Resilience

The year 2024 presented significant challenges for the Jewish people in the aftermath of the October 7th attack on Israel in 2023, which had profound effects in Israel and abroad.

This marked a turning point for world Jewry, as Jewish communities worldwide faced:

- Rising antisemitism
- Increased isolation and a stronger need for connection
- Heightened threats to Jewish identity
- Israeli society searching for support and understanding from the Diaspora
- An increased desire for Jews to contribute to Israel

Despite these adversities, Mosaic United demonstrated resilience and adaptability, fulfilling its mission of building meaningful connections between Israel and the Jewish Diaspora while strengthening Jewish identity.



Adaptability

Mosaic United swiftly pivoted its activities to address the urgent needs of Jewish communities and Israelis affected by the war. This included mobilizing global advocacy, expanding support for Israeli evacuees and diaspora teens, and creating innovative programs like war-related volunteering and "mifgashim" to strengthen connections between Israelis and the Jewish Diaspora.

Our mission and work focused on strategically funding and supporting the following key areas:

- Building a bridge between Israel and the Diaspora Jewry
- Strengthening Jewish identity and connection to Israel
- Bringing volunteers to support Israeli society,
 building connection and understanding
- Combating antisemitism through education and advocacy
- Engaging thousands of Jewish teens and connecting them to Israel and their heritage
- Strengthening Jewish college students and providing a safe space for them on campuses





Campuses

- Engaged 12,135 students across 480 campuses worldwide
- Partnered with 12 new organizations to enhance student engagement
- Facilitated student delegations to Israel and Israeli delegations to campuses worldwide

Jewish students on campuses worldwide have faced unprecedented challenges post October 7th, including rising antisemitism, hostility, and threats to their ability to express their Jewish identity freely. Through strategically funding and supporting our partner organizations, we are ensuring that Jewish students have the support, resources, and safe spaces they need to explore and be proud of their Jewish identity.





Shalom Corps (Israel Volunteering)

Post-October 7th, the Shalom Corps Division of Mosaic United, collaborated with partners to swiftly adapt to meet the urgent needs of Israel and its communities. As the war unfolded, global Jewish volunteers were mobilized to support Israel through hands-on service, including agricultural work, logistical assistance, and direct support to southern communities most affected by the war. Throughout 2024, Shalom Corps continued to facilitate volunteer missions to Israel, providing thousands with the opportunity to stand in solidarity with Israel while making a tangible impact on the ground.

- 8,700 young Jews volunteered in Israel through Taglit-Onward
- 1,300 volunteers participated in emergency trips to Israel
- 600 volunteers engaged in the RiseUp
 Advocacy program



RiseUp Initiative

- Mobilized 600 volunteers globally to combat antisemitism and strengthen Jewish resilience through education, advocacy, and hasbara
- Organized community events, digital content creation, and educational programming






Israelis Abroad

- Over 12,000 Israelis and their families
 living abroad participated in programming
 focused on preserving Jewish identity and
 maintaining connections to Israel.
- Established a forum of Israeli Community
 Leaders in Europe, with a designated
 forum head to guide its activities, leading
 to the yearly Europe Israelis summit.
- Conducted a survey to gauge the experiences and sentiments of Israelis living abroad:






Strengthening Jewish Teens

- Implemented international partnerships for Summer 2024, bringing over 800 North American and 150 international teens (from France, Russia, and Ukraine) to visit Israel.
- Launched the Campers2Gether program, sending 1,000 Israeli teens affected by the war to Jewish summer camps worldwide, building connection and understanding with Diaspora Jewish teens
- Completed the post-October 7th Global Teen Survey and presented the findings at significant forums like the JFNA General Assembly.





Community Building Platform

- Incubated 100 global communities through leadership mentoring and courses
- Supported the Adamah/Hakhel international conference with 98 participants from 26 countries

Summer Camps for Ukrainian Jews

- \$2M+ in funding to support 2,608 Ukrainian Jews across 49 summer camps and programming in multiple countries including Ukraine, Hungary, Germany, Latvia, Romania, Poland, Spain, and the USA.
- Jewish youth and families were able to attend Shabbatonim, seminars, summer camps, and other programs further strengthening their Jewish identity and sense of community.

Looking Ahead: 2025 and Beyond

In 2025, we are expanding our impact together with our partners by bringing 1,200 teens to Israel through 12 international organizations, with an additional 500 teens currently on the waiting list. Through our partnership with Root One, between 2,000 and 3,000 North American teens will have the opportunity to experience Israel firsthand. To further deepen engagement, we will introduce new alternative trips and encounters for 1,200 additional teens, focusing on Israel, Zionism, and Jewish peoplehood. Additionally, 400 Israeli teens will be integrated into various programs as part of the innovative "mifgashim" project which aims to build a deeper connection between Israeli and Diaspora youth.

On college campuses, we will continue to build on our core projects and partnerships to enhance Jewish student engagement. Looking beyond existing initiatives, we are launching a new effort to support Israeli universities by offering educational and cultural programs that strengthen international students' connection to Israel while fostering Jewish identity and cultural understanding.

Our Shalom Corps Volunteering Division is returning to its original mission of Global Jewish Volunteer Programming in 2025. After a hiatus of over a year-during which efforts were focused solely on volunteer missions within Israel, we will be supporting Jewish volunteer initiatives around the world. This year marks an exciting resurgence, with numerous new grant recipients launching impactful missions in countries including Poland, the Dominican Republic, Uganda, Morocco, Ukraine, Belarus, Russia, and many more. In addition to our global efforts, we will continue as a proud funding partner of Taglit Onward, through which they have helped bring thousands of Diaspora Jewish volunteers to Israel since October 7th.

Together with our partners, we are committed to providing meaningful experiences that inspire the next generation of Jewish leaders and strengthen their lasting ties to Israel and the global Jewish community.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to our generous supporters and donors, including the Ministry of Diaspora Affairs and Combating Antisemitism, whose partnership makes our work possible. We are deeply grateful to our dedicated Steering Committee for their commitment to our mission.
