Psalm 94: 14 – 22 New Living Translation

The Lord will not reject his people; he will not abandon his special possession. ¹⁵ Judgment will again be founded on justice, and those with virtuous hearts will pursue it. ¹⁶ Who will protect me from the wicked? Who will stand up for me against evildoers? ¹⁷ Unless the Lord had helped me, I would soon have settled in the silence of the grave. ¹⁸ I cried out, "I am slipping!" but your unfailing love, O Lord, supported me. ¹⁹ When doubts filled my mind, your comfort gave me renewed hope and cheer. ²⁰ Can unjust leaders claim that God is on their side leaders whose decrees permit injustice? ²¹ They gang up against the righteous and condemn the innocent to death. ²² But the Lord is my fortress; my God is the mighty rock where I hide.
