating some of the most famous meals that Jesus shared with people, and seeing why food and faith are so often, and so closely, linked.


Rugby Baptist Church are having a new kitchen!

IN OUR BUILDING



RoSA use Rugby Baptist Church rooms for meetings, staff training and workshops on a regular basis.

RoSA is a leading charity established to provide confidential services for survivors of rape, sexual violence and childhood sexual abuse throughout Warwickshire and surrounding areas.

In 1991 a small group of local people identified the need for a totally independent support service for survivors of rape, sexual violence and sexual abuse living in and around Rugby.

A small steering group was determined to set up a support group for anyone whose life had been affected by sexual abuse. RoSA has always been an inclusive agency and had a far-sighted and unusual approach for that time when many services excluded male survivors and partners from benefiting from support offered to female survivors.

Over the next two years
RoSA set up a training
programme to enable the
delivery of support services.
In 1993 RoSA's Constitution
was formally accepted by the
Management Committee,
and RoSA was registered as a
non-profit making charity
with the Charity Commission.

In the early days volunteer and committee meetings were held round kitchen tables, and counselling rooms were found wherever appropriate agencies would allow counsellors to meet clients free of charge. Pioneering times indeed!

However, those early RoSA volunteers had bigger ideas and set about applying to the National Lottery Charities Board for funding to develop services further. These hopes and dreams were answered in 1997 with a grant from the National Lottery to set up offices and counselling rooms in Rugby Town Centre, to employ staff and develop the structure of the organisation, thereby enabling more volunteer counsellors to be recruited and trained.

Over the years RoSA has grown considerably as a well-established specialist service, providing comprehensive holistic support throughout the county of Warwickshire.



RoSA offers support and counselling for people, regardless of age, gender, race, sexual orientation, physical or mental capability or belief, who have experienced rape, sexual abuse, and sexual violence. You can expect to receive the support that allows you, the utmost dignity and respect by our specialist team of counsellors, advocates and support workers. Our services are provided sensitively and confidentially.


Woom Women's Ministry Questionnaire
