It's a busy time for all of us and also a time in which there is a lot of uncertainty – wherever you find yourself. A time for reflection.......



The Prebend Day Centre is coping with unprecedented and rising demand - latest figures record that 750 people per month are accessing hot meals at the centre. The Mayor of Bedford, Dave Hodgson, lent his support to our Prebend Centre Open afternoon in September. It was an opportunity to say thank you to those who support us and an opportunity to have a look around and discuss the challenges faced.


Mayor Dave Hodgson said:

Currently, the Centre can only operate Monday - Fridays due to funding, so it was a surprise for us when some new and existing users of the service presented at the door on a day it is not usually open Saturday. They needed food, a hot drink, showers and new clean clothing, access to healthcare and some urgent housing advice.



Thank goodness we were able to provide immediate assistance. It just shows there is the huge need for the SMART Prebend Centre to open at weekends - if only we had the funds!

## History of Prebend and the CRIB Appeal Thirty years of service to the Bedford Community

The Prebend Centre has been around for over thirty years with the same mission: to help those who are homeless and that may be rough sleeping. The CRIB Appeal has been a regular calendar event also for many years and people have given money, goods and devised seasonal fundraising to boost the total.

### The Prebend Centre over the years

#### 1992 - 2016

BECHAR was formed (AKA Bedford Recovery Centre). The buildings at Prebend Street started being used to assist those in distress who were homeless or likely to become homeless.



#### 2018/19

smarr continued its concerted fundraising efforts in the shape of CRIB – Cold Relief in Bedford – campaign.

#### 2016/17

SMART took over the running of the Centre and the amazing work started by our predecessors. To the present day - it relies on donations and people's time to keep going.



#### 2020/22

In March 2020 SMART reluctantly had to shut during the pandemic. But re-started again in Feb 2022 with even more determination to help those in need! In 2022 - we attended the Bedford River Festival for the first time and launched the first-ever Sponsored September Sleepout.



Our target is to raise £10,000 per month from November to February. It will keep the Centre open and able to offer food, warmth, clothing, company and much more...It's not just a Christmas Appeal – this one is to support people through the entire Winter period.



Why the Appeal is so important - Disappointingly, there is no statutory or government funding for the Prebend Centre – we stay open only through the generosity and kindness of people in and around Bedford and further afield. The staff, heating, lighting and food costs (as we all know from our own bills at home) all need to be paid and are rising at an alarming rate.
